WEDNESDAY, APRIL 16, 1862.

At 4th St. Hospital, making out report. Saw Lt. Col. Mulsonner & Lady at Planters Hotel - He was wounded by a fragment of a shell at Shiloh or Pittsburgh. Life saved by Steel Vest.

Finished report A.M. at Barracks. P.M. went to City Pd. over passed \$288.55 to Maj. J. A. Cunningham U.S. Paymaster under Col. Andrews, and made report to Genl. Schofield - kept duplicate - Stopped at Planters Hotel over night -

Went to McDowalls College at
11 P.M. + released Thayer + Hale
who had been arrested.

Arrived at Cape Girardeau at
10 A.M. (Girardeau)

Went into tents 1/2 mile S.W.
from town on Fair Ground.

Manned Squadron "B" out
on Jackson road about
3 miles. Country very rolling,
land good.

3^d Batt. with Squadron E.
arrived. - Col. Daniels + wife
came with them. Came on
Steamer "Choctaw". Went into
camp about 3/4 mile west of
McC

Maj. Pomroy with Squadrons
F and I, arrived, went into
camp with 3^d Batt.

SATURDAY 31

Moved our Camp 3/4 mile
further West on Bloomfield
road. - Camped in a beautiful
piece of timber. 1st Batt. still
at Fair Ground.

Sergt. Bulluck fined 1 - .16²/₃

SUNDAY, MAY 4, 1862.

Called up between 12 + 1. 2 m + as soon as could get ready. Mounted 65 men + started in Cornhorns with Co. A. on Co. E. L. S. Cav. + 15 Tro. State Cav. for Hamburg. (about 18 miles S.W.) Arrived at H. at 7 a.m. - Went on toward "Little River" about 10 miles + confiscated some Corn to feed Horses. Rode about 3 miles farther + turned back. River packed at night about 9 miles from Camp Girardreau, on Foster's farm

MONDAY 5

Started for Camp at 6 a.m. Arrived at 8:30 - Left St. Porter at Foster's, sick. Ambulance went out for him.
