

In the month of March, 1855, Rev. M. W. Staples commenced labor in Janesville with the view of organizing a Church. On the 5th of May following, he, assisted by Rev. Messrs. Savage, Park and Gardiner organized the Church with eleven members. Rev. Mr. Staples became their pastor, and continued such until released, at his own request, in May 1858. The pulpit is now supplied by Rev. Oliver Bronson. The present number of members is eighty-two. A well organized and interesting Sunday School is maintained, having two hundred and fifty volumes in the library. During the summer of 1855 their house of worship was erected, and on the 15th day of September it was dedicated. It is built of wood, 29 by 52 feet, and cost, exclusive of the lot, about \$1,600.




