WIDE SUPPORT FOR FREDRIC MARCH MEMORIAL

Admirers of Fredric March, Wisconsin's distinguished film and stage actor, have contributed more than \$4,000 to date to the March memorial fund, initiated last summer by the Class of 1920, of which he was president and by the Union.

The fund will be used to renovate and up-date the Union's 32-year-old film and experimental theater — the Play Circle — looking toward the dedication of the Play Circle in honor of March during the Union's golden anniversary celebration in 1978. First work is expected to start soon and will continue as further gifts are received.

The re-naming of the theater will recognize March's 50 years of service to the Union and University, beginning when, as a student, he was a member of the Union Board and starred in the Union's variety shows, and will perpetuate the memory of his illustrious acting career, which included winning two film academy awards.

The wide range of the appeal of the project is indicated by the fact that gifts have been received from members of the Classes of 1906 through 1976, and from Maryland to California.

The fund campaign is now in full swing, with \$10,000 the goal. All who would like to participate are urged to send their contributions soon to the U.W. Foundation-Fredric March Fund, 702 Langdon St., Madison, WI 53706.

MEMORIAL UNION REMODELING BEGINS THIS FALL

By the time you read this, a construction fence will be built around the section of the Memorial Union between the center part of the building and the commons wing and construction equipment will be on the scene. Having been spared the unpleasantness of construction dust and noise during the summer, it is hoped that Memorial Union patrons will be patient during the remodeling inconveniences.

The impending construction will update the 48-year-old Memorial Union building adding a new art gallery, expanding the Beefeaters Room and attaching a new reception-dining room to Great Hall. The project is scheduled for completion later this year and prior to the celebration of the Memorial Union's fiftieth anniversary in 1978.

Funds for the remodeling came from contributions from alumni and friends of the University as well as from student life membership subscriptions and operating surplus funds from previous years. No tax funds are used in the construction and remodeling. The addition to the art gallery was financed by a gift from the class of 1925 on its 50th anniversary while the Great Hall addition was a gift of the class of 1924.

How to Enroll in a Mini-Course or Two

Children's Craft Classes Planned

Children ages six to eleven will be able to learn craft processes and skills in the Children's Craft Program to be held this fall in the Memorial Union Craftshop.

The program will run three sessions of seven mornings each to introduce youngsters to various craft media.

Children can experiment with clay, wood, batik, print-making and other crafts, in the fully equipped Craftshop in the Memorial Union. Instructor Kathy Levy, a certified art teacher, hopes to teach the craft process and emphasize the class as a learning experience, as well as the final art product.

Sessions One and Two are for children ages six to eight. Session One runs from Saturday, September 18, to Saturday, October 23; with Session Two running from October 30 to Saturday, December 11.

Children ages nine through eleven will meet seven consecutive Sunday mornings, beginning October 31 to December 12. All classes run from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m.

The fee is \$16 per session for children of Union members and \$22 for non-Union members. For more information call Al Brodsky at 262-1282.


