

BIENNIAL REPORT

OF

HONORABLE EMANUEL L. PHILIPP,

Governor of Wisconsin.

SIR:—We have the honor to submit in compliance with law, our biennial report of the transactions of this department for the two years ended June 30, 1920.

Section 24.39, Wisconsin Statutes created by Chapter 454, laws of Wisconsin 1917, empowers the Commissioners to lease parcels of the public lands. Under that Section there have been quite a number of leases executed for pastures and hay meadows, and small lots on shores of northern lakes for summer homes and hunting and fishing lodges. Before revision of laws of 1917, relating to State Forest Reserve, the State Board of Forestry had made several leases of public lands for terms of ten to twenty years. These leases we have recognized as valid and annual payments of rent therefrom have been collected and paid into proper funds. Leases granted the last two years have more than doubled so that the fees for such leases amount to about \$2,000.00 annually.

Under operation of Chapter 477, Laws of 1915, five hundred thousand dollars of old state certificates have been retired and that amount added to the State School Fund. Practically all of this has been re-invested in loans to school districts and municipalities of the state, as authorized by law. Pursuant to the act cited, there will be \$1,000,000.000 of the old certificates retired annually until all are paid.

It is thought advisable that some legislation should be enacted relative to the Fox and Wisconsin River Improvement lands. These lands

were granted by Congress to the State in trust for the improvement of the Fox and Wisconsin Rivers, under act of Congress Aug. 8, 1846. There was much legislation and many officials concerned in handling these lands resulting in irregularities and delinquencies and a tangled condition of records. There are still many descriptions on our records which show the trust granted under said Act by Congress to the State has never been executed by any deed or patent, and therefore, title remains in the State as trustee. These irregularities cannot now be corrected by any present officers, therefore, we deem it advisable by the next legislature to enact a law directing the Commissioners of Public Lands to present rightful owners of all lands so situated, as may be shown by abstracts in the different counties, with a quit claim deed to supply a missing link in such titles.

Exhibits "A" to "L" and appendices 1 to 4 inclusive, herewith, are intended, to show in sufficient detail the transactions of the department for the biennial term.
