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MEETING OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Madison, Wisconsin

Monday, May 25, 1925, 10 A. M.

PRESENT: Regents Callahan, Grady, Olbrich, President Kronshage; Business Manager Phillips, Secretary McCaffrey.

Mr. Arthur Peabody, State Architect, appeared before the committee and reported upon his conference with Paul Cret at Philadelphia. He also showed the plans for the Men's Dormitories and the Memorial Union Building, and a drawing of some proposed changes in the location of buildings and streets in the area between Park and Lake Streets.

Upon recommendation of the Business Manager, it was VOTED, That removable staging for use at Camp Randall for commencement and other gatherings at the stadium and field house, be constructed at an estimated cost of \$1500. Charge to Chapter 42. Laws of 1925, Capital.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE BUSINESS MANAGER

- 1. That upon the recommendation of Director Goodnight, Professor G. M. Smith be permitted to elect cash for Summer Session service in 1923, amounting to \$525.

 Adopted.
- 2. That a transfer of \$750 be authorized from Printing and Publication to Equipment and Repairs in Washburn Observatory.

 Adopted.
- 3. That the payment on the Gregg option, of \$4,900, due June 1, 1925, be approved. Charge 20.41(11).

 Adopted.
- 4. That upon recommendation of the Athletic Council an expenditure of \$2,000 for grading at Camp Randall be approved, and that the State Architect be authorized to prepare plans and specifications for the following constructional work:

Workmen's storeroom	6,700
Charge to 20.41 (5) C. Adopted.	\$12,249

5. That \$414 be made available for supplies and repairs for the life saving work. Chargeable to Regents' Unassigned, Operation.

6. That George Levis be appointed manager of athletics at a salary of \$4,500 per annum, payable in twelfths, and effective May 5, 1925. Chargeable to 20.41 (5)C.

Adopted.

Re Alda 7. That the preparation of preliminary sketch plans for the hour addition to the Chemistry Building be authorized.
