You won't want to miss the fun! □

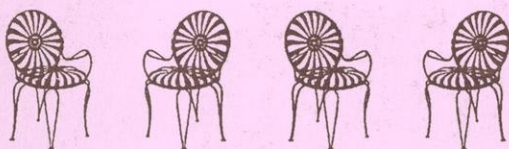


"Let's buy a gift membership for Ken and Sue!"

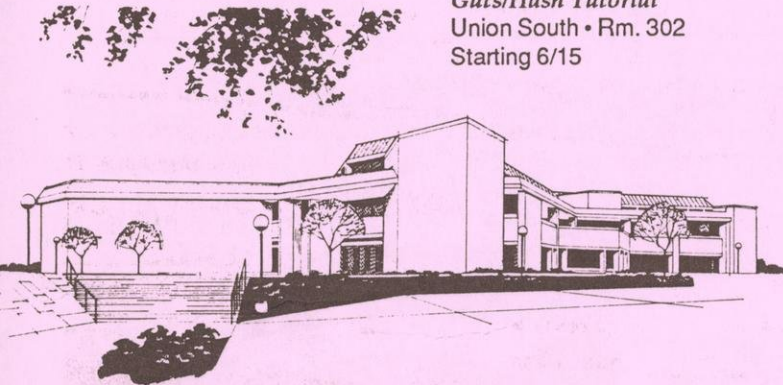

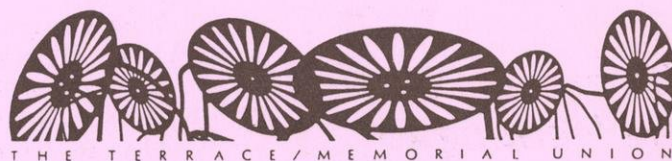

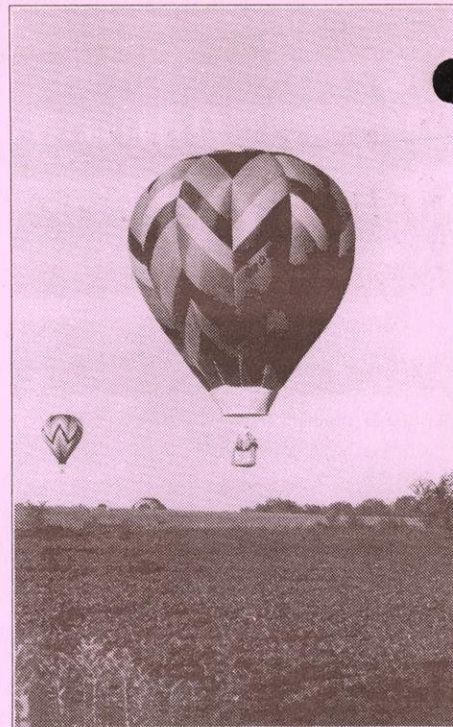
"Let's take Dad to the Terrace Grand Opening Brunch!"
