



MAX R. SPARGER, COMMISSIONER OF ATHLETICS



Max R. Sparger was named athletic commissioner of the Wisconsin State University Conference in July of 1971, succeeding Fred Jacoby.

Sparger, who has experienced a varied and successful career in athletics as a participant, coach, administrator and official, remarked at the time of his appointment:

"This is a very exciting thing for my family and me. It's a great opportunity and I am looking forward to the challenge."

A native of Wichita Falls, Texas, Sparger was a member of the UW-Stout athletic staff from 1959 to 1971 and athletic director his last two years there.

The Commissioner grew up in St. Paul Park, Minnesota, graduating from high school there in 1952. He earned his bachelor's degree in 1956 from Dubuque (Iowa) University, where he played football four years and was named captain and most valuable player his senior year.

Following graduation from college, Sparger coached high school and junior college sports in Fort Dodge, Iowa, leaving to join the Stout staff as assistant football and basketball coach in 1959. He received his master's degree in education from Macalester College, St. Paul, Minnesota, in 1961 and since then has done advance work at the University of Minnesota.

He became head football coach in 1963 and was selected to receive an award for "Outstanding Teaching" during that year. He guided the Blue Devils of Stout to a Conference Championship in 1965 after which he was named "Coach of the Year" in N.A.I.A. District 14. He gave up his football coaching duties after becoming athletic director in 1969.

Although football dominated his attention as a coach and player, Sparger's administrative duties keep him in close contact with all sports and he remains an enthusiastic backer of the Conference's varied program.

He credits the success of the W.S.U.C. to the capable and dedicated personnel on the nine campuses, saying, "We have excellent leadership at our member schools. This is our greatest asset. The faculty representatives, athletic directors, and coaches are top flight people."

Max and his wife, Eloise, are the parents of five children -- Michael, Jane, Tracy, Susan, and David. The Sparger's live at 713 Thomas Drive in Sun Prairie.

TOM BUTLER, SPORTS INFORMATION DIRECTOR



Tom Butler joined the W.S.U.C. staff part-time May 1, 1967, to assist the Commissioner with the dissemination of sports information. The Madison native was born May 19, 1924, and graduated from East High School in 1942; and after a semester at the University of Wisconsin, entered the Navy on January 25, 1943, serving until February 18, 1946.

He re-enrolled at the University of Wisconsin and received a B.A. degree in journalism in January of 1950. After working as sports editor of the Stevens Point Daily Journal and the Daily Jefferson County Union (Fort Atkinson), Butler joined the Wisconsin State Journal as a sports writer on February 1, 1953. His duties there include covering University of Wisconsin football and basketball. Butler was named Sportswriter of the Year in Wisconsin in 1964 and 1965 and was nominated for the honor five straight years. He and his wife, Bonnie, have five children -- Terence, Kathleen, Jeffrey, Jayme, and Peggy. They live at 636 Sheldon Street in Madison.

GENE CALHOUN, SUPERVISOR OF OFFICIALS



Gene Calhoun, a veteran Wisconsin athletic official, became supervisor of Wisconsin State University Conference officials in 1966. He has more than 25 years experience in officiating.

Calhoun, a Madison native was born October 15, 1924, graduated from Madison East High School in 1941, served in the Army Air Corps during World War II, and is a retired Lieutenant Colonel in the Air Force Reserves. He earned his bachelor's degree from the University of Wisconsin in 1947 and his law degree in 1950. He is a practicing attorney in Madison.

Formerly freshman baseball coach at the University of Wisconsin, Calhoun also has represented many Badger athletes pursuing professional careers. He began officiating in 1947 and has worked in the Big 10 since 1963. He was the referee in the 1968 Rose Bowl game between Indiana and Southern California, the 1971 Cotton Bowl game between Notre Dame and Texas, and the 1974 (December 31, 1973) Sugar Bowl game between Alabama and Notre Dame. Gene and his wife, Louise, live at 4014 Zeno Street in Madison with their two children -- Gary and Kim.

CONFERENCE SCHOLAR-ATHLETE AWARD

PREVIEW 1974 FOOTBALL SEASON
WISCONSIN STATE UNIVERSITY CONFERENCE

Defending champion La Crosse is given a slight edge over the field in what Wisconsin State University Conference football coaches expect will be a close title race in 1974.

Overall Conference balance seems to preclude declaring any team a decided favorite, according to the consensus of opinion among the coaching fraternity.

For instance, Stevens Point Coach Monte Charles points out, "Every year the Conference improves and all teams have a chance at the title".

Of course, La Crosse, Whitewater, Oshkosh, and Platteville always receive strong support as front-runners but no team ever can afford the luxury of overconfidence when going against any Conference opponent.

There's an old bromide that starts out, "On any given Saturday, etc." Originally it was used to describe the balance in the Big 10 Conference but with the emergence of Ohio State and Michigan as perennial co-champions, NFL publicists have picked up this adage as their own.

The old "saw" also could be used as a preface to the Wisconsin State University Conference schedule. As Stout Coach Sten Pierce explains, "The strength of our Conference is balance. Any team on any given day can beat another."

Here's an example of the way things can go in the WSUC football race: Whitewater traveled to Superior early in the 1973 season and demolished the Yellowjackets, 42-14. Later Superior upset Oshkosh, 28-27, on the Titans' home grounds.

So, dethroned unceremoniously and the victim of three straight defeats, Oshkosh closed the season at Whitewater last November 10. Although embarrassed and disconsolate, the Titans did anything but roll over and play dead. Instead they stung the Warhawks, 24-6, with their best performance of the season.

This example also tends to support the contention of Stout's Pierce, who points out, "The greatest strength is that our athletes play the game because it is fun and that educational goals are the dominant figure".

On paper, though, La Crosse possesses the balance and experience to make another strong run at the championship with energetic Coach Roger Harring again guiding the way.

Defense should be the Indians' forte, led by All-Conference defensive tackle Larry Wisniewski. Solid, if not overpowering running backs and receivers will provide adequate scoring punch. Included in this group is All-Conference end Dave Saeger, who caught 26 passes for an average gain of 17.5 yards a completion last fall.

The Conference's leading rusher, Tom Jakubowski of Platteville, and the top pass receiver, Stevens Point's Jeff Gosa, will be bidding to improve on last year's performances. The two also shared the scoring title with 42 points.

Stevens Point quarterback Mark Olejniczak, the Conference's passing and total offense leader, has graduated but Point backers are confident Charles will come up with an adequate replacement.

"Our players have really worked during the offseason," Charles says. "They want to be good and this will pay off."

Much of Oshkosh's success will depend on the development of a quarterback, according to Coach Russ Young, while River Falls' Mike Farley, always the optimist, enthuses, "The Falcons eagerly await '74!"

First year Head Coach Bob Seamans, who replaces Gil Krueger at Platteville, sounds an ominous warning, though, contending "La Crosse and Whitewater have the experience, size, and speed to make it a two-team race".

PROSPECTS FOR 1974

The search for a quarterback continues in earnest as Blugold Coach Link Walker attempts to replace graduated Tom Bauer, who last fall finished second in Conference passing and total offense. Bauer influenced Eau Claire football fortunes for five years, even when he injured a knee and missed the 1972 campaign.

The only returning quarterback with experience is Greg Hoffman, a 5-10, 200-pounder who filled in for Bauer during the latter's one-year sabbatical. Hoffman's consistency as a passer is suspect and Walker might find himself delving into the ranks of newcomers. The Blugolds return a big offensive plus in running back Mark Anderson, who ranked sixth in the Conference rushing last fall.

Among key lettermen lost with Bauer are All-Conference center Ken Bergeson; Steve Cooley, the second leading pass receiver in WSUC history; All-Conference end Steve Woletz; and Tom Grossklaus, an outstanding offensive tackle. Replacing Bauer and rebuilding the offensive line are major problems confronting Walker.

Twenty-one lettermen return, including five offensive starters and seven defensive regulars from the team that finished 4-4 in the Conference and 5-5 overall in 1973. While the Blugolds are hurting in the so-called skilled positions, the defense shows a strong nucleus with guards Dave Bielmeier and Phil Martinelli, tackle Len Luedtke, linebacker Steve Martin, and halfback Craig Hinke.

PROSPECTS FOR 1974

The Indians stand an excellent chance of repeating as Conference champions and are eager for another crack at the NAIA playoffs after losing to Elon College, 35-24, at Burlington, N.C., last fall in the Division I semi-finals. Returning from that team are 34 lettermen, including six offensive regulars and eight from the defense.

At least 12 key lettermen graduated, including quarterback Joe Wagner, linebacker Mike Curtis, and two All-Conference performers, offensive guard George Elkinton and defensive back Tom Dufault. Actually, three seniors graduated from the defensive backfield and this area, along with the quarterback, are the biggest voids to fill for Coach Roger Harring.

The strengths lie in an able receiving corps, led by All-Conference flanker Dave Saeger, and running backs Mike Hammes, Art Kasper, and Harvey Woodard. Saeger caught 26 passes in eight Conference games last fall, averaging 17.5 yards with each reception. Kasper averaged 4.8 yards a carry and 74 yards per game rushing.

The defensive front four returns intact, headed by All-Conference tackle Larry Wisniewski. Seven freshmen won letters last fall, including Ron Myhra, who finished among Conference leaders in punt and kickoff returns. Considerable help also is expected from fullback Chuck Burke, quarterback Chris Haugen, and halfback Dennis Grusnick, who led the freshman team to an unbeaten season.

PROSPECTS FOR 1974

The Titans are trying to recapture the championship they won in 1972 and saw slip away early last fall. Their play became erratic. For instance, they dropped a 28-27 decision at home to Superior and a week later closed the season with an impressive 24-6 victory at arch rival Whitewater.

Coach Russ Young, starting his 12th year as Titan head man, hopes his team can fit the pieces together earlier this year. Key to his Veer-T offense is hard-running Dan Feldt, who ranked fourth in Conference rushing last fall and averaged five yards a carry. However, Tim Vander Velden, the other half of Oshkosh's potent running tandem and second in the league last fall, has graduated.

Also missing is quarterback Pete Koupal, fourth in Conference passing and total offense in 1973, along with offensive tackle Ron Leichtfuss, and a pair of All-Conference defensive performers--tackle Jeff Waukau and cornerback Brian Zuhse.

Much will depend on the development of a quarterback and offensive line, according to Young. Team speed has improved both offensively and defensively. The secondary has played together almost intact for a year and linebacking ranks with the best in the Conference. Young considers Scott Kronenwetter the finest linebacker in the league, Feldt among the top running backs, and Gary Wild the most exciting punt and kickoff return man.

PROSPECTS FOR 1974

The Pioneers have the only new coach in the Conference this season, Bob Seamans, who succeeds Gil Krueger, now guiding football fortunes at Northern Michigan. Seamans, an assistant under Krueger, plans no major changes but figures the team will take a certain amount of time adjusting to a new coach.

Krueger's teams figured in three championships during his five years at the helm so Seamans has a tough act to follow. He has some capable performers among 26 returning lettermen, including three All-Conference players--halfback Tom Jakubowski, middle guard Ray Jackson, and linebacker Jerry Ring. Jakubowski was the Conference's leading rusher last fall, averaging 4.2 yards a carry and 100 yards per game.

Missing from the 1973 team that finished second with a 6-1-1 record and 8-1-1 overall are defensive end Bill Vander Velden, last year's most valuable player, and quarterback Bud Nystrom, who passed for 10 touchdowns in eight games. Also gone are All-Conference defensive back Guy Nelson, and outstanding pass receiver Mike Perteete.

Seamans considers the search for a quarterback and wide receivers his priority items heading into pre-season practice. Gary Pedley, a 6-1, 193 senior is the only quarterback with any previous experience. Adequate replacements at defensive end and halfback as well as tight end also are needed for the Pioneers to rank as contenders.

PROSPECTS FOR 1974

The Falcons haven't won a WSUC championship since 1958 and every team in the league except Superior claimed a title during the intervening years. Coach Mike Farley confidently predicts his team will finish in the top three this season and admits he eagerly awaits the campaign.

Sixteen starters return among 35 lettermen, eight from each of the offensive and defensive platoons. The Falcons finished 3-4-1 in the Conference last fall, their most lopsided loss being to eventual champion La Crosse, 21-6. Farley considers "being in every ball game in '73 and developing a new positive attitude that has the players believing in themselves" team strengths this year.

A potent Wishbone attack vaulted the Falcons among the Conference rushing leaders last fall, when they averaged almost 200 yards a game on the ground. But, inadequate passing caused an imbalance in the offense that created problems as the season wore on. Developing a "precision passing attack" is one of Farley's principle goals.

Retaining their strong rushing game could be a problem with the graduation of running backs Doug Vezina and Jim Lohman. All-Conference tackle Paul Cudd returns to provide some Wishbone blocking, while juniors Rodger Weyman and Tom Linehan get the first crack at trying to provide needed passing from the quarterback spot.

PROSPECTS FOR 1974

Coach Monte Charles continued his rejuvenation of the Pointers last year but the team still wound up seventh and far out of the running. They presented a crowd-pleasing wide open attack but most of the offense was negated by a porous defense. The problem this fall will be to generate the same kind of attack but stop opponents more consistently.

Charles this year is searching for a new quarterback to replace Mark Olejniczak, whose passing had a great deal to do with establishing 22 school and 15 Conference records in 1973. Olejniczak averaged more than 40 passes a game and his 350 attempts, 179 completions, and 2,209 yards are Conference season records.

Whoever replaces Olejniczak has the Conference's leading receiver back as the major target. Jeff Gosa caught 49 aerials for 671 yards and seven touchdowns as a freshman last fall. He is one of 32 lettermen back.

Point's rushing was almost non-existent. The Pointers managed only 195 yards on the ground all season. This can be deceiving, though, because even Charles' running game is predicated on short passes. Shoring up the defense remains a major problem. While scoring fairly well, the Pointers also gave up 56 points to Eau Claire, 37 to Whitewater, and 35 to Oshkosh.

PROSPECTS FOR 1974

Coach Sten Pierce struggled through a losing season last fall. The Blue Devils finished last in the Conference, winning only one of eight games, and wound up 1-9 overall. He feels a major problem confronting the coaching staff and squad will be a rededication to a winning effort following last year's disappointment.

Nothing helps rededication and morale like a contingent of big, tough people up front and that's the major challenge facing Pierce and his staff. They must find competent linemen, both offensively and defensively. Best of the returnees is senior offensive guard John Miller.

The Blue Devils return 35 lettermen, including 10 offensive and nine defensive starters, but those come from a last place team, and overcoming the losing stigma remains a major obstacle. The biggest void in the lineup was left by the graduation of running back John Osmanski.

Still, Pierce lists "good team speed, balance, and outstanding receivers" as pluses in his announced bid for a first division finish this season. Of those returning lettermen 16 are sophomores, who won their spurs at a tender age in 1973. Among this group are quarterbacks John Elkin and Gary Johnson, who shared that difficult assignment as frosh. The receiving corps is headed by junior Bill Kyle, who caught 34 passes last fall. Jack Voigt returns to the defensive secondary.

PROSPECTS FOR 1974

The Yellowjackets haven't won a Conference football championship in 28 years and that goal appears unlikely again this season, but Coach Ed Bender is confident his team can produce a winning record in 1974. Bender is starting his third year at the helm after the Yellowjackets finished ninth in 1972 and eighth last fall.

Edging into first division is a more realistic goal and Bender hopes the 38 returning lettermen, including 10 offensive starters and nine from the defense, bring enough experience and moxy to attain that objective. Returnees include last year's quarterback, Frank Lee; Mike Raskovich, the team's best rusher in 1973; and Gary Beckman, who led the Conference in punt return average with 12.1 yards.

Probably the most potent offensive weapon returning is split end Jerry Uchytil, who has ranked among Conference leaders the past three seasons. He led the league as a freshman in 1971 with 43 receptions for 829 yards, the latter a Conference record. He was fourth in '72 with 39 catches and fifth a year ago with 29. He needs 32 receptions and 188 yards this season to eclipse WSUC career records of 142 catches and 1,885 yards.

Bender can field a hefty forward wall on defense with the likes of 6-1, 260 John Beck, 6-1, 240 Oscar Hampton, and 6-2, 230 John Nye at tackles along with 6-1, 220 Greg Knoll and 6-5, 220 Tom Milanovich at ends. But, the Yellowjackets were shut out in three games last fall and they need to generate some offense most of all.

PROSPECTS FOR 1974

The Warhawks are perennial contenders who expect to be among the leaders again this season because the offensive unit returns almost intact. The Warhawks last figured in the championship in 1969 when they shared the crown with Platteville. A pair of 14-14 ties with Platteville and a 16-15 loss to eventual champion La Crosse dropped them to third at 4-2-2 last fall.

Quarterback Ed Nowell heads 32 returning lettermen and the senior has a highly competent backup man in junior Rich Murphy. Nowell completed almost 62 per cent of his passes last fall and threw for 11 touchdowns. Also returning to the offensive are 6-3, 230 fullback Kerry Larsen and 5-10, 195 halfback Jeff Hanaman.

Halfback Bill Roper, who averaged five yards a carry as the Warhawks' top rusher last fall, is gone, along with such outstanding defenders as All-Conference Jim Walters, Bob Behnke, and Gary Phillips at tackle, and backs Mark Dennis and Dan Ditter. Also gone is kicking specialist Mike Capodarco, who left with Conference career records for field goals, 13, and conversions, 73.

Rebuilding the defense is the major project facing the Warhawk staff but Coach Forrest Perkins earned a reputation for fashioning strong defensive units. While the defense matures, the offense should be able to keep the Warhawks in contention, particularly with people like split end Roger Gename, second in pass receiving last fall with 37 catches.

PREVIEW OF 1974-75 BASKETBALL SEASON
WISCONSIN STATE UNIVERSITY CONFERENCE

"Eau Claire against the world" seems to emerge as the lament of rival Wisconsin State University Conference basketball coaches at the start of each season.

The coming campaign appears to be no exception. Following Coach Ken Anderson's orientation season, the Blugolds have been perennial champions for the past five years. After winning three straight titles, they shared the crown with Whitewater the past two years.

"Eau Claire and Whitewater are defending champions and would have to be rated the favorites", is the way Stevens Point Coach Bob Krueger sums up the situation.

Oshkosh Coach Bob White says, "Whitewater and Eau Claire appear to be the top teams but La Crosse also should be a contender".

"Eau Claire!" is the succinct response of River Falls Coach Newman Benson.

Anderson, though, while quietly preparing to run his string of championships to six, insists, "Whitewater, Platteville, Stout, La Crosse, and Oshkosh all have good nucleuses returning, which means the Conference will have good overall strength".

Coach Eli Crogan, whose rebuilding efforts have paid such handsome dividends at Whitewater, agrees that "Eau Claire, Platteville, La Crosse, and Oshkosh all have a lot of experience coming back".

Anderson concedes the Blugolds should be in contention again despite the fact he has no All-Conference performers returning. Veterans Romie Thomas, Ken Kaiser, and Rich Reitzner, though, bring strong credentials into the 1974-75 season.

The Blugolds are 86-10 in Conference play since Anderson became head coach and 75-5 against league opponents during the past five years. Don't shed any tears because Anderson has no All-Conference players back. Two years ago he lost his entire starting lineup and still got a piece of the 1972-73 championship.

Five of the 10-man All-Conference team were seniors. Platteville experience the most critical loss with the graduation of Steve Kundert, the league's most valuable player. Others gone are Eau Claire's Ralph Rasmussen and Randy Wade, Stevens Point's Bruce Weinkauf, and Stout's Bill Lyons.

Whitewater needs backcourt help but two-thirds of its front line returns -- the Grimes twins, All-Conference stars Garry and Larry.

Superior has the Conference's defending scoring champion in Lafayette Collins, who won the title as a freshman, and Coach Terry Krause figures the Yellowjacket chances hinge on "how much our freshmen have grown up over the summer".

High-scoring Eric Haug and improved Larry Halverson form the nucleus at La Crosse, while Oshkosh will depend heavily on center Greg Holmon, the Titans' most valuable player last season and the Conference's defending rebound champion.

Most other teams are rebuilding, searching for the key that will end a domination that started with Eau Claire and more recently has included Whitewater.

PROSPECTS FOR 1974-75

Every year opponents expect the Blugolds to falter but it never seems to happen. Coach Ken Anderson has guided his teams to the championship or a share of the title five straight years. Last season the Blugolds tied Whitewater for the WSUC crown and represented NAIA District 14 in the national meet at Kansas City for the fourth time in five years.

Anderson has seven lettermen returning from this outfit that compiled an overall record of 24-5 last season, including 1973-74 starters Romie Thomas, Ken Kaiser, and Rich Reitzner. Thomas, a 6-3 senior guard, finished eighth in Conference scoring last season with a 15.2 average.

Two All-Conference performers will be missing from the lineup, center Ralph Rasmussen and Randy Wade, who played forward or guard. Rasmussen averaged 13.5 points and 12.2 rebounds, the latter statistic ranking him second in the WSUC. Wade contributed 12 points, almost seven rebounds, and five assists a game.

Newcomers to watch are Jeff Lund of Antigo and Guy Rossato of Eau Claire Memorial, both All-Staters. Anderson, starting his seventh season as head coach, has led the Blugolds to an 86-10 record in Conference play and expects the current group to contend also.

PROSPECTS FOR 1974-75

Youth, enthusiasm, and Eric Haug are principal attributes as the Indians head into the 1974-75 basketball season under Coach Burt McDonald. They hope to improve on a fifth place finish (7-9) and last season's overall 13-11 record.

Haug, who won the Conference scoring championship two years ago as a sophomore, finished fourth last season with an 18.4 average and was named to the all-WSUC team for the second straight year. The 6-6, 185-pound forward also was voted La Crosse's most valuable player by his teammates.

McDonald lost two lettermen due to graduation, Mark Thibodeau and Dave Holmes, but nine veterans return, including 6-7 Larry Halverson, 6-7 Merle Oelke, and 6-6 Gerry Wenzel, who gained considerable experience as freshmen and are expected to contribute much this season as sophomores.

Halverson, a sharpshooting center, finished 19th in Conference scoring with an 11.8 average and led the WSUC in field goal accuracy, making 69 of 126 shots for .548. But, he managed only 6.5 rebounds a game and McDonald is searching for more height and rebounding strength, plus a playmaker in the backcourt to go with the scoring potential of Haug and Halverson.

PROSPECTS FOR 1974-75

The Titans haven't won a Conference basketball championship since putting titles back-to-back in 1967 and '68. Coach Bob White, a 10-year man as head coach, starts this season with eight returning lettermen from a squad that finished sixth in the WSUC at 6-10 last season and wound up 9-15 overall.

Included in the list of returnees are three starters, headed by most valuable player Greg Holmon, a 6-6, 200-pound center who led the Conference last season with an average of 16.9 rebounds a game. Holmon's rebounding prowess remains the major asset on this year's squad.

In order to contend, though, White's Titans must sharpen their shooting eyes and shore up a defense that allowed opponents 75.6 points a game last season. The Titans feature a fastbreak offense that Holmon's rebounding triggers. But, the Titans must throw up a tougher defense and then hit their shots consistently at the other end.

Principal help is expected from a couple sophomores who sparked the freshman team last season, 6-3 guard Larry Carpenter and 6-4 center Jim Clay. Carpenter averaged 21 points a game with the frosh, while Clay contributed 15 points and 15 rebounds for the yearlings.

PROSPECTS FOR 1974-75

The Pioneers lost some high caliber performers off their third place team of last season but there is confidence from Coach Dick Wadewitz on down that the psychological boost from a winning record during 1973-74 will generate enthusiasm which could produce another successful campaign.

Most difficult vacancy to fill was created by the loss of 6-5 forward Steve Kundert, who capped his career by being named the WSUC most valuable player for 1973-74. Someone must be found to pick up the slack from his 21.3 points, second in the Conference, and his eight rebounds a game.

Also gone are reliable performers Bruce Gibson and Doug Knutson, and now Wadewitz must find replacements in the front line who can generate some scoring. Sophomore John Krajewski, a 6-5, 200-pounder, is the leading candidate.

The Blue Devils seem capable of rising to the occasion and whipping any team on a given night, as they did last season in a 98-81 victory over co-champion Eau Claire. Now, though, Coach Dwain Mintz is striving for consistency, so his team can end the Blugold-Whitewater domination of basketball in the Conference.

For instance, Sandy Beasley from last season's freshman team, could provide considerable help on the boards.

On the bright side, the squad shows more overall experience which should enhance teamwork. The bench is stronger with more depth at all positions. Mintz conceded, "The Blue Devils are a questionmark. If we get super improvement out of three of our players, we could be in the running."

Superior finished eighth in the Conference last season with a 3-13 record but a feeling persists around the league that the Yellowjackets are on the rise. For instance, Stevens Point Coach Bob Krueger pointed out, "If Superior comes up with a big man to go along with their two fine freshmen, they could be very competitive".

The "two fine freshmen" to whom Krueger refers are 6-0 guard Lafayette Collins and 6-5 forward Jim Happ. Collins took the Conference by storm, leading all scorers his first season with 422 points and a 26-4 average. Happ ranked sixth in the league with a 16.8 mark.

PROSPECTS FOR 1974-75

The Warhawks have shared the Conference championship with Eau Claire the past two seasons and Coach Eli Crogan, who has rebuilt Whitewater basketball so dramatically, needs some staunch replacements to continue the high caliber performance his clubs have displayed during those successes.

Gone are 6-6 Bob Stone, a sensational leaper, along with guards Tom Van De Bogart, Elmer Polk, and Hugh Gnatzig. Stone led Warhawk scoring last season with a 15.3 average while also hauling down 9.3 rebounds a game.

On the credit side of the ledger is the return of the Grimes twins, Garry and Larry, who will man the forward positions again in this their senior year. Larry averaged 14.9 points and 7.7 rebounds in the Conference last season, while Garry accounted for 13.6 points and 9.3 caroms. Both earned All-Conference recognition and hold the key to this season's success.

Crogan must rebuilt the backcourt from scratch and retain the quickness and defensive strength which have been hallmarks of his four years at the helm. Ken Peyer and Jeff Vorwald probably will get first crack at the guard spots. Newcomer Gerland Coleman, a 6-6, 205-pounder, should pick up considerable slack in the front line.
