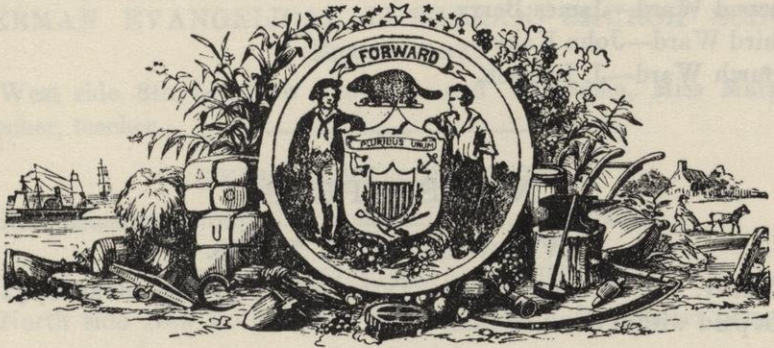

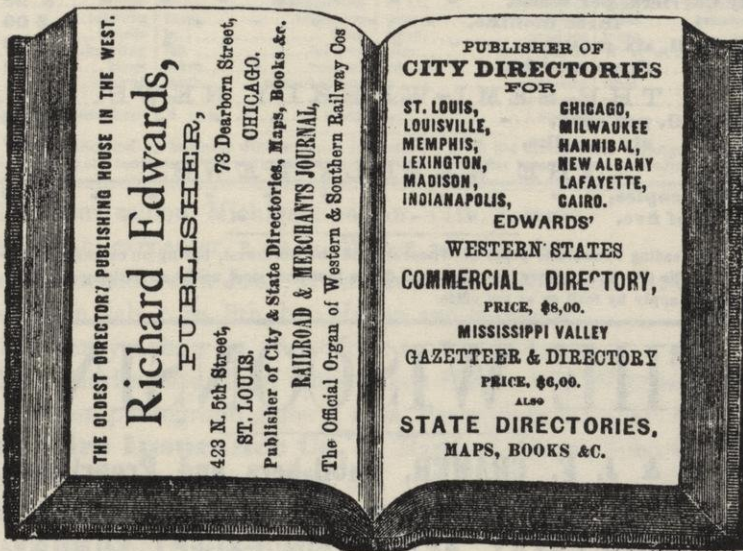

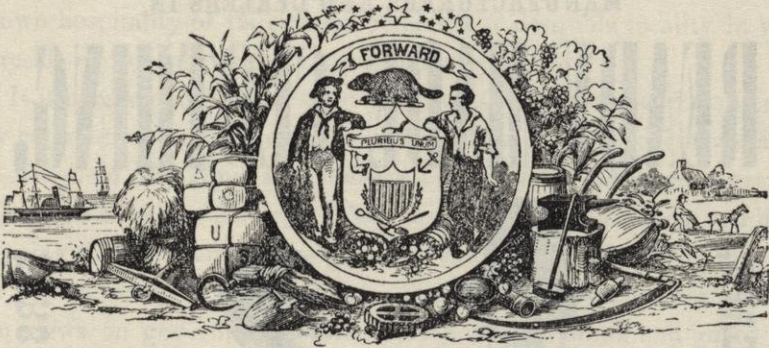

BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH



OF THE

CITY OF SHEBOYGAN.

SHEBOYGAN, the county seat of Sheboygan county, is situated on the shore of Lake Michigan, near the middle of the county, and at the mouth of Sheboygan River, a stream about four hundred feet wide, and from ten to fifteen deep. The town plat is a dry, level and sandy plain, about forty feet above the level of the lake. In 1846, this town contained only about four hundred inhabitants, and had no churches, newspaper or passable roads, and but very few educational privileges. It now has an industrious and thriving population, twelve churches, and four newspapers. The churches embrace the Catholic, Congregational, Episcopal, Evangelical and Lutheran, German Methodist, Methodist Episcopal, Norwegian Methodist, German Reform, and Unitarian denominations. By means of the Sheboygan and Fond du Lac Railroad, access is had to Chicago and other important points, southwest and northwest, and by stage routes to many important points.

The educational privileges of Sheboygan are of the first order. There are nine different schools, public and private. In 1852, the county raised \$20,000 for the purpose of constructing a harbor at the mouth of the river. Added to this sum, with the appropriations made by the General Government, the work was commenced and vigorously prosecuted to completion. It is one of the best and most accessible harbors on the lake. There are in the city a Masonic Lodge, and an Independent Order

of Odd Fellows, both in a flourishing condition. The mercantile and mechanical pursuits of the city are prosperous, and taken altogether—the location of Sheboygan, its general thrift and prosperity, and the well-known hospitality of its citizens, render it a desirable locality in which to reside and engage in the various pursuits of life.

It is a very good criterion to judge of the character and standing of any community by its newspaper press. This city has four newspapers, the *Evergreen City Times*, the *Sheboygan Journal*, the *Sheboygan Democrat*, and the *Sheboygan Zeitung*. They are all in a flourishing condition, enjoying the confidence and support of the community and of the political parties to which they belong. These papers, whilst reflecting their own views on governmental affairs, keep ever in mind, and guard with jealous care the interests of the city and county. They are ably edited and richly deserve all the patronage possible to bestow upon them.

The county of Sheboygan is bounded on the north by Calumet and Manitowoc, on the east by the State line in Lake Michigan, on the south by Washington, and on the west by Fond du Lac. It was set off from Brown county in 1836; organized for county purposes in 1838; and attached to Fond du Lac for judicial purposes, and fully organized in January, 1846. The whole surface of the county was at that period covered by a dense growth of timber, among which pine was found in considerable quantities along the margin of the principal streams. The rapid increase of population has converted these primeval forests into flourishing farms, and where comparatively but a short period since was a wilderness, now may be seen all the characteristics and advantages which follow the erection of school houses and churches.

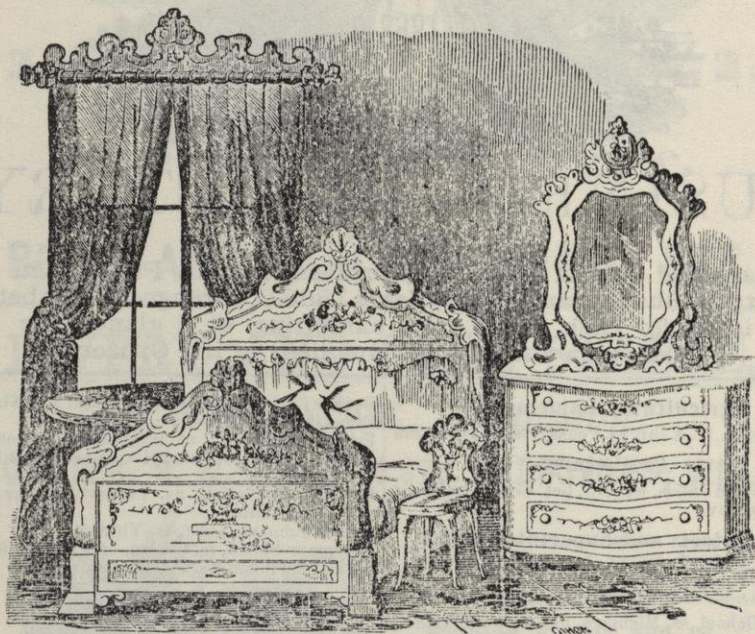

UNION PACIFIC RAIL ROAD.

NOTWITHSTANDING this *great National Work* has been so prominent before the country since its inception, we are daily in receipt of letters of inquiry from all parts of the United States and Europe, seeking information with regard to the progress of the UNION PACIFIC RAIL ROAD, the time and certainty of its completion, the value of its lands; when they will be offered for sale, their fertility, and also the resources of the State and the inducements which are presented to invite immigration. A few facts will be presented in answer to their inquiries, which we trust will be satisfactory, and of public interest.

CONSTRUCTION.

The question of the speedy construction of the UNION PACIFIC RAIL ROAD is already answered by the work of the last two years; undertaken, to a great extent, against public sentiment, with regard to its feasibility—pronounced impossible, by many of large experiences in rail road building, it has at last become a success, through the Genius, Pluck and Means of men thoroughly in earnest to accomplish this *Great National Work*. This assertion needs no argument except the simple facts, which show that it stretches to-day, its iron bands *Five Hundred and Forty-five miles* west of the Missouri River, through the first and highest chain of the Rocky Mountains.

Operations commenced late last Spring, occasioned by the unusual high water extending the whole length of the Missouri River, preventing the crossing of material, but, notwithstanding that, and the heavy grades encountered at the Black Hills, more than Two Hundred and Forty (240) miles have been laid the year 1867, to the

summit of the Mountains, and most of the difficult grading is completed for a sufficient distance beyond, to keep in advance of the track-laying.

Four thousand men are now at work in the Mountains, grading, preparing ties, distributing them along the line, getting out lumber for buildings, bridges, etc., etc., to be ready the moment the ground is in condition to work in the Spring. Thus far there has been no detention in consequence of bad weather or snow; earth-working was practicable until January 1st, and no train has as yet, (February 5th,) been detained, the whole length of the line, a single hour, in consequence of snow.

The road completed is of the best possible construction. The United States Commissioners, (who examine and report each section,) the best Engineers, prominent Rail Road men of large experience, and the *public*, declare it to compare favorably with any road of its length in the country, and that it is superior to most.

The temporary bridge across the Missouri will be of almost incalculable benefit to the construction of the coming year. It enables the UNION PACIFIC RAIL ROAD Co. to transport in one unbroken line from the Eastern cities, a vast amount of material: rails, chairs, spike, lumber, etc., to the end of the track, so as to be ready to commence operations early in the Spring; and arrangements are fully completed to build the present year, *Three Hundred and Fifty miles* of road, thus completing west of the Missouri River, *Eight Hundred and Ninety-five miles* of the UNION PACIFIC RAIL ROAD.

EQUIPMENT.

There is no better equipment upon any road than that of the UNION PACIFIC RAIL ROAD. Its cars are all new, constructed in best possible manner, and sufficient in number to accommodate the public. Sleeping-cars of the most approved style, are in daily use on all Passenger Trains, and One Hundred and Eighteen Locomotives of the most approved patterns will be in use the present season.

MACHINE SHOPS.

The Machine Shops of the Company, located at Omaha, Grand Island, North Platte, and at Cheyenne, are constructed of brick and stone, in the most substantial manner, and furnished with modern

improvements in machinery, tools, &c., and with foundries attached, thus enabling the Company not only to repair promptly at many points on the road, but to build cars with the greatest dispatch. The Omaha shops alone have turned out eighteen flat cars per week; can easily build twelve box cars in the same time, besides the work going rapidly forward on five or six coaches. Iron ore and coal are plentiful in the mountains, which will enable the Company to manufacture their own rails and iron as soon as rolling mills can be got in operation.

CONNECTIONS.

The Chicago and North-Western Railway is completed to the Missouri River, and trains will run regularly to Chicago, in connection with the UNION PACIFIC RAILROAD, making the trip in twenty hours.

The Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific Rail Road, now running trains to Des Moines, Iowa, and in course of construction from Des Moines to the Missouri River, will be completed to Omaha this year; thus forming a direct railroad line between Omaha and Chicago. *The Council Bluffs and St. Joseph Rail Road* will be completed by July 1st next, which, in connection with the *Hannibal and St. Joseph* and the *North Missouri Rail Roads*, will give a direct railroad line between Omaha and St. Louis daily. Then our regular line of Missouri River Steamers between Omaha and St. Louis, St. Joseph, Sioux City, &c., &c.

A road is already commenced, to run from Cheyenne, Dakotah, to Denver, Colorado, the Golden City of the Mountains, which will be completed in November, 1868, as a branch of the UNION PACIFIC RAILROAD. Until the completion of this road, coaches run daily from Cheyenne to Denver, and also to the forts, and all points in the omuntains, such as Virginia City, Helena, and Salt Lake, and connect with the Central Pacific Railroad at its eastern terminus, now east of the Sierra Nevada Mountains.

MINERAL REGIONS.

It is not alone iron and coal, those prime necessities, which abound in the Rocky Mountains, but the UNION PACIFIC RAILROAD opens up the avenue to untold wealth in the broad and productive mineral regions, which are thus brought within the reach of the enterprise

and industry of all. Gold, silver, precious stones, copper, lead—indeed, all minerals exist beyond the wildest dreams of the most vivid imagination.

The great want in the development of the mines, stretching over thousands of miles of territory, has been machinery for companies and quick transportation for men. The long distance to the mountains from the river, dragging the ponderous machinery with ox or mule teams, discouraged the most hardy adventurer in the outset, and the impossibility of repairing any considerable damage rendered machinery otherwise good almost useless. Now forty-eight hours accomplishes the work of weeks, and sometimes months, and places in early spring the men at the mines for the summer campaign. Added to this are whole fields of alkali and salt, enough to supply a continent, and springs of the purest oil bubbling to the earth's surface. Coal is very abundant, some veins being reported of fifteen feet in thickness. Both bituminous and cannel are found, and some specimens of anthracite have been brought from the Atlantic slope, which leads to the belief among those who have had large experience in mining that an inexhaustible supply will reward enterprise and labor in that direction.

MINES.

The Sweet-water Mines, located in the main range of the Rocky Mountains, on the eastern slope of the Atlantic, are now attracting a great deal of attention. The gulch or surface diggings are said to be very rich, and the quartz lodes are almost innumerable and inexhaustible. They embrace a country nearly fifteen miles square, and, what is of first importance, are surrounded by an abundance of timber and water, embracing some fine mill sites, with which to operate the machinery. Four or five towns have already sprung up, some containing one hundred houses, and large operations will be commenced the coming summer. Miners already report, under all the disadvantages attendant on first discovery, a yield of from \$25 to \$50 per day.

NEBRASKA—SETTLEMENTS.

The new State of Nebraska presents many inducements to immigrants who are seeking a home, whether they come as laborers, farmers, mechanics, or as capitalists. It is between the fortieth and

forty-third parallel of north latitude, north of Kansas and west of the Missouri River; bounded by it for about three hundred miles, and extending westward about four hundred miles.

The country is well watered, and the soil cannot be surpassed in the world, particularly for wheat-growing and stock-raising. Town and cities extend along the Missouri River, many of them of considerable importance, and rapidly increasing. The valleys of the rivers of the interior, the Platte, Elkhorn, Papillion, and their tributaries, are rapidly settling up with a farming population. This is true of the whole State, both north and south of the Platte. Aside from the million acres of land owned by the Company, which will soon be in the market, there is plenty of Government land, subject to pre-emption and homestead rights, which is, of course, free to all actual settlers.

AGRICULTURE.

No finer land for agricultural purposes than this can be found. The soil is from three to ten feet deep, and wholly inexhaustible, so bountiful has nature been in her gifts. Land which has been cultivated for thirteen years produces just as fine crops without manure as when first broken. Nebraska to-day stands at the head of all States as a wheat-growing country, *producing, by Statistics in the Agricultural Bureau at Washington, more wheat per acre than any other State of the Union*, and besides, the quality is such that, even in the St. Louis market, it commands a higher price than any other wheat sold there. The productions are not confined to wheat and grass alone, for both of which she is pre-eminent, but all of the staples and luxuries are produced with little labor. Indian corn, oats, hemp, tobacco, sorghum, are most successfully cultivated, and all the smaller fruits and vegetables grow with little care, and attain an enormous size, and the basins of the rivers are well wooded.

COAL.

Coal has been found in various parts of the State, in veins of from two to three feet in thickness, and produces in their localities sufficient fuel for domestic purposes. It is confidently expected that the geological survey now in progress will develop sources of supply, throughout the length and breadth of the State.

It is also demonstrated that apples, pears, peaches, and grapes can be produced in the greatest profusion, with only ordinary care.

STOCK RAISING.

If Nebraska excels in any one particular, it is in stock raising. She has ample fields FREE for hundreds of thousands of cattle, horses, and sheep. The purest streams and springs of water, and the sweetest food for all. One peculiarity is that the grass is very nearly as nutritious in winter as in summer, and stock will thrive and fatten during the winter months with very little care or shelter.

MARKETS.

The markets of Nebraska are almost literally at every man's door; all, and more than can be raised, finds a ready market at any point on the UNION PACIFIC RAIL ROAD; to be shipped west to supply the large and constantly increasing demand for the mountains.

Every article which the farmer raises finds ready sale at large prices, and the cultivation of the soil brings a competence not only sure, but quickly. This is demonstrated by the fact of land being worth from \$1.25 to \$5.00 per acre, and wheat worth \$1.50 per bushel, and an average can be raised of thirty bushels to the acre.

Of course, the most valuable lands are in close proximity to the UNION PACIFIC RAIL ROAD, and these will be sold by the Company at a very moderate price to actual settlers, or may be purchased from the Government.

TRIP TO THE MOUNTAINS.

The trip from Omaha to the mountains is one of great interest—through a country until recently given up to the red man and the buffalo, the elk, deer, antelope, wolf, and fox, but now opening up with the grand march of civilization, which is moving along the whole breadth of the continent, at the rate of seventeen miles a year; but more rapidly along the great *National Highway*. Towns, cities, and villages are literally springing up in a night along the whole line of the road. No finer trip can be taken by the tourist who would see nature as she is, than to visit these hunting grounds of the red man, now so fast disappearing, and enjoy the pleasures of the chase for the

buffalo, elk, deer, antelope, &c., who yet roam in thousands over these plains. The scenery at the mountains cannot be surpassed. Italy has no more gorgeous sunsets, and the rising sun, bursting forth in all its splendor, while the pale moon, still empress of the deep canons, retires slowly, and both seen at the same moment, presents a scene of grandeur and sublimity which nowhere else exist in such perfection; and then in the distance rise to the clouds the snow-clad mountains, bearing almost continually the hoary covering of winter.

CLIMATE.

The climate of Nebraska cannot be excelled for health. It is dry, pure, and particularly adapted to invalids. Lung diseases are scarcely known, and those having any tendencies in that direction, or even considerably diseased, are immediately benefited by a residence here, and particularly by a trip to the mountains. Many persons live here in comparative health who could not survive a single season on the seaboard.

OMAHA, until recently the capital of Nebraska, and for the present virtually so, from a population, two years since, of some four thousand, now numbers fifteen thousand; and this is a healthy, legitimate growth, based upon position and capital. Immense blocks of fine brick stores are constantly in process of erection, such as would be an ornament to any city; and the private houses are many of them not only comfortable and luxurious, but elegant. There are four banks; the deposits of one reaches \$1,300,000; large wholesale houses, doing a business of from \$100,000 to \$1,000,000 annually; several fine hotels; three daily papers; a number of large manufactories; good churches of all denominations; FREE SCHOOLS; and more wealthy men, made so by legitimate business, than any city of its size in the Union, and all this constantly and marvellously increasing. More than twelve hundred houses were built last year, and a much larger number are projected for the coming season.

CITIES AND TOWNS.

The cities and towns along the line have grown with wonderful rapidity. Almost all the stations have a considerable village, flanked with a farming population; and Fremont, Columbus, Grand Island, North Platte, Julesburg, Cheyenne, and many others, have more than doubled their population during the past year, or grown to be cities,

where before was nothing but the wild waste, and no sound but that of the beasts of prey, or the whoop of the wilder savage, and each does an extensive business with the surrounding country. The UNION PACIFIC RAIL ROAD COMPANY have materially aided all these places, by building shops at various points, and giving employment to large numbers of men, and also in opening trade with the mountains and affording a market for the productions of the country.

PRICE OF LIVING, LABOR, &c.

Nebraska, for a new State, is a cheap place to live, and is constantly improving in this respect, with Eastern railroad connections. Unskilled labor is in great demand, not only on the road, but among freighters, farmers, &c. Farm hands get from \$30 to \$50 per month and board. Carpenters, blacksmiths, masons, bricklayers, and mechanics get from \$4 to \$6 per day.

CONCLUSION.

It was well said by a prominent editor of one of our largest cities, that "It makes one's brain whirl to think of what the UNION PACIFIC RAIL ROAD is doing for this country, in developing its agricultural, commercial, and mineral resources." It develops not only a few cities and towns along its line, but a country in extent much larger than many kingdoms of Europe, and richer than any of them in its natural resources. All agriculture, mining or commerce asks is quick and sure transportation to favorable markets, and a spot of earth which will yield the commodities of trade and commerce. All this is found here, and the result must be rising cities, broad, cultivated acres, and millions of the precious metals, to make glad the heart of the laborer and capitalist, and build up an empire where a few scattered tribes and wild beasts obtained a precarious subsistence. And when this great *National Highway* shall be completed, connecting the Atlantic and Pacific, and communication across the continent is established with the whole Eastern world, and those great nations, teeming with wealth, shall be at our doors, with their countless productions—when its giant arms shall extend, as they must, north and south, through valleys and mountains, to gather in for commerce the vast products of our rich Western empire—when *homes* shall rise from the now unbroken wilderness, and the blessings of civilization, art, science, and religion be extended—it will be seen that the greatest power for civilization of the age has been the UNION PACIFIC RAIL ROAD.

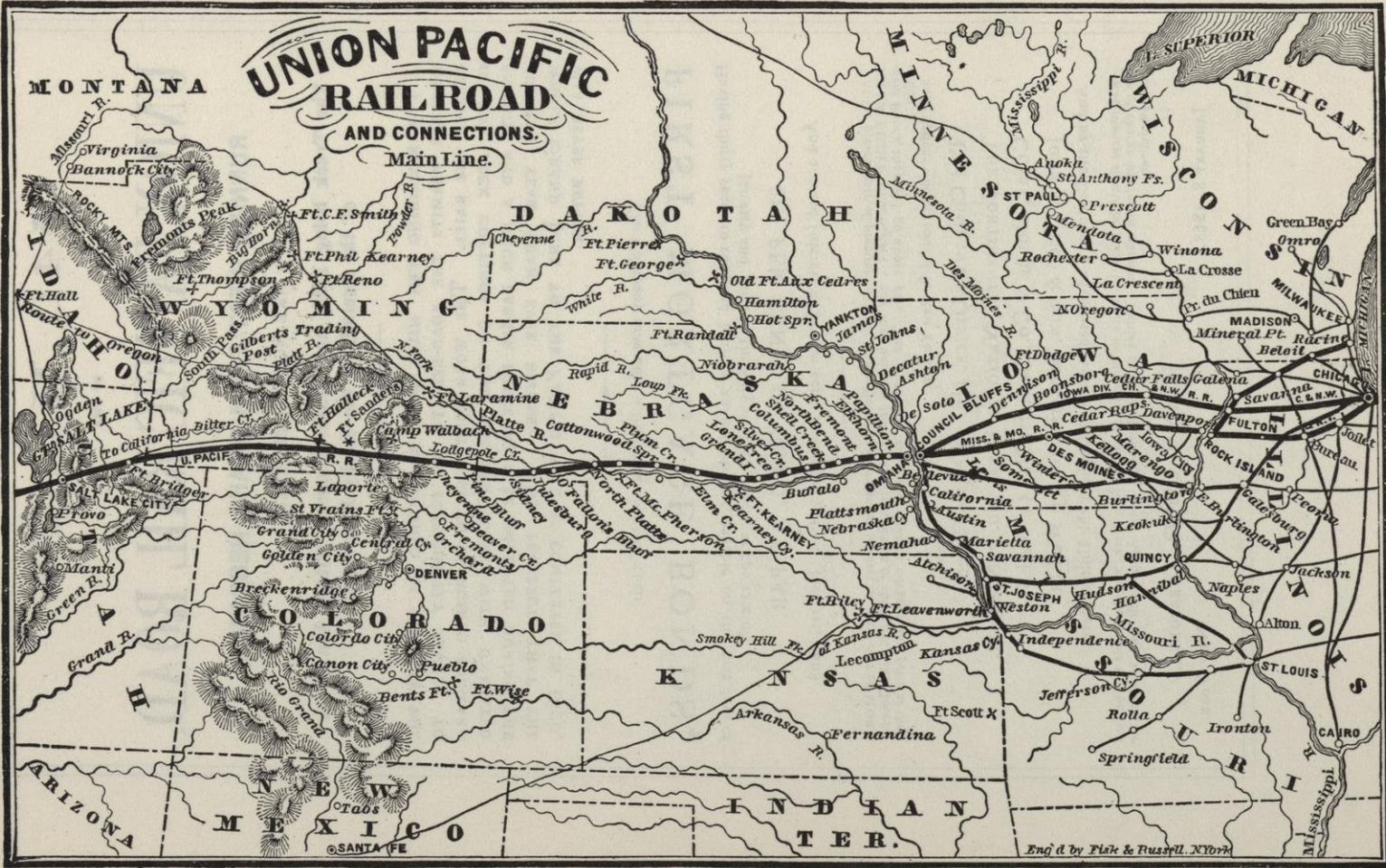

HISTORICAL SKETCH



OF THE

VILLAGE OF MANITOWOC.

The village of MANITOWOC is beautifully situated at the mouth of Manitowoc River, on Lake Michigan, ninety miles below Milwaukee. Its population is in the neighborhood of four thousand, and is increasing at a rapid rate. Its harbor, the best natural one on the lakes, has been improved through an appropriation by Congress, and is now second to no other. It is the county seat of Manitowoc county. The village is noted for the hospitality of its people, and is a desirable place of residence, and an excellent point for business, the branches of which are, warehouses, stores, steam saw mills, blacksmith and wagon shops, manufacturing establishments, shoe and tailor shops, tin shops, ship yards, etc. The churches are, Methodist Episcopal, Episcopal, Presbyterian, German and Norwegian Lutheran, German Methodist Episcopal and Catholic. It has three excellent newspapers, the *Manitowoc Pilot*, the *Tribune*, and the *Nord-Westen*. There are two fire companies, one hook and ladder and one bucket company; three public schools, and six secret and benevolent societies, and several excellent hotels. Large quantities of lumber are annually manufactured on the river above Manitowoc from which a large revenue is derived. The plank roads leading to the village bring a large amount of trade and make it a place of importance as a commercial point.

Manitowoc County is bounded on the north by Brown and Kewaunee,

on the east and southeast by the State line in Lake Michigan, on the south by Sheboygan, and on the west by Calumet and a portion of Outagamie. It was set off from Brown, December 7, 1836; organized and attached thereto for judicial purposes, December 17, 1836; fully organized, March 2, 1848. The northern boundaries were somewhat changed February 7, 1850. The general formation of the surface is moderately underlating, and in some parts very agreeably diversified with hills and vallies. The soil is good and well watered, with springs and creeks, and is well adapted to tillage and grazing. The county is well timbered with maple, oak, elm, birch, ash, pine, and hemlock.

Manitowoc River has its origin in two branches; the one heading at near the southern extremity of Lake Winnebago, and the other near the northwestern part of the same, in Calumet county; unite near the southeast corner of town 19 N., of range 20 E., draining about 400 square miles of lands. It runs nearly east, entering Lake Michigan at the village of Manitowoc, and is navigable to the village of Manitowoc Rapids, 5 miles from its mouth.

The object of this Association is, to assist its members in case of sickness or disability by reason of *accident or disease*, each member paying a stated amount as annual or semi-annual dues, and becoming thereby entitled to a proportionate weekly benefit. An annual payment of from Five to Fifty Dollars, secures to the assured the same amount weekly in case of any such disability. An Initiation Fee of \$3.00 and \$1.00 for the Policy, must be paid at the time of making the application, the premium to be paid within thirty days from date. Any person of good health and known moral character, between the ages of sixteen and sixty-five years, may become a member of this Association, by conforming to the requirements laid down in the blank form of application. This Association makes no distinction whatever between cases of accident and of sickness generally. The only cases that are excepted, are diseases caused by immoral practices or self-abuse, and chronic diseases, *i. e.* such as are inveterate, or which the applicant has suffered with previous to making his application.

The Physician's certificate by him duly executed and signed, must be sent to the Agent on the 8th day of such medical attendance, and the patient must make an affidavit, endorsed thereon, to the effect that he has been unable to work, for seven days since the first day of such medical attendance. The Agent is in all cases a Notary Public, in order that no expenses may accrue to the insured. Such certificate will in all cases be considered a proper voucher for the benefit to be paid *forthwith*, and on which, benefits will be paid until the member is sufficiently recovered to enable him to return to his usual avocations, or until the expiration of one year from the date of the Physician's Certificate.

Members entitled to the benefits of the Association do not have to await the result of a long and tedious adjustment of claims, but in every instance, every week, upon delivery of the proper voucher, the agent will call and personally pay the amount insured for; if a member should happen to fall sick or meet with an accident, in a place where no agency is established, the certificate must be sent to the General Office, in order that the money may be sent by mail.

Circulars and Blanks of Physicians' Certificate, can be obtained from the Agents, or by applying to the Secretary of the Association.
