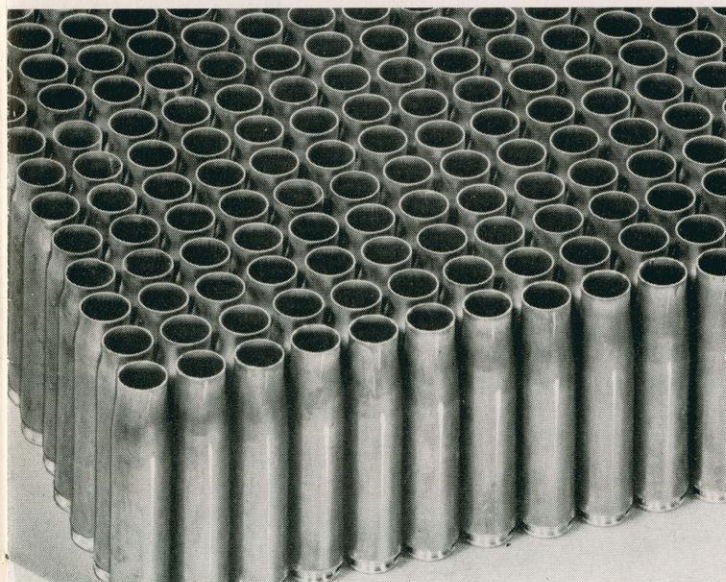

The Aluminum Specialty Company utilizes more than 200,000 square feet of floor space in its two wholly owned plants and employs some 500 people.
