I presume that you think that I have entirely forgotten your little bill, but the fact is, that since my return to the City, I have been so incessantly occupied that I have not been able to command an instant to myself. You will therefore, I know, excuse my delay and assure yourself, that I can not easily forget you or your kind attentions to me while in East. Hampton.
