Ladies and Gentlemen:-

In

September 1907, I began work
as Assistant to your librarian
at \$5.00 a month, for
two months, \$10.00 a month
for the ten months, which
would make the first year,
with the understanding that
my salary would be in-
creased to 15 or \$20 for the
second year's services.

Realizing that the Board has been greatly handicapped by lack of funds, I have refrained from asking for an increase in my salary up to the present time. But as I am still receiving but \$10.00 a month, I feel that you will as a Board realize that the salary isn't sufficient compensation for the work to be done and would respectfully ask your Honorable body for an

increase in my salary.
