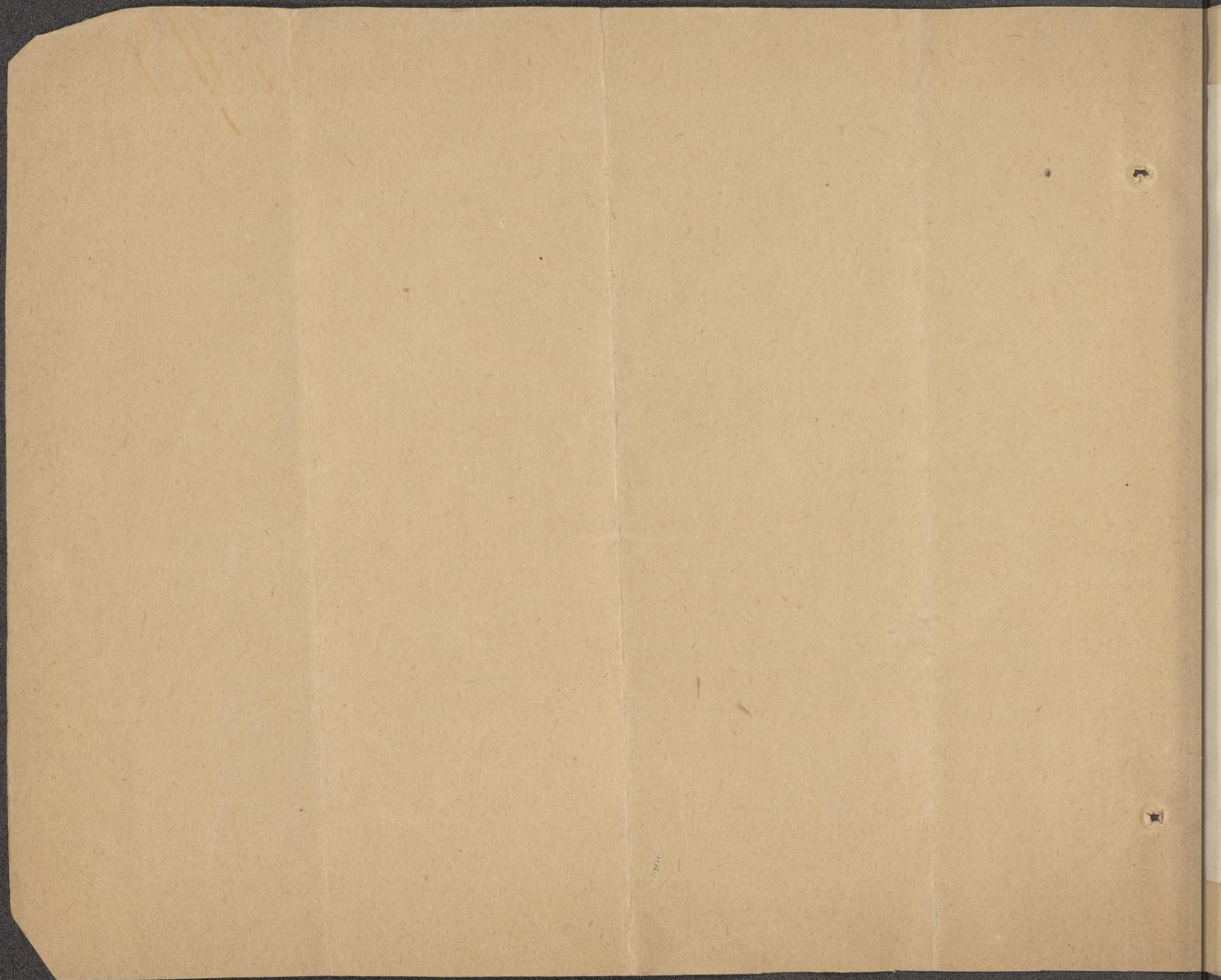

Up through the murky air with Merkyry.

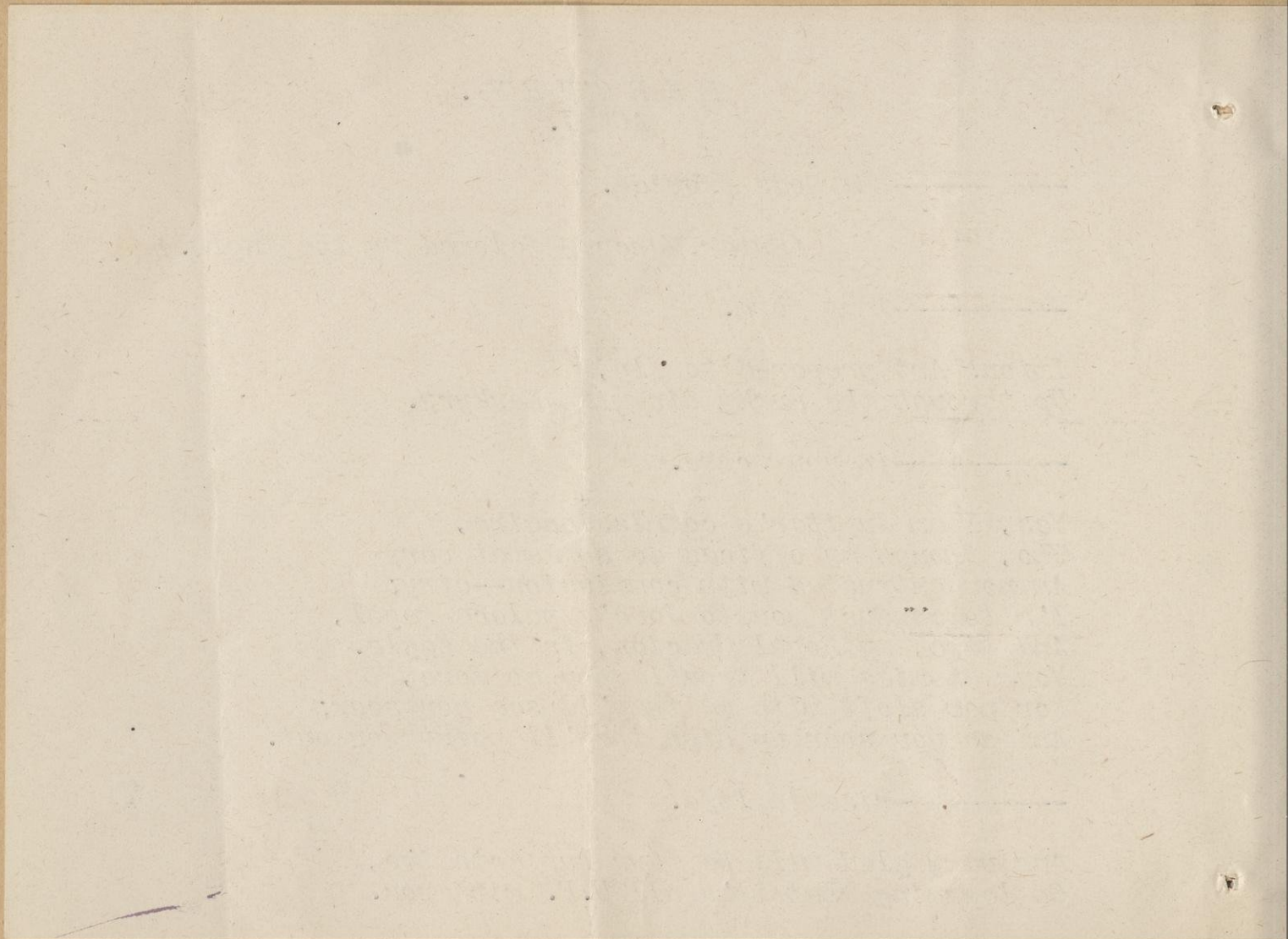
-----in your care.
