September 1907, I began work as assistant to your librarian at \$5,00 a month, for two months, \$10.00 a month for the ten months, which would make the first year; with the understanding that my salary would be increased to 15 or \$20 for the second year's services.

Realizing that the Board has been greatly handicapped by lack of funds, I have regrained from asking for an increase in my salary up to the present time. But as I am still receiving but \$10.00 a month, I feel that you will as a Board realize that the salary usn't sufficient compensation for the work to be done and would respectfully ask your Honorable body for an

increase in my salary.
