The first sedimentary rock laid
up to the Archean surface was
sandstone, shales ~~& marble~~
& limestone, not appearing as
quartzite, slate & marble
and iron formations.

For hundreds of thousands
of years immense flows of
lava covered the site of Lake
Superior & the region immediately
surrounding;
in the interbedded conglomerate
copper formed.
