# RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE PRESIDENT

### - General -

- 3. That W. H. Twenhofel, professor of geology, on leave of absence, be paid \$100 in lieu of expenses for travel from Washington, D.C., to take charge of the Baraboo Field Trip, April 29 to May 1, 1933, and to confer with graduate students, charge to L. and S. administration, clerical help, p. 37, fund 1-A. Adopted.

### - Medicine -

l. That the resignation of Rudolf Howald, resident in surgery, be accepted; to take effect May 1, 1933, p. 29.

Z. That the memorandum of agreement between the N.V. Potash Export My and the University of Wisconsin, relative to the continuation of an industrial fellowship in Soils be approved, and that the Business Manager be authorized to sign the contract.

(\$1800 for period May 1, 1933, to April 30, 1934.)

Adopted.

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3. That Norman J. Volk be reappointed Industrial Fellow in Soils from May 1, 1933, to May 1, 1934, at a salary of \$150 per month; total \$1800, less waiver \$72; net \$1728. Charge to N. V. Potash fellowship No. 2, 15-B.

Adopted.

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Upon recommendation of President Frank it was VOTED, That the gift of \$400 from Dorothy Whitney Elmhurst for collecting, arranging and analyzing the material relating to the Experimental College, be accepted.

# RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE BUSINESS MANAGER

- That upon the recommendation of the President, \$300.00 be transferred from General University Service, Lectures, Concerts and Convocations (Convocations) to Educational Administration (President's Office) General Supplies. Adopted.
- That rooms in the men's dormitories be rented on a semester basis instead of the present academic year basis. Adopted.
- That the Business Manager and the Director of Dormitories and Commons be authorized to effect a graduated schedule of room rents at the men's dormitories with the understanding that the total potential revenue will be approximately the same as with the present rates. Adopted.
- 4. V That the Business Manager and the Director of Dormitories and Commons be authorized to evolve a plan of refunds or rate reductions whereby the residents of the men's dormitories would receive the benefits of an increasing percentage of occupancy to total capacity.

Adopted.

The Business Manager reported that there was a cash balance in excess of \$18,000 in the account of the Wisconsin University Building Corporation. Upon recommendation of the Business Manager it was VOTED, That approximately \$7500 of this amount be invested in U.S. Government Bonds and that approximately \$8000 be used for prepayment of principal and interest.

Upon recommendation of the Business Manager it was VOTED, That the Town of Madison be permitted to improve and maintain certain roads in the vicinity of Eagle Heights Farm, Mendota Drive, but that this is not to be considered in any way as a waiver of the rights of the University in controlling these roads as in the past.

The matter of revision of gymnasium fees was discussed. Upon motion of Regent Wilkie, seconded by Regent Sholts, the following recommendation was adopted:

That beginning with the academic year 1933-34 a physical education fee of \$1.00 per semester for every student registered in the university be levied as a substitute for the \$2.00 semester fee previously levied on students taking the two years' required physical education course; the income from this fee to be expended for equipment and supplies for the required course for freshmen and for the development of voluntary physical educational and intramural sports. Further, that the present fees for the basic and advanced R.O.T.C. courses be continued and that students paying these R.O.T.C. fees be exempted from payment of the physical education fee hereby authorized.

The Business Manager reported upon the progress with reference to acquiring the chimes and the building of the tower and recommended that the action of the Regents taken on December 13, 1932, approving the site for the tower, be amended by adding "or another suitable site to be approved by the Regents."

The recommendation was approved.

The Business Manager filed his report of transfers for the third quarter.

The Business Manager reported upon his negotiations with the Phi Psi Fraternity for the acquisition of their State Street property and it was

VOTED, That negotiations be discontinued, as the Regents are not interested in the present proposal.

Regent Grady was asked to come to the meeting, in connection with his letter advising that he would move reconsideration of the increase in the loan to the University Y.M.C.A. The Regents present discussed the matter and it was

VOTED, That it be put over to the next meeting of the Board.

The Business Manager presented a communication from Israel Sweet, offering his property on State Street. It was VOTED, That the offer be declined.

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The following recommendation was adopted:

That the action of the Trustees of the Vilas Estate, reducing the rent on the Pioneer Block, occupied by the Woolworth Company, in the amount of \$1000 for the present year, be approved. (Confirming verbal approval.)
