TO HIS EXCELLENCY, J. M. RUSK,
Governor of the State of Wisconsin:

As required by law we have the honor to submit the following report of the transactions of this office during the biennial fiscal term ending September 30, 1888. The reports of the Secretary of State and State Treasurer exhibit detailed statements of the receipts and disbursements on account of the several funds affected by our action and to them we respectfully refer.

The only funds those reports do not show, are the Non-productive Trust Funds, which consist principally of unsold lands, and their estimated value will be found in Exhibit No. 1.

Sales of Public Lands.

SALES OF PUBLIC LANDS.

The sales during the fiscal term ending September 30th, 1888, amounted to 250,800.62 acres.

The sales for the year ending September 30th, 1887, amounted to 162,726.01 acres, and for the year ending September 30th, 1888, amounted to 88,074.61 acres.

The classification of these lands and the revenues derived from sales thereof, will be found under their proper headings and exhibits.

SALES OF SCHOOL LANDS.

Exhibit "A" shows that there have been sold during the year ending September 30th, 1887, 22,112.62 acres of school lands, for the sum of \$33,873.29.

From these sales the state received \$21,591.29 as principal and other charges, \$375.60 interest charges, leaving a balance due of \$12,282.00 upon which the state receives 7 per centum interest.

Exhibit "H" shows that there have been sold during the year ending September 30th, 1888, 10,207.76 acres of school lands for the sum of \$13,713.68.

From these sales the state received \$9,496.68 as principal and other charges, \$75.69 interest charges, leaving a balance due of \$4,217.00, upon which the state receives 7 per centum interest.

SALES OF UNIVERSITY LANDS.

Exhibit "B" shows that there have been sold during the year ending September 30th, 1887, 464.27 acres of University lands for \$1,323.85. Of this sum the state received as principal and other charges \$426.85, interest charges \$9.33, leaving a balance due the state of \$897.00 upon which the state receives 7 per centum interest.

Exhibit "I" shows that there have been sold during the year ending September 30th, 1888, 480 acres of University

lands for \$1,235.78. Of this sum the state received as principal and other charges \$674.50, interest charges \$5.59, leaving a balance due the state of \$1,389.00, upon which the state receives 7 per centum interest.

SALES OF AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE LANDS.

Exhibit "C" shows that there have been sold during the year ending September 30th, 1887, 4,041.02 acres of Agricultural College lands, for \$5,109.94, for which the state received as principal and other charges \$2,627.94, and interest charges \$107.26, leaving a balance due the state of \$2,482.00, upon which the state receives 7 per centum interest.

Exhibit "J" shows sales during the year ending September 30th, 1888, to be 1,846.05 acres, sold for \$2,063.50, of which the state received as principal and other charges \$674.50, and interest charges \$5.59, leaving a balance due the state of \$1,389.00, upon which the state receives 7 per centum interest.

SALES OF MARATHON COUNTY LANDS.

Exhibit "D" shows that there have been sold during the year ending September 30th, 1887, 440 acres of Marathon County lands for \$330.

Exhibit "K" shows sales during the year ending September 30th, 1888, to be 764.74 acres, for which the state received \$573.57.

SALES OF NORMAL SCHOOL LANDS.

Exhibit "F" shows that there have been sold during the year ending September 30th, 1887, 67,733.03 acres of normal school lands for the sum of \$89,415.58, of this amount the state received as principal and other charges \$88,630.58, interest charges \$27.48, leaving a balance due the state of \$785, upon which the state receives 7 per centum interest.

Exhibit "M" shows sales during the year ending September 30th, 1888, to be 29,676.25 acres for \$53,595.09, of this

amount the state received as principal and other charges \$52,224.09, interest charges \$26.15, leaving a balance due of \$1,371, upon which the state receives 7 per centum interest.

SALES OF DRAINAGE LANDS.

Exhibit "G" shows that there have been sold during the year ending September 30, 1887, 67,742.67 acres of Drainage lands for the sum of \$89,558.38, and sold during the year ending September 30, 1888, as shown by Exhibit "N" 30,345.26 acres for the sum of \$47,339.51. The proceeds from the sale of these lands have been apportioned in accordance with law, to the several counties wherein the lands so sold lie, and as shown in Exhibits "U" "1" and "2."

SALES OF INDEMNITY LANDS.

The lands known as indemnity lands, comprising 70,539.84 acres which the state received as indemnity and selected in lieu of swamp lands, located by United States land warrants, were offered for sale in accordance with law, and Exhibit "E" shows that there have been sold during the year ending September 30, 1887, 192.40 acres for the sum of \$456.66, and sold during the year ending September 30, 1888, as shown by Exhibit "L," 14,754.55 acres for the sum of \$53,054.90.

Prices and Terms of Sale of State Lands.

PRICES AND TERMS OF SALE OF STATE LANDS.

Lands held by the state are subject to sale at private entry, after having been offered at public auction, on the following terms: The School, University and Agricultural College lands are sold on ten years' time; twenty-five per cent. of the purchase money, interest on the seventy-five per cent. remaining unpaid, at the rate of seven per cent. per annum, from the date of purchase to the first of January following, and the certificate fee of fifty cents for each forty-acre tract, being required in cash; interest thereafter at seven per cent. per annum, payable annually in advance. The Normal School and Drainage (Swamp), and Marathon county lands are sold for cash. The prices range as follows:

School lands from	\$1 00 to \$1 25 per acre.
University lands from	2 00 to 3 00 per acre.
Agricultural College lands	1 25 per acre.

Lands Held by the State.

Section 3, chapter 332, laws of 1883, provides that any lands the state owns may be entered by actual settlers at \$1.25 per acre, in quantities not exceeding two hundred acres, under such rules, requirements, restrictions, conditions and provisions as the Commissioners of Public Lands may establish to be approved by the Governor.

THE LANDS HELD BY THE STATE.

Exhibit "O" shows the number of acres of land in the several counties held in trust by the state and subject to sale.

In addition to these, the state has lately received patents for about 4,000 acres of swamp lands, which have not yet been offered at public sale. There are also included in Exhibit "O," 55,932.75 acres reserved, under Chapter 324 of the Laws of 1878, for a state park, in Oneida county, and are therefore not subject to entry.

Forfeitures of State Lands.

FORFEITURES OF STATE LANDS.

Exhibit "P" shows the number of acres of lands held on certificates in the several counties, and the amounts due that were forfeited for the non-payment of interest during the fiscal term, and in "Exhibit Q" will be found the forfeitures of individual loans, amounting to \$600.00, which are also included in the following summary statement. Of these forfeitures a considerable portion are annually redeemed before sale, and a portion even after sale under the law.

This statement, compared with same in former reports, shows a large and continuous decrease of principal and income from this source which is accounted for by the increase of full payments on outstanding certificates and fewer purchases of lands on contract.

LOANS TO SCHOOL DISTRICTS.

Exhibits "S" and "T" show the amount due September 30, 1888, to the several funds on account of loans to school districts, and new loans made during the fiscal term amounting to \$49,674.00.

LOANS TO INDIVIDUALS.

Exhibit "Q" shows the amount due the Trust Funds September 30, 1888, on account of loans to individuals to be \$42,771.70, and showing a decrease by payments during the fiscal term of \$9,963.40, and by forfeitures, \$600.00.

No loans to individuals have been made since 1865, and the amount is gradually diminishing by payments and forfeitures, as shown in the exhibit.

FEES AND CHARGES.

During the fiscal term ending September 30, 1888, there has been paid into the General Fund for certificate and patent fees, diagrams showing vacant state lands, plats, field notes, and other services the sum of \$4,331.35. The income from this source shows a considerable increase over former years, although a great deal of this kind of work has been done without charge, especially when of slight cost in time and material, and a nominal charge only has been made in any case, as it is our opinion that the public should be served at the least possible expense.

The Non-Productive Trust Funds.

THE NON-PRODUCTIVE TRUST FUNDS.

The non-productive capital of the several funds consists of the lands which have been offered for sale and are unsold, and cash in the treasury. School lands are estimated at the average price of \$1.10 per acre; University lands, \$2.50; Agricultural College, \$1.25; Normal School, at \$1.40; Drainage lands, at \$1.30, and Indemnity, at \$3.

The following is an exhibit of the Non-productive Trust Funds September 30, 1888, compared with the figures for September 30, 1886.

The 4,000 acres of swamp lands lately patented to the state, and not yet offered at public sale have been omitted in the above statement.
