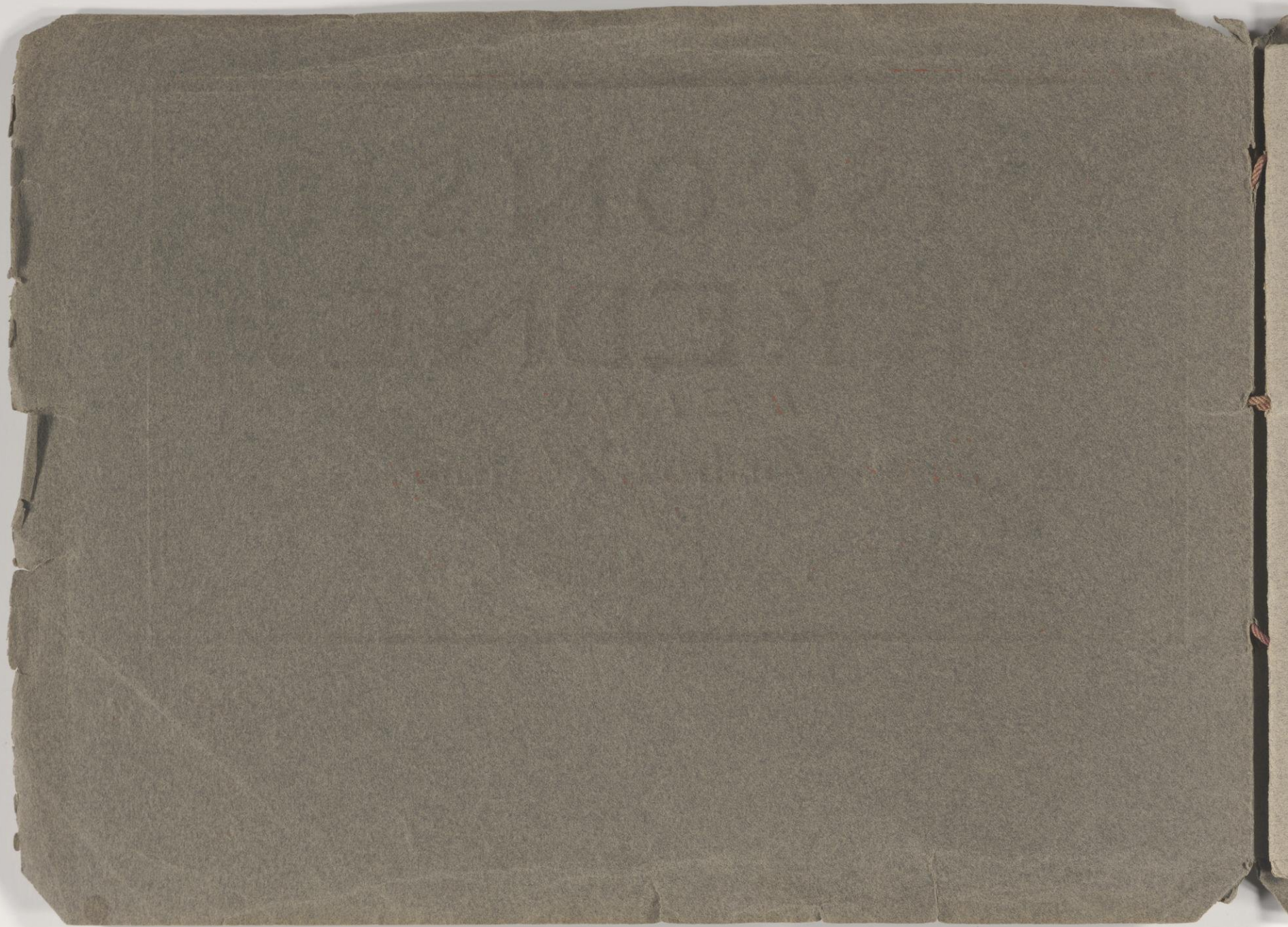

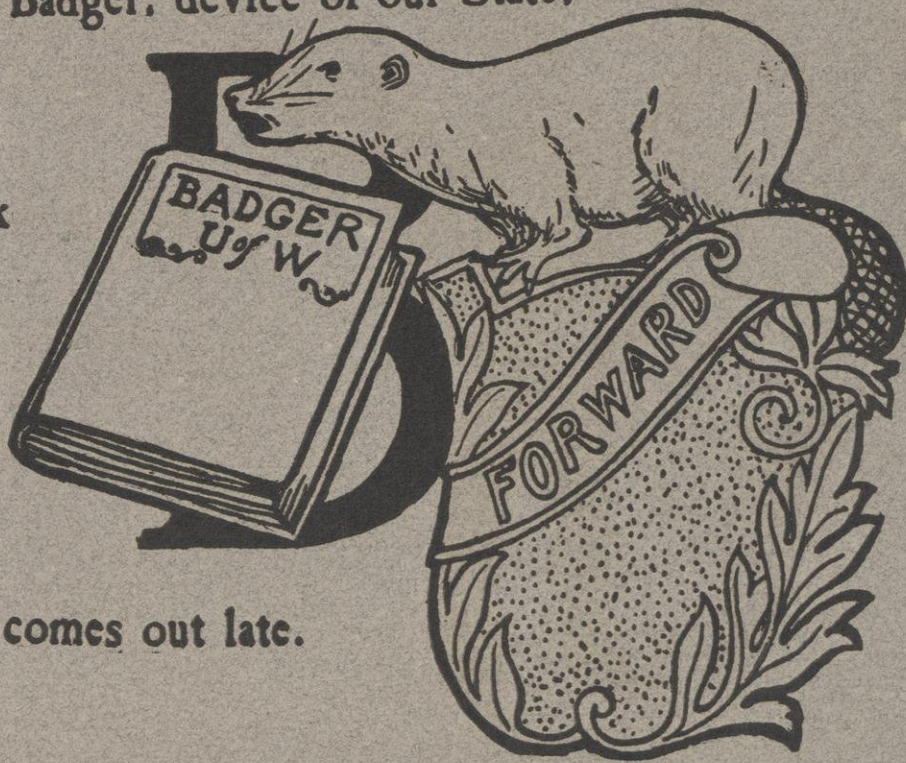


Who come from the farm

H is the Hop where we go in our pride.

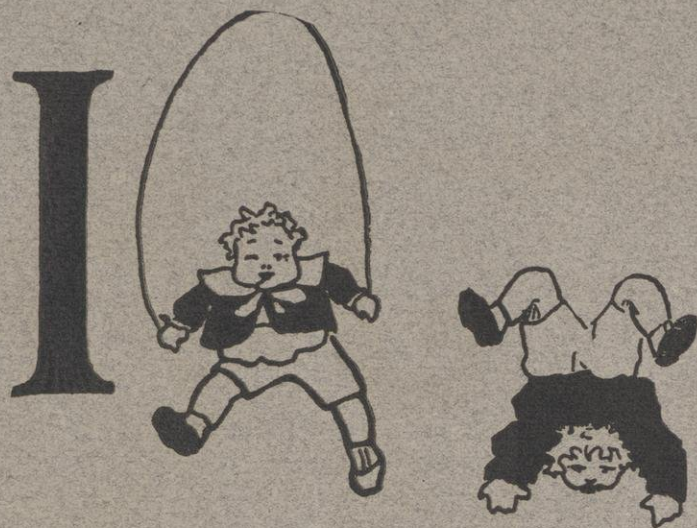

We hope will be that with the much-needed "mon."

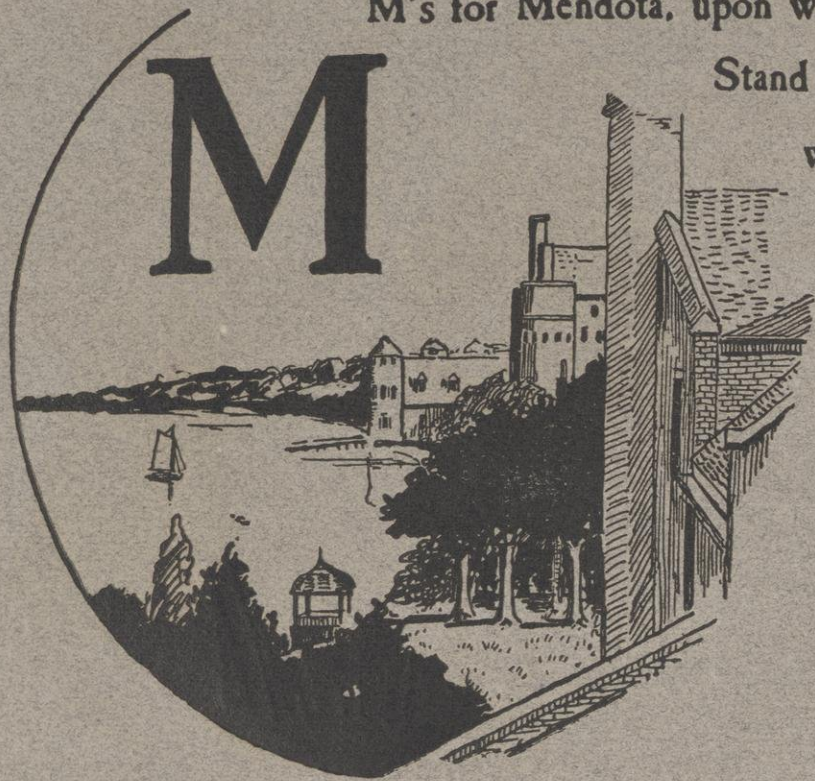




M's for Mendota, upon whose fair shore

wherein we seek learning and law.



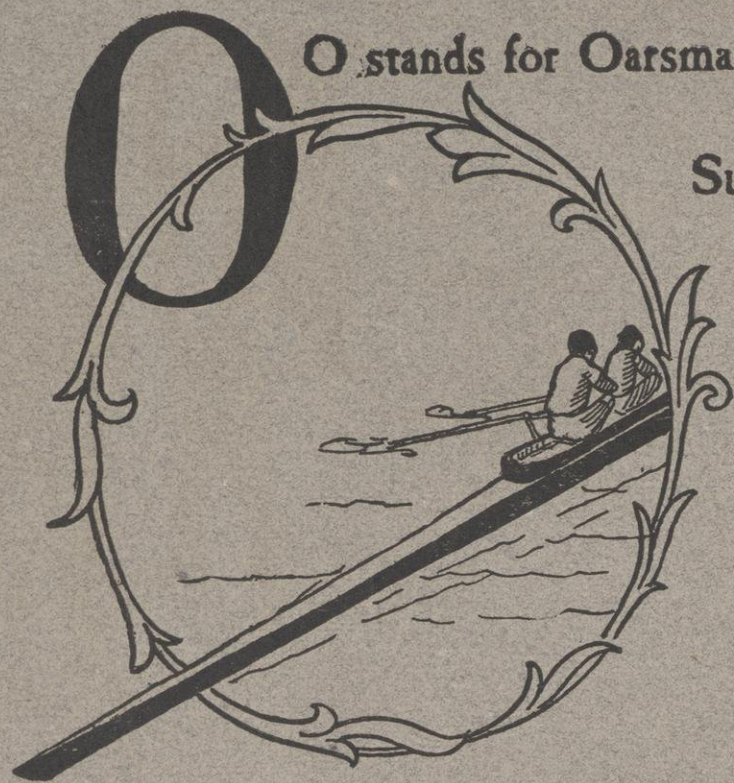


N is for Normalite, festive and wise,

Make exports too plenty the previous week.



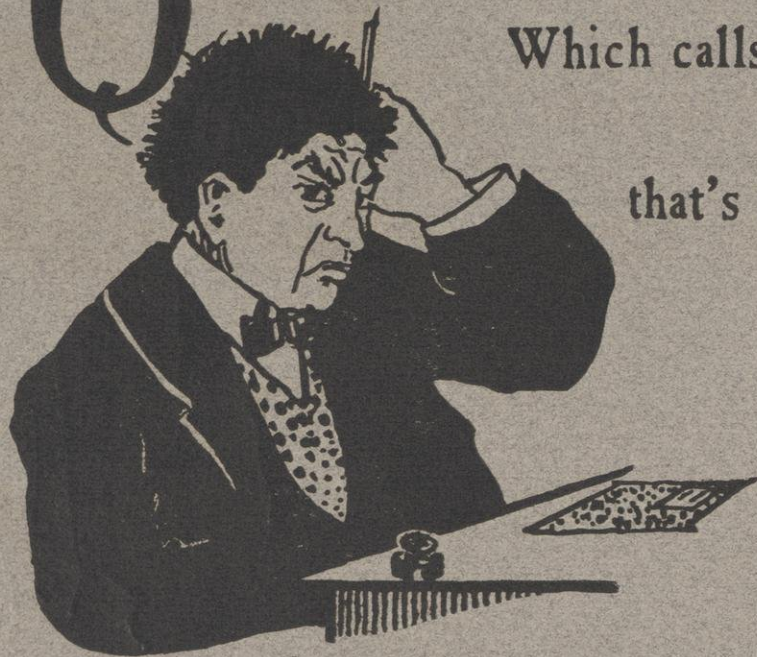

for a swim in the lake.



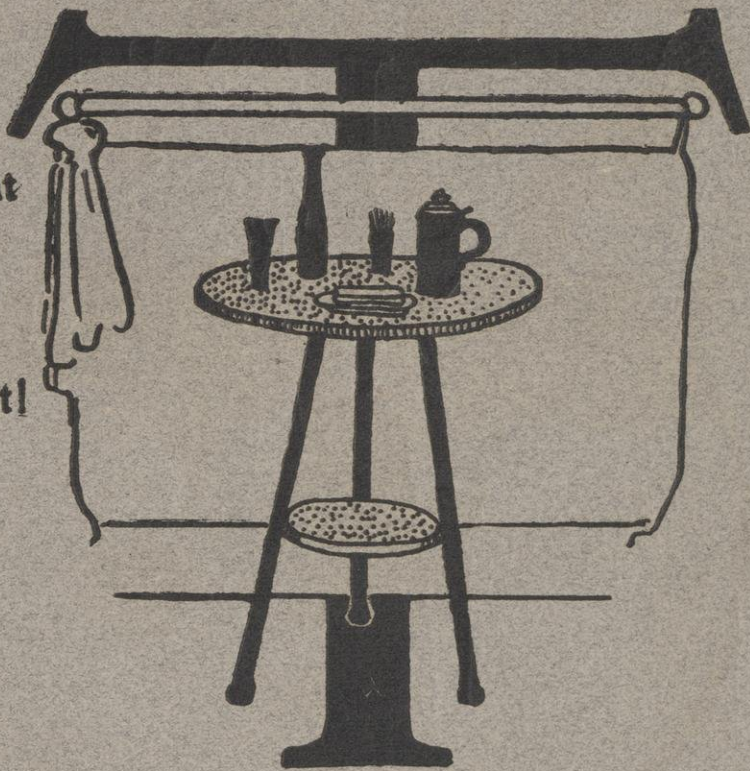


**T** stands for Tommy's.

U our University, to us all so dear,

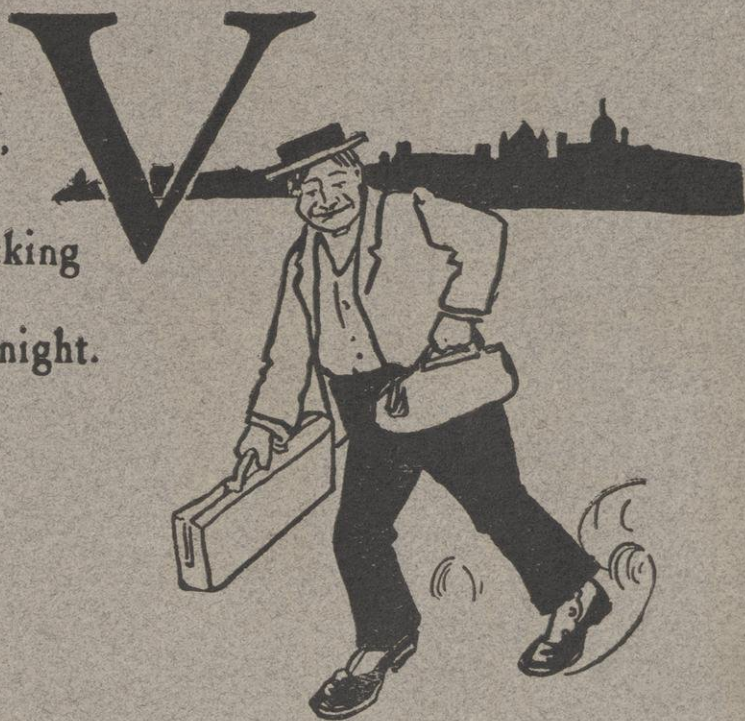
No less to our dads
