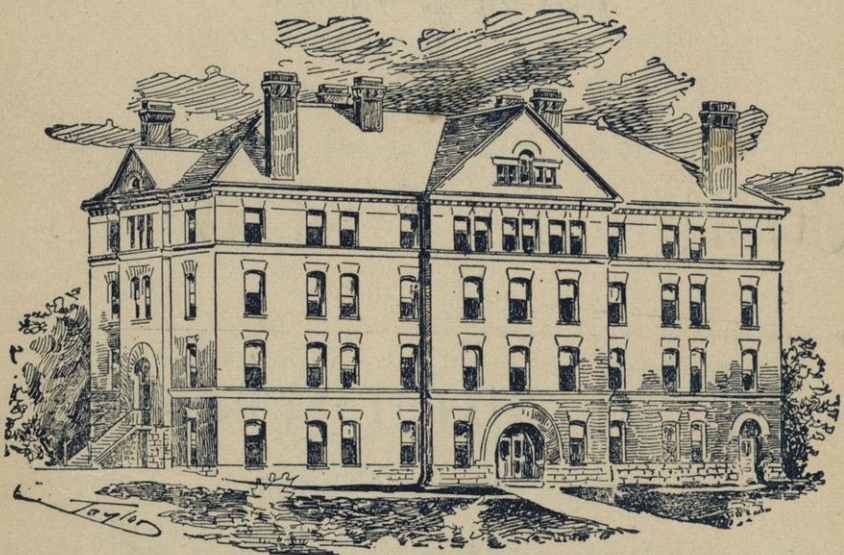

It is with satisfaction that we present to the citizens of Beloit our third annual edition of the Hand Book. The growth of the city for the last year has been steady and substantial. The per cent. of increase in population has not been as great as last year. This, of course, could not be expected, as the growth last year was even greater in proportion than that of Chicago. The changes, however, in business or residence address have been about the same. The building this year has been of a more substantial nature. Extensive improvements have been made in many of our manufacturing establishments. One hundred and seventy-three new houses have been built. A number of these have contributed much to the beautifying of the already attractive streets and avenues.

We have added to our information this year the death list in Beloit for the last year, the marriages during the year, the pay-days of all the manufactories of the city, and a full explanation of the ward boundaries. We have also on page VIII a condensed Historical Sketch of Beloit from the time when the first white man settled here up to the time when the town became a city. For this we are indebted to Prof. H. M. Whitney, who kindly prepared it for this issue. As a matter of convenience, where a lady is a widow, we have given, as far as possible, her husband's initials together with her own maiden-name.

On pages X and XI you will find a list of our advertisers, the enterprising business men of Beloit. These men have made the publication of the Hand Book a possibility. Without their co-operation you would receive no free Directory. We therefore ask that you bear these men in mind when you wish anything in their line of business.

HISTORICAL.

The city of Beloit has attained the age of fifty-five years. After the Mound-Builders and the Indians, came the white man, the way having been cleared by the Blackhawk war.

The first white man to live on the site of Beloit was a French Canadian, Joseph Thiebeau, (his name is variously spelled), who had two Indian wives and several children. His log house stood just about where the office of the Keeler Lumber Co. now stands.

Caleb Blodgett was the first real settler. He was here exploring with one or two of his sons as early as May, 1836. Through the latter half of that year he was farming, building, and getting ready for his family, who came in December. His house stood on the river bank, back of where J. B. Gordon's store now stands.

From Colebrook, N. H., about that time, "The New England Emigrating Company" sent out Dr. Horace White, Robert P. Crane, and Otis P. Bicknell, to find them a suitable place. Dr. White got here in February, 1837; the three were here together in March. Dr. White, as financial agent, bought for the Company a part of Mr. Blodgett's claim; it became the "east side" of the future Beloit. The other members of the Company came scattering along through that year and the next. The Company began housekeeping in Thiebeau's log house. Their fame led many steady and high-minded people to cast in their lot with them.

They set up a sawmill, which cut its first boards in April, 1837; these made a floor for the Blodgett cabin. The first death in the community was that of Horace Clark, Dec. 2d, 1837, the interment being made in what is now the City Green. The gristmill began grinding, and the first store was built, in 1838.

The post-office for the first year was Chicago; then Rockford; then Roscoe. The Beloit post-office was established in 1839.

The settlement was first called Turtle, but that name did not suit; then Albany, or New Albany, was proposed; the name Beloit was selected by a public meeting in the fall of 1838.

The city bridge dates from 1840, a stock company being then organized to erect a toll-bridge. Finally the village paid the bill, and the bridge was made free. This bridge brought the west side land into market.

The Rock river dam dates from 1844.

One of the earliest structures was the "Beloit House," erected where the Milwaukee railroad station now stands. State street was then called Turtle.

The Methodist church was organized as a class Dec. 27th, 1838; the First Congregational church began to be on Dec. 30th of that year. The Baptist and Episcopal churches soon followed, and in due time the rest.

In 1844 began the conventions that resulted in the organization of the College. Middle College was begun in 1846; the first instruction was given Nov. 4th, 1847.

The village became a city in 1856.

Fuller accounts of the beginnings may be found in the letters of R. P. Crane to the *Free Press*, published early in 1878, and in Rev. L. D. Mears's historical address at the semi-centennial celebration of the First Congregational church. Copies of the latter are on sale at the store of C. A. Emerson.

WATER SUPPLY.—The city of Beloit has one of the finest water supplies in the country, which is remarkable for its medicinal qualities and its purity. The source of supply is evidently the same as that of Waukesha, Palmyra and other notable Wisconsin waters in this part of the State. The water is supplied by innumerable springs bubbling up in the bottom of a huge well 30 feet in diameter and 40 feet deep. It is so clear and colorless that a cut glass when filled to the brim looks no different than an empty glass of the same style, and the great pureness of the water is demonstrated by heating the residue, which does not change its color.

We give below the chemical analysis of the water, made by Prof E G Smith of Beloit College who is an acknowledged authority on these matters.

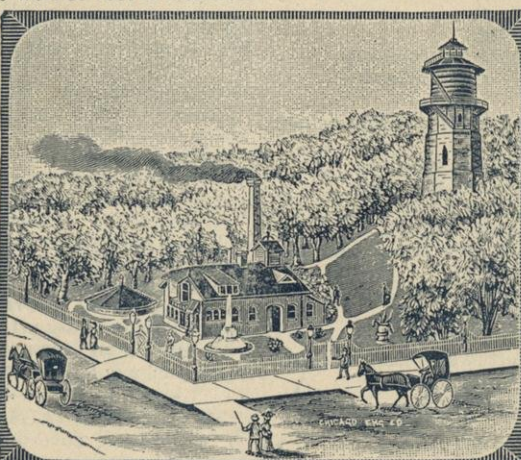

(2) The Hardness is about the average of our surface waters. (3) The results of the analysis show this water to rank among the very best city supplies.

The grounds of the Water Works occupy about five acres on the East bluff of the city. The water tower, nearly 100 feet high, is built of stone and is the finest and largest piece of stone masonry of the kind in the West. The tower sustains a large cypress tank, holding 100,000 gallons of water, which is kept full at

all times, day and night, and gives from its own head 60 pounds pressure to the business portion of the city. The pump gives a direct pressure of 125 pounds when required for fire purposes. The city has over eight miles of water mains and eighty fire hydrants, thus giving splendid fire protection as well as beautiful and healthful water for domestic purposes.

WARD BOUNDARIES.

THIRD WARD—Lies entirely on the west side of Rock river, and includes all that portion of the city north of the middle of E street and west of the centre of Rock river.

FOURTH WARD—Includes all the territory on the west side of the centre of Rock river not included in the third ward.

Mrs Sherman is the matron and all the cooking is done in the building. The price of board is \$2 per week. E G Hoyler, '93, is steward of the Club. Single rooms furnished, heated by furnace, rent for 60 cents per week, and if heated by stove 50 cents per week. Double rooms, furnished, heated by furnace, \$1.00 per week for the two. If heated by stove, 75 cents per week. Rooms in North College can be had at lower rates. Spacious bath rooms are maintained in connection with the building for the convenience of the

inmates. There are hard wood floors throughout. Chapin Hall is wired for electric lighting, but lamps will be used for the present. No glass lamps are allowed in the Hall.

Rooms in private families, furnished and taken care of, are from \$1.00 to \$1.50 for one, and from \$1.50 to \$3.00 for two per week. Fuel and light are extra. Board at present rates is from \$2.00 (in clubs) to \$3.50.

It is the plan of the donor and of the trustees to have as much of the work as possible done by the young men and thus enable a number of students to pay their own way in part.

BUILDINGS.

MIDDLE COLLEGE (original building, erected 1847-8, four stories, red brick) contains Treasurer's office (4), Biology room (2), Geology rooms (3, 4), Philosophy room (5), Greek room (6), Mathematical rooms (7, 8), Modern Languages room (9), Archæan Reading room (10) English room (11) Latin room (12), Althean Hall (fourth floor, north), Delian Hall (fourth floor, south). NORTH COLLEGE (1854, three stories, red brick) at north end of campus. Contains students' rooms.

OLD CHAPEL (1858; two stories, yellow brick) south of Middle College contains assembly room up stairs, Physics rooms down stairs.

LABORATORY (1868, one and two stories frame, southwest of old chapel) formerly a dormitory, now used by the departments of Chemistry and Mineralogy.

MEMORIAL HALL (1869; two stories, lime stone, southeast corner of campus) contains College library up stairs cabinets down stairs. Notice the tablets in the vestibule.

GYMNASIUM, (1874, frame, west center of the campus).

OBSERVATORY (1881-3, stone, with dome

and wing, south end of campus, brow of the hill.

SCOVILLE HALL (1889-90; three stories red pressed brick, trimmings of brown stone and terra cotta, brow of the hill south of Observatory) contains manual training rooms, furnaces etc. (basement), recitation rooms (all floors), Principal's office (first floor), assembly room (second floor), music rooms (third floor), janitors' rooms.

NEW CHAPEL (1890-1; Wauwatosa and Richmond stone, now erecting, east center of campus,) will contain 700 sittings, rooms for College Y M C A, President's office, organ, etc. Visitors are welcome at College worship at 4:05 p m.

CHAPIN HALL (1890-1; red pressed brick, four stories, north end of campus); College boarding club, etc., on first floor; rooms for students in three upper stories, bath rooms, electric lights, etc.

SCIENCE HALL (1891, red pressed brick to cost \$60,000, which is also the gift of Dr. Pearsons, will stand just northwest of Middle College. It will be a handsome building, lacking nothing, either without or within, which such a Scientific Laboratory should possess. The exterior will be very attractive, and the equipments of the interior will be all that are necessary. All of the laboratories which the various scientific branches of study require will be located in this building, and also the private offices and laboratories of the professors. The museum of science will be located on the second floor, and the Public Lecture Hall, sitting room for 300, will occupy the centre portion of the first floor. Each department will be furnished with such appliances as its requirements demand and these many new and excellent accessories will place Beloit College in a position to successfully compete with older and larger institutions, in the high standard of its scientific departments.

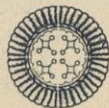

STREET AND AVENUE GUIDE

EXPLANATORY.—Beloit is numbered according to the Germantown plan, with 20 feet as the unit of measure.

All streets running north and south, count from the state line, with the even numbers on the west side of the street. The first block begins with 100, the second with 200, the third with 300, etc., increasing by 100 with each succeeding block; but Bushnell street and Bridge street form a correction line, which corrects to 600.

All streets running east and west, count eastward and westward from Fifth street, with the even numbers on the south side of the street. The correction lines in passing eastward are Pleasant street, correcting to 500, and Park Avenue, correcting to 900. In passing westward, Bluff street corrects to 300; Eighth street to 700, and Hackett street to 900.

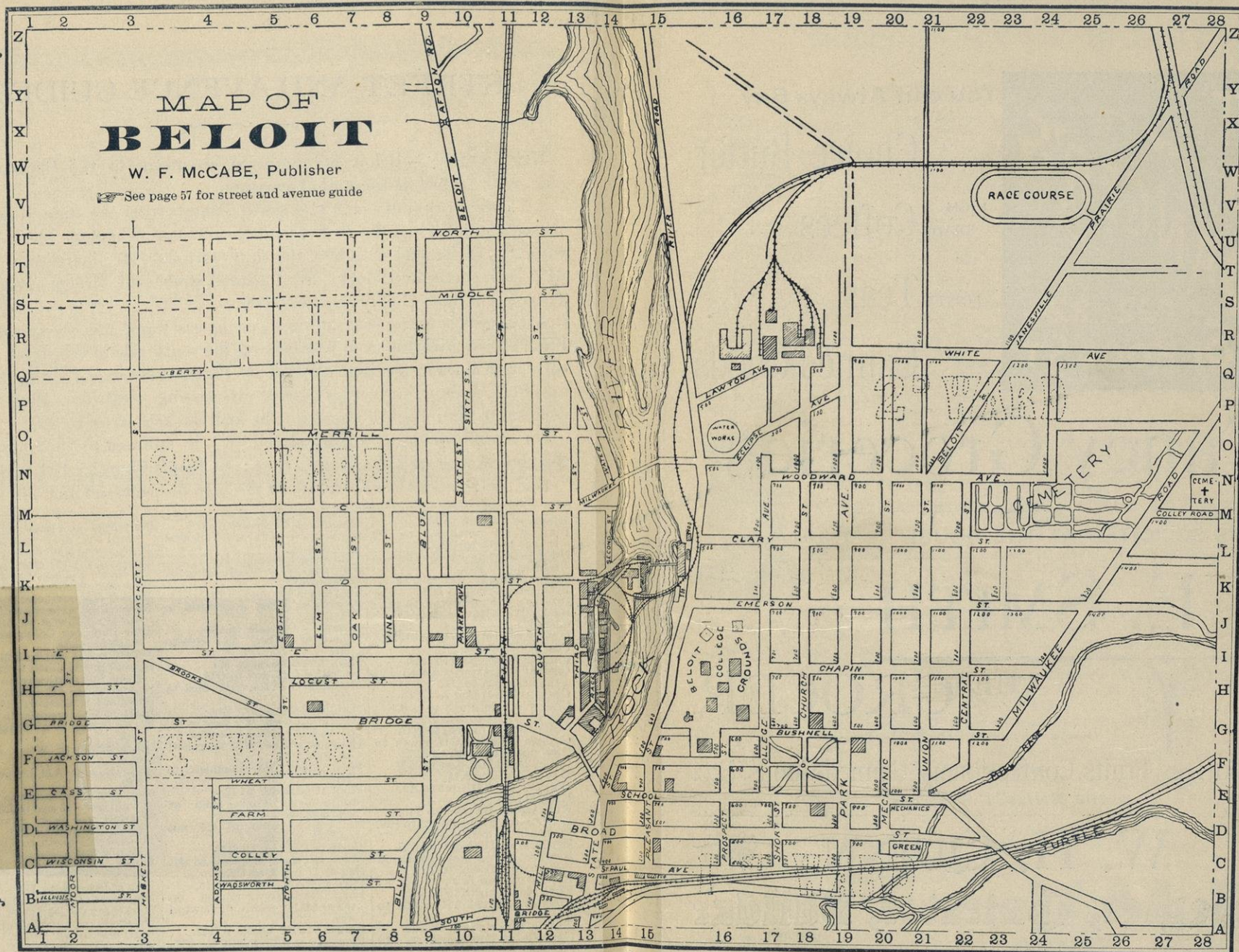
