Dear Judge Schultz,

Thank you for your letter of March 19 and your concern over the recent developments relating to the film which our Extension Division is working on.

Enclosed is a statement prepared by Dean Adolfson, which I believe gives the facts in the matter and answers the questions you raise.

I was especially concerned over your item #4 -- "breach of faith or a breach of contract" with the NAACP. I wish to point out that we have negotiated directly with the donors. There are three of them, and each of them has given his approval to the re-making of this film. Therefore, I believe there can be no breach of contract.
