

the wisconsin salon of art

The 25th annual Wisconsin Salon of Art, exhibiting the work of artists across the state from November 23 through December 14, represents the execution of a design created 25 years ago by John Kienitz, now professor of art history at the University, and Porter Butts, Union director.

In 1934 Kienitz was chairman of the Union Gallery committee, a student group of the Union which has traditionally made all arrangements for the Salon since Kienitz and his committee initiated it.

He felt that there was a need for an exhibition which would show a cross-section of the work being accomplished by artists in Wisconsin.

Porter Butts agreed that such an exhibition would fill a dual purpose: "to bring the University into a more vital relationship with art activities in the state, and to give artists an opportunity to exhibit their most recent work."

The conviction that having such an exhibition was necessary

became even stronger when the first obstacle in staging the Salon of 1934 was encountered: no one in the state even knew who Wisconsin artists were.

The Union group, particularly Porter Butts, who completed his graduate degree in art history and who ultimately wrote *Art in Wisconsin*, culled old newspapers, other art show catalogues, and art schools' lists of graduates living in Wisconsin.

The committee also wrote letters, made trips around the state, and finally were in touch with more than 500 artists.

With Grant Wood as one of the judges, the first Salon opened on Nov. 15, 1934, exhibiting 99 works by 46 artists. A total of \$125 was awarded in prizes, including a \$75 purchase by the Union, with the painting selected for the award to become part of the Union's collection. The Union's Purchase Award has since been boosted to \$300, making it the largest single award to be presented annually.

At the reception which opened the first Salon, most of the

guests appeared in formal dress. A doorman in full dress stood at the entrance of the Gallery and accepted invitations as the art patrons entered.

When the presentation of awards began, the audience waited in silence as each of the prize-winning works was brought to an easel at the front of the room by a coed who was also in formal dress. "Often the coed was prettier than the picture," recalls one of the original Salon guests.

Santos Zingale and Alfred Sessler, now both members of the University art faculty, were among the artists whose work was recognized at the first Salon. Their entries led a judge to comment that "economic unrest is pervading even the usually placid field of art." This, you recall, was during the depression.

The role of the Salon in portraying the temper of the time was also shown in 1942 in the first war-time exhibition. According to the *Milwaukee Journal*, the exhibition that year indicated that "painters of the state have discarded the 'whimsical' for the duration."

The success of the initial Salon can be gauged from the participation in the next season's show in 1935, with the

second Salon drawing a hundred more entries and \$150 more in awards, including the Madison Art Association's award of \$100 which is now presented annually.

The Salon design begun only a year before was on its way to being executed, and the representation of artists has continued to grow with the Salon's two and a half decade development.

Entries in the Silver Salon represented some 30 Wisconsin communities and six states, where former Wisconsin artists who qualify for the competition under its residence requirements now live.

One entry card was even received from Paris, France, where a Milwaukee resident is traveling.

Judges for the current Salon had more than 500 entries to choose from in selecting the 25th exhibition, with some \$1500 in awards to present.

The judging panel was comprised of Orazio Fumagalli, sculptor and curator of the Tweed Gallery in Duluth, Minnesota; Byron Burford, prize-winning painter who has studied in England on a Guggenheim Foundation grant; and Ray

French, whose work in the graphic arts has appeared in museums, collections, and traveling exhibitions both in this country and abroad.

The work which they have selected for exhibition represents the ultimate impact of fostering art exhibition in Wisconsin for a quarter of a century—a study in composition which has involved hundreds of artists, thousands of works of art, and \$16,550 in award money (in addition to this year's all-time high of more than \$1500) in the 25 years which the Silver Salon marks.

statistics

317 artists submitted 550 works of art in oil, watercolor, graphics, and sculpture with a limit of two entries per person. 102 works by 84 artists were selected by the jury for exhibition in the Salon.

The contributors who were eligible have had three year's residence in Wisconsin including the past year, or were ten year residents in Wisconsin if now living outside the state, or are faculty or students now in Wisconsin art schools.

judging

For the judging of this show each entry was placed in the gallery and given a number. Jury members working independently of each other voted on each entry as being "in" or "out." Two "in" votes or a meritorious vote by any one judge resulted in an entry being exhibited, regardless of how the other judge voted. In addition, each judge marked those entries he felt were particularly meritorious. Any entry having a meritorious vote or three "in" votes automatically became eligi-

ble for awards. From this group the three judges, working together, chose the award winners.

In this catalog, after each title is a code telling how that particular entry was judged. The letters "Fr" are for Ray H. French; "Fu" for Orazio Fumagalli; and "B" for Byron Burford. An asterisk after an initial indicates a meritorious vote from that judge.

comments of the jury

The many students whose names appear elsewhere in this catalogue have worked long and arduous hours in organizing this exhibition. The fact that some of them are not art majors or are not in any other way involved with art makes their efforts doubly impressive.

This exhibition is mute proof of their excellent work. They proved to be most cooperative co-workers and gracious hosts during our stay here.

There is much good work being done in Wisconsin, with

the caliber and the variety of this work indicated in the 25th Salon exhibition.

As is the case with any exhibition, where space must be taken into consideration, it becomes physically impossible to achieve a complete representation.

The quality of the more than 500 entries which were submitted made this consideration a particularly difficult one for us as judges to make.

The 25th Salon exhibition, however, we feel typifies the quality of the work which is being accomplished.
