She emphasized the importance of shared governance, of maintaining student life services, of holding down student costs and of working for adequate student financial aid. In closing, she stated her hope that, under the Board's leadership, the UW System would continue to move forward as one of the best in the nation.

Commending Ms. Leahy for her outstanding work as UW Council President, Regent Davis said her constructive relationships with the Board ensured that student voices were better heard than in the past.

Regent Clusen noted a complimentary article in *The Chronicle of Higher Education* about United Council's lobbying efforts and congratulated Ms. Leahy on the professionalism of the organization's work.

Approval of Nonpersonnel Actions

Presentation on Aquatic Toxicology, UW-Milwaukee, pp 3-4

In introducing this presentation, Acting Vice Chancellor Watters explained that, due to time constraints at the Education Committee meeting the prior day, it had been held over to this time. Both of this day's presentations, he said, exemplify the sound faculty research and scholarship base that is necessary to undertake solutions to real world problems in the community. They integrate the research and service mission into instruction at all levels.

Chemistry Professor David Petering, a member of the faculty of the Center for Great Lakes Studies, presented slides to illustrate the following remarks:

The Marine and Freshwater Biomedical Core Center is funded by the National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences to explore and develop the use of aquatic organisms for the study of human environmental health problems. It is one of five such centers nationwide and the only one on the Great Lakes. Members of the Center come from a number of regional institutions including UW-Milwaukee, the Medical College of Wisconsin and UW-Madison to use the newly renovated laboratories at the UW System Great Lakes Research Facility.

Of particular note are the new aquatic animal quarters, designed to match in total environmental control what one finds in highest quality mammalian animal facilities. Control of variables such as water temperature, light period and intensity, and background noise level is necessary for reproducible biomedical experimentation. Researchers in the Center work on the mechanism of action of toxic heavy metals, industrial pollutants, pesticides and natural substances found in the environment. For example, a scientist from the Milwaukee Public Museum has discovered that fathead minnows are an excellent model to help define the behavioral abnormalities caused by low-level lead exposure in children.

New Center objectives include construction of a new aquatic biomedical center with the aid of building funds approved by the Board of Regents. In addition, a major proposal has been submitted to the National Institutes of Health in collaboration with the precollege education program and the Mathematics-Science Education Center of UW-Milwaukee to design innovative curriculum materials for middle school science based on the theme of environmental health.

Regent Gundersen inquired about establishment of a freshwater well, and Professor Petering said that negotiations remain ongoing.

In reply to a question by Regent Gundersen about PCBs creating damage to humans, Professor Petering said that there is evidence that PCBs have damaged the environment. There are data which show that in polluted waterways of this country, 50-90 percent of fish two years old have liver cancer.

Acting Vice Chancellor Watters introduced Assistant Professor Sally Lundeen who is Director of the UW-Milwaukee Nursing Center and the special project at Silver Spring Nursing Center.

Explaining that the Silver Spring project integrates the multiple university missions of education, research and service and exemplifies how the university can help to solve community problems, Professor Lundeen said that the School of Nursing has provided health promotion services to Metropolitan Milwaukee residents since 1979 through its Nursing Center. During the past five years, the Nursing Center has been focused on development and implementation of this innovative project in the Milwaukee inner city by integrating primary health care into existing community-based and trusted networks of social service and educational agencies. It also prepares future health care professionals to provide culturally relevant, comprehensive and holistic community-based care and provides ongoing leadership and consultation to other educators, to service providers and policy makers on a number of issues regarding implementation and evaluation of alternative modes of health care delivery and evaluation. During the past year, consultation has been provided to over 50 universities and service organizations across the country. Professor Lundeen then introduced Jean Bell, Clinical Coordinator and nurse clinician at the Silver Spring project.

Having received her master's degree from the UW-Milwaukee School of Nursing, Ms. Bell said that the Silver Spring Nursing Center project provides health care services to the young, truly disadvantaged, primarily African-American families who reside in a large housing project on the city's northwest side. A team of five nurse clinician colleagues, nursing faculty and students currently staff the Center over 50 hours each week and, last year, provided over 8,000 direct client encounters to area residents. Individuals and families are seen in a daily walk-in clinic, small educational group programs, community health screening programs and home visits. There are parents who are concerned about their ability to care for their children; pregnant teens seek support and prenatal care; young Black males who do not feel comfortable seeking care from more traditional care settings; children and teens who are ill or in crisis and need care and support; and elders who seek information and monitoring of chronic health conditions. They all are looking for guidance in how to cope better with health issues, to become healthier and to stay that way; and they have either no other source of care; or they encountered incredible barriers when attempting to access a physician. The staff leaves the clinic and goes to patients' homes, which exemplifies that the entire setting also has become an integrated, community-based, educational, clinical research setting which serves to better prepare professional nurses and other providers to meet the health care challenges of today and in the coming decades.

Sandra Plach, currently an intensive care nurse who is a UW-Milwaukee graduate student, shared her reasons for becoming involved in this program as being her belief that fiscal constraints have shortened hospital stays and created an even greater need for nurse-managed community care. She wanted to learn how to better meet the needs of acutely ill and recuperating patients in the community and to help people change their lifestyles, so they could prevent illness. Enrolling at the UW-Milwaukee School of Nursing because of its strong focus on community health, she sought the learning experiences offered by the Silver Spring Nursing Center to provide a broad education in nurse-managed community care and stated that she has been culturally enriched as a person and as a health professional. Learning the multiple roles of a community health practitioner through her duties at the Center, she has been mentored in the role of care giver, confidante, counselor, patient advocate and community liaison, has participated as a health care planner, has assisted in several major research projects, has learned how to enable those in the community to help themselves, through health screening, support groups and wellness groups, and has learned how to make nursing services more accessible, acceptable and relevant. She has been exposed to the sophisticated, multi-disciplinary collaboration that is essential for effective community care.

Dr. Norma Lang, Dean of the UW-Milwaukee School of Nursing, concluded the presentation by reinforcing her pride in the Nursing Center at the Silver Spring site. An invaluable resource for the faculty and students, it is a tremendous resource to the community as well. Originally funded with a \$650,000 federal grant, the Center currently is supported through a combination of financial arrangements, including state, county and city contracts, private foundation grants and some reallocation of funds within the Nursing School. The UW-Milwaukee Nursing School has been recognized nationally, and Dr. Lumdeen and her colleagues are sought out as consultants on issues related to primary health care throughout the country and have been asked to submit testimony at legislative hearings on health care policy issues. The Silver Spring Center has been selected as one of the six community nursing centers in the country to be presented to the United States

Senate Finance Subcommittee on Health, as exemplars of alternative, cost-effective, primary health care delivery models. Dr. Lang stated that many of the serious and costly health care problems of urban communities which affect the health care industry are directly related to lifestyle choices that are in turn related to issues of poverty, limited education and family structure. Solutions to these complex problems, she said, will be made by collaborative partnerships and expansion of the current efforts being made at the UW-Milwaukee School of Nursing.

Regent Clusen inquired about the current status of the doctoral program.

Dr. Lang said that 47 students currently were enrolled in the program, and twelve have graduated, far exceeding their expectations.

In reply to a question by Regent Hassett about payment for patient service, Dr. Lang said that there is a combination of payors. Professor Lundeen further noted that the cost-effective direct reimbursement to nurses is precluded in Milwaukee County because Title XIX clients are assigned directly to HMO providers. An arrangement currently is being pursued for subcontracts with a number of HMOs.

Regent Nicholas inquired further about the 12 funding sources, and Professor Lundeen replied that one major funding source would aid in the program's cost reduction and enable expansion to some innovative areas.

Regent Davis asked about the cost effectiveness of this method as opposed to a more traditional model.

Professor Lundeen said that 97 percent of the health care dollar goes to acute, long-term care, and that approximately 60 percent of the health care problems faced could be eliminated by a healthier lifestyle of the client.

Regent Krutsch asked if there are any initiatives available for helping people change lifestyles which lead to these problems, and Professor Lundeen replied that the entire model is predicated on a family-based approach with the nurse operating as primary caretaker and service coordinator. Focus is on family support systems for problems such as early pregnancy, child abuse and neglect, substance abuse and a variety of accidental homicides. The program is a combination of teaching, early identification and counseling with family units over a long period of time.

President Lyon thanked the presenters for an interesting overview of their program.

President Shaw reported on a telephone survey of peer institutions on expected pay increases for next year, which indicated that considerable uncertainty remained as to what final figures would be. At this time, he projected increases of approximately three percent in 1991-92 and five percent in 1992-93. Increases equal to peers would mean UW System salaries would remain behind peer medians.

Report of the Vice President

In his report to the Committee, Vice President Portch highlighted recent awards, honors and grants received by faculty and staff at UW institutions.

Planning to introduce an Academic Affairs staff member at each monthly meeting, he began with Associate Vice President Albert Beaver, who is a soil scientist with B.S., M.S. and Ph.D. degrees from UW-Madison. Dr. Beaver holds collateral appointments as Professor of Soil Science at both UW-Madison and UW-River Falls.

Research Paper on Characteristics of New Freshmen presented to Edn. Comm.

Presenting the paper, Vice President Portch noted that this year's freshman class was smaller than any other since merger, but also one of the most qualified. Admissions standards have increased, with 80 percent of the freshmen coming from the top half of their high school class, 44 percent from the top quarter and only 4 percent from the bottom high school quartile. He suggested that areas of concern, including remediation, minority enrollment and access be considered within the context of the Regent Undergraduate Education Working Groups.

Vice President Portch noted a reversal in the trend for Wisconsin students, with the proportion of grants now exceeding loans, although the level of indebtedness continues to be cause for concern.

The Committee was particularly complimentary of the quality of both research reports.

The Committee received a discussion paper on funding of sabbaticals, which had been requested at the December 1990 meeting. Vice President Portch considered this to be an interim report, for there are some issues that need further attention, including the issue of funding retirement benefits. The issue of equitable sabbatical opportunities among departments also merits further review.

Regent Gelatt, Chair, presented the Committee's report.

Regents - Audit Subcommittee

At a session to which all Regents were invited, the Audit Subcommittee of the Business and Finance Committee heard President Shaw outline the UW System's response to the Legislative Audit Bureau audit of faculty positions authorized in 1987. Central themes of the discussion were problems of imprecise definition and communication of the objectives for the faculty positions created in the 1987-89 biennial budget and inadequacy of section counts as the sole measure of educational quality and access.

Regent President Lyon asked the Audit Subcommittee to follow up on a number of management issues related to measuring course access and to the management of the allocation of teaching assignments among departments and courses.

Athletics - Report by UW-Madison Athletics Dept on cutting 5 sports, p.17

UW-Madison Athletic Department Budget

At a portion of the meeting to which all Regents were invited, the Business and Finance Committee heard members of the Athletic Board, Athletic Director Richter, students and Chancellor Shalala comment on the April action taken by the Athletic Board regarding the cutting of five sports at UW-Madison.

In discussion at the Board meeting, Regent Nicholas commented on the need for unity and urged that the Athletic Board decision be accepted as final. Stating his complete confidence in the leadership of the Athletic Department, he said the program is on the right track, and the leadership deserves the Board's support and encouragement.

Consent Agenda Items

Regent Gelatt presented Resolutions 5787-5791 which were approved unanimously by the Business and Finance Committee, and he moved their adoption by the Board of Regents as consent agenda items. The motion was seconded by Regent Vos and carried, with Regent Davis abstaining from the vote on Resolution 5787.

Resolution 5791: That the Board of Regents adopts the following policy with respect to collegiate licensing at UW institutions:

UW POLICY ON COLLEGIATE LICENSING

The Board of Regents recognizes the merits of collegiate licensing programs. In particular, licensing programs serve to: (1) generate funds to support student services, athletics, or other programs; (2) promote the positive image and identification of an institution; and (3) protect an institution's reputation, good name and image by permitting only appropriate uses and assuring that only quality products bear the institution's name and symbols. For these reasons, the Board of Regents supports the establishment of a collegiate licensing program at any UW institution, subject to the following guidelines. It is at the discretion of each UW institution to determine whether the establishment of a collegiate licensing program serves its interests.

Guidelines

To ensure that licensing programs are consistent with other UW policies and objectives, collegiate licensing programs at any UW institution should adhere to the following guidelines:

1. Exemptions

a. Retailer exemptions: As a general policy, UW institutions shall not exempt sales of licensed goods to some retailers from licensing fees and/or royalties, while charging fees and/or royalties on sales of goods to all other retailers. Exemptions for only certain retailers provide differential treatment and a competitive advantage to one set of retailers. Such policies are inconsistent with the UW Policy on Competition with the Private Sector. A UW institution shall charge licensing fees on sales to a bookstore it owns, operates or leases if the institution is charging licensing fees on sales to any outside vendors for the same items.

An example of a prohibited retailer exemption is a "geographic" exemption which exempts from fees and/or royalties sales to private sector vendors within a specified geographic area, such as the area bordering the institution's campus.

b. Consumer exemptions: Except as stated in d. below, UW institutions shall not exempt sales to some types of consumers from licensing fees and/or royalties, while charging fees and/or royalties on sales to all other consumers.

c. Product exemptions: UW institutions may exempt selected products from licensing fees and/or royalties. Examples of products that may be appropriate for exemptions include selected school supplies, which are bought primarily by students, and craft items produced by local individuals or shops.

d. Internal consumption exemption: UW institutions may exempt from licensing fees and/or royalties purchases for internal university consumption. All such purchases shall be from licensed manufacturers.

2. Use of Licensing Revenue

A UW institution shall use the revenue generated from collegiate licensing for programs or activities with direct benefits to students. Examples of programs with direct student benefits include student athletics and student scholarships.

3. Internal versus External Administration of Licensing Programs

Each UW institution that establishes a licensing program should determine whether it is more cost-effective to administer the program internally with university employees, or externally by contracting with an outside agent. Institutions shall seek the most favorable contractual terms possible with outside agent(s) and use these terms as the basis for a cost-effectiveness comparison with an internal program. Except for programs with minor activities, licensing programs shall be financed solely from licensing revenue.

Prior to entering into a licensing contract, a UW institution shall have the potential contract reviewed by UW legal counsel at the System Administration level. Any licensing contracts concluded by a UW institution must be reported to the Board of Regents.

4. Registration of Marks

Federal and state registration of any mark by a UW institution shall be in the name of the Board of Regents of the University of Wisconsin System.

5. Design Standards and Use Guidelines: UW institutions with collegiate licensing programs shall develop design standards and use guidelines and make them available to potential licensees.

6. Technical Assistance: The UW System Office of the General Counsel shall serve as the technical assistance contact point for the UW System for collegiate licensing. UW institutions shall report licensing disputes within thirty days to the System Administration General Counsel.

President Lyon expressed appreciation to Regents Schilling, Weinstein, Flores and Gelatt for their work on the licensing issue.

Regent Schilling requested a report in six months or a year as to the impact of the resolution and whether there was more or less licensing within the System.

The Committee also planned to oversee progress on resolving the dispute involving the UW-Madison licensing program and the University Bookstore.

Indirect Cost Report

In a report on funding of indirect costs for federal research grants in the UW System, Vice President Poellnitz informed the Committee of the method of calculating indirect costs and why they vary among institutions. Internally, the UW System is taking actions to ensure that non-allowable and inappropriate costs are not included. An internal audit of the federal indirect cost appropriation is scheduled, in addition to which the Legislative Audit Bureau, as part of its audit of the year-end financial statements and the federally mandated A-113 audit, will be reviewing federal indirect costs. The Committee was assured that, based on initial reviews, there is nothing in the UW System similar to the Stanford University situation.

Noting that overall federal funding has not kept the research infrastructure up to date, Regent Gelatt commented in Committee that it is unfortunate that this funding is now being called into question. The report indicated that Wisconsin is an exemplary institution in the handling of indirect costs, he noted, with a rate substantially lower than most peers.

Vice President Poellnitz outlined for the Committee the initial implementation plans of the Regents' Supplies and Expenses Task Force report. The Committee reminded System Administration that institutions are to be notified that a review of S&E funding requirements is to be a part of their standard five-year program reviews. A number of additional implementation plans will be presented at the June meeting.

Audit Subcommittee 1991-92 Internal Audit Schedule, p. 23

Reviewing this item, the Subcommittee asked for a copy of that portion of a 1986 Legislative Audit Bureau audit of System Administration which recommended that System Administration monitor the various System institutions more closely. This will be reviewed in light of the loss of auditor positions and falling behind on scheduled audits.

REPORT OF THE PHYSICAL PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

The Committee's report was presented by Regent Gundersen, Chair.

Consent Agenda Items

Presenting Resolutions 5792-5795 which were unanimously approved by the Committee as consent agenda items for action by the Board, Regent Gundersen reported that the Committee favored Option A in Resolution 5792, which provided for a one-year lease, with pursuit of office space alternatives to consolidate System Administration functions not located in Van Hise Hall. However, the Committee agreed that now might be an appropriate time for the Board to consider whether a single, consolidated location for all elements of System Administration might be the direction in which to move. The Board's position on such a proposal would be needed.

Upon motion by Regent Gundersen, seconded by Regent Vos, the consent agenda resolutions were adopted unanimously by the Board of Regents.

Option A will provide for the continued use of 20,155 square feet (SF) of office space at 1914, 1920 and 1930 Monroe Street facilities for a one-year period beginning July 1, 1991 through June 30, 1992. The one-year lease cost of \$264,031, or \$13.10/SF, represents a 12% increase in rental rate over the annual cost of \$234,820, or \$11.70/SF, of the current lease.

If Option B is exercised, the existing lease of space at the Monroe Street facilities will be renewed for a three-year period beginning July 1, 1991 through June 30, 1994, with two, one-year renewal options. Further negotiations between the Department of Administration, UW System Administration and the Lessor will be required to determine acceptable rental rates for each year of the initial three-year lease period and the potential renewal options.

The rental rates will include all utilities, taxes, services, insurance and maintenance of the facility. Additionally, the lessor will undertake various facility repairs and improvements, such as: recarpeting and repainting agreed-upon areas; installing an air lock door in the lobby; and remodeling, repairing or replacing the heating, ventilating and air conditioning systems, and insulating the ceiling area of the parking garage. This work will be scheduled with the concurrence of the affected UW System Administration offices and will be completed no later than October 1, 1991. Sixty-two, off-street parking spaces will be included in the lease.

City and County Operating Budgets for the UW Centers

Jan 1991, p. 25

This report, which described the continuing financial commitment that municipalities across the state are making on behalf of the UW Centers, showed that budgeted city and county expenditures for 1991 total nearly \$5 million, including debt service expenditures for seven of the centers.

Kunkle Day Care Center Tour

Regent Gunderson expressed appreciation to those who made the special arrangements for the tour of Kunkle Day Care Center and to the Center's staff for sharing their programming efforts with the tour participants.

Regent Committee - Presidential Search -

PROCESS FOR PRESIDENTIAL SEARCH

Procedure for Search and Selection Process *for show replacement R 5796, pp 26-29*

Presenting a paper entitled, "Options for a Search and Screen Process for a President of the UW System," Regent President Lyon noted that there was no predetermined protocol in law or Regent policy for the search and selection process. In 1979 and 1985, the Search Committee was composed of UW System administrators, faculty, academic staff and students appointed by the President of the Board. In 1976, the Search Committee was composed of Regents, administrators, faculty and students.

President Lyon then outlined three options for the search process: (A) A Search Committee of approximately 16 members composed of System administrators, faculty, staff, students and public members. The Committee would recommend the 10 most highly-qualified candidates to the Executive Committee, which would bring no fewer than three candidates to the Board of Regents for interview and decision; (B) A Search Committee of about 16 members, composed of the Regent Executive Committee, System administrators, faculty, academic staff and students, would recommend no fewer than three candidates for interview and decision by the Board of Regents; and (C) The Regent Executive Committee would function as a search committee, in consultation with an advisory committee, composed of System administrators, faculty, staff and students. The Executive Committee would submit no fewer than three candidates to the Board of Regents for interview and decision.

Under each option, an Executive Director would be employed to assist in the search process.

Regent Davis suggested a Regent retreat to discuss the attributes desired in the new President, and other regents agreed that a retreat would be useful.

It was noted by Regent Dreyfus that such a session would be open to the public under the state open meetings law, since individual candidates would not be discussed.

Regent Nicholas favored Option B because of his view that Regents should be involved from the start of the process. He also felt the process should move ahead as rapidly as possible.

Regent Schilling also favored Option B, with other Regents invited to participate if they wished.

Regent Krutsch concurred that Regents should be involved from the outset in the Committee membership and that other Regents should be encouraged to participate.

Regent Clusen considered it important that the Search Committee be a well-balanced and diverse group. For the position of Executive Director, she felt knowledge of higher education, of the University System, and of prominent people in higher education were key criteria.

President Lyon said his view was that the Executive Director would have been highly involved in higher education searches and would have the breadth of experience needed to be effective.

Regent Hassett commented that executive directors had been very valuable to searches in which he had been involved. Such professionals are in a position to contact people who might be excellent prospects but who would not become candidates without encouragement.

Regent Dreyfus felt the two key issues were protection of privacy of candidates and the matter of compensation. With regard to compensation, he thought the statutory limit might not apply to non-state funds and that, in any event, the time may have come when the Legislature would look more favorably upon non-state funding as long as there is willingness to be open about what funds are involved. As to the privacy issue, he felt that at some point in the process there might be declaration of candidacy, at which time finalists' names would become public. He believed that these two issues should be addressed early in the process.

Regent Schilling suggested that legal counsel be consulted as to the parameters concerning the points Regent Dreyfus raised. In addition, he suggested discussion with media as to how there could be meaningful disclosure in a manner which would not discourage candidates from coming forward.

In response to a question by Regent Vos, Regent President Lyon explained that in past searches, nominations for membership on the Search Committee were requested from the various System institutions and governance groups.

Replying to a question by Regent Gundersen, President Lyon expressed his preference for Option B, expanded to take into account suggestions that had been made.

Regent Clusen stated her opposition to giving so much power to the Executive Committee, which was composed solely of men and did not include minority members, particularly since the institutions were asked to ensure diversity in their search committees.

President Schilling thought that concern could be addressed by allowing other Regents to participate in the Committee's deliberations, as was the tradition on other committees.

In reply to a question by Regent Flores, Regent Schilling thought Regents not on the Committee should participate without voting, so as not to disturb the balance among faculty, staff, administrators, students and Regents.

Regent Gundersen did not believe that the Regent members of the Search Committee should necessarily be the members of the Executive Committee. Instead, he suggested empowering the Regent President to select Regents to serve on the Committee.

Regent Dreyfus thought the key question in selecting Regent members would be time availability and flexibility.

Regent Hassett moved adoption of Option B, with the President of the Board to appoint seven Regents to the Search Committee. The motion was seconded by Regent Nicholas.

Resolution 5796: That the following option be adopted as the procedure for structuring the search and selection process for a UW System President:

Appointment by Board President of a Search Committee (total size of about 16 members) consisting of seven members of the Board, System administrators, faculty, academic staff, and students to conduct the search and screen process. Appointments would be confirmed by the full Board.

The Search Committee would conduct the search by advertising, soliciting nominations, identifying and evaluating candidates. The Search Committee would be assisted by an Executive Director.

The Search Committee would determine the most highly qualified candidates and submit no fewer than three candidates to the full Board of Regents.

The Board would interview the candidates and make the final decision as to an appointment.

Regent Vos felt seven Regents would tend to dominate the Committee and have a chilling effect on other members. He suggested that five Regents would be an adequate number.

Regent Krutsch disagreed because of her view that Regents should have strong input from the outset in this critical decision. The other nine members would provide proper input from other groups.

Regent Dreyfus also disagreed, noting the Board's statutory responsibility for selection of the President. He thought a non-Regent majority on the Search Committee was itself a great concession of power.

Responding to a request from Regent Gundersen for his advice as to the process, President Shaw said he would recommend some variation of Option B. It was his belief, on the basis of experience in other searches, that Board members working with constituents on the Search Committee would have a unifying effect and would result in a better judgment. Regarding the number of Regents, he suggested that the Board President be given flexibility to appoint a Committee of 16-18 members, with 5-7 Regent members. With regard to attributes sought in a President, he felt a public discussion of this matter would be strained. This problem could be alleviated by having the Executive Director interview each Regent and provide a report which could be discussed by the Board.

Put to the vote, the motion was adopted, with Regents Vos and Vattendahl voting "No."

Regent Committee - Presidential Search

Authorization to Engage an Executive Director for the search, R 5797, p. 29

Regent Schilling moved that the Regent President be authorized to engage an Executive Director for purposes of this search, with involvement in the interview process by Regent members of the Search Committee. The motion was seconded by Regent Steil and carried unanimously.

Resolution 5797: That the President of the Board be authorized to engage an Executive Director for the Presidential Search, with the interview process to involve the Regent members of the Search Committee.

Terms of Employment discussed for new President, pp 29-30

Turning to terms of employment, Regent President Lyon indicated that change in statutory language regarding compensation would need to be addressed promptly.

Regent Davis stated his belief that a competitive salary should be paid with state monies rather than through use of private supplements. He also noted the need to consider the total benefit package, rather than salary only.

Regent Schilling suggested that the matter of a back-up appointment be decided at the outset, in order to avoid any misunderstanding on the part of candidates. He thought the Board should not seek tenure for the President, but instead make clear that what is offered is a back-up appointment similar to the one provided for President Shaw, which was a three-year rolling-horizon academic staff appointment with the title of Regent Professor. While a President could seek tenure as part of the Regent Professorship, he did not believe the Board announcement should make any reference to tenure, since the Board cannot grant such an appointment unilaterally.

President Shaw suggested that a five-year rolling horizon might be a more marketable package, particularly for candidates of an age at which they would not want to move to another presidency.

Regent Flores requested that the definition of a rolling-horizon appointment be provided.

With regard to salary, Regent Vos felt statutes should be changed to allow the President to be paid more than the \$116,000 state limit from private funds.

Regent Clusen requested a legal opinion as to whether it is or is not legal at the present time to supplement state salaries with private funds. She urged the Board to do everything possible to have the state salary increased and not to seek private supplements. She was proud of Wisconsin's record of not accepting private arrangements on the side.

Regent Dreyfus felt there would be nothing untoward about using university-raised private funds in combination with state funds for this exceptional position. The Legislature, he thought, would find a combination of funding easier to accept than a GPR increase alone, which would tend to have a ripple effect on other state executive salaries.

Regent Clusen wondered where the loyalty of a President would lie if a large portion of his or her salary came from an outside source.

Regent Dreyfus replied that loyalty would be to the Board of Regents as the appointing authority.

Regent Steil suggested that negotiation of the terms and conditions of employment be undertaken by the Search Committee.

Regent Nicholas felt that terms of employment should be flexible for purposes of effective bargaining. Secondly, he believed the salary should be raised considerably and that the increase should be funded with tax dollars.
