



BIENNIAL REPORT

HONORABLE WALTER S. GOODLAND, Governor, State of Wisconsin.

Sir: In compliance with law we have the honor to submit the following report of the transactions of this department for the two years ending June 30, 1946.

SALE OF LAND

The withholding of state school lands from public sale as a general policy, which has prevailed since 1913, has been continued. A few isolated descriptions have been sold where it appeared advantageous for the state to dispose of them because of their isolation and cost to administer and to afford an opportunity to the adjoining land owner, and particularly a farm owner, to purchase as an extension to his present holdings. These lands have little or no timber and are more adapted to farming than growing timber. During the last two years considerable swamp acreage has been disposed of for the purpose of growing cranberries and should the demand for this type of land continue we will have realized additional revenue from lands which were considered almost worthless just a few years back.

SALE OF TIMBER

During the years 1944, 1945 and 1946 from special funds provided for under Sec. 20.19-3 Wis. Stats. 13,919,800 feet of saw-log timber was marked for cutting, and sold, as well as 23,617 cords of

pulpwood and 18,017 cords of other cord timber were designated for cutting and sold with a total aggregate of 34,735,000 feet of timber. This timber was sold under the selective cutting method as provided by Sec. 24.39 Stats. with sales totaling approximately \$384,000. Such selective cutting will benefit the remaining stand of timber on these lands as only mature, defective or corrective trees are marked to a percentage in most cases not exceeding 40% of the stand. Sales of timber now will benefit the school funds because of the present favorable market for the sale of timber stumpage. Prices received on the sale of state timber the last two years doubled and tripled normal prices. For example, the following average prices were received on some species of timber sold the first six months of 1946.

Dead and down and blown down timber on the school lands has been sold wherever possible, providing it was advantageous for the state to do so without damage to standing green timber in removing such timber.

INVESTMENT OF FUNDS

There has been no appreciative increase in loans from the state school funds to school districts and other municipalities the last two years because of war restrictions on new constructions, and the inability of municipalities in securing the necessary material needed for improvements and repairs. Funds not needed for loans to school districts and other municipalities were invested in government securities.

The total of the productive state trust funds as of June 30, 1946, is as follows:

SWAMP LANDS IN MENOMINEE INDIAN RESERVATION

The State's interest under the federal swamp act of 1850 to lands located within the Menominee Indian Reservation (Shawano and Oconto counties) was sold to the United States government for the benefit of the Menominee tribe of Indians under Chap. 349, Laws of Wisconsin for 1945, at a net price to the state of \$1,590,854.50. The acreage involved under the above consideration was 33,870.23 acres made up as follows:

The long standing controversy between the United States government and the State of Wisconsin involving the state's interests under the Swamp Act of 1850 in the Menominee Indian Reservation (which controversy was concluded by the above act of the Legislature) had its beginning possibly in 1866 when the state refused to surrender to the federal government the federal swamp patent issued to state in 1865 involving the patented lands in this recent sale. The federal government contended such lands so patented were reserved lands prior to the issuance of patent and consequently considered patent void. The state contended the patent valid because of the passage of the swamp act prior to the establishment of the Menominee Indian Reservation in 1854. Since 1866, and prior to 1925, the state had repeatedly requested from the federal government further approved lists and patents to other swamp lands within the reservation with no results, notwithstanding the terms of the grant required the government to certify such lands to the state as soon as practical after the survey.

The state in 1881 and 1898 filed swamp land selection lists totaling approximately 10,000 acres of additional swamp lands within the reservation with the hope that this might bring results in opening up this question of further state's rights under the swamp act within the reservation. The filing of these lists brought no government action only the reply that these lists could not be recognized as a selection by the United States government. However, the turning point came in 1925 on the decision in the case of United States vs. Minnesota (270 U. S. 181) which held that the swamp act of 1850 operated as a grant in praesenti and that an Indian Reservation established subsequent to the swamp act was ineffective as to swamp lands. That decision definitely put the title to the lands already patented in the state, as well as any other lands in the Menominee Indian Reservation of the character of the swamp act. Because of this decision the United States government, through the Commissioner of the General Land Office, Department of Interior, by letter December 26, 1929, so conceded the state's interests under the swamp act within the reservation. Immediately, the state Legislature appropriated funds to this office to appraise the patented lands and other lands in the reservation of swamp character for the purpose of negotiating a sale with the federal government of the state's interest in said reservation under said act. The appraisals were made in 1929, 1930 and 1931, and in 1935 this office made the following two propositions to the federal government as far as it concerns the Menominee Indian Reservation. (1) Sell the state's interest at \$851,947.69, and the state to assume the education of Indian youths. (2) Sell state's interest for \$520,000 without assuming such education. Subsequently, these two propositions were dropped by the state when the Attorney General of Wisconsin held the educational feature unconstitutional, and also because of opposition received from bordering school districts that would be involved under such an arrangement. Again in 1937 and 1939 the state was willing, and attempts were made to pass a federal law for the acquisition of such lands by the federal government at a price of \$851,947.69. No such law was passed. In 1941 the Court of Claims of the United States rendered an interlocutory judgment in Menominee Tribe of Indians vs. United States No. 44294, holding that the Menominee Indians were entitled to recover from the United States the present acquisition cost of swamp lands owned by the state within the Menominee Indian Reservation, but reserved for future proceedings the determination of such acquisition cost. The interlocutory judgment also provided that the United States may, in lieu of paying such judgment, acquire and hold such lands in trust for the Menominee tribe. Then followed negotiations with the federal government and the Menominee tribe of Indians through their attorneys as to the acquisition cost of such lands by the federal government for the benefit of the Indian tribe which resulted in the sale under Chap. 349, Laws of Wisconsin for 1945. Final settlement under the judgment, and on passage of Chap. 349, Laws of Wisconsin for 1945, involved an acreage of 33,870.23 acres; 1929-30 state timber inventory using the over-run and under-run as determined by a spot check in 1943; 1942 timber prices, trespass and land values. (Difference in acquisition cost received and considered in 1935, 1937 and 1939 is accounted for in timber prices prevailing at the time and additional lands claimed under swamp act in final settlement). So ended a controversy which had continued spasmodically the last eighty years.

ISLANDS IN MISSISSIPPI RIVER

Upon application of this office the United States government is now in the process of surveying islands in the Mississippi River which were not included in prior official surveys of the townships and in existence as lands in place when Wisconsin was admitted into the Union, and at the time of the passage of the swamp land act of September 28, 1850. Upon recent completion of the survey of some of these islands and the filing of the official plat thereof on October 17, 1945, this office filed swamp land selection list to eight islands totaling 212.92 acres, which islands will soon be patented to the state. As the survey progresses more islands will be patented to the state under the swamp act and it is very possible the survey of all islands will not be completed for another two years. The total number of islands which will be eventually patented to the state under the swamp act will be much less than first anticipated. Many of the islands in the river were created from the bed of the river since the swamp act, and this type of island is excluded from the swamp act, and some islands were and will be surveyed as parts of the states of Iowa and Minnesota. For the past seventy or eighty years the federal government has refused to make these surveys on the assumption that periodically overflowed lands or islands are not considered swamp lands under the act. The courts have held otherwise and to the effect that the grant includes not only such lands as might strictly come under the description "Swamp lands" but also such as were so "wet" (lands subject to overflow) as to be rendered thereby unfit for cultivation. The excessive cost to the federal government to survey such islands which were considered of little value and possibly state under the swamp act should a survey be made, may have been another factor in the delay of such surveys.

WHITEHEAD PROPERTY—PLATTEVILLE

This property included real estate which accrued to the common school fund by will and was assigned to the state by judgment of the County Court of Grant County, Wisconsin, in the probate of the estate of Ellen Lisle Whitehead. This property consisted of four dwellings, one an old land mark, the former home of Major Rountree built in 1854. These dwellings have been sold, with the Board of Regents of Normal Schools purchasing the former Major Rountree dwelling as a home for the president of the Platteville State Teachers College. Net rent of \$8,441.64 was collected on the property while in possession of the state, and only two vacant lots remain unsold.

CIVIL WAR DEBT

The remaining certificates of indebtedness held by the common school and normal funds incurred by the state in connection with its participation in the Civil War were paid in full on April 7, 1943 by Chap. 21, Laws of Wisconsin for 1943. The amounts were \$200,000 in favor of the normal fund and \$1,163,700 in favor of the common school fund. These payments were made during Julius P. Heil's term as Governor.
