

FOR A PATRIOTIC PURPOSE, A NEW MELODY WAS CREATED AND PUBLISHED, IN ORDER TO DISCARD OR ELIMINATE, THE MUCH GERMAN TUNE WHICH WAS PLAYED AND SUNG AND ADOPTED BY THE GERMAN GOVERNMENT AND ITS PEOPLE, FOR THE PAST 200 YEARS, FOR A NATIONAL HYMN TO THE VERSE "HAIL THEE WITH VICTOR'S WREATH" AND ALSO TO A PARODY WITH RIDICULOUS WORDS "BRAUNSCHWEIGEN LEBERWURST MAGHT VIEL BIER-DURST". WHY, WE AMERICANS SING THIS GERMAN TUNE TO ONE OF OUR BEST NATIONAL HYMNS "AMERICA", IS ANSWERED BY THE POVERTY OF AMERICAN MUSICAL COMPOSITIONS AND THROUGH INDIFFERENCE OF OUR PEOPLE. THE COMPOSER OF THIS NEW AMERICAN MELODY HAS FOR MANY YEARS DEPLORED THE USE OF THE OLD GERMAN TUNE FOR ONE OF OUR GRANDEST HYMNS. THE SINGING OF SAME DOES NOT HARMONIZE NOR BLEND WITH THE BEAUTIFUL SENTIMENTS EXPRESSED BY SAMUEL FRANCIS SMITH IN HIS EULOGY "MY COUNTRY 'TIS OF THEE" AND HE CONSIDERS IT DECIDEDLY UNPatriotic IN OUR TIME, TO STILL MAKE USE OF THE MUCH RIDICULED GERMAN TUNE, SUNG AT ALL OUR PATRIOTIC AND RELIGIOUS GATHERINGS!. IF MUSICAL HARMONY IN CONJUNCTION WITH PATRIOTIC UTTERANCES, SHOULD PRODUCE AND EXPRESS GENUINE SENTIMENTS OF AFFECTION, DEVOTION AND LOYALTY - BOTH, VERSE AND MUSIC, MUST SPRING FROM THE SAME SOURCE. FROM THOUGHTS AND INSPIRATIONS OF PURE AMERICAN ORIGIN. THIS NEW MUSIC FOR "AMERICA" WAS DEDICATED TO HIS COMRADES OF THE GRAND ARMY OF THE REPUBLIC AND CHRISTENED TO BE KNOWN AS THE "G. A. R. MELODY". THE COMPOSER IS CONVINCED, WHENEVER HIS NEW MELODY IS PLAYED OR SUNG, THAT ITS HARMONIOUS TIMBRE, WILL FAR MORE AND BETTER EXPRESS, THE SENTIMENTS WHICH THE WORDS OF "AMERICA" INSPIRE AND HE HOPES THAT FOR ALL TIME, THIS NEW TUNE "MADE IN AMERICA" MAY HELP TO SATISFY AND STRENGTHEN THE PATRIOTIC MUSICAL ARM OF THIS, OUR GLORIOUS COUNTRY!
