# HISTORY OF CAMP RANDALL STADIUM

They call it Camp Randall.

**That's important.**

Every now and then some hurried out-of-town sports announcer will call it "Randall Field," but he is corrected quickly.

The University of Wisconsin is proud that its sports center is more than just an athletic field—and that the drama and excitement of football seasons are set against a backdrop of colorful Wisconsin history.

In its 79 years of ownership, the University has expanded the facilities there until they include a large stadium, fieldhouse, memorial practice building and football practice fields.

But the University didn't name it. The name was decided long before that by veterans of the Civil War who knew it was a great military camp named for a wartime governor. When the University took it over they insisted that the name be preserved forever as a memorial to their fallen friends.

In the days before the Civil War, the site was owned by the State Agricultural Society whose yearly state fairs attracted holidaying throngs there. With the outbreak of the war, however, the society turned the place over to the government to become the state's major training center.

The display halls were transformed into white-washed barracks and the hall used for flower shows became a hospital. A total of 70,000 troops was drilled—usually about 7,000 being stationed there at a time—and 500,000 relatives and friends came to visit them.

Later in the war part of the camp became a prison where a group of sick Confederates, captured by Gen. Pope at Island No. 10 in the Mississippi, was brought. Many died in the drafty prison hospital on the knoll and were buried in what is now Confederate Rest at Forest Hill cemetery.

The land again became the state fair grounds when peace returned and when Gen. U. S. Grant visited it 15 years later he hailed the transformation as "a symbol of beating the spears of war into the plowshares of peace."

Other visitors to the grounds were Gens. Sherman and Sheridan and Pres. Hayes. When the state fair was moved to Milwaukee and a few years later even the Dane County Agricultural society stopped using it for fairs, the Civil War veterans were furious to learn the land was to be sold for building lots.

Blasting the "sordid sacrilege," they urged the legislature to buy it and in 1893 the state presented it to the University as a memorial athletic field.

When the question of a name arose, the veterans promptly carried the day for "camp" instead of "Field."

Intercollegiate athletics had been started at Wisconsin in 1881 and the University has had a football team since 1889. The school won its first great victory in 1894, defeating Minnesota 6-0 in a game on the lower campus that part of the crowd watched from fringed surreys. The great teams of '96, '97, and '01 were among the first to play at the new field.

Charles Van Hise, who became president of the University in 1903, was a sports enthusiast as well as a great president and he used to ride his horse nightly out to watch the football practice. Games were played before the old wood fairstand and many Madison business and professional men still boast of the holes they found as boys to insure a free look at the fun.

The University had a "real" stadium by 1913 but its stands were still wooden. The legislature declined to pay for concrete—and consequently, was promptly blamed when a large section collapsed Nov. 21, 1915, at the climactic Wisconsin-Minnesota game.

Twenty people were injured, some seriously, and only the fact that the seats fell slowly prevented more casualties among the 1,800 in the area.

So in 1917 the present stadium—following completion of the past year's addition—was started with a grant of \$15,000 from the legislature. The rest of the money was earned by athletic events and the stadium, which now seats 77,280, is the only one in the Big Ten to "pay its own way" that way. Permanent dormitories were built, housing 150 men, but this space now is used as athletic department offices and training quarters.

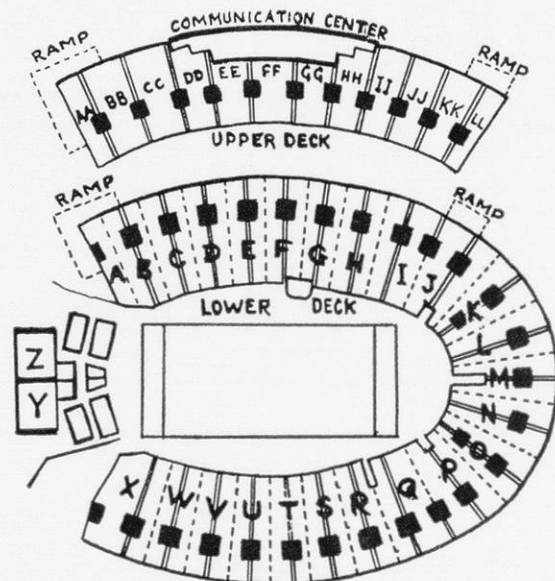
The first game to be played in Camp Randall Stadium was the 1917 homecoming game against Minnesota's Golden Gophers. The Badgers won the game 10-7 to hand the Gophers their only Big Ten loss, relegating them to second place in the final conference standings. A week later, Ohio State visited Camp Randall and inflicted a 16-3 defeat on the Badgers: the Ohioans won the title that year with an unbeaten record. Wisconsin placed in a tie for third place with Northwestern.

The fieldhouse at the open end of the stadium horseshoe was built in 1930 for almost \$500,000 and has a seating capacity of 13,800 for basketball games and other events.

The original capacity of the stadium when first utilized in 1917 was 10,000, with permanent seats being added in stages to increase seating capacity.

The current construction project is the third since the end of World War II which began with the completion of the horseshoe at the north end in 1950 and 1951.

The running track was eliminated in 1958 expansion which saw the playing field of Camp Randall lowered by ten feet to add almost 12,000 seats to the stadium capacity which grew to 63,435 at that time.

# "MAN ON THE GO"—

## Elroy Hirsch

Elroy Hirsch is in his seventh year as Wisconsin's Director of Athletics and he's the guiding force behind one of the finest athletic programs for men and women in the United States today.

He came back to Wisconsin — where he gained collegiate fame as a star sophomore running back in leading the Badgers to a No. 3 ranking during the 1942 football season — from the Los Angeles Rams on February 28, 1969, and his original appointment as athletic director — slated to end in 1979 — was extended in 1974 by the school's athletic board through June 30, 1984.

Professor Frederick W. Haberman, Athletic Board chairman, points out, "Elroy richly merits our confidence. His dynamic personality has infused our entire operation with that indefinable quality we usually call spirit. He has heightened the total consciousness of the state and of our alumni throughout the country. He's taken the role of the leader.

"His good sense and hard work has contributed substantial achievements to the progress of the Division of Intercollegiate Athletics.

"He has kept us financially solvent in a day and age when athletic budgets are in deficit and he is the best person we can think of to handle the harsh problems with which our athletic program will be faced in the months ahead."

Wisconsin Chancellor Edwin Young notes, "When I meet with other chancellors of other schools and listen to their problems, I feel very good about our program. It's a good situation, and I've been very pleased with the way Elroy Hirsch and the Athletic Board have handled the growth of the women's programs."

**His career has been one of success.**

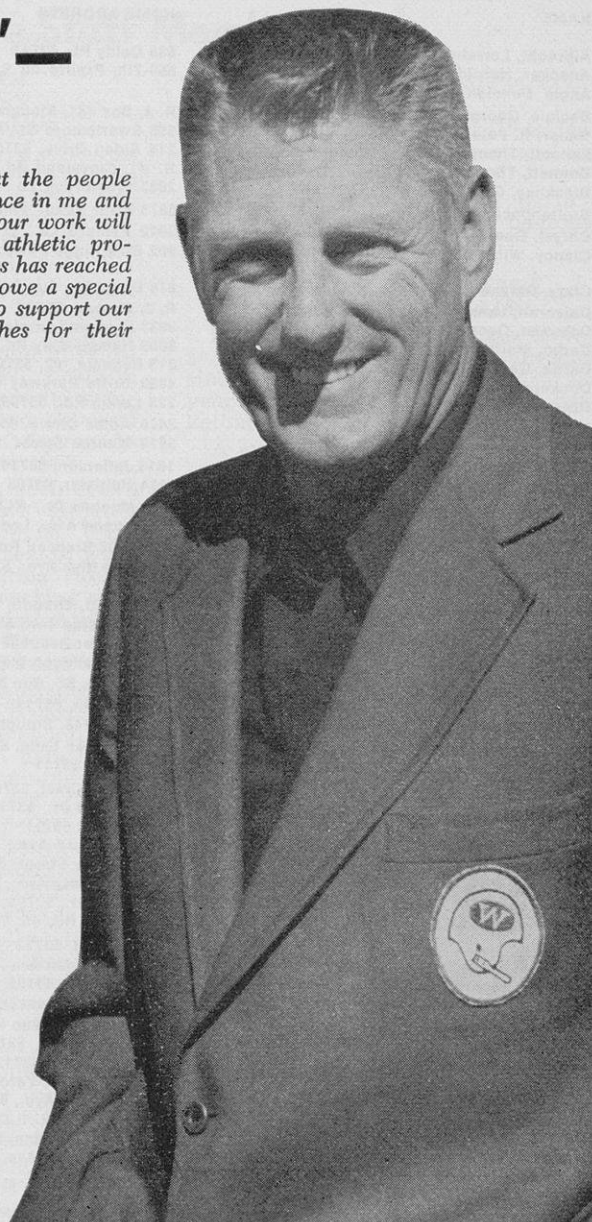
He is a living legend to followers of Wisconsin football and to sports fans and people throughout the entire state even though he played just one season — as a sophomore in 1942 — for the Badgers.

Wisconsin fans, especially the older generation, remember him as the great triple threat halfback on Harry Stuhldreher's 1942 football team that won eight games, lost only to Iowa, and tied Notre Dame.

He played at Michigan in 1943, as a Marine trainee, and he not only played football, but basketball, track and baseball. He won his "M" in each sport, the only athlete ever to accomplish such a feat at Michigan.

He had a successful professional football career, first as halfback with the Chicago Rockets of the post-war All-America Conference, and later

with the Los Angeles Rams for nine seasons as one of the all-time great ends.

He was a successful executive with the Rams, first as general manager of the team, and later as assistant to the president of the team, a job he relinquished to accept the job as Wisconsin athletic director.

Elroy retired from active NFL play following the 1957 season.

He's been named to the Wisconsin Athletic Hall of Fame (1965), to professional football's Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio (1968), and to the National Football Hall of Fame in New York last year.

He's also a member of the all-time NFL All-Star team for his play as end and flanker with the Los Angeles Rams that served to change the game from one of two-way players to

offensive and defensive specialists under free substitution.

In 1951, Hirsch displayed all his talents as he put together one of the finest seasons in National Football League history. He gained 1,495 yards on receptions, an all-time record approached only by Bobby Mitchell of the Washington Redskins (1,436 yards in 1963) and Hirsch had only twelve games to set the record, not 14, like Mitchell!

That same season Hirsch caught 17 touchdown passes to tie the league record set by Don Hutson of the Packers in 1942. He also caught at least one touchdown pass through 11 consecutive games over the 1950 and 1951 seasons.

Elroy was married to the former Ruth Stahmer on June 27, 1946. The couple has two children — Win Stephen, 25, and Patricia Carolina, 17.

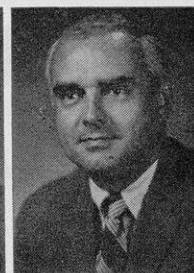

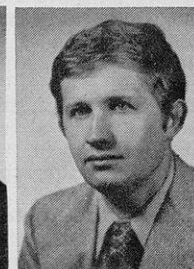

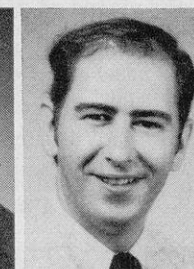

## Wisconsin Administrative Staff Members

### OTTO BREITENBACH Assistant Athletic Director

Otto Breitenbach joined the Wisconsin Athletic Department staff July 1, 1973 following an highly successful tenure as athletic director and football coach at Madison's LaFollette High School.

The new Badger assistant athletic director is a native Madisonian and graduated in 1941 from Edgewood High school, where he was a three-sport star.

He enrolled at Wisconsin in the autumn of 1941 and was a halfback on the school's 1942 football team which posted an overall 8-1-1 record while placing second in the Big Ten and third nationally that year.

The 51-year-old Breitenbach began his coaching career at Chilton

His 1969 LaFollette track team won the state Class A championship with 20 points.

He completed work on his master's degree in Physical Education at Wisconsin in 1955.

He is a past-president of the Wisconsin High School Coaches Association 1968-69, served as secretary-treasurer of the Wisconsin Athletic Director's Association in 1971 and is a past member of the Board of Directors of the National "W" Club.

Otto and his wife Pat are the parents of two married daughters — Sarah and Jane — and a son, Bill.

### KIT SAUNDERS Director, Women's Intercollegiate Athletics

Katherine 'Kit' Saunders serves as Wisconsin's first Director of Women's Intercollegiate Athletics. She was named to the job in May, 1974 by action of the Athletic Board effective July 1, 1974.

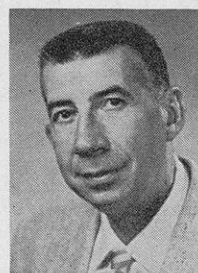
Ms. Saunders played field hockey and lacrosse while in college and played on club teams in both sports following graduation, gaining all-Sectional honors in field hockey.

Ms. Saunders is an active participant in skiing, golf, tennis, badminton, sailing and canoeing.

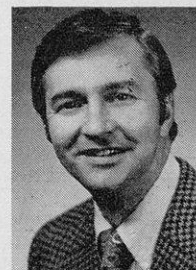
### HAROLD E. 'Bud' FOSTER Director, Grant-In-Aids

He served as president of the National Association of Basketball coaches and was a member of the Basketball Rules Committee from 1957 to 1966.

He's a Hall of Fame member as well — National Basketball, Wisconsin State, Madison Sports, and Helms Athletic Foundation.

### JIM MOTT Sports Information Director

Jim Mott was appointed Wisconsin's Sports Information Director in March, 1966, after serving as assistant to Art Lentz 1954-56 and George Lanphear 1956-66.

The 46-year-old journalist was born in Madison in 1929 and spent

## JOHN JARDINE GUIDES BADGERS' FOOTBALL PROGRAM

**John Jardine** provided Wisconsin's football faithful with their first winning season since 1963 last year as the Badgers turned in an overall 7-4 record — including a 21-20 win over Nebraska — and achieved their highest Big Ten finish since the 1962 championship campaign with a 5-3 mark — including four road victories — good for fourth place in the final standings.

**Jardine**, a 1958 Purdue graduate has built a solid foundation since coming to Wisconsin in December, 1969, and is now starting his sixth season as the school's 23rd head football coach.

His overall record for five seasons as Wisconsin head coach is 23-29-2 and in those four seasons, the Badgers' home attendance has totalled 1,989,894 or an average of 66,330 for 30 Camp Randall dates.

Wisconsin's average attendance of 71,630 for five home dates in 1974 ranked the Badgers fourth nationally to mark the fifth straight season that Wisconsin's attendance has been among the top eight nationally as fans have responded eagerly to the exciting style of Jardine-coached football.

Following the 1974 season, the Wisconsin Athletic Board, acting upon the recommendation of Athletic Director **Elroy Hirsch**, approved an extension of three years on **Jardine's** contract as head coach. The action extended his contract through December 31, 1979.

Athletic Board Chairman **Frederick W. Haberman** commented, "We have a high regard for Coach Jardine. His performance has been superlative during his time at Wisconsin. He has a reputation for being totally honest in his dealings with his students, his colleagues, and the public. He wants every student-athlete to reach his full potential athletically and scholastically."

**Haberman** added, "The action by the Athletic Board to extend his contract at this time is to provide Coach Jardine with at least some measure of security in a high risk profession."

"By this action we also want to indicate to his fine staff of assistant coaches that we have faith and confidence in their work."

**Jardine** came to Wisconsin from a highly successful assistantship at UCLA where he was offensive line coach under **Tommy Prothro** for five seasons, a period in which UCLA posted an overall record of 35-13-3.

The 40-year-old **Jardine** prepped at St. George High School in Evanston, Illinois, lettering in football, basketball and swimming in the rugged Chicago Catholic League. He was not eligible to play as a senior — due to a transfer rule — and was team manager as St. George won the 1953 Chicago city title.

He pursued his collegiate career at Purdue and was a tough, 186 pound guard for the Boilermakers in 1955,

1956, and 1957. He was captain of Purdue's 1954 freshman football team and a starter his junior and senior years.

**John** began his coaching career at Central Catholic High school in Lafayette, Indiana, in 1958 and then moved into the head coaching job at Fenwick High school in Oak Park, Illinois, where in five seasons his teams won 51 games, lost 6 and tied one. He guided Fenwick into Chicago Catholic League title games in 1959, 1960 and 1962, winning in 1959 and 1962. His 1959 team lost to Lane Tech in the Chicago city championship game, but his 1962 team compiled an unbeaten record and blanked Schurz High school 40-0 in winning the Chicago city title.

He was enshrined into the Chicago Catholic League's Hall of Fame in 1974 ceremonies for his coaching exploits in the league from 1959-63.

He left the prep ranks following the 1963 season to join Purdue's football staff under **Jack Mollenkopf** as offensive line coach, where his assign-

ment covered working with the guards and centers and he was also assigned to recruit the Chicago area.

After spending 1964 at Purdue, he joined **Tommy Prothro** at UCLA in 1965.

The native Chicagoan is the son of James Jardine, recently retired as Water Commissioner of the nation's second largest city.

His brother **Len**, a starting end, co-captain, and most valuable player on Purdue's 1959 football team, coached six years at Brown University before resigning at the end of 1972 season.

**John** is married to the former Janice Ensign of River Forest, Illinois, and they have four children: Dan 15, Jennifer 13, John 11, and Jill 9.

**Jardine** has been active in post season All-Star game coaching. He was head coach of the Blue team in the 1971 Blue-Gray Classic at Montgomery, Ala., and served as an assistant coach in the 1972 Hula Bowl (North) and 1973 East-West Shrine games.

## Michigan Home Opener

# WISCONSIN SEEKS 1975 BIG TEN HONORS

Wisconsin's 1974 football team achieved the school's best overall (7-4) and Big Ten (5-3) record since the 1962 Badgers won the conference title and played in the 1963 Rose Bowl game against USC.

A solid corps of talented runners headed by tailback **Billy Marek** and a veteran offensive line that features **Dennis Lick**, both All-Americans, form the nucleus of an offensive unit that placed second in the Big Ten last year in yards (398.4) and scoring (30.0) behind Ohio State.

**Billy Marek** paced the nation in scoring in 1974 with 19 TD's and finished third in rushing with 1,215 yards. In Big Ten play he won the scoring crown with 90 points and annexed the rushing title with an average of 159.3 yards per game.

**Marek**, who's been **Archie Griffin's** running mate on the all-Big Ten team in both 1973 and 1974, tallied thirteen

times in the final three games last year capped by a 304 yard, five touchdown spree against Minnesota.

**John Jardine** notes, "I don't see why **Marek** shouldn't have another outstanding year. He was as good a running back as there was in the country at the end of last season."

Fullbacks **Ken Starch** and **Larry Canada** rushed for 637 and 356 yards, respectively, last year, while **Mike Morgan** turned in a brilliant freshman campaign with 461 yards that included 135 yards on 23 carries against Indiana and 100 yards on 14 tries against Northwestern. He tallied eight touchdowns, including a seven yard run on his second collegiate carry in the season's opener at Purdue.

**Lick**, a three-year starter at right tackle, and **Terry Stieve** combine to give the Badgers one of the top tackle-guard combinations in college football this year. **Lick** is 6-4, 262, while **Stieve** is 6-2, 256, and both are outstanding blockers.

**Jardine** points out, "**Lick** should be in the running for whatever awards they give to linemen."

**John Reimer**, 6-3, 276, who started in place of **Lick** the final three games last year when **Dennis** was idled by knee surgery, moves in at left tackle

— where **Bob Johnson** has graduated — with **Joe Norwick** returning as the regular center.

Sophomore **Steve Lick** appears headed for stardom at left guard.

Gone from the 1974 Wisconsin offense are quarterback **Gregg Bohlig** and the top three receivers — split end **Art Sanger** (18 catches for 236 yards); flanker **Jeff Mack** (16 catches for 353 yards and two TD's); and tight end **Jack Novak** (16 catches for 331 yards and two TD's) along with left tackle **Bob Johnson**.

**Jardine** acknowledges, "We'll miss **Bohlig's** experience and leadership."

The leading candidates for the quarterback position in spring drills were senior **Dan Kopina** (5-10, 196); freshman **Anthony Dudley** (5-11, 176); and junior college transfer and 1974 redshirt **Mike Carroll** (6-1, 179).

**Kopina** was **Bohlig's** understudy in both 1973 and 1974 and **Jardine** notes, "**Dan** has the experience and is less apt to make mistakes."

**Dudley** enrolled at Wisconsin in January — being a mid-year high school graduate in Detroit, Michigan — and was able to take part in spring drills.

**Jardine** points out, "**Anthony** has the most ability of the three quarterbacks; just how soon he'll be ready, I don't know."

**Carroll**, who started his collegiate career at Minnesota, had an outstanding junior college career at Lakewood JC in White Bear Lake, MN., and his strong point is passing.

All three back-up receivers from 1974 — **Randy Rose** at split-end (5 receptions for 88 yards and one TD); **Ron Pollard** at flanker (6 receptions for 70 yards and one TD); and **Ron Egloff** at tight end (one catch for nine yards and one TD) — return and figure to have good seasons.

Graduation took five starters from the defense as well — defensive ends **Mike Vesperman** and **Randy Frokjer** (who stepped in when **Mark Zakula's** career ended with injury at Indiana); middle guard **Mike Jenkins**; linebacker **Rick Jakious**; and defensive back **Alvin Peabody**.

**Jakious** (104), **Jenkins** (95) and **Frokjer** (94) were the leading Wisconsin tacklers on defense last year.

The Badger defense matured as the 1974 season unfolded and in the final three games limited Iowa (267), Northwestern (248), and Minnesota (270) to 785 yards rushing and passing on a total of 166 plays.

Letterman **Pat Collins** and junior college transfer **Craig Phalen** appear set at the ends. **Collins** was named the Badgers' "most improved defensive player" at the end of spring drills.

Good depth is available at tackle with **Andy Michuda** — who moved into a starting role when freshman **Bob Czechowicz** was idled by knee surgery following the Michigan game — and **John Rasmussen** along with **Bill Brandt**, **Dave Anderson** and **Czechowicz** all vying for starting roles.

Sophomore **Mike Grice** has good

quickness and impressed many with his play at middle guard.

**Jim Franz** and **John Zimmerman** are holdover linebackers and **Scott Sklare**, a transfer from Illinois State University, showed Big Ten caliber play in spring drills.

The defensive secondary appears set with **Steve Wagner**, **Terry Buss**, **Greg Lewis** and **Ken Simmons** all two-year "W" award winners. **Buss** (79) and **Wagner** (60) are sure tacklers and **Wagner** set an all-time school record with eleven passes broken up in 1974.

The kicking game appears solid with **Ken Simmons** — the Big Ten's top punter in 1973 — available for punting chores and **Vince Lamia** and **Vladimir LaBun** set to handle the field goal, extra point, and kick-off tasks.

**Lamia** set a school record of 49 kicking points in 1974 and is well on his way to establishing an all-time career kick-scoring mark. He's got 75 points in two years of play and with two seasons to go should erase **Roger Jaeger's** mark of 106 points in three years 1969-71.

### GARY BLACKNEY Assistant Coach — 1st Season

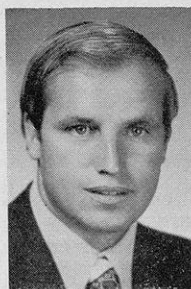

Bob Lee joined the Wisconsin staff just prior to last season from the University of Kansas where he had been an assistant since 1971. He handles the coaching of the pass receivers for the Badgers.

The 37-year-old native of Florida was a defensive end and linebacker for Florida A&M for four years under the legendary **Jake Gaither**. He was a member of the 1959 A&M team which played in the Orange Blossom Classic.

Lee received a Bachelor of Science degree from Florida A&M in 1959, a Master of Education degree from Boston University in 1961 and a Doctor of Education degree from the University of Kansas in 1973.

Switching to the University of Kansas in 1971, Bob's duties included coordinating the defense of the freshman team; coaching the Varsity defensive line and the scout squad; and later, coaching the pass receivers.

### JOHN SMITH Graduate Assistant

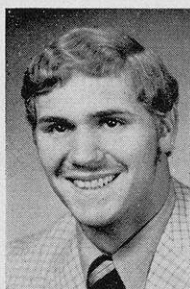
John is a native of Sycamore, Illinois, and is starting his second year as a graduate assistant.

Assistant Coach — 6th Season

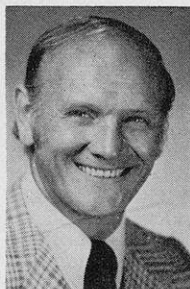
