Friday Sept - 2 -

This afternoon Papa got two horses and took Sora and I out for a drive and we drove over to the farm houses just in time for supper. Sora was so happy when she found where she was that she could not eat any thing. She wanted such over and over time. And Ida was down to spend the day. Sat. Sept - 3 -

Aunt Bellia was down this afternoon and said they would be down tomorrow and take us horses to spend the day and we will be ready too for school means a good time for Sora and me.

She was out-walking tonight for a time and how happy she was over the moon and stars and every thing she saw in fact.

Sunday Sept-4 -

Grandpa drove down and took Sonja and I over home and Aunt-Carrie were going over too. Uncle Fred and Grandpa had Helen and Sara on the front-seat-with them and the two little ones kept them busy for they had a most-delightful time.

Monday-5 -

Aunt-Bertha was down this afternoon and told me that-Aunt-Carrie was all tired out-and that-little Morris was very sick so Sonja and I walked up there tonight. We found him quite a sick baby. He seems to cry most of the time.

How thankful I am that-Sonja is so well again. She would never dream from her looks she had a sick day this evening-

Tuesday Sept - 6 -

Mamma has not felt very well today. But the day is most over and I am glad, but Sora could not have done more to help me than she did for she has been such a good baby all the whole day long. It did seem to her that she realized that I did not feel very well.

Wednesday - 7 -

Sora does not sleep very well at night so we thought perhaps to take her for a walk each night after supper might tire her more for sleep. She has had such a walk for seven times <sup>and</sup>. I think it is helping her quite a little. Thursday - 8 -

It has been so rainy today and Sora could not go out any. This seems to be her greatest trial. Aunt Ida

was down a little while  
this afternoon and this  
helped to break up some  
lonely spell somewhat.

Friday Sept 9

This morning it rained  
quite a little but it cleared  
up nicely this afternoon and  
Hattie Reed took Sonja out-  
for a short time in her car.  
It certainly made a happy  
little girl out of my little  
Sonja.

Saturday Sept 10

Aunt Carrie's girl was down  
this afternoon and left Helen  
with me while she went  
out to do an errand nearby.  
The two little ones had such  
a good time playing together  
that it really did them good  
to watch them.

Hazel Cotton had George  
out for the first time today.  
She said she did not know  
it was so much fun.

and that she was coming  
again to take her for Sora  
was such a good baby to take.

Sun - Sept. 11 -

Today Papa took Sora and  
I out in a most lovely carriage  
and after driving around a  
little he took us over home.

I then gave Grandma a  
nice ride in the carriage.  
I took her down to call on  
Aunt Carrie and to hear how  
the baby could be. We were  
glad we went there instead  
of anywhere else for we found  
it not so well.

Mon - 12

Today while Sora has been  
a good little girl, I have not  
been at all well. Her Papa  
came home very early and  
took Sora out for a walk.  
She was as happy and  
entertaining as any human  
little person could possibly  
be. It made her happy to have

to have him with him  
this evening.

Wednesday -

I spent a very bad night  
but felt well enough to go  
out for a walk with Sona  
today. I went to Auntie  
Sophia's with her and she  
gave her a large orange to-  
carry home and she did  
carry it every step of the  
way too.

Wednesday -

Sona has been so very  
good all morning, has played  
outside so nicely all morning  
with her dolls and this  
afternoon Hattie had her  
out for a ride in her car.  
This evening she seemed very  
tired and said "Mama put  
me in my bed Mama".

Thursday Sept-15 -

Sona could not go out  
any this morning for it has

been raining all the time.  
But this afternoon it has been  
very pleasant - and she has  
been out - very much. This  
evening she took a long walk.

Friday Sept: 160

This forenoon Sora was  
very busy helping Mama  
for it was sweepin day  
and she always gets her  
little sweater and helps  
all she can. This afternoon  
I took her out - to see a little  
balay boy near by. The two  
babies had a good time  
together and played very  
nicely too. Aunt Carrie  
came down this forenoon  
for a short time and brought  
Mama two pairs of booties  
and a shawl she had made  
herself. Sora was fast-  
asleep while Auntie was here,

Saturday Sept-17

Sonja entertained herself  
very nicely this forenoon  
with her dog cat-and dolls  
and this afternoon Aunts Ida  
and Bantie came down and  
gave her a ride. Then she  
had a short walk with  
Hattie and a ride in her  
cab. She slept very well  
tonight.

Sunday Sept-18

This morning Sonja, Papa,  
and I had settled ourselves  
down in the yard with  
a large dish of warm pop  
corn when Uncle Fred came  
down and asked us to go  
over home with him to  
spend the day at Grandpa's.

We went and had a  
most lovely time as we  
always do. Sonja came  
home all tired out,

Monday Sept. 19

It was a little cold out-for  
Sona today. Soon after dinner  
we took a little walk and  
then a good nap and we  
both felt very much refresed.

Sona then had a ride in  
her little wagon with  
Rebekah Denham. She has  
a very good time with the  
little girls every day.

Tues - 20

Hattie took Sona out-for  
a ride in her little wagon  
after school tonight. I think  
Sona had almost rather  
draw her little dollies  
around in their cab than  
always take a ride herself.  
but I almost-dislike to  
use the little girls after  
they come, after supper we  
took a little walk.

Wed. Sep - 21.

This morning Sona spent  
awhile a little time decorating  
her kitty with ribbons.

He is as black as midnight,  
and she put yellow ribbons  
all around his neck. He  
looked rather gay when she  
got all through. Sona  
Cotton had Sona out this  
afternoon. After dinner  
today her Papa found an  
old dollie chain up in  
one of the cubboards and Sona  
was simply overjoyed  
with it. She plays with  
nothing else today.

Thursday - 22

It has rained all day and  
it has been very hard for  
Sona to stay in so much  
but I have done all I could  
to entertain her. There is  
one thing about Sona that

I am quite happy over and  
that is over the memory  
she seems to have. To me  
it seems quite remarkable  
for a child of her age.

Friday Sept. 23 -

This afternoon while Sora  
was asleep I redressed her  
doll, and she was simply  
overjoyed again. She took  
it out for a ride with  
herself in her cub, for Hattie  
came over to take them.

Hattie said she never let  
go of the little things for  
one moment - all the time  
they were out. She calls  
her doll Jessie Voeckler  
and loves her very dearly.

Saturday 24

Aunt Id, Britta, Carrie  
and little Helen were down

for a short-time this afternoon. It seemed good to have them here. Helen was quite disappointed to find Sonja out-for a ride in her cab with Hattie Reed. She called Sonja quite distinctly too. We could all understand her.

June - 25-

We did not go over to the farm house to spend the day today but-Aunt-Bertha came down here to stay with us. Sonja was so glad to have her Auntie here all day long-she would not let her go out-of her sight. This afternoon we were disturbed in our play by others coming in and yet we all had a good time together.

Monday Sept - 26

This morning it was very  
damp on the grass and  
Sora could not be out - very  
much but she made it off  
up this afternoon with her  
dolls and their cab. Uncle  
Henry came along - with  
his horse and carriage while  
she was out - in the yard  
and took her down to the  
creamery with him for a  
while. They said she had a  
big time down there.

Tuesday - 27

Aunt Ida came down to  
stay all night - with us and  
it pleased Sora very much  
to have her here too. She  
took a moonlight ride after  
supper which made her  
very happy. We took a  
little walk too.

Wednesday Sept. 28

Sona helped Mamie and  
Aunt Ida pick a duck this  
morning but she feared all  
the time it would hurt  
the poor headless duck. She  
is growing so cute. Says  
her little prayers at night -  
both in English and German  
so nicely. How I do love  
my little girl,

Thursday Sept. 29

Sona was a dear good  
baby today and I only wish  
the books would hold all  
the cute things she does  
from day to day. I have  
not felt very well so I  
could not do much today  
After supper she and I  
went down town to do  
some shopping and she  
had a good time for me

ran into Carrie down  
there and we did as much  
visiting as anything else.

Sora was good all evening  
too, but very tired.

Fridley Sept - 30

This morning Aunt-Bertha  
came in only for a very  
short time but it made  
Sora very happy and  
this afternoon Dorothy Soray  
came over. She is only  
eighteen months old but  
the two children had a  
good time on the lawn  
together. They played very  
nicely. Saturday Oct - 1

This forenoon Hattie Reed  
took Sora down town in  
her cab and then over to  
her house until now. But  
this afternoon Sora had

to be quiet - and stay in,  
for it rained too hard  
for her to be out on the  
grass or walk any.

Sunday Oct-2

This morning Grandpa  
came down and took Popa  
Sona and I over to the  
farm house and we spent  
the day there. Aunt-Carrie  
was there with her two  
babies and between all the  
three children no one had  
any rest - to speak of. Sona  
had such a big time that  
she came home cross and  
tired.

Monday -0

This has been a lovely day  
for Sona and I. We went to  
down to Aunt-Carrie's to spend  
the day and we did have  
a good time. The only thing

that went wrong was  
Sonia had her first very  
hard fall. She fell from  
a foot stool and struck her  
lip against the corner of  
a sharp chair. She cut it  
through but the doctor  
said it would be all right.  
She feels much better tonight.  
How we do love her looks.

Tuesday Oct. 3

Sonia spent most of her  
afternoon at Mrs. Reeder playing  
with Hattie dolls while  
she was at school. This  
afternoon Hattie had her out-  
in her cab. Uncle Herman  
called this afternoon to see  
how Sonia felt after her  
hard fall of yesterday, but  
he thought nothing could  
seem to have much effect  
on her for she was always  
happy.

Wednesday - 5 -

Sonja's Aunt - Sophie called this afternoon and found Sonja fast-asleep but she loved her just the same. She thought Sonja had grown faster than any of the little girls she knew of. She walked out with her dolls after her nap and would not ride in her cab with any of the little girls that called.

Thursday - 6

Papa's Aunt - Jessie came and took Sonja and I out for a long drive this afternoon. It did us all lots of good for we had a good ride and visit too. Little Hattie Red came and stayed to tea <sup>and</sup> it pleased Sonja very much. She talked and laughed away most of the time.

Friday Oct - 7

This morning Uncle Hannan  
came down and took  
Sona and I over home to  
spend the day while the  
rest all went to the fair  
but Grandma. They had  
a good time at the fair <sup>and</sup>  
Sona had a big time at  
Grandmas. She was glad  
to see new things and find  
new play things too. She  
did not sleep well though  
and that made her cross.

Saturday - 8

We did not go home last-  
night as we thought we  
would but stayed all at the farm.

Sona did not sleep as well  
as she does at home but had  
a good time every minute  
during the day. She goes  
down into the orchard and

every where with Uncle  
Harlan.

-Sun - 9 -

This morning Papa came over to the farm to spend the day and Sona was wild with delight at seeing him.

We are all going back home tonight. I took Grandma out for a nice drive this afternoon and Sona stayed at home with Papa and Cousin Helen.

Mon - 10

This afternoon I took Sona out with me to make a few calls. She was a very good little girl too. She played so nicely and unselfishly with the little ones she met.

Tue - 11

This morning Uncle Fred and Henry came in to dinner. It pleased Sona more

than I can tell. She does  
love company and gets very  
lonely when left alone  
only for a short time. She  
had two hard bumps today  
but did not make much  
fuss over them. Tonight  
she asked Mama to put her  
into her little bed almost as  
soon as supper was over.

The new little pants  
now and how proud she is  
of them too.

Wed Oct-12

This afternoon Aunt Carrie  
came down with Helen  
and Sona was so glad to  
see her if only for a little  
time. Sona uses her little  
chair so nicely now that  
I am more than glad. It  
has been very hard to get  
her used to it but I think  
I shall never have any more

trouble with her. & struck  
the worst-in over.

Tonight Emma Johnson  
came back to stay with  
us for some little I presume.  
Some seemed to know  
her the moment-she was  
here. Thursday Oct-13

Today it rained most-of  
the day and it was so  
damp and cold we could  
not go out-with comfort.

Today Grandpa and Uncle  
Roy came down on some  
business and stayed with  
us to dinner. Emma was  
nearly wild with delight  
when she found he was  
going to be here. She rushed  
around and brought him  
all her play things she  
could find. Uncle Fred  
surprised us today by

by sleeping in and stayed  
all night with us this  
was another pleasure for  
our little Sona -

Frid. Oct. 14

It has been raining the  
most of the day and I could  
not let Sona out until  
tonight. We took a little  
walk tonight before supper  
in hopes we would meet  
Papa but he was a little  
late and so we missed him.

Sona has been such a good  
little darling all this dreary  
day. How much comfort her  
Papa and I have taken with  
her so far in life and how  
much we look from each  
day to the other. We hope  
she may only be spared to  
us all our lives to love  
and to care for.

Saturday Oct. 15 -

This morning after Sona  
had her nap she spent most  
of the forenoon with Hattie  
Reed then this afternoon  
she was out in her cab  
with Emma and stayed  
until evening. Aunt Ida  
and Bertha were in a little  
while this afternoon but Sona  
was asleep. She awoke up  
rather cross but I think  
she does not feel at all  
well. Sunday Oct-16

This has been an ideal  
day for us for early this  
morning Grandma and  
Grandpa came down to  
spend the day with us.

Sona hardly knew what  
to do with her little self  
when she saw they were  
going to stay a little while.  
Grandma insisted upon

Papa taking Sona and I out - for a drive with their horse, so Papa took us over to the Prison Asylum to see the ruins of a terrible explosion they have had there a short time back.

Sona did not know the meaning of its terrible condition and so enjoyed walking about it with her Papa.

Sona cannot understand when she is with Grandmother why she does not walk about. She tries to find her missing leg. She says she has one, two, legs and Grandmother only one. She often tries to find it for Grandmother she says. After our happy day for us all they returned tonight - leaving us just a little blue for we miss them.

Monday Oct: 17

This afternoon Emma had Sonja out nearly all the afternoon in her cab while I did some fancy work for her that I had long tried to do. Emma seems to enjoy taking her for Sonja seems to enjoy going too much and everyone seems to enjoy seeing her too. We had another afternoon that our Uncle had died very suddenly yesterday to be buried Thursday 18. a.m.

Sonja came home and slept very well after her ride of this afternoon.

Tuesday - 18

This morning it rained but it cleared up this afternoon so that Sonja could take her afternoon ride as usual. Uncle Fred and Harry came in

to dinner and that-  
always more than pleased  
Sona. She has been very  
active and pleasant-tomorrow.

Papa has been very busy  
to get-ready to go the Uncle  
funeral tomorrow and also  
to visit-his father's home.

Wednesday Oct-19

It has been very pleasant  
but-rather cold all day. Sona  
played outside a little this  
morning. Her Papa left this  
afternoon on the four o'clock  
train. But-Uncle Herman  
came down after school  
tonight and stayed with  
us and will all night.

Sona could not understand  
why her Papa did not come  
home when the whistle  
blow for six o'clock. She  
always says "Now Papa come"

Tonight after supper Uncle  
Harman discovered she was  
cutting teeth. That - she had  
cut other large molars and  
another first - coming through.  
She will then have only  
two more to cut; she has  
done so nicely with cutting  
her teeth. That - I feel we  
have much to be thankful  
for. Thursday Oct-20.

This is my birthday and  
am thirty two years of age.  
Grandma did not forget  
it either for she sent me  
quite a little fruit and  
vegetables from the farm  
as she always does, and  
many good wishes for  
many more happy birthdays.

The rest of the day was  
quiet. It has been rainy  
outside and I have been

feeling very poorly. Papa  
has been away and I  
have felt rather lonly with  
him. I think Sora has  
missed him terribly too.

Uncle Harry came in  
tonight to stay all night  
with us and chit-chatted  
des quite a little.

Papa came home on the  
ten o'clock train tonight  
and told us all about the  
funeral. He told us all  
about Grandma and Grand  
Pa Voelker and the Fueles  
and Aunties. He reports  
a very pleasant time at  
his home. They are all  
very anxious to see Sora  
he says. They have never  
seen her and cannot imagine  
how she must look.

Grandma Voelker sent  
Sora a dollar for her little

bunk and also sent me  
a quilt - they had made  
theirs also for my  
birthday. It certainly  
pleased us both. They  
have been very kind to  
Sora and I thought we  
had never seen them.

Friday Oct 21

Papa brought Sora from  
Grand Rapids yesterday a  
pair of little rubbers. She  
thinks there never was  
anything quite so fine.

She has been out most of  
the forenoon and it has  
been damp and cold too,

She came in with rosy  
cheeks and an appetite.  
She could hardly wait  
for dinner. This after-  
noon Emma had her out-

in her cab again. She  
just had a big time Emma  
said. Tonight she would  
not go to sleep until she  
had a big time with her  
Papa. Saturday Oct-22.

It has been so damp &<sup>and</sup>  
cold and rainy part of  
the time today I could  
not let Sora sit very  
much, but she was over  
playing at Hattie a little  
this morning and then after  
dinner Aunt Bertha came  
down a little while and  
look Sora and I down to  
see Aunt Carrie and Helen  
a short time. We did  
enjoy the ride so much  
and enjoy at seeing them  
too. Queler Fred and

Henry and down to  
supper with us tonight  
and we were glad Henry  
came in for Sona does  
miss her Papa Saturday  
evenings so much always.  
She went to sleep very  
early tonight.

Sunday Oct. 23

While it has been very  
pleasant outside, it has  
not been what we call  
a perfect day for us for  
Papa had to be away from  
home most of the day.

Mr Bailey was buried  
this afternoon and this  
morning he visited several  
of his sick customers so  
that Sona could not see  
much of her Papa.

Sona and I went down

to visit Aunt Carrie a  
little while while Papa was  
at the funeral. Grandma  
and Grandpa were down  
there to spend the day and  
it made it very pleasant  
for us all. Papa declared  
after reaching home tonight  
that this had been our  
more day wasted. He  
would have been with us  
all day had he not been a  
paul banner for Mr Bailey.  
This evening we spent  
happily together -  
Monday Oct. 24.

Sonia has been very happy  
today. This morning she  
took her dolly in her  
little red wagon and  
started out for a little

then she soon forgot - all  
about wagon and doll and  
visited Grandma Reed and  
had a good time until  
she discovered her Papa  
had come home to do  
a little work and spend a  
little time at home. She  
then had to hurry home  
and help him or rather  
bind him. Then this  
afternoon she spent out-  
side in her little wagon  
with Emma. She soon  
woke up after reaching  
home and was delighted  
over a little cap and pair  
new shoes I had ready  
for her. Then after  
dinner it seems as if  
she never had a better

been playing with her  
Papa for about twenty five  
minutes. Tonight I  
could not get her to sleep  
untill he came home for  
the night.

Tues Oct - 24.

This has been one very  
rainy cold day. Some child  
not go out - except - for a  
very few moments this  
morning. But her Uncles  
Fred and Harry came in  
to dinner and that - always  
makes her very happy.  
Then tonight Hattie Reed  
came in a few minutes too.  
She entertained us all by  
the effort she made to keep  
her here. It was simply  
cute.

Wednesday Oct-25-

This morning Emma saw it snow for the first time that she can remember.

It hardly snowed enough for her to realize much was going on. But she thought it was cold she said. This afternoon of her little baby friends came in and they had a lovely time together. After their reparation Emma took her out for a ride in her cab. She came home much refreshed and had a lovely time. She saw her Uncle Hiram while out she said. She is very happy tonight.

Thursday Oct-26.

This morning we have been rushing around

getting ready to meet -  
our Grandma Voelker for  
the first time. She came  
this noon and Sona  
could not for the first  
few minutes realize that she  
should have a Grandma  
that could walk around  
out - the day more away  
and with night - she  
realized it more all the  
time. Her baby Uncle  
Stanley only eight years  
of age came with his  
Mamma and Sona was  
happy all day to have  
her here. We gave our  
Grandma a little tea  
this afternoon and invited  
in Harry's Uncle and  
Auntie. Sona was too  
sleepy to enjoy anything  
more and soon fell asleep

Friday Oct. 28

This morning Papa sent -  
a carriage and man to  
take us driving. Papa  
could not go as he was  
short-of help in the store  
so we went - with out him.

We had a very good time  
much better than we  
thought - we could have  
without out - Papa. Some coal  
scarcely wait - until we  
got out to Grandpas. We  
rode from ten o'clock until  
one and Sora slept most  
of the time. Grandpa  
seemed to enjoy the ride  
and also the horses and  
seemed to like herself  
to be obliged to return so  
soon. She returned for  
her honey on the four  
o'clock train this  
afternoon. We were so

much pleased with her  
found her so much  
nicer than we had ever  
imagined and hope to  
see her again sooner than  
we did before -

Saturday Oct 29 -

It has been such a very  
pleasant morning and  
Hattie came over after  
dinner early this morning  
to take bed out - for go  
ride in her car. There were  
quite a number of other  
babies out and some  
thought she had a most  
elegant time. She came  
in this noon all tired out  
then this afternoon she was  
determined to go out - with  
Emma when she went.  
So I feel as if she had  
had a good turn & plenty of air.

Sunday Oct- 30.

Last-night late about eleven o'clock Uncle Fred and Henry came in on the train and came up to stay all night with us we all were glad to see them though we were fast-asleep when they came. This morning Grandpa came down and took us all hunting with him. He held Soda all the way home and it pleased her very much.

The Rex dog was so glad to see her he kissed her hand and cheek. She has talked about that all day. She was glad to see Grandpa too. We always have a good time when we are at Grandmas.

Monday Oct- 31-

Sona has not felt very well all this day. She took quite a cold in some unknown way today and has been cross and sick as a result. She would not go out riding or walking this afternoon as much as she loves to but stayed in very close all day.

Tuesday Nov. 1 -

Uncles Fred and Harry were here this noon to dinner. It pleased Sona very much. I do not think her cold any better. She took more today I think. In the night she very nearly had the croup. It kept us all jumping for about an hour. She was out in her cage

this afternoon with her  
good nature with her too.  
Emma said she enjoyed  
it very much today.

Wednesday Nov. 2.

This morning Sora and I  
started out bright and early  
for a walk & it has been  
a most lovely day. We  
walked as far as Mrs. Beuging  
and while there she gave me  
a very handsome piping  
blanket for the little one  
that we expect soon. It  
surprised me completely  
and also pleased me most  
wonderfully. Howard her  
little baby and Sora had  
a most lovely time while  
together. We also stopped  
at Mrs. Just and Sora  
had a good time there

too. Then we started for home again and Sona was quite tired after we got back. Then Sona for the first time asked me to take down my hair. That she might brush it for me. I trembled quite nice too to think my little girl was old enough to really brush my hair -

We took another walk first before supper to meet Papa. She slept very well too.

Thursday Nov. 8 -

This morning we looked for Aunt Carrie down to spend the day with us and we heard yesterday that she would bring her

two babies with her. We were quite disappointed when noon came and still no winter and no babies. So after dinner I let Emma take Sora out in her cab and she thought it. Sora never had a better time when out with her. She came home fast-asleep and very much tired out with sleep and play.

Friday Nov. 4.

This has been a very pleasant day for Sora especially and for me too. This morning I sat on the porch doing a little fancy work and

the other babies beside  
Sona playing around me.  
It did me lots of good to  
see them how so much  
fun together. Then this  
noon Papa surprised us very  
much by bringing a horse  
and carriage to the door for  
Sona and I to drive all  
the afternoon. We had a good  
time too. We drove over  
home and to several other  
places. It did us much  
good especially to get so  
much fresh air.

Saturday - 5-

It has been raining and a  
very cold rain too, so that  
little people like Sona  
could not go out much of  
any. But Sona was so

lonely and disappointed  
at staying in so closely  
all day that this afternoon I  
took her across the road to  
visit with Dorothy Sora a  
little while. The two  
babies seemed to have such  
a good time together. In  
the evening she seemed quite  
contented and ready for  
sleep -

Sunday Nov-6 -

While this has not been  
the most-pleasant day of  
the year outside, yet it has  
been a most-lovely day  
for Sora and I for Popa  
could be home. It always  
seems like the shortest  
day of the whole week -

We have had a most-  
lonely time together too.

Sona has taken several

It has not been very hot  
pleasant today and I  
almost feared Sora could  
not go out much. But it

ready for fun in just  
one minute. They played  
so happy together while

Thursday Nov. 10

We have had our first  
very hard snow storm  
today. I saw the first

took her out again for a

Papa with her.

Monday Nov. 21.

It has been our lovely day and this afternoon I took Sona out for a short ride in her cab and brought her back asleep. She was very happy while out with me and it did me good to see her. One of the neighbor ladies was in when Sona woke up and it pleased her to see how good natured she was.

I also had a surprise this afternoon of a little blue sack for the coming little stranger from Aunt Grace and Uncle George.

It is very handsome and pleased me very much.

Tuesday Nov. 22 -

Sona can talk of nothing  
else but - Grandpas today,  
Thursday Nov. 24

Sona slept so very well  
last night that it pleased

to come and at last -

better last night.

Wednesday Nov. 30.

This morning I took Sona out - for a long ride in her sled. She fell asleep while we were out - and slept for a long time. It did her lots and lots of good. She has been very good natured too. Aunt Ida and Bertha were down this afternoon the first time for a long time and Sona was so pleased to see them too.

This afternoon Emma had Sona out - for a long ride too. She came in looking so well and refreshed.

Thursday Dec 1 - 1898.

I almost-dreaded to have them go back home for we were having such a good time. Sona seemed so playful this evening we could scarcely get her in time for her. She has been a very good baby not being out all

this day. Little Dorothy was

noon and they had a very

slept very much better than  
she has for some time  
before. Tuesday Dec-6-

this day so I could not  
let Sora go out again  
today. She has entertained  
herself quite well however.

in a few minutes and that  
made her forget her troubles  
for a little time. Her  
cold is growing slowly  
better I think and I am  
very glad for there is quite  
a little sickness around  
among the little ones -

Wednesday Dec 7.

Sonia has been a very happy baby today and I think her cold has somewhat better. I took her out this morning for a short ride in her sled and she had a good time though it was bitter cold. She did not sleep today so she begged to be put into her little bed early. Her Uncles Fred and Harry were here to dinner and it pleased her very much.

Thursday Dec 8

This morning we were very busy but she helped us do all the work as usual. After

divine I had her out-  
for a ride on her sled  
and she fell asleep and  
was very happy all  
afternoon. Hattie came  
in a little while this  
evening and ~~Sonia~~ had  
a big dinner -

Friday Dec 9-

Sonia has been quiet all  
this day. I had her out  
this morning for a short  
ride in her cab and she  
seemed to enjoy it very  
much. Uncle Harmon  
had but in her sled this  
morning for a short time.

He came home this  
morning saying school  
had been closed for  
the scarlet fever, we

are all very much  
frightened and cannot-  
help being because the  
trouble seems to be almost  
entirely among the younger  
children. We can only  
hope for the best.

Saturday Dec -10.

This morning Sora has  
been very busy helping  
me with the books. It  
being very cold out I  
have kept her in today.  
Her Papa put her to sleep  
before he left this noon  
and she rested well.

Sunday Dec 11

Today we all stayed  
quietly at home. Sora's  
Papa took her out after

dinner for a long ride  
in her cab. She came  
home fast-asleep. Her  
Grandpa and Uncle  
Fred were in just-a  
minute to see her. She  
was simply delighted.  
They were very sorry  
that we could not go  
home but it seems quite  
a good way for us  
to ride first now.

Monday Dec 12.

almost-gone. She came  
in from her ride this  
afternoon fast-asleep

Tuesday Dec-13

out this afternoon and fell  
asleep as usual and  
slept well after she came  
in too.

Thursday Dec 15-

now and it pleased us  
very much to see them.  
Sona was so delighted  
that she cried when they  
left. She loves her Aunts  
and Uncle so very much.

Friday Dec 16.

Grandpa was in only  
for a few moments

this morning. He thinks  
Sona is growing prettier  
every day of her life.

He hoped she would not  
get the fever he said. It  
seems to worry him  
quite a little. Sona was

that she scarcely knew

Sunday Dec-18.

come and he took us  
all out for a ride. We  
drove over hour and

them all. Sora enjoyed

any one in to see me of  
late and that makes it  
very quiet for Sora, more  
so than she enjoys.

Thursday Dec. 29

Grandma came down  
today to spend the day and  
to see the baby for the first  
time. She thinks my baby  
a very dear sweet-little  
boy, and she kissed him  
many, many times.

Sora for the first time  
in all her life went over  
to spend the day with her  
Grandpas without her Popa  
or Mama. They say she
