

Wisconsin plays its home games in the beautiful and spacious Dane County Memorial Coliseum. There are 8,000 theatre type seats and space for 670 additional seats and standing room making the capacity for hockey 8,670. It is the largest college hockey arena in the nation. The ice surface is regulation 85 \times 200 feet



RECORD ATTENDANCE

Wisconsin hockey has attracted record crowds to the Coliseum ever since the Badgers joined the Western Collegiate Hockey Ass'n in the 1969-70 season. Wisconsin fans have set college hockey attendance records for 9 consecutive seasons starting with 1970. The 1981-82 season total of 240,095 fans that saw 28 home games set an all-time collegiate record. The 1978-79 average attendance total of 8,654 is a school and collegiate record.

IMPORTANT DATES IN WISCONSIN HOCKEY

- March, 1962— Wisconsin Athletic Director Ivan Williamson announced the return of hockey as an intercollegiate sport after a 28 year absence.
- **December 6, 1963**—A rebound goal by Chan Young 5:10 into the sudden death period gives Wisconsin its first modern collegiate win, a 3-2 win over Macalester.
- February 22, 1964—Wisconsin concluded its first season of hockey in the modern era with an 8-5-3 record.
- December 11, 1964—In an effort to upgrade their program, the Badgers scheduled eight games against WCHA teams. In the first game, Michigan State scored a 9-2 win. The Badgers lost all eight of those games.
- **February 22, 1966**—After 13 straight losses to WCHA teams, the Badgers finally post a victory, a 5-4 overtime win over Minnesota. Jim Petruzates scored on a break just two minutes into the overtime period.
- April 1, 1966—Following the retirement of John Riley, Bob Johnson was named head coach of the Badger hockey program.
- March, 1968—Wisconsin hockey hit the national spotlight as Bert DeHate, a sophomore center from St. Paul, MN, wins the national scoring title with 77 points on 47 goals and 30 assists. DeHate hits for seven hat-tricks, a Badger record, as the team goes 21-10.
- March 30, 1969—After another successful season, including an 11-9-2 mark against WCHA teams, the Badgers were admitted to the league.
- March, 1970—Wisconsin places fourth in the WCHA and qualifies for the national tournament, where they post a third place finish. Defenseman John Jagger of Sault Ste. Marie, Ontario becomes the first Badger player to win all-American honors.
- March, 1972—The Badgers make their second NCAA appearance in three years, but again they come away with a third place finish.
- March 16, 1973—Wisconsin stuns Cornell 6-5 in overtime to advance to the NCAA finals. A goal with five seconds left in regulation time by sophomore Dean Talafous ties the game. Talafous tallies the game-winner with 33 seconds left in overtime.
- March 17, 1973—With a 4-2 win over WCHA rival Denver, Wisconsin wins the NCAA championship for the first time in the school's history.
- March 25, 1977—After missing the NCAA playoffs for three years, the Badgers make it to the final four again. Les Grauer scored the tying goal against New Hampshire and Mike Eaves won it in overtime 4-3, as the Badgers advanced to the finals.
- March 26, 1977—Senior Steve Alley culminated the Badgers' finest season with a goal 23 seconds into overtime to give Wisconsin a 6-5 win over Michigan for their second NCAA title. Wisconsin finished the season at 37-7-1 and was the first team to capture the Big Ten, WCHA and NCAA titles in the same season. Three players were named to the all-American squad, Johnson was named Coach of the Year and his son Mark was named Freshman of the Year.
- March 25, 1978—Wisconsin fans took Providence by storm for the NCAA tournament although the team finished fourth, Badger fans were proclaimed the "World's Greatest Hockey Fans". Mike Eaves finished his career as the school's all-time scoring leader, while he and Mark Johnson were all-Americans.
- March, 1979—Record crowds saw the Badgers (25-13-3) play as 21 of the 23 home games were sell-outs and the average crowd of 8,654 was just eight short of a sell-out. Mark Johnson closed out his Badger career as the top goal scorer in Wisconsin history. He was named to the all-American squad again and was the college "Player of the Year".
- March 27, 1981—Wisconsin returned to the NCAA final four after defeating the best team in the East, Clarkson, 9-8 in a total goal series at Potsdam, NY. After a 5-1 win over Northern Michigan, the Badgers advanced to the finals again.
- March 28, 1981—The Badgers regained the NCAA crown with a 6-3 win over Minnesota. The "back door" Badgers proved they were the champions after defeating the #1 teams in the ECAC (Clarkson), CCHA (Northern Michigan) and WCHA (Minnesota). The season also marked the end of the ten-team WCHA, as the three Michigan schools and Notre Dame dropped out to join the CCHA.
- March 27, 1982—Badgers finish 2nd in NCAA Tournament, and compile the second best record in Wisconsin Hockey history at 35-11-1. Center John Newberry and Defenseman Bruce Driver receive All-American status.
- June 1, 1982—Bob Johnson resigns after fifteen years at Wisconsin. Johnson has guided the Badgers to 3 NCAA Championships and the best attendance of any college hockey program in the country.
- July 8, 1982—Jeff Sauer, Head Coach at Colorado College and former assistant to Bob Johnson at Wisconsin, is named as the second full-time coach of the Badgers.

HEAD COACH JEFF SAUER

Jeff Sauer was named Wisconsin's second full time hockey coach on July 8, 1982. Sauer succeeded Bob Johnson who was named head coach of the Calgary

Flames of the National Hockey League.

Wisconsin Athletic Director Elroy Hirsch had the following comment on the appointment of Sauer, "We believe we made an exhausting and thorough search for a replacement for Bob Johnson. After we collected all the facts on each candidate, Jeff Sauer came up with the most points. We feel his philosophy will sustain the high quality level of Wisconsin hockey."

For the past twelve seasons Sauer has been the head coach at Colorado College compiling a record of 184-233-11. Coach Sauer was named WCHA "Coach

of the Year" in his first season, 1971, and again in 1975.

Sauer graduated and played hockey and baseball at Colorado College under Bob Johnson. Jeff became an assistant under Johnson at Colorado College in 1966 and followed Johnson to Wisconsin in that same position in 1968. Sauer was named head coach at Colorado College in 1971.

Coach Sauer made the following statement when he was named head coach at Wisconsin. "First, I was very honored to be just considered for this position and now being named as Wisconsin's Head Hockey Coach is a tremendous thrill. This is a first-class position with a first-class organization with people in the finest hockey league in the country. Our job will be to continue the winning attitude and quality tradition of Wisconsin hockey."

Sauer has been active nationally serving as a member of the NCAA Ice Hockey Rules Committee, is the current Chairman of the WCHA Coach's Committee and is on the 1984 U.S. Olympic Hockey Committee. He is also involved with several nation-wide hockey clinics and directs his own hockey school in the summer.

Jeff and his wife Jamie have two children, Chip 7, and Beth 2.



DOUG SPENCER Administrative Assistant — 1st Season

Doug Spencer, 29, was named Administrative Assistant to Wisconsin Hockey Coach Jeff Sauer and Executive Director of the Blue Line Club, by Elroy Hirsch, athletic director and Bill Rowe, Blue Line Club in September of 1982.

Spencer is a 1976 graduate of Western Michigan University with a Bachelor of Arts degree in English and Journalism.

He has served as assistant Sports Information Director at Eastern Michigan University and at his alma mater Western Michigan.

Before coming to Madison he was Director of Publicity and Publications for the Amateur Hockey Association of the United States in Colorado Springs, and editor of the COLORADO SPORTS MONTHLY MAGAZINE.



GRANT STANDBROOK Assistant Coach—7th Season

Grant Standbrook starts his seventh season as Wisconsin's assistant hockey coach after being retained by new head coach Jeff Sauer. Originally hired by former Badger mentor Bob Johnson, Grant has been responsible for Wisconsin's off-ice conditioning program and recruiting. Grant can be credited for helping with the smooth transition from the Johnson to Sauer hockey program.

Prior to coming to Wisconsin Standbrook was Johnson's assistant coach for three years with the U.S. National and Olympic teams. A native of Winnipeg, Manitoba, Standbrook graduated from the University of Minnesota-Duluth in 1961. He lettered in hockey two years and was an alternate captain in 1960–61.

Standbrook, 43, began his coaching career at Churchill High School in Winnipeg in 1961. In 1963, he took over the coaching position at Greenway High School in Coleraine, Minn., and in three years his teams posted a 56-21-2 record.

Grant entered the coaching ranks in 1966 when he joined the Dartmouth College staff; he became that school's head coach in 1970—a position he held for five years. At Dartmouth Grant also coached soccer and lacrosse. Grant was a member of the Canadian championship soccer team in 1963. Grant and his wife Joy have three children.



Bill Howard Goaltending Coach

Coach Bill Howard returns this season to guide Wisconsin goalies. Howard, 37, a highly successful high school coach during his 10 year tenure at Madison Memorial High School, won two state titles and amassed an incredible 136-72-1 record with the Spartan skaters.

As a player, Howard shined in the nets for Colorado College while playing for former Wisconsin Coach Bob Johnson.

Coach Howard is actively involved in numerous summer hockey camps and seminars including an intensive goaltending camp in St. Louis, Mo.

Originally from Grand Forks, N.D., Bill and his wife, Bonnie, have two sons, Troy, 8, and Casey, 7.



DENNIS HELWIG

Dennis Helwig is a 31 year-old native of Columbus, Wisconsin and is in his eighth season as a member of Wisconsin's training staff. Besides being head hockey trainer, he assists in football.

He received his degree in Physical Education from Wisconsin in 1974 and worked with the Philadelphia Eagles of the National Football League before join-

ing the Wisconsin staff.



ROB MALNORY

Rob Malnory begins his sixth season as a manager for the Wisconsin hockey team. The Waupun, Wisconsin native spent one year with the Varsity Reserve squad and this is his fifth year with the Varsity. Rob is a 1982 graduate of the University of Wisconsin with a bachelor's degree in Accounting. He is currently employed at the UW Athletic Department Business Office.

WISCONSIN HOCKEY PREVIEW

New Head Hockey Coach Jeff Sauer leads the 1982–83 Badger Hockey Squad. A team that should be strong on defense but must replace firepower up front that has since graduated or been signed by the National Hockey League.

Sauer, Head Coach of Colorado College the past twelve seasons, replaces Bob Johnson, who is now coach of the Calgary Flames. In his twelve seasons with the Tigers, Sauer compiled a record of 184-233-11. Jeff was named WCHA "Coach of the Year" in 1971 and again in 1975. Sauer is a 1965 graduate of Colorado College.

The new coach welcomes back the solid goal tending duo of Marc Behrend and Terry Kleisinger. Behrend, MVP of the NCAA Tournament in 1981, set a new Wisconsin record for lowest goals-against average at 2.60. Marc compiled an overall record of 21-3-1 last season. Not to be outdone Kleisinger set a school record with 4 shut outs last season including 2 over NCAA Champions North Dakota. Kleisinger recorded a goals-against average of 2.65 last season.

Wisconsin's steady defensive corp is lead by All-American Bruce Driver. Driver picked up 7 goals and 34 assists last season. Defenseman Chris Chelios led the team in assists with 43. Driver, Chelios, and senior Pat Ethier all possess hard shots that accounted for several power-play goals last season. Steve McKenzie, who went 15 games without being on the ice for an opponents goal, and Jeff Andringa are both solid defensemen who make very few mistakes.

Up front the Badgers lost their 3 top point scorers. Seniors Pete Johnson and Ron Vincent graduated and John Newberry signed with the Montreal Canadiens. Leading returnees include center John Johannson and wingers Ted Pearson, Pat Flatley, and Todd Lecy. Sophomore Tim Thomas, who can play both forward and defense, also returns.

Wisconsin has added six newcomers to its roster this season including 5 freshman. The non-freshman is senior center Jacques de Saint Phalle, who has transferred from RPI. The other new faces on the Badgers are Marty Wiitala, Superior, WI; Dave Maley, Edina, MN; Jim Johannson, Rochester, MN; Ernie Vargas, Coon Rapids, MN; and Eric Faust, Toronto, Canada.



A dozen years ago, Bob Johnson and the University of Wisconsin entered an age that changed college hockey—the Badgers became members of the Western Collegiate Hockey


Association (WCHA).

In the first ten years, the Badgers won 171 WCHA games, lost 102 and tied 15 times for the best winning percentage in the league over the past decade (62%). In nine seasons, Johnson's teams had never had a losing record, finished in the top five in final league standings every year and captured two national championships.

In commemorating the Badgers' first ten years in the WCHA, fans voted for the all-time Wisconsin WCHA All-Star team. The list of 66 former Badger lettermen who participated in WCHA action included eighteen professional hockey players and five All-Americans.

The all-time team, as selected by the fans, includes two All-Americans and five members of national championship teams—four of which played in the 1976–77 squad.


Here then, is "the team"—the "class of classes" over that decade that molded Wisconsin hockey and its prominence in United States collegiate hockey.
