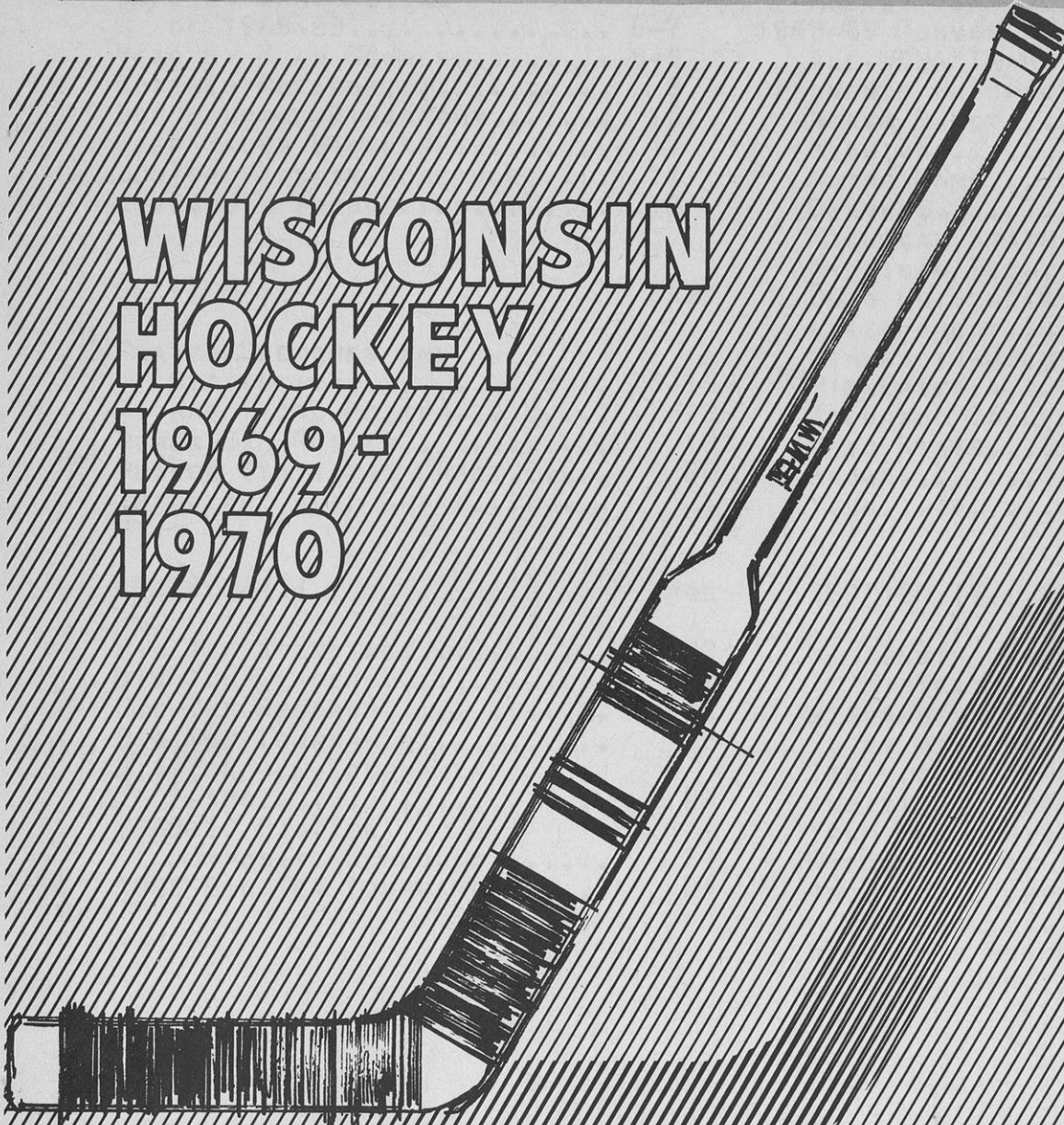

WISCONSIN WILL PLAY ALL THIRTEEN HOME GAMES PLUS THE JUNIOR VARSITY--VARSITY GAME NOVEMBER 18 AND THE ALUMNI GAME NOVEMBER 22 AT THE SPACIOUS DANE COUNTY MEMORIAL COLISEUM. THE COLISEUM'S 7,634 FIXED SEATS NOT ONLY GIVE WISCONSIN THE LARGEST FACILITY IN THE BIG TEN AND WCHA, BUT ALSO THE MOST COMFORTABLE--THE SEATS ARE UPHOLSTERED, SELF-RISING THEATER TYPE. THE COLISEUM'S ICE SURFACE IS 85 FEET BY 200 FEET.

WISCONSIN ATTENDANCE

THE BADGERS DREW 64,298 FANS TO 19 HOME GAMES IN 1968-69, SECOND ONLY TO NCAA CHAMPION DENVER, WHICH DREW 88,267 FOR 18 HOME DATES. IN 13 DANE COUNTY MEMORIAL COLISEUM DATES, THE BADGERS DREW 49,785 FOR AN AVERAGE OF 3,830 FANS A GAME. IN FIVE HARTMEYER ICE ARENA GAMES, WISCONSIN DREW 10,789 FOR A NEAR CAPACITY AVERAGE OF 2,158. IN WISCONSIN'S ONLY APPEARANCE IN THE MILWAUKEE ARENA, THE BADGERS DREW 3,724. OVERALL, WISCONSIN AVERAGED 3,384 FANS A GAME. WISCONSIN'S OVERALL ATTENDANCE FOR SIX SEASONS AND 100 HOME COLLEGIATE GAMES IS 208,956 FOR AN AVERAGE GAME ATTENDANCE OF 2,090.

REVIEW OF THE 1968-69 SEASON

WISCONSIN'S SIXTH SEASON IN INTERCOLLEGIATE COMPETITION, AND LAST AS AN INDEPENDENT WAS A HIGHLY SUCCESSFUL ONE. THE BADGERS WERE 22-10-2--15-1 AGAINST OTHER INDEPENDENTS, 7-9-2 AGAINST WCHA TEAMS, AND 5-5 AGAINST BIG TEN TEAMS FOR A THIRD PLACE FINISH.

BIG WINS OF THE SEASON INCLUDED A 4-3 VICTORY AND 7-7 TIE AGAINST WCHA CHAMPION MICHIGAN TECH AT HOUGHTON; 7-5 AND 11-7 VICTORIES OVER PREVIOUSLY UNBEATEN NORTH DAKOTA; A COME-FROM-BEHIND 5-4 VICTORY AGAINST MICHIGAN FOR THE BADGERS' FIRST WIN AGAINST THE WOLVERINES; A 2-1 TRIUMPH AGAINST MICHIGAN STATE FOR WISCONSIN'S FIRST WIN AT EAST LANSING; AND A 7-3 POUNDING OVER MINNESOTA.

1 : WISCONSIN'S FINAL SERIES AT MICHIGAN DECIDED THE BIG TEN TITLE, WITH THE WOLVERINES COMING OUT ON TOP WITH 8-5 AND 2-0 WINS.

THE BADGERS PARTICIPATED IN TWO TOURNAMENTS, FINISHING SECOND TO MICHIGAN TECH IN THE GREAT LAKES TOURNAMENT, AND TIED FOR THIRD IN THE BIG TEN TOURNAMENT. DEFENSEMAN JOHN JAGGER WAS NAMED TO BOTH TOURNAMENT TEAMS, AND CENTER BERT DEHATE TO THE BIG TEN TEAM.

ROBERT N. (BOB) JOHNSON

WISCONSIN HOCKEY COACH

ALTHOUGH HE IS JUST BEGINNING HIS FOURTH YEAR AS HOCKEY COACH OF THE UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN, BOB JOHNSON HAS CREATED A HOCKEY RENAISSANCE IN THE UNIVERSITY'S HOCKEY PROGRAM, AND THROUGH HIS HARD WORK AND ENTHUSIASM HE HAS SPARKED THE GROWTH OF HOCKEY AT ALL LEVELS OF COMPETITION IN THE STATE OF WISCONSIN.

IN THREE YEARS UNDER JOHNSON, THE BADGERS HAVE COMPILED 16-10 (1966-67), 21-10 (1967-68), AND 22-10-2 (1968-69) RECORDS FOR A COMBINED MARK OF 59-30-2 AND A .648 WINNING PERCENTAGE. LAST SEASON'S VICTORIES INCLUDED A WIN AND TIE (4-3, 7-7) AT MICHIGAN TECH, TWO VICTORIES AGAINST NORTH DAKOTA (7-5, 11-7), THE BADGERS' FIRST VICTORY EVER AT EAST LANSING, MICH. AGAINST MICHIGAN STATE (2-1), AND A VICTORY OVER MICHIGAN (5-4). ALL ARE MEMBERS OF THE WESTERN COLLEGIATE HOCKEY ASSOCIATION, WHICH THE BADGERS JOINED LAST MARCH.

JOHNSON IS A 38 YEAR OLD MINNESOTA NATIVE WHO HAS HAD A SUCCESSFUL ATHLETIC BACKGROUND--BOTH AS A COMPETITOR AND AS A COACH.

HE WAS AN ALL-STAR HOCKEY PLAYER AT MINNEAPOLIS CENTRAL HIGH SCHOOL AND CAPTAIN HIS SENIOR YEAR IN THE LATE 40'S. HE ALSO EXCELLED IN FOOTBALL AND BASEBALL.

HIS COLLEGIATE HOCKEY WAS PLAYED AT NORTH DAKOTA WHERE HE WAS THE LEADING SCORER IN 1950-51, AND AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA IN 1952-53 AND 1953-54.

THE GOPHERS WON THE WCHA TITLE BOTH YEARS JOHNSON PLAYED. HE ALSO WON LETTERS IN FOOTBALL AND BASEBALL AT MINNESOTA.

JOHNSON BEGAN HIS COACHING CAREER AT WARROAD, MINNESOTA HIGH SCHOOL FOLLOWING ARMY DUTY IN KOREA IN THE MID-1950'S, AND AFTER ONE YEAR, BECAME HEAD COACH AT MINNEAPOLIS ROOSEVELT HIGH SCHOOL WHERE HIS TEAMS WON 51 OF 60 CONFERENCE GAMES IN SIX SEASONS THROUGH 1962-63.

PRIOR TO COMING TO WISCONSIN, JOHNSON SERVED COLORADO COLLEGE AS BOTH HOCKEY COACH AND BASEBALL COACH FOR THREE SEASONS. HIS HOCKEY TEAMS POSTED 12-14-1 (1963-64), 7-19 (1964-65), AND 10-18-2 (1965-66) RECORDS.

JOHNSON'S BASEBALL TEAMS WERE HIGHLY SUCCESSFUL AND IN BOTH 1964 AND 1965 HE WAS NAMED 'COACH OF THE YEAR' FOR THE NCAA COLLEGE DIVISION ROCKY MOUNTAIN DISTRICT. HE ADDITIONALLY ASSISTED IN FOOTBALL AND TAUGHT IN THE PHYSICAL EDUCATION CURRICULUM WITH THE RANK OF ASSISTANT PROFESSOR.

JOHNSON RECEIVED HIS BACHELOR OF SCIENCE DEGREE FROM MINNESOTA IN 1954 WITH A DOUBLE MAJOR IN PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND SOCIAL STUDIES. HE GAINED HIS MASTERS FROM MINNESOTA IN 1961 IN PHYSICAL EDUCATION.

HE IS THE AUTHOR OF TWO BOOKS, COACHING HOCKEY AND HOCKEY, THE LATTER JUST PUBLISHED THIS YEAR. HE HAS ALSO PLAYED A GUIDING HAND IN THE ORGANIZATION OF ONE OF THE FINEST HOCKEY SCHOOLS IN THE NATION, HELD EACH SUMMER IN ASPEN, COLORADO.

BOB AND HIS WIFE ARE THE PARENTS OF FIVE CHILDREN.

HE PLAYED HOCKEY AND BASEBALL AS A COLLEGIAN UNDER THE TUTELAGE OF CURRENT WISCONSIN HEAD COACH BOB JOHNSON, WHO COACHED BOTH SPORTS AT COLORADO COLLEGE.

BOB JOHNSON LOOKS AT THE 1969-70 SEASON

GOALTENDING -- We have two outstanding goalies returning this year, senior Bob Vroman (3.2 avg) and junior Wayne Thomas (2.8 avg). They will certainly compete for the starting position, however if both are equal, we will alternate them again. Both are good WCHA goaltenders.

DEFENSE -- To improve ourselves in the WCHA, we will have to tighten up defensively. The year's experience to all four starting defensemen (Doug McFadyen, Chuck Burroughs, John Jagger, Dan Gilchrist) will help them. We have several talented sophomore defensemen trying to break into the lineup, so we may play with six rather than four defensemen this year.

CENTER -- We think we have three outstanding centers in Bert DeHate (36 goals, 25 assists), Bob Poffenroth (25 goals, 29 assists), and Jim Boyd (25 goals, 21 assists). They really carried the bulk of our offense last year. In analyzing the 1968-69 season, I can find no fault with the play of our centers. Bert will play only 20 games for us this year and then graduate. It will be difficult to find another center to adequately replace him.

LEFT WING -- Two sophomores, Jim Young (Dafer, Mich.) and Phil Uihlein (Milwaukee) are being counted on heavily to fill left wing spots with veterans Dave Smith (15 goals, 18 assists) and Stu Henrickson (15 goals, 10 assists). Young is a talented skater and was MVP on last year's freshman team. He certainly could be a key in the Badger offense.

RIGHT WING -- Three returning veterans, outstanding scorer Murray Heatley (29 goals, 25 assists), Dick Klipsic (9 goals, 13 assists), and Matt Tochtermann (11 goals, 15 assists) are all expected to keep Wisconsin a high scoring team.

GENERAL OUTLOOK -- This will be the biggest challenge a Wisconsin hockey team has ever faced. Being in the WCHA will have a stronger bearing than ever before. How we will do, though, is honestly a big question mark. We felt that with most of our team back we'd be in pretty good shape to compete as a league member. However, with the freshman rule, I have just no idea how this will affect us or the other teams. No team will be caught short of talent. It should be the best balanced WCHA ever. I can't honestly predict where we will finish, but I certainly hope it's in the first division. I know our players, coaching staff, and fans are looking forward to competition in the WCHA.
