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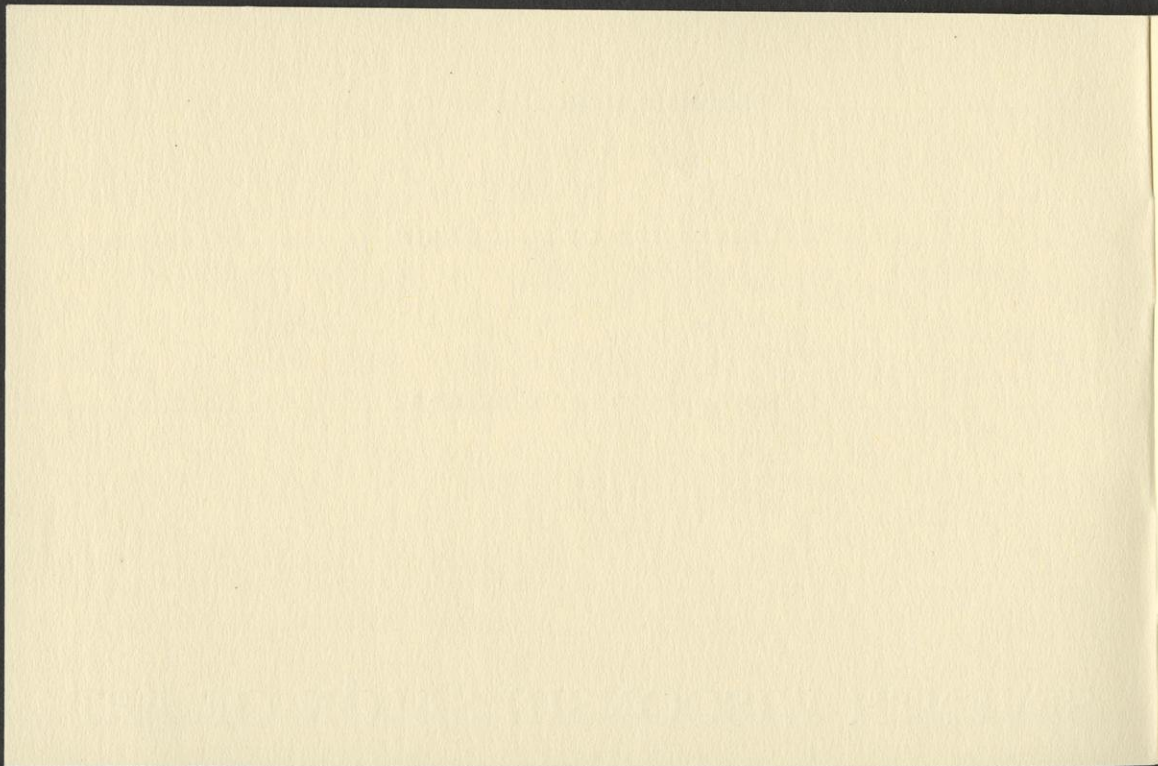

THE WISCONSIN SALON OF ART

The Wisconsin Salon of Art has as its prime objective what national art groups have undertaken broadly for the encouragement of American arts and artists — the cultivation of art in the state and of public appreciation for our artists by enlarging the opportunities for seeing and purchasing their works. Established in 1934 as a medium through which Wisconsin artists might exhibit in the fall season, thus complementing the spring exhibition sponsored by the Wisconsin Painters and Sculptors and the Milwaukee Art Institute, the Salon furnishes another mutually strengthening bond between the University and the art life of the state.

The artists, by exhibiting in the Salon, afford to students and visitors the opportunity to observe and study the contribution the visual arts are making to the culture of our time. A significant part of the whole enterprise is the method of conducting the Salon, which

is perhaps unaparalleled anywhere in the field of large competitive art exhibitions. From beginning to end the arrangements are conceived and executed by university students, working voluntarily as a committee of The Wisconsin Union and aided by the Union staff. In this way, the Salon, in company with the multiform music, literary, discussion, dramatic, radio, crafts, and social undertakings of other student groups in the Union, is helping to provide a future leadership for the cultural life of the state.

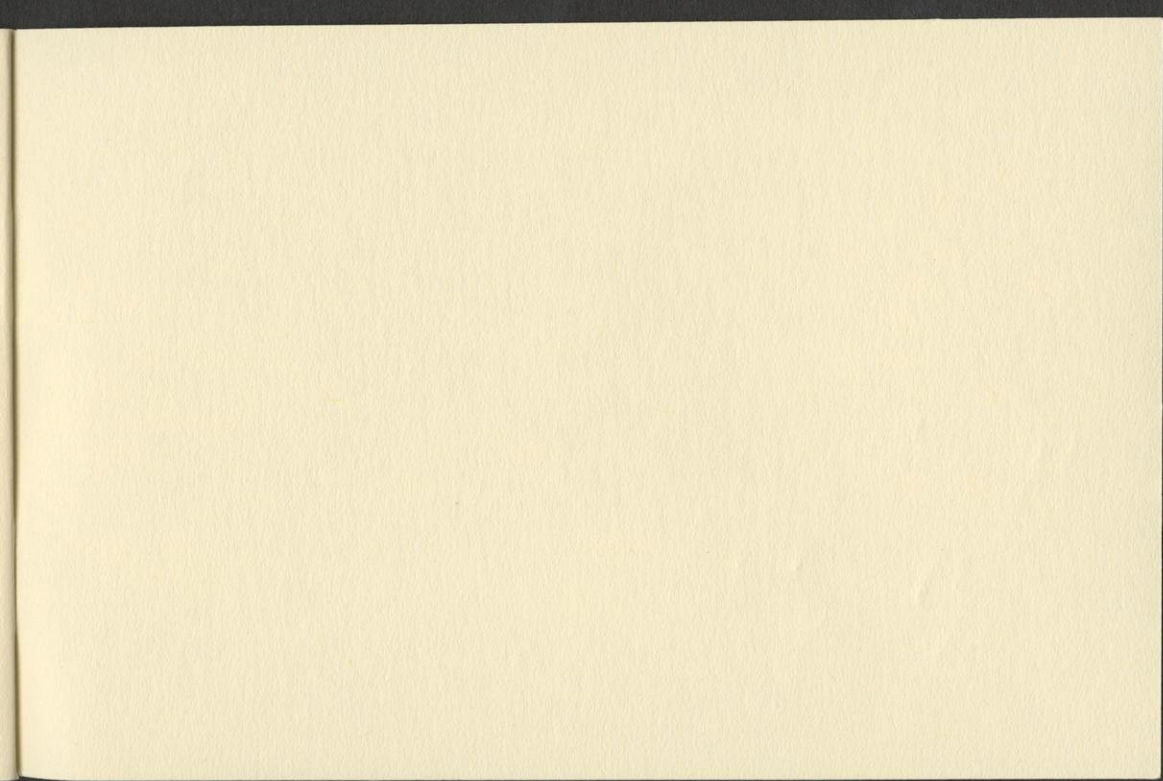
