

Lecture by Linda Briscoe Myers, Assistant Curator of Photography, Harry Ransom Humanities Research Center, The University of Texas at Austin, "The Reconsidered Eye: Ramifications of the Digital Revolution," Room L140.

The year 2006 marks an unparalleled time in the history of photography. It is simultaneously the 180th anniversary of the creation of the world's first photograph by Nicéphore Niépce in 1826, and the year that may be remembered as the tipping point when digital technology demonstrated its dominance over analog processes. In the commercial sphere, the writing is on the wall: the industry is turning its back on the darkroom. The speaker will examine what effects this revolution has had and may have on our arts and culture.
