
A Talk on

Namibia achieved political independence from South Africa on March 21st, 1990, after more than a century of colonial rule by South Africa and Germany. Mr. Ngatjizeko played an active role in the liberation struggle and was imprisoned twice by the colonial government. He will speak on the role of the Church, labor and students in Namibia's liberation struggle and the challenges facing post-colonial Namibia. Mr. Ngatjizeko is treasurer of the Council of Churches in Namibia.
