

# The Field House Advantage



The Wisconsin Field House was the site of the 1993 NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball Championship. Wisconsin set attendance records of 11,155 for the championship and 9,930 for the semifinals making it the most watched collegiate volleyball event ever. Wisconsin's record-setting attendances began in 1990 when 10,935 fans watched the Badgers defeat Illinois in the first round of the NCAA tournament.

## Crowd of 10,935 breaks records

Every attendance record known to women's college volleyball fell Friday when 10,935 fans watched the University of Wisconsin sweep Illinois at the UW Field House in a National Collegiate Athletic Association first-round tournament match.

"That was crazy," UW Coach Steve Lowe said. "It was so much fun."

Get out the erasers. These marks must be changed—NCAA all-time record of 10,645; NCAA tournament mark of 9,107; NCAA first-round record of 4,969; and the UW mark of 4,335.

"Knowing there's that many people supporting us just makes us want to go out and play harder to show how much we appreciated the support," UW middle blocker Arlisa Hagan said.



Wisconsin set the all-time match attendance record when it played host to the 1993 NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball Championship. Wisconsin holds the No. 1, No. 3 and No. 5 all-time highest collegiate volleyball attendance figures.

Wisconsin has ranked among the top 10 in national attendance average for the last four years including a second-place ranking in 1991.

Wisconsin has finished in the top three in Big Ten Conference volleyball attendance the last four years including leading the league in 1990 and '91.



# Head Coach John Cook

**A** former Olympic coach, John Cook begins his third year as the head coach at the University of Wisconsin. Cook not only brings Olympic credentials but also national championship experience to the Badger program.

In his first year at Wisconsin, he led the young Badgers to a 14-17 record and seventh-place finish in the Big Ten Conference. Senior Arlisa Hagan was named to the second-team all-Big Ten Conference team while setting the all-time UW kills and blocking records during Cook's inaugural season.

During his second year, the Badgers finished fifth in the Big Ten Conference and junior outside hitter Joanna Grotenhuis earned honorable mention all-Big Ten honors. Wisconsin qualified for its third NCAA post-season tournament in four years in 1993. The Badgers defeated South Florida, 3-0, in the first round before losing at the




University of Hawaii in the second round.

As the first assistant coach with the United States Men's National Volleyball team, Cook aided the U.S. to a bronze medal in the 1992 Olympic Games in Barcelona. The team's defensive coordinator, he was also in charge of scouting, and supervising the team's flexibility, strength and conditioning programs.

For his Olympic coaching experience, Cook was honored in June of 1993 at the NACDA/USOC Collegiate Coaches Recognition Awards Luncheon.

Prior to his appointment with the national team, Cook served as the head assistant coach with the University of Nebraska women's volleyball program from 1988-91. During Cook's tenure at Nebraska, the Cornhuskers advanced to the NCAA final four every year including a second-place finish in 1989. Nebraska also captured the NCAA Midwest Regional and

Big Eight Conference championship each of those three years.

Cook served as the Huskers' recruiting coordinator, scouting chief, strength and conditioning coordinator, and was the liaison with the academic advising center. Nebraska garnered seven volleyball academic all-America honors during a three-year period, ranking them No. 1 in the country.

As the head assistant coach at the University of California-San Diego from 1983-84, Cook aided the Tritons to a NCAA Division III National Championship in 1984 and a second-place national finish in 1983.


In U.S. Olympic Festival competition, Cook served as head coach of the bronze medal-winning North team in 1989, and was an assistant coach with the third-place West team in 1987.

A co-founder of the San Diego Volleyball Club, Cook served as a coach with the club from 1986-88. The club won two Southern California Regional Championships and finished among the final four teams twice in the USVBA Junior Olympics for girls 18 and under.

Cook's coaching credentials also include leading Parker High School in San Diego to two California state championships. During his six-year coaching stint, he had a .900 winning percentage with an overall record of 162-18, including a 90-match league winning streak.

A graduate of the University of San Diego, Cook earned his bachelor's degree in history in 1979. He completed his master's degree in teaching and coaching effectiveness from San Diego State University in 1991.


Cook and his wife Wendy are the parents of two children—Lauren 3 and Taylor, who was born in October of 1993.

# Assistant Coaches

## Megan McCallister



**M**egan McCallister, a former member of the United States National Women's Volleyball team, begins her second year as an assistant coach with the Wisconsin volleyball program. A six-foot outside hitter, McCallister was a member of the national team 1991-1993. She competed in the 1991 Pan American Games and 1991 World University Games earning a bronze medal. As a member of the


Chrysler Californians, she won the inaugural NORCECA Women's Club Championship in 1991.

A 1991 graduate of USC in business administration, McCallister served as the Trojans captain as a senior. A four-year starter, she was a two-time all-PAC 10 selection. As a freshman McCallister led the conference and ranked fifth nationally in hitting percentage at .391. She was named to the PAC 10 all-freshman team. McCallister completed her career at USC with 1,472 kills and 375 blocks, and led USC to three appearances in the NCAA tournament. She was also named the USC Scholar Athlete of the Year in 1991.

McCallister competed in the 1986 and 1987 U.S. Olympic Festivals earning bronze medals. A native of Manhattan Beach, Calif., she graduated from Mira Costa High School and was named the 1986 high school player of the year by *Volleyball Monthly*.

Following her graduation, McCallister worked as an assistant to the branch manager at Paine Webber in Beverly Hills, Calif. She is working towards her master's degree in educational administration while at Wisconsin.

## Craig Skinner



**A** former member of the Ball State men's volleyball team, Craig Skinner begins his first season with the Badger volleyball program. As a member of the third-place 1990 NCAA Championship team, Skinner was a two-time team captain for the Cardinals. He finished his career ranked 13th on the Ball State career list for service aces and digs. As a sophomore, Skinner received the Mid-American Conference Commis-

sioner's Award for Academic Excellence. He graduated from Ball State with a bachelor's degree in accounting in 1993.

While attending Ball State, Skinner also worked as a coach and administrative assistant with the Munciana Volleyball Club, one of the most successful club volleyball programs in the country. Skinner was an assistant coach with the Munciana 18's aiding them to a second-place the varsity program was crowned *USA Today* High School National Champions.

In addition to his club experience, Skinner has worked a number of volleyball camps around the nation.

# Chasing After a Field of Dreams

With images of Big Ten championships and NCAA tournament appearances dancing in their heads, the University of Wisconsin volleyball team is chasing after its dreams.

Part of the Badgers' dream came true in 1993 as they advanced to the second round of the NCAA tournament. Wisconsin also finished fifth in the Big Ten Conference.

"By improving upon last year, we continue towards our dream of a Big Ten Championship," said third-year head coach John Cook. "I think the coaches along with the players are confident that we're on the verge of making an impact in the Big Ten Conference."

The Badgers finished with a 19-13 record last season including a first-round NCAA tournament win over South Florida in the UW Field House. The season ended at the University of Hawaii as Wisconsin lost to the 18th-ranked Wahines in the second round of the NCAA tournament.

The UW also finished fifth in the Big Ten Conference with a 11-9 record. With eight returning letterwinners and four returning starters, the Badgers have the vision to create their field of dreams.

"One of the keys for our team is going to be that for the first time in three years, we have a senior class," explains Cook. "A senior class provides experience, leadership, and the ability to perform at a high level in key matches. My expectations are that Laurie (Smith), Cathy (DeZutel) and Joanna (Grotenhuis) have the best years of their careers."

Smith, a 5-11 outside hitter, will serve as a 1994 team co-captain along with junior Jaime Smith. She played in all 32 matches last season ranking third on the team in kills with 216 and second in blocks with 106. A native of Wheaton, Ill., Smith averaged 2.01 kills and 0.80 blocks per game last season. She was named the most valuable player of the 1993 Hofstra Classic and also to the all-tournament team at the Loyola Invitational. Smith,

who played middle blocker and right-side hitter last season, will return to her outside hitter position this year.

"Laurie needs to play at the level of a senior in the Big Ten—making the big plays

when needed, knowing when to keep the ball in play and keeping the team focused during a match," says Cook of Smith.

"We're going to take advantage of Laurie's athletic ability and quickness with her passing most of the rotations and then attacking a fast-temp set."

DeZutel, a 5-9 outside hitter, played in 24 matches last season missing eight matches due to a knee injury. She played primarily as a back-row specialist recording 24 service aces and 141 digs. The West Chicago, Ill., native led the team with nine kills against Stanford and recorded career highs of five service aces twice.

"Every time Cathy comes into a match, we want her to make an impact whether it's with a serve, a dig or passing the ball right to the target," says Cook.

"She has to make a difference every time she comes into the game."

Smith and DeZutel will serve as the primary passers for the Badgers this season along with Jaime Smith.

The senior duo also brings something else to the Badger program—both were national champions with their club program at the 1991 USVBA Junior Olympics.


"Both of them know what it takes to be a champion," says Cook of Smith and DeZutel.


"I'm hoping that they can bring that championship experience to our team in their senior years."

Grotenhuis, a 5-11 outside hitter, could become known as the "Terminator" this season for her ability to put down the big kill. Grotenhuis tied for the lead in the Big Ten Conference in kills per game with 4.33. She led the team in kills in 16 matches including a career high 28 against South Florida in the NCAA first-round match. The Juneau, Alaska, native also finished second on the team in attack percentage at .271, which ranked 15th in the league.

"Joanna has to put the ball on the floor for us," says Cook. "I expect her to be one of the premier outside hitters in the Big Ten."

Grotenhuis has also improved her blocking and defense, and can greatly help the team by





**Laurie Smith (#8) will serve as a team co-captain in 1994. The senior played in all 32 matches last season finishing second on the team in blocks and third in kills.**


defense, and can greatly help the team by elevating her game in those areas.

Co-captain Jaime Smith, a 5-9 outside hitter, played in 28 matches last season tied for third on the team in service aces with 29. She recorded 190 digs playing primarily as a back-row specialist.

"Jaime had the best spring of anybody on our team and this will be the first time that she's come in healthy," says Cook of the El Toro, Calif., native. "This year she's going to see playing time all the way around. If she's not playing the entire rotation, she'll be coming in the back row to make something positive happen for our team."

In addition to a strong senior class, the Badgers also have something else this season that they've been lacking in recent years—depth.

"With depth two things happen, one is that you create more competition in practice so players make each other better," explains Cook. "And two, when we get into long matches and when we play back-to-back Friday and Saturday nights, we'll have people who can come off the bench and keep us at the same level."

The Badgers also have the advantage of returning their starting setter, sophomore Laura Abbinante. One of the premier setters in the country according to Cook, Abbinante was named to the 1994 U.S. Olympic Festival North team. She was also named to the 1993 all-tournament teams at the Inntowner Invitational and Hofstra Classic.

"With Laura coming back, everybody knows that the communication on the court will be much better and the timing of our offense will continue to improve," says Cook. Much like a hockey team playing for its goalie, Cook feels that the other players bring the level of their play up for their setter.

"The players believe in Laura," says Cook. "They're going to play hard for her. She's very dynamic and has a very strong personality. Laura has the ability to make everyone around her raise their

level of play."

The 5-9 Abbinante played in all 32 matches as a freshman tallying 1,291 assists on the season finishing fourth in the Big Ten with 11.42 per game. Abbinante, from Itasca, Ill., set a UW match record with 86 assists at Iowa. Abbinante refined her blocking and Cook expects her to be the best blocking setter in the conference.

"She's taken a lot of pride at working very hard and becoming a better blocker," says Cook.

The Badgers finished third in the Big Ten last season in blocks per game with 2.56 and second in digs with 16.61. Part of the reason for the big Badger block was sophomore Holly Smith. As a freshman, the 6-1 middle blocker finished fourth in the league in blocks per game with 1.23. She led the team with 119 blocks, and also averaged 1.53 kills per game.

Smith, who is the sister of Laurie, played her best matches towards the end of last season, an indication that she is ready to make even more improvement according to Cook. Primarily a front-row player last season, Smith has strengthened her passing and diversified her attack.

"Holly has worked hard to become a better all-around player," says Cook. "The team needs her to excel at blocking and we think she has the opportunity to be one of the leaders in the Big Ten at blocking."

Another strong blocker is junior Tricia Landry. A 6-0 middle blocker. Landry played in 30 matches last season and earned a start in several matches. She averaged 0.72 kills and 0.76 blocks per game. The Milwaukee native set career highs of nine kills, nine digs, seven blocks and two service aces last year.

"Tricia's work ethic and attitude have helped improve her attack and block," says Cook. "The team needs her to come in and score points with her attack or block."

Landry, who has been injured her first two seasons, will look to challenge for the starting middle blocker position opposite Holly Smith.

Also challenging for a starting position will be sophomore Kelli Luther. A 6-1 outside hitter, Luther played in 29 matches as a freshman averaging 1.41 kills per game. She led the team in kills in two matches including a career high 15 against Minnesota. Luther also had a team high six service aces against Michigan State.

"Kelli made tremendous improvement over the spring," says Cook. "She is mentally tough and a great competitor even though she's quiet on the court."

Overall, Cook is pleased with the strides his team has made through the conditioning and strength program, but the biggest improvement the team has made is in attitude.

"We have everyone thinking about the team first rather than about themselves," says Cook. "They know they're only going to be able to get back what they're willing to put into it. If everyone makes a commit-

ment to that then I think we have the opportunity to have a great season."

One thing that could hold the Badgers down this season is their lack of size. With only three returning letterwinners 6-0 or over, the Badgers will have to work on their quickness in order to dominate at the net.

"As far as Big Ten teams go, we're still on the small side," says Cook. "Our size forces us to outquick teams instead of trying to overpower them."

"Our tempo of attack will be very quick and we're going to be an exceptional serving and defensive team. That's where we're going to win the big matches—serve tough, play defense and transition for points."

With the addition of the 1994 recruiting class, the Badgers should become a more physical team at the net.


"All of the freshmen are capable of coming in and playing right away in the Big Ten," says Cook. "All should get significant playing time, add to the depth of our team and provide competition at each position."

"All three want to be great players and they want to win. That's something they're going to add to our team."

Cook's 1994 recruiting class was rated the best in the Big Ten Conference and the fifth best in the nation by *Volleyball* magazine. All three, Lauren Burny, Heather Dodaro and Amy Lee, were named to *Volleyball Monthly's* Feb 50 while two, Dodaro and Lee, were among the top 25 recruits named by *Volleyball* magazine.

A native of Elmhurst, Ill., Burny was a finalist for Illinois player of the year as named by the *Champaign News-Gazette*. She was also named to the all-state team by the *Chicago Tribune*. The 6-0 outside hitter set the Illinois state single season record for kills with 612. She also played club volleyball with the Sports Performance Volleyball Club which won the 1994 USVBA Junior Olympics and AAU national championships.

"Lauren can pass, play defense and score points with her attack and serve," says Cook. "She's one of the fiercest competitors that I've seen. I don't think

anything fazes her, that's why I think she'll be ready to step right in at this level to play.

"When she gets on the court, she's just concerned about playing volleyball and winning, giving it everything she's got."

Dodaro, a 6-0 middle blocker from Oak Lawn, Ill., earned first-team all-state honors by the *Champaign News-Gazette*. She was also named to the *Chicago Sun Times* all-star team. Dodaro set a school record for kills and blocks her senior season while being named her team's most valuable player. She was also a teammate of Burny's on Sports Performance Volleyball Club earning most valuable player honors at the AAU tournament.

"Athletically, Heather can do some things that nobody else on our team can,"

says Cook. "She's a true middle that can hit slides and is also a fierce competitor. Heather can carry a big hitting load and put up a solid block for the team."

Lee, a 6-0 outside hitter, was named the Wisconsin state player of the year. A native of Milwaukee, Lee led Heritage Christian High School to the 1993 WISAA Division 2 state championship. She earned all-conference honors three years in a row, leading her team to two conference titles. Lee also played with the Northern Sky Volleyball Club leading them to a second-place finish in the 1993 Great Lakes Power League.

"Being left handed, Amy provides another dynamic to our team that we haven't had," says Cook. "Amy will be able to attack at this level in the Big Ten but her playing time will be determined on how well her other skills develop to the Big Ten level."


"Amy wants to be a great player and she's willing to work hard to get there."

Also seeing action for the first time will be redshirt freshman Dawn Kelly. Kelly, a 5-11 middle blocker from Neenah, Wis., walked on to the Badger squad last season. A two-time all-conference selection, she was named her high school's team captain and outstanding blocker.

"Dawn made tremendous improvement this spring and is developing into a very dynamic attacker," says Cook. "We'll be anxious to see what she can do in a match."

The Badgers open their season on Sept. 3-4 at the Northern Illinois Invitational while the Badgers open at home on Sept. 7 with a doubleheader against DePaul and Marquette. Wisconsin also serves as the host of the Inntowner Invitational on Sept. 9-10 before competing in one of the most prestigious tournaments, the Mizuno USA Volleyball Cup on Sept. 17-18 in Chicago. This year's Cup features 1993 NCAA semifinalist Florida, and former NCAA champions Pacific and UCLA. The Big Ten Conference season begins on Sept. 23 and Cook expects even more challenges.


"The level of volleyball in the Big Ten is going to go up another step this year," says Cook. "Ohio State, Minnesota, and Penn State return basically their whole teams and are going to be top 20 teams



starting off the season. With those three teams, along with all the other rivalries in the Big Ten, there's going to be great competition.

The 48-team NCAA tournament bracket will be announced on Nov. 27 with the first-round matches being played on Nov. 30.

Cook expects a lot of excitement on the court this season. "Our team is going to be fun to watch because they're going to give 110 percent every match. We have players who are committed to winning, are going to work very hard and do everything possible to win."

# 1993 In Review

**The Records:** Wisconsin finished with a 19-13 overall record, and 11-9 in the Big Ten Conference for fifth place.

**NCAA Tournament:** The Badgers advanced to the NCAA tournament after a one-year absence. Wisconsin defeated South Florida 3-0 in a first-round match at the UW Field House before losing at Hawaii, 0-3, in the second round. The Badgers have made post-season appearances in four of the last five years.

**Coach John Cook:** Cook wrapped up his second year with the Badgers with a 33-30 career record.

**Home Winning Streak:** The Badgers begin the 1994 season with a six-match home winning streak. Wisconsin won its last six matches at home in 1993 starting on Nov. 5 with a 3-0 win over Michigan. The streak includes a 3-0 win over South Florida in the first-round of the NCAA tournament.

**Badgers on Radio:** For the first time ever, UW volleyball was broadcast on the radio in 1993. WTSO-AM 1070 broadcast two matches during the season.


**Abbinante Assists:** Freshman Laura Abbinante set a UW match record for assists as she recorded 84 at Iowa. She also tallied 1,291 assists on the season for a 11.42 per game average, which ranked fourth in the Big Ten.

**Lourey Sets Kill Record:** Junior Brigitte Lourey set a UW match record with 34 kills at Iowa on Nov. 11. The 5-11 outside hitter finished the season with 1,016 kills in her career, which ranks fourth on the UW all-time list.

**Tournament Champions:** Wisconsin won two tournaments taking their own Inntowner Invitational and the Hofstra/Spalding Classic. The Badgers finished with 3-0 records in both tournaments.

**All-Tournament Teams:** The Badgers landed players on the all-tournament teams of all three tournaments they played in. At the Hofstra Classic, junior Laurie Smith earned most valuable player honors while junior Joanna Grotenhuis and freshman

Laura Abbinante were named to the all-tournament team. At the Inntowner Invitational, senior Kristin Sobocinski earned MVP honors with Grotenhuis and Abbinante again earning all-tournament honors. At the Loyola Invitational, Grotenhuis and Smith were named to the all-tournament team.



**Joanna Grotenhuis was named to three all-tournament teams last season and also earned honorable mention all-Big Ten honors.**

**Team Awards:** Three Badgers were honored with team awards for the 1993 season. Senior Kristin Sobocinski earned the Captain's Award for serving as the team captain. Sophomore Jaime Smith earned the Team Spirit Award while sophomore Tricia Landry received the Coaches' Award for giving 110 percent in all practices and matches.

**Big Ten Rankings:** In final Big Ten Conference Individual statistics, the Badgers had a number of athletes among the top competitors. In attack percentage, freshman Holly Smith ranked 14th (.275)

and junior Joanna Grotenhuis ranked 15th (.271). Smith was fourth in blocks per game (1.21) while Grotenhuis tied for first in kills per game (4.33). Junior Brigitte Lourey was eighth in kills per game (3.76). Freshman Laura Abbinante was fourth in assists per game (11.42) while senior Kristin Sobocinski was sixth in digs per game (3.09).

As a team, Wisconsin ranked second in digs per game (16.61), third in blocks per game (2.56), fifth in service aces (1.84) and fifth in assists (13.32). It was also sixth in attack percentage (.205) and sixth in kills per game (14.77).

## **Nationally-ranked**

**Attendance:** Wisconsin finished the season ranked seventh in the nation in attendance. The Badgers averaged 1,566 spectators per match. Wisconsin also finished third in the Big Ten Conference behind national-leader Illinois and sixth-ranked Minnesota.

**Grotenhuis Honored:** Junior Joanna Grotenhuis earned honorable mention all-Big Ten honors. The 5-11 outside hitter tied for the Conference lead in kills with 4.33 per game. She also finished 15th in attack percentage at .271.

## **Smith Academic All-Big**

**Ten:** Sophomore Jaime Smith was named to the Academic All-Big Ten team. In order to be named to the team, a student-athletes must maintain a 3.0 cumulative grade point average, be a letterwinner, and be in at least their second year at the institution. Smith maintains a 3.362 GPA in business.

## **Luther Named Board Scholar:**

Freshman Kelli Luther was named the 1993-94 UW Athletic Board Scholar for volleyball. Athletic Board Scholars honor the student-athlete with the highest cumulative grade point average on each team. Luther maintains a 3.380 GPA in occupational therapy.

## **Abbinante Named to Olympic**

**Festival:** Freshman Laura Abbinante was named to the 1994 U.S. Olympic Festival North Team in women's volleyball. She is only the third UW player to be named to a USOF team.

# Steve Lowe Memorial Scholarship

When Steve Lowe unexpectedly passed away on Aug. 22, 1991, the University of Wisconsin and the Madison community lost a true friend and a winner on and off the court.

With Lowe at the helm, the Badger volleyball program burst onto the national scene. In 1989, he directed the Badgers to the title in the inaugural National Invitational Volleyball Championship, their first post-season appearance ever.

The following year, he steered Wisconsin to its first Big Ten Conference title and guided the Badgers to their first NCAA tournament appearance and first national ranking, finishing 10th in the final 1990 NCAA poll. Lowe also produced Wisconsin's first volleyball all-American with Lisa Boyd earning second-team honors in 1990.

Lowe, who had a 108-64 career record in five years at Wisconsin, earned 1990 Big Ten and Mideast Coach of the Year honors.

In honor of the former coach, the University of Wisconsin has established the Steve Lowe Memorial Scholarship for a UW volleyball player. In 1994, for the first time, the scholarship will be presented. This year's recipient is senior Laurie Smith.

Every year Wisconsin's Big Ten Conference home opener will be designated "Steve Lowe Night." This year's match is on Friday, Sept. 23, versus Michigan State. A portion of the gate receipts from this match will go to the scholarship fund.









The University of Wisconsin benefits from the interest and media exposure associated with the Big Ten Conference, one of the premier athletic conferences in the nation. Big Ten women's athletics programs take pride in leading the nation in volleyball attendance and in receiving more network and cable television exposure than any conference in the nation.

Begun in 1895, the Intercollegiate Conference of Faculty Representatives (popularly known as the Big Ten) has changed little from its original philosophy of faculty control of athletics with emphasis on the student-athlete.



The women's athletics programs became affiliated with the Conference officially in 1981, although unofficial conference championships had been held among the member institutions since 1972. Penn State became the 11th university to join the conference in 1991.

As a Big Ten school, Wisconsin women athletes compete in conference championships in basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, swimming and diving, tennis, indoor and outdoor track and field, and volleyball.

The Big Ten Conference volleyball champion is determined by the match record within the conference. The teams play a double, round-robin schedule with all teams playing each other twice, both at home and away, for a total of 20 matches.

The conference champion earns an automatic bid to the NCAA tournament. In 1993, the Big Ten was represented by five universities in the NCAA Volleyball Championship. The University of Wisconsin served as the host school of the 1993 NCAA Women's Volleyball Championship with Penn State University advancing to the championship final.

For four consecutive years, the Big Ten Conference has led the nation in volleyball attendance. In 1993, six schools finished in the top 25 in attendance, and overall the league averaged 991 spectators per match. The University of Wisconsin finished seventh in the nation in attendance averaging 1,566 spectators. Illinois was first with 2,657, Minnesota sixth with 1,694, Purdue 13th with 1,444; Penn State 23rd with 1,054 and Ohio State 24th with 985.

# The Wisconsin Experience

## A World-Class University

The University of Wisconsin-Madison, one of the nation's leading institutions of higher education, is dedicated to the support of academic freedom.

Established in 1848, the first class of 17 students enrolled February 5, 1849. Today, UW-Madison ranks as the nation's fifth largest university with 40,924 students. The student body is one of the most diverse in the country with students coming from every state in the country. Wisconsin also ranks fourth in the nation for foreign student enrollment.

More than 4,470 courses and 12,832 sections are offered in UW-Madison's 12 schools and colleges. Majors are available in 151 bachelor's, 191 master's, and 123 doctoral and professional degree programs.

Wisconsin has ranked among the top 10 universities in the United States in every scholarly reputational study since 1910. The quality of its undergraduate, graduate and research programs is recognized around the world.

One survey rated 49 different undergraduate programs at UW-Madison among the top 10 in the nation. Among those ranked include sociology, German, chemical engineering, geography, statistics, plant pathology, molecular biology, biochemistry, Spanish, Portuguese, zoology, political science, chemistry, economics, mathematics, and history.

UW-Madison faculty or alumni have been awarded 12 Nobel Prizes and 20 Pulitzer Prizes. There are 44 faculty members who are winners of Presidential Young Investigator awards, 10 winners of the National Medal of Science, and four Searles scholars. Forty-four professors are members of the National Academy of Sciences, 12 are members of the National Academy of Engineering, and three in the National Academy of Education. The university also ranks fourth in the nation in research and development expenditures.

UW-Madison is one of the nation's first land-grant colleges, establishing a tradition of research in agriculture and the life science. The founders of the university developed the "Wisconsin Idea" as making "the beneficent influence of the university available to every home in the state."

UW-Madison is the largest institution in the University of Wisconsin System. It has the only public law and medical schools in the state as well as the only school of veterinary medicine.

## A Scenic Campus

One of the most picturesque college campuses in the country, UW-Madison lies along the beautiful shores of Lake Mendota.


One mile from the capitol, traveling down historic State Street, the city was designed so the University and state would be linked, signifying the interrelated nature of the academic and political life of Wisconsin.

Madison's lakes, rolling hills, architecture, parks and arboretum have enhanced UW-Madison's reputation for scenic beau-

ty. The city of Madison is frequently listed among the top five best places to live in the nation.

Tree-lined Bascom Hill, which features a bronze statue of Abraham Lincoln, is one of the University's most famous landmarks. Others include North Hall, the first building on campus; the Carillon Tower in front of the Social Science building; the Library Mall, with its clock tower and fountain; and Picnic Point, a 129-acre peninsula complete with hiking and biking trails—one of the most romantic spots on campus.

A favorite area for UW students to congregate is the Memorial Union and its



lakeside terrace. Here students can study or socialize against a backdrop of sailboats, canoes, sailboards, kayaks and swimmers, while enjoying the sunshine and breezes from Lake Mendota.

## The Student Body

**A**lmost 41,000 students populate the 900-acre UW campus, including more than 10,372 graduate students in numerous fields.

Although a UW Board of Regents policy limits undergraduate enrollment from outside the state to 25 percent, the University still maintains one of the nation's most diverse student bodies.

Students hail from every county in the state and every state in the nation, as well as from approximately 115 foreign countries. UW-Madison ranks fourth in the nation for total foreign student enrollment.

A greater effort is also being made to recruit and retain minority students and faculty. In 1993-94, African-Americans, Hispanics, Native Americans and other minority groups accounted for 8.3 percent of the student body.

## The Community

**L**ocated in southern Wisconsin, Madison is the home of the University of Wisconsin and the state capital. Considered one of the Midwest's most vibrant communities, it offers an endearing quality of life for full-time residents and students.

With a diverse population of 194,591, Madison offers the "big city" spheres of politics, arts and entertainment, as well as the attributes of a small town. It is a family, action-oriented community that promotes participation in government, education, the arts, sports, and recreational activities.

The May 1989 issue of *Outside* magazine rated Madison as one of the top 15 "great sports towns" in the country, based on quantity and quality of outdoor activities, the surrounding environment, and the participation of its population in various sports and recreation.

Madison was also listed as the second most livable city in the nation in a 1993 *Money* magazine survey.

## Where Wisconsin Ranks

Since 1910, the University of Wisconsin has ranked on the top ten lists in every objective national faculty reputational survey. The quality of Wisconsin's undergraduate, graduate and research programs is recognized worldwide.

The *Fiske Guide to Colleges 1994*, the best-selling guide to colleges, gives the UW-Madison its highest academic ranking. In fact, UW-Madison is one of the few public universities to receive the five-star rating.

One recent survey rated 49 undergraduate programs at the UW-Madison among the top ten in the nation. The university has also ranked fourth for the last several years in research funding among the nation's universities.

Academic, financial, and other rankings are summarized below to offer a flavor of the quality at the University of Wisconsin-Madison.



## Funding and Support

► **Federal Grants:** UW-Madison ranked ninth nationally in 1991, receiving 1.2 percent of the federal budget for research.

► **Research and Development Funds:** UW-Madison ranked fourth in the country for research and development expenditures in 1993, with \$372.4 million, according to the National Science Foundation.

► **Tuition:** Over the last 10 years, tuition for resident undergraduates at the UW-Madison has been consistently lower than the average for public Big Ten schools. The UW-Madison has the second-lowest resident undergraduate tuition, behind the University of Iowa, and the third-lowest nonresident undergraduate tuition of the public Big Ten institutions.

► **Private Support:** UW-Madison ranked fifth in the nation, and first among public institutions in 1992-93 by receiving \$164 million in private support.

► **Alumni:** UW-Madison is the number one ranked independently financed alumni group in the Midwest and the second largest in the U.S.

## Research

► **Research Activity Index:** A productive, public research university, Wisconsin ranks fourth among all institutions in research and development expenditures.

► **Doctoral Degrees:** UW-Madison is a national leader in number of doctoral degrees awards. Between the school's founding and 1993, the University of Wisconsin-Madison awarded 29,628 Ph.D.s.

## Departmental Academic Rankings

► **Liberal Arts:** In its first ranking of graduate programs in the liberal arts in 1992, *U.S. News & World Report* listed UW-Madison's sociology department as tops in the country. The magazine also ranked psychology 12th, history ninth, political science 10th, economics 11th, and engineering 12th.

► **Education:** The School of Education is the nation's best according to a survey by the University of Illinois released in 1990. The UW's educational administration and educational policy studies rank second.

► **College of Agricultural and Life Sciences:** In 1993, the College of Agricultural and Life Sciences was ranked one of the top 10 agricultural schools in the country according to *Farm Futures* magazine.

► **Journalism and Mass Communication:** The faculty at the School of Journalism and Mass Communication was

rated first in the nation in research productivity in 1988 by *Journalism Quarterly*.

► **Science Programs:** According to *U.S. News and World Report's* annual graduate school ratings, published in March 1993, six UW-Madison science programs ranked in the top 12: computer science, tied for eighth; biology, tied for ninth; chemistry, 10th; nursing, tied for 11th; health-sciences administration, tied for 12th; and engineering, 12th.

► **Libraries:** The UW-Madison has the 13th largest university library system in the United States, with more than 5.4 million books in 40 locations across campus.

► **Graduates:** *Standard & Poor's* 1992 survey lists the University of Wisconsin as one of the nation's top producers of corporate executives, ranking second in undergraduate degrees and fourth in undergraduate and graduate degrees.



- ▶ with the oldest Scandinavian studies (1875), psychology (1888), agricultural economics (1909), genetics (1910) and wildlife management (1939) departments in the United States

- ▶ in discovering Vitamins A and B

- ▶ with the oldest radio station in the nation—WHA—which began broadcasting in 1917

- ▶ as the Memorial Union became the first public university union to serve beer in 1933

- ▶ in finding in 1937 that niacin supplementation prevents pellagra, a deadly disease that killed 5,000 people a year

- ▶ with the nation's first department of wildlife management in 1939

- ▶ in the synthesizing of genes. Former biochemistry professor Har Gobind Khorana synthesizes the first gene, for which he later receives the Nobel Prize in 1968

- ▶ in finding which wavelength of ultraviolet light produces skin cancer

- ▶ in discovering the anti-cancer drug, fluorouracil

- ▶ as Elizabeth and James Miller, UW Medical School professor of oncology and professor emeritus of oncology, were the first to identify characteristics among chemicals that cause cancer

- ▶ with launching the Orbiting Astronomical Observatory, the world's first true observatory in space

- ▶ in revolutionizing brain surgery, as Dr. Manucher Javid, UW Medical School professor of surgery, became the first neurosurgeon to use a solution from the age-old compound area during brain surgery on a human


- ▶ in developing tests for phenylketonuria (PKU), a congenital disease of children

- ▶ as UW-Madison researchers describe the atomic structure of a common cold virus

- ▶ in developing new techniques to measure bone tissue loss, known as osteoporosis

- ▶ with the Biotron, a research building that can control environmental conditions for experimental purposes

- ▶ with bone marrow transplants. Using techniques developed at UW-Madison, the first bone marrow transplant in the U.S. was done at UW Hospital. Today, more than 10,000 transplants are performed yearly, giving new hope to patients with leukemia and immune deficiency diseases



- ▶ in finding evidence linking cancer in laboratory animals with saccharin and cyclamates

- ▶ in finding that the anti-estrogen drug tamoxifen can prevent breast cancer from recurring in certain women who have had cancer previously

- ▶ as UW Hospital and Clinics develop the nation's first Mobile Critical Care Unit, which duplicates facilities of a hospital intensive care unit and laboratories



- ▶ with the first and only medical physics department in the nation to exist within a medical school

- ▶ with the establishment of the Center for Dairy Research, the nation's first such center to be established at a university

- ▶ in organ preservation breakthroughs. In 1987, Dr. Folkert Belzer used a cold storage preservation solution to preserve dog livers up to 36 hours and dog pancreases up to 72 hours. Clinical use of this new solution decreases the need for emergency transplantation, increases the number of livers and pancreases available to people who need transplants, and improves organ sharing among transplant centers

- ▶ with Dr. Howard M. Temin (deceased) of McArdle Laboratory and his coworker discovering reverse transcriptase (Independently discovered by Dr. David Baltimore). This enzyme explains how retroviruses cause cancer and AIDS. Temin's work in this field led to his selection as a co-recipient of the 1975 Nobel Prize in Medicine.

# Athletics at the UW

The University of Wisconsin-Madison offers its student-athletes one of the premier intercollegiate athletic programs in the country.

A member of the prestigious Big Ten Conference, Wisconsin offers its student-athletes the best in education, opportunities, coaching and on-field competition at the NCAA Division I level.

With a number of sports begun more than 100 years ago, men's teams compete in basketball, cross country, football, golf, ice hockey, rowing, swimming and diving, soccer, tennis, track and field, and wrestling.

Established July 1, 1974, the nine-sport women's athletic program offers basketball, cross country, golf, rowing, soccer, swimming and diving, tennis, track and field, and volleyball. Wisconsin will be adding fast-pitch softball in 1995-96 and lacrosse in 1996-97.

Wisconsin has ranked among the top 25 NCAA Division I programs for the past two years. In 1993-94, Wisconsin finished 12th in the Sears/National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics Directors Cup competition, which recognizes the best Division I college sports program in the nation.

In 1993-94, 18 of Wisconsin's 20 sports qualified as teams or individuals for their respective national championships.



The University of Wisconsin women's golf team won its first Big Ten Conference championship in 1994 and also qualified for its first NCAA tournament.

The Badger football team won the 1994 Rose Bowl while the women's soccer finished among the top eight teams in the NCAA soccer tournament. Other teams qualifying for NCAA post-season appearances were men's basketball, men's and women's cross country, men's and women's golf, ice hockey, men's and women's rowing, men's and women's soc-








**Chancellor


**Associate Director


**Associate Director


## Academic & Student Services

Academic excellence is emphasized at Wisconsin. Much of the credit for the impressive academic record behind many Badger athletes is the counseling system available to the student-athletes.

Associate athletic director **Alan Zussman** supervises a staff of four full-time and two part-time counselors which conduct the program offered to the nearly 800 UW student-athletes. The advising staff of **Mary Weaver, Jean Patt, Craig Hudson, Christine Sayler, Liane Kosaki, and Marcus McCoy** have a comprehensive understanding of academics at Wisconsin, and a permanent line of communication with all University departments.

For those student-athletes who request assistance, counseling sessions are offered on a one-to-one basis at a time appropriate for the athlete. Wisconsin athletes are degree-oriented while allowing for the flexibility to explore different areas. The counseling staff takes a personal approach to each athlete in determining his or her individual needs, personal or academic.

Student-athletes may receive academic honors in a number of ways. The Big Ten Conference honors scholar athletes with Academic all-Big Ten honors while the UW Athletic Board names Athletic Board Scholars for the highest grade point average in each sport. In addition, student-athletes may be nominated for Academic All-America honors through the sports information office.

## Scholarships

UW-Madison is proud to offer to its prospective student-athletes one of the most comprehensive athletic scholarship programs in the nation. As a Division I member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA), scholarships are awarded to athletes on a one-year renewable basis if scholastic and athletic commitment are maintained.

Scholarships are available in all varsity sports with the exception of rowing, which does not grant scholarships. Full scholarships include the cost of room and board in addition to tuition and fees. The selection of scholarship recipients is based on athletic ability and projected academic success at the University of Wisconsin-Madison.

## Sports Medicine

The care, prevention, and treatment of injuries to Wisconsin athletes is supervised by a staff of six N.A.T.A.-certified athletic trainers. Wisconsin's Sports Medicine program features state-of-the-art facilities and the services of leading sports medicine and health care professionals.

Under the direction of head athletic trainer **Dennis Helwig**, the Sports Medicine program focuses on injury prevention. Staff members **Chuck Hart, Jan Helwig, Mike Johnson, Barb Pearson, Henry Perez-Guerra**, and **Andy Winterstein** utilize Cybex strength-testing devices, provide dietary analysis, measure physiological capacity and outline programs to improve flexibility. Should an injury occur, athletes are seen immediately by team physicians affiliated with the UW Hospitals and Clinics headed by **Dr. Ben Graf**.

In addition to the headquarters in the McClain Athletic Facility, auxiliary training rooms are located in the Stadium, Coliseum, Natatorium, and UW Field house. All training areas are equipped with the finest therapeutic modalities and rehabilitative apparatus. Other medical specialists assigned to athletics also assist in the diagnosis and treatment of the athletes.

## Strength & Conditioning

The Wisconsin strength and conditioning program is a sophisticated blend of science, technology and one-on-one attention to each athlete.

Weight training areas in the McClain Center and Camp Randall Stadium feature Nautilus equipment, free weights, and stereo music in spacious, carpeted rooms. Four full-time and one part-time weight training instructors monitor and advise all Wisconsin student-athletes. Head strength and conditioning coach **John Dettman** along with assistant coaches **Robert Hackett, Steve Myrland** and **Laura Graf** along with part-time assistant **Stieg Theander** work with the individual sport coaches to develop programs specific for that sport.

The UW also offers a sports nutrition program to assist athletes in meeting their nutritional demands and body composition goals.

## Sports Information

Directing the communications for the nine women's sports in the Division of Intercollegiate Athletics is the responsibility of the Women's Sports Information Office. This office utilizes a variety of communications systems to provide student-athletes the opportunity to be recognized for their athletic endeavors.

The office provides and maintains many resources such as records, fact sheets, photographic files, statistics, media guides and event programs in meeting the information requests of the media, coaches, administrators, opponents and the general public.

Women's Sports Information Director **Tamara J. Flarup**, associate director **Diane K. Nordstrom** and intern **Debbie Rosenfeld** maintain close contact with local, regional and national media as well as the athlete's hometown media in providing information. The office prepares news releases, designs sports brochures and media guides, covers all women's sports, and provides post-event results for print and electronic media.

# Wisconsin Sports Facilities

Athletes at the University of Wisconsin benefit from outstanding sports facilities. From practice and competitive areas to athletic and weight training, Wisconsin offers modern and well-equipped facilities for its athletes.

The Wisconsin Field House, which seats 11,500, is the practice and competitive facility for the Badger basketball and volleyball teams. It is also used as a competitive arena for wrestling. The Field House features four locker rooms, an athletic training area and state-of-the-art scoreboard, sound and lighting systems.

The Camp Randall Memorial Sports Center or Shell, located next to Camp Randall Football Stadium, is a multi-purpose facility used by all students. A 200-meter Mondo rubber track surrounds four basketball or volleyball courts that double as throwing and jumping areas for indoor track meets. With a seating capacity of 2,500, the Shell is the site of numerous track meets including the 1992 Big Ten Men's Track Championship.

One of the most versatile buildings is the McClain Athletic Facility. Over 76,000 square feet of artificial turf offers the ideal indoor practice facility for football, soccer and track. The lower level features the headquarters of the Badgers Sports Medicine facility and a fully-equipped weight


room. Locker rooms for football and men's and women's track are also located on the lower level.

The Wisconsin tennis teams have a competitive advantage to play year-round at one of the best college facilities in the

United States—the Nielsen Tennis Stadium. The stadium features 18 tennis courts (12 indoor and six outdoor), five squash courts, one squash doubles court, and seats 1,500 spectators. The stadium is named for Arthur C. Nielsen, founder of the Nielsen television rating system. Nielsen captained the Wisconsin men's tennis team from 1916 to 1918 while a student in electrical engineering.

The newest facility at Wisconsin is the outdoor track and soccer complex located at the west end of campus. The Dan McClimon Memorial Track, named for the former UW men's coach, features a newly resurfaced 400-meter, Martin rubber track. The track, which was the site of the 1994 Big Ten Conference Outdoor Track Championship, surrounds the Olympic size, natural grass soccer field. The facility, which is fully lighted, was completed during the fall of 1993. Building permanent seating with locker rooms and a media facility is scheduled to begin in the near future.

The swimming and diving teams have the luxury of two pools for practice and competition—the Natatorium and Southeast Recreational Facility. The "Nat" contains an eight-lane, 25-yard racing pool equipped with an automatic Colorado Timing System and digital readout scoreboard. The 50' x 40' separate diving well is fitted with three one-meter and two three-meter Dura (Maxi) Flex boards. The SERF facility features an indoor long course pool

with movable bulkheads that more than double the program's training space.

Situated between five lakes, Madison is the perfect location for a rowing program. The Badger crews are headquartered in the boat house, situated on Lake Mendota. The boat house provides the Badger crews with an indoor rowing tank during the winter season. During the warm months, crews can often be seen on any one of the five Madison lakes.

With the opening of University Ridge in 1991, UW golfers now have the opportunity to compete on the new UW golf course. The par 72, 18-hole course was designed by Robert Trent Jones Jr. The facility also features a 15,000 square foot practice green and 5,000 square foot chipping green.


