



FRED JACOBY, COMMISSIONER OF ATHLETICS




Fred Jacoby was appointed Commissioner of Athletics for the Wisconsin State University Conference in July, 1966, following a highly successful coaching career that included eight years as assistant football coach at the University of Wisconsin.

Jacoby, a 41-year old native of Logan, Ohio, had his plans for a football career at Ohio State University shattered during his freshman year, when an injury ended his playing days. He earned a bachelor's degree in physical education from Ohio State in 1948 and a master's from Wisconsin in 1953.

His nine-year record of high school coaching at Bremen and Washington Court House, Ohio, and Madison West shows 63 victories and 13 defeats with five championships and three runner-up finishes. During his tenure at Wisconsin, the Badgers won two Big Ten championships and were runner-up once.

As WSUC commissioner, Jacoby coordinates the athletic program at nine schools which sponsor a program of ten sports that include approximately 100 coaches and in excess of 3,000 participants. Fred and his wife, Marcia, live at 4918 Tokay Boulevard in Madison with their three sons -- Tom, Robert, and Steve.

TOM BUTLER, SPORTS INFORMATION DIRECTOR



Tom Butler joined the WSUC staff part time May 1, 1967 to assist the commissioner with the dissemination of sports information. The 44-year-old native of Madison graduated from East High School in 1942; and after a semester at the University of Wisconsin, entered the Navy on January 25, 1943, serving until February 18, 1946.

He re-enrolled at the University of Wisconsin and received a B.A. degree in journalism in January of 1950. After working as sports editor of the Stevens Point Daily Journal and the Daily Jefferson County Union (Fort Atkinson), Butler joined The Wisconsin State Journal as a sports writer on February 1, 1953. His duties there include covering University of Wisconsin football and basketball.

Butler was named Sportswriter of the Year in Wisconsin in 1964 and 1965 and was nominated for the honor five straight years. He and his wife, Bonnie, have five children -- Terence, 16; Kathleen, 15; Jeffrey, 10; Jayme, 8; and Peggy, 7. They live at 636 Sheldon Street in Madison.

Gene Calhoun, a veteran Wisconsin athletic official, became supervisor of Wisconsin State University Conference officials in 1966. He has more than 20 years experience in officiating, including the last five in the Big Ten Conference, where he is now a football referee.


Calhoun, 43, graduated from Madison East High School in 1941, served in the Army Corps during World War II and currently is a Major in the Air Force Reserve. He earned his bachelor's degree from the University of Wisconsin in 1947 and his law degree in 1950. He is a practicing attorney in Madison.

Formerly freshman baseball coach at the University of Wisconsin, Calhoun also has represented many Badger athletes pursuing professional careers. He began officiating in 1947 and started in the Big Ten in 1963. He was the referee in the 1968 Rose Bowl game between Indiana and Southern California. Gene and his wife, Louise, live at 4014 Zeno Street in Madison with their two children -- Gary, 11 and Kim, 3.

PREVIEW 1968 FOOTBALL SEASON
WISCONSIN STATE UNIVERSITY CONFERENCE

Whitewater will be an overwhelming favorite to win its third straight Wisconsin State University Conference football championship in 1968. Coach Forest Perkins, who has guided the Warhawks to five titles in nine years, figures to continue the dynasty with a star-studded cast that includes six returning all-conference performers.

Heading the list is defensive halfback and kicking specialist Neil Hansen, the Conference's 1967 scoring champion. Other all-conference players returning are guard Jim Perkins and halfback Greg Jones from the offense, and end Jerry Mahoney, tackle Larry Dickerson, and linebacker Al Equi, NAIA All-American linebacker, off the defense. Senior quarterback Bob Dorn is expected to direct Perkins' attack. Equi, the team's Most Valuable Player last fall, heads the defense, which limited opponents to 47 yards per game rushing in 1967 and 148 yards total offense.

Again, Stevens Point and Oshkosh are likely challengers for Whitewater's throne. Point has end Jim Hansen, the Conference's leading receiver, and offensive guard Pat Fee, a 5-10, 247-pounder, returning this year. Both were all-conference. The Pointers will miss tackle Bill Ferge and fullback Tom Heimerl, two league all-stars, and talented quarterback George Tigges.

Oshkosh must replace the architect of its powerful ground attack, 6-2, 225-pound halfback Myles Strasser. The Titans hope to rebuild around two all-conference guards, Frank Orzel on offense and Claire Rasmussen on defense. Oshkosh averaged a league-leading 214 yards per game rushing in 1967 and Strasser topped individuals with 909 yards and a 5.1 average.

La Crosse will build its offense around quarterback Rocky Falaschi and end Dewey Stendahl, a fine receiver. The Indians will miss defenders Len Funk and Tom Carroll, as well as running back Warren (Teddy) Bear.

At Platteville Chris Charnish could pick up where his talented brother, Al, left off as a record-breaking passer. Al, winner of the Conference's Most Valuable Player trophy last fall, led the Pioneers to league passing and total offense crowns. They averaged 233 yards passing per game and 218 overall. Chris will probably be aiming most of his passes at Rick Hempel, one of his brother's favorite receivers.

All-conference end Bob Peck, No. 2 conference receiver last fall, returns at Superior; but the loss of quarterback Jim Osborn, halfback Mel Thake, and end Bill Hollister might be too much for the Yellowjackets to absorb this year.

River Falls loses the heart of its offensive line, 6-5, 245-pound all-conference tackle Dick Sievert. The Falcons take consolation in the fact that hard-driving fullback Mike Danielson still has a year of eligibility left.

Stout will build around sophomore quarterback Rocky Maxson, but faces defensive problems, especially with tackle Jim Warrington, a 225-pounder, gone.

Eau Claire's ranks are thin and a replacement must be found for Dave Brygger, the Blugold's leading ground-gainer.

It has been said, "A player good on offense but weak on defense will lose more than he can gain." Whitewater didn't score the most points in the WSUC last fall, but they held opponents down and won more games. It looks like a repeat.

Link Walker moves up as head coach of the Blugolds this year, replacing Jim Rice. He must rebuild a club which shared seventh place last fall with a 2-6 record and wound up 3-6 on the season.

Walker's problems will include replacing fullback Dave Brygger, who averaged 3.9 yards rushing in 1967 and ranked among the conference leaders. Also gone is safetyman Tom Perault, last year's most valuable player who intercepted six passes during the season.

Heading the list of 27 returning lettermen are defensive end Tom Clark, a 225-pounder who was all-conference honorable mention last fall; and quarterback Jim Bach, who ranked fifth in conference total offense in 1967 with 719 yards.

Walker must beef up his interior line and find some speed to make his wing-T and pro-T offenses click. He detects another weakness in the defensive secondary with Perault gone, but finds some consolation in experienced defensive linemen and linebackers.

Coach Gwynn Christensen figures the Falcons for somewhere in the middle of the standings on the strength of a defense which is fairly experienced, good receivers, and better than average passing.

Tackle Mark Lynch, center Dave Outcelt, and guard Dennis Erno are gone; but the most devastating loss of all is 6-5, 245-pound all-conference tackle Dick Sievert, who comes close to being the indispensable man.

Christensen hopes to have 26 lettermen available in the fall, seven off the starting offensive unit and ten from the defense. Quarterback Jerry Trooen returns to handle the passing along with Harold Blank, who caught 17 passes in the conference last fall for the best average in the league, 24.2 yards per catch.

Gwynn is looking for halfbacks who run with reckless abandon, but he should be solid at fullback with 210-pound Mike Danielson, who averaged 4.1 yards per carry last fall.

PROSPECTS FOR 1968

This is rebuilding year, especially on offense, according to Coach Duaine Counsell. "We will be using primarily incoming freshmen as our graduation this year took more boys than in the previous ten years," Counsell said.

Toughest to replace will be tackle Bill Ferge and fullback Tom Heimerl, both all-conference, and two fine quarterbacks Jack Wohlt and George Tigges. Wohlt compiled a .629 passing average last fall, completing 56 of 89 attempts.

Among 30 lettermen returning are Pat Fee, 247-pound all-conference defensive guard, and Jim Hansen, who caught 54 passes in 1967 including a league-leading 45 good for 533 yards and 6 touchdowns, and also made all-conference.

The defensive line appears strong, but Counsell must rebuild the offensive line. The success of halfbacks like Bob Rhode, a 210-pounder who finished third in rushing last fall with a 4.7 average and wound up sixth in total offense with 516 yards rushing and 166 passing, will depend on how well the line is rebuilt.

PROSPECTS FOR 1968

Max Sparger starts his fifth year as head coach with 27 returning lettermen and some promising transfers he expects to have available in the fall. "We expect to be a much improved football team in 1968," Sparger says, "but we will need time to get some experience with a relatively young club."

The Bluedevils will miss all-conference tackle Jim Warrington especially, as well as halfback Mike McHugh, who ranked as the league's third best ground-gainer last fall with a 4.7 average.

Sophomore Lyle Maxson, a much improved quarterback, leads the offensive team, which Sparger says "should be able to move the ball with some consistency." He added, "the backs will be above average in 1968."

Of the returning lettermen, ten are from the starting offensive unit of a year ago with seven off the defensive unit. "We must rebuild the interior defensive line," Sparger notes.

PROSPECTS FOR 1968

All-conference end Bob Peck leads a group of 29 returning lettermen around whom Coach Mertz Mortorelli hopes to better his 3-6 record of last fall. Peck lost his pass receiving crown last year, but still caught 43 in the conference, two away from the leader.

The toughest job will be replacing quarterback Jim Osborn, who threw ten touch-down passes in 1967 and finished second in passing statistics, and the loop's second-ranked ground-gainer, Mel Thake, who averaged 5.1 yards per carry.

"If we can find a quarterback, we will be tough," Mortorelli says. "We're much improved on defense and offense. We feel we are one year away from having a good football team which will be a title contender."

The Yellowjackets compiled the third best rushing and passing statistics in the conference last fall and the hope is they can do at least as well in 1968. Bolstering Mortorelli's hopes are Doug Sutherland, the conference's leading punter (39.3) and Dick Jurcsak, the 1967 leader in punt returns with a 14.6 average.

Rival coaches and most WSUC observers still tab Whitewater the team to beat as Coach Forrest Perkins and his Warhawks aim for their third straight championship. A total of 36 returning lettermen, including 10 offensive starters and 9 off the No. 1 defensive unit, boost the Warhawks into the favorite's role.

Strengths include a traditionally potent defense, which held opponents to an average of only 47 yards rushing per game last fall (148 total offense) and limited foes to 72 points in eight games.

Defensive back Neil Hansen, the conference's defending scoring champion, guard Jim Perkins, halfback Greg Jones, end Jerry Mahoney, tackle Larry Dickerson, and linebacker Al Equi -- each one all-conference -- head the returnees.

Offensive end Barry Wojtak, linebacker Jim Olmstead, and cornerback Bill Banonse are gone; but newcomers, including an impressive list of expected transfer students, should more than pick up the slack. Perkins still feels he needs a quarterback and a breakaway runner, but veteran Bob Dorn should be able to handle passing duties adequately.



PREVIEW 1968-69 BASKETBALL SEASON
WISCONSIN STATE UNIVERSITY CONFERENCE

Wisconsin State University Conference basketball teams won't concede Oshkosh a third straight championship in 1969. Stringing together three undisputed titles is unprecedented in WSUC basketball. River Falls figured in four straight (1947-48-49-50), but the '48 crown was shared with four other schools.

La Crosse won titles in 1930-31-32, but the Indians tied River Falls for the '30 crown. Stevens Point figured in 1935-36-37 titles, but two were shared.

Oshkosh faces an extremely difficult task in its bid for a third undisputed championship. First, the Titans lose John Lallensack, the conference's most valuable player last season. Second, high scoring Ron Hayek and talented guard Tom Witasek also must be replaced. Third, other WSUC teams are catching up with the Titans. Lallensack, Hayek, and Witasek were all-conference selections.

Indications of the third premise occurred late in the 1967-68 season when Oshkosh lost two of its last three games and won the championship by a single game over Stout. The Titans had "romped" most of the season.

Following the late scare, Coach Bob White steered the Titans back on course, and they finished third in the NAIA tournament in Kansas City.

The 1968-69 run looks like a "horse race" with all nine teams after a piece of the action. Oshkosh can't help but be weakened by the loss of Hayek, Lallensack, and Witasek, while challengers appear stronger.

The top 25 scorers during the 1967-68 season included only eight seniors. The remainder of the list had 10 juniors, 5 sophomores, and 2 freshmen.

Four of the first five scorers were juniors, as were seven of the top ten. Hayek and Bill Heidemann of Stout shared the scoring championship with 22.6 averages.

White will rebuild around Bruce Miller and Bill Schwartz. Both are tournament tested but need help. Newcomers hold the key. Stout, Stevens Point, and Platteville again figure to offer the stiffest challenges to Oshkosh.

Stout's success again hinges on Heidemann and Mel Coleman, who set a conference record last season with an average of 19.1 rebounds a game. Another asset is Cal Glover, who finished tenth in scoring as a freshman (17.5).

Mike Hughes, 6-8 center and third ranked WSUC scorer (21.8), returns to Stevens Point for his senior year. Also back is Ken Ritzenthaler, a transfer student who played only nine games in 1968 but set a field goal accuracy record of .558.

Platteville finished fourth last season with essentially a young team. The leading Pioneer scorer was Doug Knutson (16.6), now a junior. Guy Gust (15.5) has graduated, but Jim Lawinger (15.1) is back and only a sophomore.

Joel Hafner, 21.4 and fourth in the conference, leads La Crosse's challenge, while Whitewater's hopes revolve around junior Don Paulsen, who averaged 19.4 points as a sophomore for sixth in the conference.

River Falls would like to steal a page from its glory days of two decades ago when Nate DeLong and present Coach Newman Benson made cage history. The Falcons pin their hopes today on two seniors, Bill Van Dyke and Steve Gustafson. They averaged 19.3 and 18.5 points as juniors last season.

Eau Claire, under new coach Ken Anderson, and Superior are rebuilding. Newcomers must play major roles if each hopes for a resurgence.

All-conference returnees include Hafner, Knutson, Van Dyke, Hughes, Coleman, Heidemann, and Paulsen.

PROSPECTS FOR 1968-69

Ken Anderson is the only new coach in the conference this season and he inherits a team which won only seven of 20 games last season and finished with a 4-12 league record.

Anderson is expected to put an essentially young team on the floor and provide a new look in Blugold basketball. He is likely to use some talented incoming freshmen who have indicated their desire to attend Eau Claire.

The two top scorers off last year's team, Pat Hammond and Jim Severson, are gone, so one of the biggest jobs Anderson faces is finding some scoring punch. This, too, probably will have to come from newcomers.

Among veterans who expect to see action are 6-5 center Bob Campbell, 6-4 forward Larry Rasmussen, and 6-2 guard Bill Beckwith.
