## MEDIA INFORMATION

## Arriving at the Dane County Coliseum

The University of Wisconsin's working facilities for newspaper and radio are located in the upper level on the east side of the Coliseum. Media covering the Badgers should enter the Coliseum at the Press/Players' Entrance located at ground level on the north side of the building.

#### **Media Credentials**

All requests for working media credentials for Wisconsin home games must be made in advance through the Sports Information Office, 1440 Monroe Street, Madison, WI 53711. PHONE: (608) 262-1811. Requests should be made on your company's official letterhead at least one week in advance of the game(s) you wish to cover. Upon acceptance of applications, appropriate tickets are either mailed or held for pickup at the Press/Players' Entrance to the Coliseum.

#### **Media Parking**

There is no reserved parking for visiting media at the Dane County Memorial Coliseum. Visiting media should plan to arrive at the Coliseum at least one hour prior to game time to avoid parking problems.

#### **Photographers**

Photo passes are limited because of space restrictions at the Coliseum. Requests should be submitted on your company's letterhead to the UW Sports Information Office and will be granted on a priority first-come, first-served basis. Photographers are asked to consider the fans when shooting in the Coliseum.

## Radio and Television

Visiting radio and television stations will be admitted for broadcast upon recommendation of the visiting school and its sports information director. Requests must be received at least one week prior to the game(s) you wish to broadcast. Broadcast locations are assigned by the UW Sports Information Department based on involvement with the co-op line arrangement. Tickets will be held at the UW Sports Information Ofice through noon on Friday and then will be placed at the Press/Players' Entrance to the Coliseum.

## **Interviewing Coach Sauer**

UW Head Coach Jeff Sauer will meet with the media following each game after a short post-game session with the team. The post-game interviews will be conducted in the media interview room adjacent to the Wisconsin dressing room. The best time to interview Sauer during the week is between 10:00 a.m. and noon at the UW Hockey Office or before (approx. 2:45-3:00) or after (6:00-6:30) practices.

#### Interviewing Wisconsin Players

#### During the week

Media wishing to interview players during the week must set up all interviews with the Sports Information Office. Practices are generally held at the Coliseum from 3:00-6:00. Occasionally, practice will be at the Camp Randall Memorial Sports Center (the Shell) on campus. Practice times at the Shell run from 3:00-6:00. For exact practice times and locations, contact the SID Office. Players will be available up to 15 minutes before practice and at the conclusion of practice, depending on class schedules.

#### Post-Game

Player interviews may be conducted outside the Wisconsin dressing room following each game. Wisconsin has a closed locker rom policy. No media will be permitted inside the Wisconsin locker room.

#### **FAX-ON-DEMAND**

The Big Ten has implemented a new system this year called Info Connection. Info Connection is an automated, 24 hour a day, 7 day a week service that instantly sends the latest information, in this case on Badger hockey, to your fax machine. You must dial from the handset on your fax machine. This replaces all mailing lists. You will no longer receive a weekly release from this office (except for media guides).





epth. That seems to be the key word when describing the 1993-94 Wisconsin hockey team.

"Our greatest strength this year is our depth, said Coach Jeff Sauer. "How that depth takes over when it is needed is going to be the important factor."

The Badgers return 23 lettermen — including 9 seniors — off last season's 24-15-3 team, which earned the school's sixth straight NCAA bid and finished second in the WCHA.

Talent and experience, at all three positions, are abundant on this team.

Offensively, seven of the top 10 scorers from last season (75 percent of the goals and points) are back.

Defensively, Wisconsin returns the bulk of a team defense which yielded a league-low 107 goals last year (3.34 avg.).

In goal, the WCHA's 1992-93 Rookie of the Year, Jim Carey, solidifies the Badger defense.

#### At Forward

Lettermen returning: 15 Lettermen lost: 2

At forward, seniors Andrew Shier —
the leading scorer from a year ago —
and Jason Zent — the top-returning
goal-scorer — are back to lead an
experienced group up front. Senior
center Blaine Moore and assistant
captain Rob Granato plus juniors
Kelly Fairchild and Jamie Spencer
round out the list of the top scoring
forwards that return.

Both Shier and Fairchild received all-WCHA honorable mention status in 1992-93.

In addition, sophomores **Scott Sanderson** and **Max Williams** look for additional ice time to step up their games and contributions.

Coming off a season-ending injury, **Mike Strobel** missed the majority of 1992-93 with an injury sustained against Minnesota a month into the season. He returns to challenge for a regular spot in the lineup.

The rookie class includes highlytouted **Dan Tompkins** (Minnetonka, Minn.) from the Omaha Lancers of the USHL and **Fran Bussey** (Duluth, Minn.)

Tompkins was a third round draft choice of the Calgary Flames this summer. The Badgers' top-rated rookie has been ranked by many as the top prep player coming out of Minnesota.

"It is our job to make Dan a good college hockey player, said Sauer. "He's got the size, strength and skating ability to be a very effective player."

The biggest loss up front was the early departure of **Dan Plante**, the designated captain of this year's team. He elected to bypass his senior season and signed with the New York Islanders of the NHL. Plante was the team's

second leading scorer and tied Zent for the team lead in goals scored last year.

Zent, who was invited to the 1994 Olympic Trials camp, did not make the cut. He returns for his senior season.

#### On Defense

The defensive corps returns seven of eight lettermen. With just two seniors — Ulvis Katlaps and Jeff Sanderson — the blueline is young but boasts a lot of experience.

"We have a lot of experience returning," said Sauer. "Our young players were able to get a lot of playing time in all situations last season. That only helps us as a team when our younger guys have that type of experience under their belts."

Katlaps, the top returning defensive scorer, plays out his second and final year of eligibility. The Latvia native was the league's top scoring rookie defensemen in 1992-93 and an all-WCHA honorable mention selection.

The junior class is the nucleus of the defensive unit and anchors the blueline.

They include assistant captain Mark Strobel, Chris Tok (voted the team's most improved player last season), Brian Rafalski and Maco Balkovec.

Rafalski and Strobel were members of last year's U.S. Junior National Team. Rafalski was voted one of the team's top three stars after the World Junior Championships in Gavle, Sweden.

Balkovec returns after missing the second half of '92-93 with a knee injury. He was injured at the Bank One Badger Hockey Showdown and saw action in just 16 games. How he makes the adjustment back to game competition could prove to be a key as the season progresses.

The only sophomore on defense, **Mickey Elick**, improved with every game last season and should become a steady force on the blueline.

Newcomers include **Matt Peterson** (Maple Grove, Minn.) and **Tim Krug** (Bloomington, Minn.), who was redshirted last season.

Missing this season will be the leadership and scoring punch of all-American **Barry Richter**. He is currently on Team USA's pre-Olympic team tour.

#### In Goal

Wisconsin returns the league's top goaltender and one of the premier netminders in the country. Sophomore **Jim Carey** recorded the best goalsagainst average (3.07) and save percentage (.901) in the WCHA as a rookie. He had a record of 15-8-1 (.646) overall.

"Certainly, Jim proved last year that he can play in this league," said Sauer.

Carey recorded victories against every WCHA team but one in his first collegiate season. Michigan Tech was the exception.

With an 11-0 decision over Northern Michigan on Nov. 1, 1992, Carey became the first true freshman in UW

history to record a shutout in his first start in a Badger uniform.

On an international level, he gained experience with the U.S. World Junior Team at the World Junior Championships. He recorded victories for the U.S. against Finland and the former Soviet Union.

Challenging for playing time will be **Kirk Daubenspeck** (Madison, Wis.). Last season he played for the Wisconsin Capitols of the USHL.

#### The Schedule

The 1993-94 schedule is a challenging one. The regular season features 32 games against WCHA opponents and a four-game non-conference slate.

With the addition of Alaska-Anchorage to the WCHA this season, each league member will play only two games (instead of four) against two designated conference opponents. The UW does not travel to St. Cloud State nor host Denver in 1993-94.

"Although the schedule is tough because of who we start with and where we have to go early," said Sauer. "I think it is broken into pretty good segments for us."

Wisconsin starts the season on the road for two weeks at Denver and Minnesota-Duluth. The home opener is Nov. 5-6 against North Dakota.

New to the schedule this season is the addition of a four-game Thanksgiving showcase.

WCHA members Wisconsin and Minnesota will face CCHA representatives Michigan and Michigan on Nov. 26-27. The site will rotate every year among the four schools. This year, the College Hockey Showcase takes place at The Palace in Auburn Hills, Mich.

During the Christmas holiday, the

fifth annual Bank One Badger Hockey Showdown takes place on Dec. 28-29. Making their first appearances in the holiday classic are Northern Michigan, Providence and Alaska-Fairbanks.

The WCHA Playoff Championships are set for March 17-19 in Milwaukee at the Bradley Center.

The 1994 NCAA Championships will be held at the St. Paul Civic Center.

#### The WCHA

Wisconsin, Denver, Michigan Tech and Minnesota look to be strong in 1993-94 and should all compete for the top spot in the WCHA. Ironically, all four teams have experienced unexpected losses, which may prove to have an effect on the race.

The pre-Olympic roster includes Minnesota's Darby Hendrickson and Craig Johnson, as well as Jim Storm of Michigan Tech. Johnson and Storm were leading scorers for Minnesota and Michigan Tech, respectively, a year ago. They will miss at least the first half of the season.

Denver's Brent Cary suffered a shoulder injury which will sideline him for up to three months.

As already mentioned, Wisconsin was hit by the early departure of Dan Plante signing with the New York Islanders.

For the Badgers, teamwork will decide the fate of the 1993-94 team.

## JEFF SAUER



In 11 seasons at Wisconsin, Sauer's teams have averaged 27 victories a year and posted 20 or more wins every season. Compiling an impressive 297-159-22 record (.644) at UW, his teams have earned NCAA tournament bids the last six years.

One of the most respected and influential coaches in the collegiate game today, Jeff Sauer begins his 12th season at Wisconsin and his 23rd as a college coach.

Sauer's career coaching mark is 463-385-33, ranking him as the seventh winningest coach in the history of the college game. He is one of only three active coaches to win that many games. Only Ron Mason of Michigan State (675) and Bob Peters of Bemidji State (603) have won more games.

#### At Wisconsin

In 11 seasons at Wisconsin, Sauer's teams have averaged 27 victories per year and posted 20 or more wins every season. Compiling an impressive 297-159-22 record (.644), his Badger teams have earned NCAA tournament bids the last six years.

Last season, Wisconsin enjoyed another successful season under the direction of Sauer. With an overall

record of 24-15-3, the Badgers achieved their 11th straight 20-win season and advanced to the NCAA touranment for the seventh time under Sauer. In the WCHA, Wisconsin finished second.

During the 1991-92 season, Sauer's Badgers surprised the college hockey world, finishing as the NCAA runnersup. Receiving the sixth seed in the West, Wisconsin was an underdog to advance to the Final Four. The UW proceeded to upset the No. 3 seed New Hampshire (4-2) and No. 2 seed St. Lawrence (5-2) to qualify for the NCAA Championships.

In the NCAA semifinals, Wisconsin knocked

off Michigan (3-2) before losing to Lake Superior State (5-3). It marked the second time in three seasons Wisconsin played for the NCAA title.

In one of Wisconsin's finest seasons (1989-90), Sauer's team posted a 36-9-1 record, en route to the school's fifth NCAA Championship and the second in his tenure. The Badgers won both the WCHA regular season and playoff championships. The WCHA regular-season title was only the second in UW history.

The Badgers' 36 victories in '89-90 marked the third time under Sauer that a Wisconsin team won 30 or more games. No other Wisconsin coach can boast of such a distinction.

In his first year at Wisconsin in '82-83, Sauer accomplished what no other first-year college hockey coach had ever done. His Badgers captured the 1983 NCAA Championship, earned the No. 1 ranking in the final poll, and posted one of the best marks in school history at 33-10-4. Four members of that team—Pat Flatley, Chris Chelios, Bruce Driver and Marc Behrend—also played in the 1984 Winter Olympic Games in Sarajevo, Yugoslavia before moving on to careers in the NHL.

#### **International Experience**

In addition to being one of the game's top coaches, Sauer has been one of its foremost ambassadors of the game. He is a regular consultant to USA Hockey.

In the spring of 1985, he served as an assistant coach to Dave Peterson for the USA Hockey Team that participated in the annual IIHF (International Ice Hockey Federation) World Championships in Prague, Czechoslovakia.

In 1987 he was one of four head coaches at the Olympic Festival. He has also served on the U.S. Olympic Hockey Committee (1984) and been a member of the Rules Committee.

Not only has Sauer been a noticeable presence off the ice, but he has earned a wealth of international experience on the bench as well.

Consider that he was a finalist for both the 1992 and 1994 U. S. Olympic coaching jobs.

During April of 1992, Sauer was an assistant coach for the U.S. at the World Tournament team in Prague, Czechoslovakia.

He was head coach of Team USA in the 1990 Goodwill Games. Prior to the games, Team USA beat the Soviet Union's National Team in an exhibition contest at the Oakland Coliseum. It was the first time since 1980 that a U.S. squad had beaten a team from Russia. Under Sauer's guidance, Team USA advanced to the

gold medal game against the Soviet Union, but lost a 4-3 decision decided by a shootout at the end of sudden death.

Sauer also coached the USA Select Team (composed primarily of top collegiate players) at the 1989 Pravda Cup in Leningrad.

#### The Players

Many of Sauer's players have moved on to prestigious careers in the NHL. The list is quite extensive and includes Chris Chelios, Pat Flatley, Tony Granato, Curtis Joseph, Scott Mellanby, Paul Ranheim, Mike Richter, Gary Shuchuk and Gary Suter.

He has coached 12 all-Americans and eight Olympians. Those lists includes:

#### **During the Summer**

In the off-season, Sauer works various hockey camps throughout the country. Wisconsin hockey schools are located in Madison and Milwaukee, Naperville (Ill.), and St. Louis. He also assists at Bob Johnson's school in Aspen (Colo.). In Chicago, Sauer is a counselor at Stan Mikita's hockey camp for the hearing-impaired.

#### As an Assistant

Sauer began his coaching career as an assistant to Bob Johnson at Colorado College in '66. In addition to coaching hockey at CC, he was an assistant baseball coach for one year.

In 1968, he became Johnson's first full-time assistant at Wisconsin. He served in that capacity until 1971, when he accepted the head coaching job at his alma mater, Colorado College.

At Colorado College, where he served as head coach from 1971-82, Jeff won more than 166 games and was twice named WCHA Coach of the Year. His first award came following his rookie season, and the second was

following the 1974-75 campaign when Colorado College posted a 23-16-0 record and finished third in the WCHA. Sauer also guided his '80-81 Tigers to third place in the WCHA.

#### Personal

A 1965 graduate of Colorado College, Sauer earned a Bachelor's degree in sociology. During his undergraduate years, he competed in both varsity hockey and baseball for the Tigers.


His father, Ted, coached high school hockey at St. Paul (Minn.) Central and last year was inducted into the UW-Platteville Hall of Fame.

Jeff and his wife, Jamie, have a son Chip, 18, who attends Wisconsin, and a daughter Beth, 13.


Mike Kemp 13th Year Gustavus Adolphus, 1975

From 1983-85, Mike served as administrative assistant coach to Jeff Sauer as well as executive director of the Blue Line Club.



Sports Administrator Joel Maturi


Joel Maturi has been a member of the UW Department of Athletics since 1986. He currently is one of two sports administrators for the school.

After receiving her bachelor's




He received his B.S. in physical education with a coaching emphasis at UW-La Crosse and his M.S. in educational administration from Madison.


Tim and his wife Margaret reside in Watertown.

# **1992-93 Highlights**

The Wisconsin hockey team finished the 1992-93 season with a 24-15-3 record and a second-place finish in the WCHA. It marked the 13th straight 20-win season for the Cardinal and White and the sixth consecutive appearance in the NCAA tournament. Head Coach Jeff Sauer extended his string of 20-win seasons to 11.

# BADGER MOMENTS

# The Sixties

### March, 1962

Athletic Director Ivan Williamson announces the return of hockey as an intercollegiate sport after a 28-year absence.

### **December 6, 1963**

A rebound goal by Chan Young into sudden death gives Wisconsin its first modern collegiate victory, a 3-2 decision over Macalaster.

### December 11, 1964

To upgrade the program, the Badgers schedule eight games against WCHA teams. Unfortunately, the Badgers lose all eight.

### February 22, 1966

After 13 straight losses to WCHA teams, the Badgers post a 5-4 overtime victory over Minnesota. Jim Petruzates scores on a breakaway two minutes into overtime.

# April 1, 1966

Following John Riley's retirement, Bob Johnson is named head coach

### March, 1968

Bert DeHate, a sophomore center, wins the national scoring title with 77 points (47 goals and 30 assists). DeHate has seven hat tricks, a Badger record.

### March 30, 1969

The Badgers join the WCHA.



# The Seventies

## March, 1970

Wisconsin places fourth in the WCHA and qualifies for the NCAA Championships, where they finish third. Defenseman John Jagger becomes the first Badger to earn all-America honors.

### March, 1972

The Badgers make their second appearance at the NCAA Championships in three seasons, finishing third.

## March 16, 1973

Wisconsin stuns Cornell, 6-5 in overtime, to advance to the finals of the NCAA Championships. A goal with five seconds left in regulation by Dean Talafous ties the game. Talafous then tallies the winner with 33 seconds left in overtime.

### March 17, 1973

With a 4-2 victory over WCHA rival Denver, Wisconsin wins the NCAA Championship for the first time.

# February 19, 1977

Wisconsin captures the MacNaughton Cup. With a 6-4 win over Minnesota-Duluth, the Badgers clinch their first WCHA regularseason championship.

## March 25, 1977

After missing the NCAA playoffs for three years, the Badgers make it to the final four. Les Grauer scores the tying goal and Mike Eaves gets the game-winner in a 4-3 overtime win over New Hampshire in the NCAA semi-finals.

### March 26, 1977

Steve Alley culminates the Badgers' finest season with a goal 0:23 into overtime to give Wisconsin a 6-5 win over Michigan for the school's second NCAA Championship. Wisconsin becomes the first team to capture the Big Ten, WCHA and NCAA titles in one season. Bob Johnson is named national coach of the year, while his son Mark is named freshman of the year.

# March 25, 1978

Wisconsin fans take Providence, R.I., by storm for the 1978 NCAA Championship, and are proclaimed the "World's Greatest Hockey Fans" by the city. Mike Eaves concludes his UW career as the school's all-time scoring leader. The Badgers finish fourth in the national tournament.

## March, 1979

The Badgers play before 21 sellout crowds. The average crowd of 8,654 at the Dane County Memorial Coliseum is eight short of a sellout. Mark Johnson closes out his Badger career as the top goal scorer (125) in Wisconsin history.

# BADGER MOMENTS

# The Eighties

### March 28, 1981

The Badgers win the NCAA crown for the third time with a 6-3 decision over Minnesota. The Badgers defeat the No. 1 teams in the ECAC (Clarkson), the CCHA (Northern Michigan) and the WCHA (Minnesota).

### March 27, 1982

Wisconsin makes its seventh NCAA Championship appearance and finishes second to North Dakota.

### June 1, 1982

Coach Bob Johnson resigns after 15 years at Wisconsin. He guided the Badgers to three NCAA titles, seven national tournament appearances, a record of 367-175-23, and the best attendance of any program in the country.

## July 8, 1982

Jeff Sauer, previously head coach at Colorado College and former assistant to Johnson at the UW, is named the school's fourth coach.

### March 5, 1983

Chris Chelios and Paul Houck score the tying and winning goals as the Badgers beat North Dakota, 6-5, in triple overtime to advance to the WCHA Playoff Championship.

# March 24-26, 1983

After sweeping Minnesota in Williams Arena to gain the WCHA Playoff Championship, Sauer's Badgers advance past St. Lawrence in the NCAA Quarterfinals. The Badgers claimed their fourth national championship beating Providence (2-0) and Harvard (6-2).

### January 1, 1984

Wisconsin becomes the only American college team to defeat the 1984 U. S. Olympic team (4-2) on its preparation tour.

# November 23, 1985

Wisconsin records its 500th victory since reviving hockey in 1963 with a 6-2 victory over WCHA rival North Dakota in the Coliseum.

## December 30, 1987

Wisconsin beats CCHA members Michigan and Michigan State to win the 23rd annual Great Lakes Invitational Tournament before 19,482 at the Joe Louis Arena in Detroit.

### March 6-7, 1988

Wisconsin defeats North Dakota (2-1) and Minnesota (3-2) to claim the first WCHA playoff championship.

## December 28-29, 1989

Wisconsin hosts the inaugural Bank One Badger Hockey Showdown in Milwaukee. The Badgers defeat Notre Dame (9-3) and Boston College (6-5) to capture the Pettit Cup. More than 30,000 fans attend.

# The Nineties

# February 16, 1990

Wisconsin plays its 1,000th game, a 6-3 victory at Minnesota.

### February 24, 1990

Wisconsin defeats North Dakota (5-4 in overtime) on Chris Tancill's goal to clinch the school's second MacNaughton Cup before a sellout crowd at the Coliseum.

### March 12, 1990

Wisconsin defeats Minnesota, 7-1, to claim the 1990 WCHA playoff championship. It is the UW's ninth WCHA playoff title and second in three years under Sauer.

### March 24, 1990

Wisconsin completes an NCAA quarterfinal sweep of Maine with a 4-3 overtime win on Tom Sagissor's goal. The win sends the Badgers to Detroit with a berth in the 1990 NCAA Championships.

## March 30, 1990

The Badgers down Boston College (2-1) in an NCAA semi-final game in Detroit as Chris Tancill scores both goals. More than 8,000 Badger fans made the trip to Detroit.

## April 1, 1990

Sauer's Badgers whip Colgate (7-3) to claim the school's fifth NCAA hockey championship before 15,034 fans at the Joe Louis Arena in Detroit. John Byce records a hat trick to pace the UW.

## April 2, 1990

More than 5,000 enthusiastic Wisconsin fans turn out at the UW Field House for a pep rally to honor the NCAA champions.

## December 28, 1990

Sauer records his 400th career victory over St. Lawrence in the Bank One Badger Hockey Showdown.

# December 29, 1990

The Badgers claim their second Bank One Badger Hockey Showdown title, defeating North Dakota (3-2) in the championship game. The contest drew 17,671 fans, setting a WCHA record forattendance. Over 32,000 fans attend the two-day event.

# December 28-29, 1991

Wisconsin wins its third straight Bank One Badger Showdown title. The Badgers defeat No. 1-ranked Maine (3-2) for the championship. The two-day tourney draws 34,578 fans.

### April 2-4, 1992

Wisconsin defeats Michigan, 4-2, to move into the NCAA championship game against Lake Superior State. The Badgers lose the title contest, 5-3, but become the lowest seeded team to advance to the championship game. It is Wisconsin's second Final Four appear ance in three years.



# "Badger Hockey Party Relocates in Detroit" 1977 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

Detroit, Mich. (Olympia Stadium) March 26, 1977

Milwaukee Journal, March 27, 1977

(Editor's note: Parts of this game story were taken from the March 27, 1977 Wisconsin State Journal article written by Jay Poster)

Steve Alley slammed in a rebound off Tom Ulseth's shot 23 seconds into the overtime to give the weary Badgers a 6-5 victory over Michigan and the 1977 NCAA Hockey Championship.

If Wisconsin was off balance in Friday's overtime victory over New Hampshire, the Badgers came out clicking against the Wolverines. They passed crisply and confidently and played strong defense, with the forwards back checking consistently. Julian Baretta played confidently and positively in the net.

Alley scored on a power play 2:29 into the game when he fought off a man in the slot and deflected a Craig Norwich slapshot from the center blueline past goalie Rick Palmer. Dave Herbst scored on a breakout off a beautiful pass from Craig Norwich at 9:27. The two Badgers steamed down the slot, Norwich on the left side and Herbst slightly ahead of him on the

right. Norwich slid a pass through traffic to Herbst at the goal mouth and Herbst flicked the pass in.

Mark Johnson scored on a rebound off an Alley shot on a power play at 15:12. Norwich, at the blueline, passed to Eaves in the left circle and Eaves got it to Alley, who got off a shot in the slot. The rebound hopped out to Palmer's left and lay there until Johnson could roar in from the right circle to flip it over Palmer.

In the second period, Mike Meeker carried the puck down the right wing boards, stopped and deked around a defender at the top of the circle then skated a stride and floated a backhander which hit the bottom of Palmer's glove and skittered down into the net.

Baretta, a sophomore, was named the Most Valuable Player in the Tournament. Baretta, along with defensemen Norwich and John Taft were members of the all-tournament team. Wisconsin became the first team to win the Big Ten, WCHA and NCAA titles in the same season.

# "Back Door Badgers Exit Out Front" 1981 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Wisconsin hockey team took full advantage of its at-large berth and captured the NCAA title for the third time under Head Coach Bob Johnson.

The Badgers downed CCHA champion Northern Michigan in the semi-final game (5-1) and then took on the top-ranked team in the country and WCHA title winner Minnesota. Wisconsin beat Minnesota by a 6-3 count behind the steady goaltending of sophomore Marc Behrend and a total team effort that the Gophers could not match. Behrend, who was also in the nets against Northern Michigan, was selected tournament Most Valuable Player and along with freshman center John Newberry made the all-tournament team.

Behrend had 55 saves in the tournament, 25 against NMU and 30 against the Gophers. Newberry led the Badgers in scoring with two goals and four assists and tied Aaron Broten of Minnesota for the scoring leadership in the Final Four.

Wisconsin playing on an emotional

high, never let the Gophers get into their style of play and first period goals by senior Dan Gorowsky, Newberry and Lebler gave the Badgers confidence.

Wisconsin jumped out to a 4-0 lead midway through the second period on a goal by freshman Ted Pearson. Minnesota cut the advantage to 4-1, but Newberry gave the Badgers its fourgoal lead back with a power-play goal at 16:09. Minnesota pulled its goaltender with 1:25 remaining in the game and Lebler hit the open net from just outside his own blueline to ice the victory.

On its way to the 1981 NCAA crown, Wisconsin defeated the conference champs of all three Division I leagues. In the NCAA quarterfinals, Wisconsin beat Clarkson 9-8, in a total goals series. Clarkson was the ECAC title holder. Northern Michigan had captured the CCHA title and Minnesota finished first in the WCHA.

The Badgers finished their season with an overall record of 27-14-1, second in the WCHA and winners of the 34th NCAA Championship.

### "Badgers Put Title On Ice" 1983 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

In what was to be a transition year, first-year Coach Jeff Sauer guided the Badger hockey team to its fourth NCAA Championship, and second in the last three years. Sauer molded the squad slowly but suffered only one loss in the last 15 games. By downing the powers of the East, Wisconsin proved to the hockey world that without a doubt they were No. 1.

Wisconsin met Providence in the semi-finals of the NCAA meet, and with Marc Behrend in the nets, shut out the Friars 2-0.

There was no scoring in the opening period, but a carry over power-play helped Wisconsin get the winning goal 0:37 into the second period. Bruce Driver and John Johannson combined passes to set-up Paul Houck for his seventh power-play goal of the year and his 14th winning goal.

Behrend was tested only 17 times while recording his first shutout, and Wisconsin's second in NCAA tournament history. Jim Johannson tallied an open net goal with 0:47 remaining for the final tally.

Wisconsin faced Harvard in the

Championship game. The Badgers jumped out to a 3-0 lead with a goal in each of the first two periods and another goal early in the final stanza.

Pat Flatley, who along with Paul Houck were named to the all-tournament team, scored Wisconsin's first goal on a power play midway into the first period. Flatley picked up his second goal of the game late in the second period. Paul Houston made it 3-0 early in the third. Harvard then scored two goals with Driver getting one in between.

The Badgers pulled away late in the game with Houston scoring his second at the 18:39 mark and John Johannson tallying a short-handed, empty net goal at 19:21 to make it 6-2.

Behrend was honored as the tournament's Most Valuable Player. It was the second time he received the award having captured it in the 1981 tourney. Badger defenseman Chris Chelios was named to the all-tournament team too.

It was UW's fourth title in eight appearances in the Final Four and their third straight appearance in the championship game.

Colgate's game plan was wrecked in the first 3:23 by UW forward John Byce. His two early goals put the Red Raiders behind the eight ball, and left them in a precarious position, which they were not able to escape. The Badgers held off Colgate 7-3, and claimed the NCAA title.

Wisconsin capitalized on its first opportunity as Red Raider Steve Poapst was whistled for high sticking just 0:37 into the game. When Byce tipped in Sean Hill's blast from the left point, it put the Badgers ahead to stay. The telling play occurred less than two minutes later. With Colgate on the power play, Rob Mendel stole the puck and banked it off the boards and up to Byce who was breaking ahead of the pack. He deked Dave Gagnon and neatly deposited the puck through the netminder's pads.

Two goals by Byce and single tallies by tournament MVP Chris
Tancill and Rob Andringa gave Wisconsin a 4-1 first-period lead. However, with 40 minutes to play there was still plenty of time for Colgate to put together a comeback. But Dennis Snedden took a pass from Brett Kurtz, skated right around a Colgate defender and blasted the puck past netminder Gagnon, to make it 5-1.

Though Colgate pulled to within 6-3 midway through the third, Coach Jeff Sauer knew that victory was there. All facets of the game were clicking, as the Badgers scored on tip-ins, perfect passing, and booming slapshots while receiving Stanley Cup-style goaltending from Duane Derksen. The UW once again stood at the top of the college hockey world.

Along with MVP Tancill, center Byce, goaltender Derksen, and defensemen Mark Osiecki and Rob Andringa were selected to the alltournament team.



## DANE COUNTY COLISEUM

#### Home of the Badgers

ne of college hockey's finest all-around facilities, the Dane County Coliseum, has been home ice for the Wisconsin hockey team for the past 25 years.

With theatre-style seating for 8,644, the Coliseum is the third largest collegiate ice facility in the nation behind Minnesota and Illinois-Chicago. The ice surface is an impressive 200' by 85', making for fast-paced, free-wheeling action.

Inside the Coliseum, the hockey Badgers make use of dressing room facilities as fine as any in the country. Each player is assigned a comfortable, spacious dressing stall (3 1/2 x 6 feet) for practice and game equipment.

Located adjacent to the dressing room is a modern training room,

which includes a whirlpool and all the various modalities and exercise equipment for treatment and rehabilitation of injuries. The Badgers also have a fully-equipped weight room located inside the Coliseum.

Recognized as the home of some of the nation's best collegiate hockey fans, the Dane County Coliseum has hosted the nation's largest crowds every year since the Badgers joined the Western Collegiate Hockey Association in 1969-70.

Wisconsin has led the nation in attendance 24 consecutive seasons! Some 4,385,716 Badger fans have watched UW hockey teams in the Coliseum since 1967. Since 1969, the UW has drawn 4,003,721 fans for 480 home dates (not including exhibitions), an average of 8,341 per game!

Over the past 24 years, Wisconsin has averaged 98% capacity at the Dane County Coliseum.

Since the 1987-88 season, Badger fans have filled the Coliseum to capacity on 72 occasions.

In 1981-82, the Badgers drew 240,095 fans for 28 home games to set the all-time NCAA season record. The 1978-79 average attendance of 8,654 is an NCAA and UW record.

Along with some of the country's best fans, the Badgers have one of the college game's best home ice records. UW hockey teams have a home record of 445-161-24 since 1963, a winning percentage of .725!

Witnessing a Badger hockey game in the jam-packed Dane County Coliseum is like nothing else in college hockey.



After this season, the Coliseum will undergo a facelift as the ice sheet will be expanded to Olympic size (200 x 100). In addition, the Badger locker room will move to the South end of the Coliseum. It will be one of the nation's finest collegiate dressing rooms covering 5,000 square feet.



he University of Wisconsin, the Bradley Center and Banc One Wisconsin Corporation will host the fifth annual Bank One Badger Hockey Showdown in 1993.

Touted as one of the best showcases of college hockey talent in the nation, the Showdown has become the most successful college hockey tournament in the country.

In its four previous years, more than 130,000 fans have witnessed the December spectacle in Milwaukee.

During the Christmas holiday period each year, the Bank One Badger Hockey Showdown is contested at the state-of-the-art, 18,000-seat Bradley Center sports facility. Considered by most to be the finest hockey arena in the United States, the Bradley Center is located in the heart of downtown Milwaukee.

Wisconsin claimed the Pettit Cup, given to the Showdown champion, in 1989, 1990 and 1991, beating hockey powers Boston College (1989), North Dakota (1990) and Maine (1991).

Last year's crown went to Boston University.

In addition to three-time Showdown champion Wisconsin, the '93 field will include Hockey East member Providence, first-year CCHA member Alaska-Fairbanks and WCHA-rival Northern Michigan.

All three participants are making their first appearances in the Bank One Badger Hockey Showdown.

Participants in the Bank One Badger Hockey Showdown, have come from every Division I conference and even from Canada. Hockey East has been represented by Boston College, Boston University and Maine. From the CCHA, Bowling Green State and Miami (Ohio) have participated. The ECAC has been represented by St. Lawrence. Then-independent Notre Dame was part of the tournament field in 1989. WCHA rivals Minnesota-Duluth and North Dakota have also taken part. The University of Toronto became the first Canadian team to participate in 1991.

The Showdown has set attendance records every year. In 1990, the championship game between Wisconsin and North Dakota drew 17,671 fans setting a record for a WCHA match-up.

## BRADLEY CENTER

### Site of the 1994 WCHA Playoff Championships

he Bradley Center, located on the corner of Fourth and State Streets in Milwaukee, covers more than a city block and is within walking distance of such luxury hotels as the Marc Plaza, the Wyndam and the Hyatt Regency, tournament headquarters for the Bank One Badger Hockey Showdown.

With state-of-the-art engineering and technology, the Bradley Center features the integration of classic architectural elements. There are four dramatic entryways leading into the facility, one on each corner of the building. Each entryway is reached through a progression of visually exciting spaces: a treelined plaza, leading through an exterior portico into a 28-foot high, glassenclosed vestibule, which opens onto a stunning 60-foot high, 17,500 squarefoot lobby, also totally glass enclosed.

Inside each lobby, double rows of concrete columns with granite bases rise almost 70 feet to support a spectacular skylight system.

Two elevators, 16 escalators and various stairways take spectators to the seating area. Seating is comfortably arranged in an oblong octagon that provides spectators with an unrestricted view of the playing surface and the centrally located, four-sided video scoreboard.

The first level accommodates approximately 8,000 spectators. The second level features private suites that encircle the arena and provide seating for nine to 12 people per suite. The third level seats approximately 10,000 spectators in 21 rows of seats.

The Bradley Center has a total of 12 concession stands; eight of which sell traditional concession food and refreshments. The other four sell hamburgers, french fries, shakes, tacos, pizza pasta and other foods. Each stand is equipped with two to six closed circuit TV monitors.

Last year the Bradley Center was the site of the 1993 NCAA Ice Hockey Championships. It was the most

successful Final Four in NCAA history, drawing nearly 53,000 fans (an NCAA record for three sessions). The crowd of 17,704 for the NCAA championship game, set an NCAA hockey singlesession record. Because of the remarkable success in 1993, the Bradley Center was awarded the 1997 NCAA Championships, which marks the 50th anniversary of the championships.

#### Accommodations for the disabled


The Bradley Center is an accessible facility with a variety of accommodations for patrons with limited mobility or special requirements.

### DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS



#### Pat Richter

Pat Richter, who made his mark as a Wisconsin all-America football player in the 1960s, is realizing similar successes as an administrator. The Madison native is in his fourth year as the Director of Athletics.

Richter, the last nine-time letterwinner in school history, is responsible for overseeing one of the nation's most successful athletic programs.

#### As an administrator

Named to his position in December of 1989, Richter is in charge of a division that includes 20 sports, nearly 700 student-athletes, more than 160 employees and a large physical plant.

Since Richter joined the department, UW athletics have made giant strides. Among his biggest impact moves, Richter hired former Notre Dame defensive coordinator Barry Alvarez and former New York Knicks coach Stu Jackson to head the football and basketball teams.

He oversaw an improvement in facilities, helped regain program support from every corner of the state and worked diligently to return the department to fiscal solvency. After inheriting a department that was \$2.1 million in debt, Richter and his staff have trimmed the deficit by 85 percent in just three years.

Success on the field of play has been a trademark of Richter's department. Badger hockey and crew teams have won national championships during his tenure, and the men's cross country and women's track squads placed second at NCAA meets in the last year.

The 1991-92 season will be remembered as one of the most successful in school history. *USA Today* rated Wisconsin's total program as the nation's sixth best. Only six schools (including Wisconsin) had both their men's and women's programs ranked in the newspaper's top 10. Additionally, the Badgers realized a surplus of \$1.3 million over its budget projections in '91-92.

Wisconsin football and men's basketball caught people's attention last year. Alvarez' gridiron team was one win short of a bowl bid and was third nationally for attendance increase.

Badger basketball, in Jackson's first year, earned its third National Invitation Tournament berth in the last five seasons. The Badgers were nationally ranked for the first time since 1974 and had five sellouts in the Field House, the most since 1950.

#### As an athlete

Richter's love for Badger athletics started as an undergraduate, when he earned three letters each in football, basketball and baseball.

Pat earned all-America (1961-62), academic all-America (1962) and all-Big Ten (1961-62) honors as a football end. He led Wisconsin to the 1963 Rose Bowl and caught a game-record 11 passes in the Badgers' 42-37 loss to USC.

Richter led the Big Ten in receiving twice and is still the third-leading receiver in school history. As a senior, Richter won the 1963 Big Ten Medal of Honor (given for proficiency in scholarship and athletics) and received the Knute Rockne Award (given to the nation's top lineman).

Richter earned all-conference honors in baseball (1963) and led the Badgers in hits, home runs and runs batted in three times. Pat earned his scholarship for basketball, where the 6-6 center played three seasons.

After earning his B.S. degree from the UW in landscape architecture in 1964, Pat was a first-round draft pick of the NFL's Washington Redskins. He played eight years (1963-70).

#### Professional life

Upon retirement from the NFL, he returned to Wisconsin to earn his law degree (1971). After employment with a Madison law firm, he worked his way up to Vice President of Personnel at the Oscar Mayer Corporation.

Richter was honored with an NCAA Silver Anniversary Award for post-college achievement in 1988. He is a member of the Wisconsin State Athletic and Madison Sports Halls of Fame, and the NFL Player and Alumni Associations. Pat was included in the inaugural class of the Athletic Department Hall of Fame in 1991.

He is a regular contributor to many charitable organizations, including the UW Children's Hospital and the Four Lakes Boy Scouts.

#### Personal life

Richter and his wife, Renee, have four children: Scott, Brad, Barry and Tim.

### THE UNIVERSITY

The University of Wisconsin-Madison, founded in 1848, throughout its history has been recognized as one of the nation's leading institutions of higher learning, with many departments ranked among the nation's top 10.

Nobel Prize-winning research, a liberal tradition of shared governance and a diverse student body have given UW-Madison a worldwide reputation. Wisconsin has ranked among the top universities in the United States in every scholarly pursuit since 1910.

In what is the most extensive study on graduate level education of its kind, the five-volume *Assessment of Research-Doctorate Programs in the United States* rated Wisconsin tied for eighth (with UCLA and Michigan) for its academic quality.

#### Political atmosphere

Because of its roots in Wisconsin legislation, UW-Madison has always maintained close links with the state. With the passage of a federal act in 1862, it became one of the nation's first land grant colleges, establishing a tradition of research in agriculture and the life sciences.

A number of centers and programs exist on the campus specifically to facilitate the exchange of information between the university and government, business and industry. Mandated by Wisconsin statute, faculty governance has been a hallmark of the university since its founding.

#### Physical setting

UW-Madison is considered one of the most beautiful college campuses in the country, lying as it does along the shore of Lake Mendota. There are five lakes in the Madison area, two of which — Mendota and Monona — form an isthmus on which sits the state capitol building.

Madison's lakes, rolling hills, architecture, parks and arboretum have en-

hanced UW-Madison's reputation for scenic beauty. Hollywood filmmakers have selected the campus as its location for films about college life; one film was the 1986 hit *Back to School* with Rodney Dangerfield.

#### Academic leader

The UW-Madison has been a leader in many areas. Among the breakthroughs at UW: establishing the first academic programs in the U.S. for Scandinavian Studies (1875), Psychology (1888), Agricultural Economics (1909), Genetics (1910) and Wildlife Management (1939); launching the world's first space observatory; conducting the first bone marrow transplant in the United States; operating the nation's first radio station (WHA) in 1917; discovering Vitamins A and B; and finding evidence to link cancer with saccharine and cyclamates.

#### Student body

From an initial enrollment of 17, the student population has grown to more than 39,000, making it one of the nation's largest universities. Although almost 80 percent of the students come from Wisconsin—representing every county of the state — Madison's isthmus is truly an international community.

UW students come from more than 125 countries, and the institution ranks fifth in the nation for total foreign student enrollment. It is one of the nation's most diverse student populations.

#### Faculty

The UW-Madison faculty routinely wins national citations for teaching excellence, research and service. Much of the university's international reputation comes from the quality of its faculty. In fact, UW faculty and alumni have accounted for 11 Nobel and 16 Pulitzer Prizes.

There are 44 UW-Madison faculty members who have won Presidential Young Investigator awards (second to MIT); eight winners of the National Medal of Science; and three Searles Scholars. Forty-two professors at the UW-Madison are enrolled in the National Academy of Sciences, nine are members of the National Academy of Engineering and three have been named to the National Academy of Education. One of the nation's leading institutions for higher learning, the UW-Madison includes 11 schools, 133 academic departments, 14,000 employees and a \$1 billion budget. Majors are offered in 151 bachelors, 191 masters and 123 doctorate programs.

### **UNIVERSITY FACTS**

#### **UW-Madison Rankings**

**Five stars for academics.** The *Fiske Guide to Colleges 1993* gives the UW-Madison its highest academic ranking. In fact, UW-Madison is one of just eight public universities to receive the five-star rating.

**Top 10 rankings.** The Assessment of Research-Doctorate Programs in the United States, the most comprehensive and recent survey conducted, ranked many UW-Madison departments as some of the best in country. Sociology, German, chemical engineering and geography were ranked No. 1 or 2 in the nation, according to the 1983 study.

**Leading executives.** The university produced the third-highest percentage of CEOs at Fortune 500 industrial companies and at 350 Fortune 500 service companies according to a 1987 *Wall Street Journal* survey. A 1992 *Standard & Poor's* survey ranks UW-Madison second for executives with undergraduate degrees.

First in private support. With gifts totaling more than \$128 million in 1990-91, UW-Madison is the leading public institution in gaining private support and sixth among all U.S. higher education institutions.

**Scientists cited third most.** UW-Madison scientists are the third-most frequently cited scientists in the world, according to a 1983 study by the *Surveys of Science Resource Series*.


Two movies have been filmed on the UW-Madison campus, including the 1986 hit *Back To School*, featuring Rodney Dangerfield.

### CITY OF MADISON

Located in southern Wisconsin, Madison is home to both the University of Wisconsin and the state capital. The city was designed so that the school and state would be linked, signifying the interrelated nature of academics and politics.

One of the Midwest's most vibrant communities, Madison offers an endearing quality of life to both its residents and students.

The centerpiece of the city is the State Capitol. The campus is west of the Capitol and offers easy access to shopping malls, restaurants for every taste and popular night spots.

With a diverse population of more than 190,000, Madison offers the unique combination of big-city excitement and small-town charm. Madison is an action-oriented community that promotes participation in government, education, sports, arts and recreation.

Madison was listed as the 11th most livable city in the United States in a 1992 *Money* magazine survey.

Besides the UW Athletic Department, the city offers a large quantity and high quality of outdoor leisure activities. *Outside* magazine ranked Madison as one of the top 15 sports towns in the nation several years ago.



### ACADEMICS & ATHLETICS

Achieving national recognition in both academics and athletics is a difficult challenge for universities and colleges today. The University of Wisconsin is one of the few institutions that has earned praise for its work in the classroom and on the field of play.

With its admittance to the Association of American Universities (AAU), one of the most prestigious organizations of higher education, the UW-Madison has been recognized for its solid reputation in the academic world. Only 56 schools nationally are in the AAU.

Balancing the academic requirements of an outstanding institution with the demands of athletic competition is difficult. However, the UW-Madison has successfully met the challenge.

Besides its academic prowess, the University of Wisconsin is one of the top total-sports programs in the nation. Ac-

cording to a survey conducted by *USA Today*, Wisconsin had the 23rd-most successful athletic department in the nation for 1992-93. Programs are ranked by performance in the top 10 NCAA Division I sports. Teams were ranked from 1-20, with 20 points going to the national champion.

On the conference level, the Badger men's program placed fifth in the all-sports standings, winning team titles in cross country, golf and soccer (regular season). In figuring a Big Ten all-sports champion, one point was awarded for first place, two for second place, etc. for each sport. Total points are divided by the number of sports offered at each school. The list includes all varsity sports plus basketball and football.

Inclusion on both the AAU and *USA Today* lists clearly demonstrates that academics and athletics do mix at the University of Wisconsin.



### SUPPORT AREAS

#### **Academic Support**

The primary objective of the Department of Academic and Student Affairs office is to ensure the academic success of all UW student-athletes. Counseling and advising services, plus a number of academic help programs, are offered to all student-athletes at the University.

The academic and student affairs staff is available to assist the UW's 700 student-athletes in registration and course selection, monitor progress toward degrees, offer career guidance and serve as valuable resource people.

Staff members work with studentathletes who desire extra academic help. The department utilizes the services of more than 100 tutors to provide oneon-one assistance or group study help.

The department maintains a fivestation computer center, arranges for exam proctoring, offers advice on resume preparation and coordinates the grant-in-aid program. Support groups are offered to students who become medically or academically ineligible for competition.

#### Weight Training

The Wisconsin Strength and Conditioning program is a sophisticated blend of science, technology and one-on-one attention to each athlete. Throughout the year, UW athletes spend more time working on strength and conditioning than any other aspect of their sport.

During the off-season, athletes work on strength improvement, speed, power, agility and conditioning. Inseason programs are devoted to continuation of strength gains and conditioning.

Specific programs are designed for each sport to ensure peak performance during competition and practice and a minimal amount of rehabilitation time. Based upon the strength and flexibility needs of each sport, special programs feature methods and exercises that aid enhanced performance.

The UW also offers a sports nutrition program, coordinated by Dave Ellis. The program assists athletes in meeting their nutritional demands and body composition goals.


#### **Training Room**


The Wisconsin Sports Medicine program features state-of-the-art facilities and the services of leading sports medicine and health care professionals. Headquartered in the McClain Center, the department also maintains facilities at Camp Randall Stadium, the Field House, Natatorium, Nielsen Tennis Stadium and Dane County Coliseum.

The Sports Medicine program focuses on injury prevention. Staff members utilize Cybex strength-testing devices, provide dietary analyses, measure physiological capacity and outline programs to improve flexibility.

The UW is one of a handful of schools with an on-site X-ray machine, enabling physicians to quickly and thoroughly evaluate injuries and prescribe treatment and rehabilitation.

A wide variety of facilities and equipment, including a rehabilitation swimming pool, Cybex equipment, Stairmasters and Fitron Bicycles, help athletes rehabilitate injuries and minimize the loss of general fitness during recuperative time.
