HISTORY:

The THISTLE was in the passenger and freight service on Lake Winnebago and the Fox River of Wisconsin, out of Oshkosh. In the fall of 1915, she stranded at High Cliff, northeast end of Lake Winnebago. Last listed in 1915.

US Custom House record of February 20, 1900, states her former name as J. H. CRAWFORD (vessel was not enrolled).
