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## MEETING OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Madison, Wisconsin

Friday, June 17, 1927, 9:30 A. M.

PRESENT: Regents Callahan, Grady, Olbrich; President Frank, Business Manager Phillips, Secretary McCaffrey.

Several regents were present and sat with the committee.

## RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE BUSINESS MANAGER

1. That the following transfers be made in the College of Agriculture:

\$2,000 from salaries and wages to general supplies
600 " " " " " chemical supplies
500 " " " " equipment repairs
Adopted.

2. That the following items in the Athletic Council Revolving fund 20.41(5)(c) be increased from increased receipts over budget estimates:

Postage \$1,500
Printing & Publishing 2,000
Salaries 2,000
Adopted.

3. That \$2,200 be transferred from 20.41(1)(d) Regents' Unassigned to 20.41(1)(d) Administration and General. (Confirming verbal approval.)
Adopted.

4. That \$175 be transferred from 20.41 (1)(a) Operation, Reents' Unassigned to 20.41 (1)(a) Administration and General, Comncement.

That \$700 be transferred from 20.41 (1)(a) Library, and \$256

- 6. That the agreement between the <u>State Historical Society</u> and the University, dated October 29, 1915, be modified as follows:
  - 1. The University to pay 60% instead of 50% of the cost of heat.
  - 2. The University to pay 55% instead of 50% of the cost of power.
  - 3. These modifications shall be effective only for the years 1925-26 and 1926-27, and shall not form the basis of the charges for heat and power in the new agreement to go into effect for the year 1927-28. (Confirming verbal approval.)

- 7. That the Business Manager be authorized to purchase the Owen Property located on the corner of Lake and Langdon Streets for the sum of \$25,500, provided there is a sufficient appropriation balance in 20.41(1)(a) at the close of the legislative biennium ending June 30, 1927. (See memorandum.)

  Adopted.
- 8. That the Business Manager be authorized to reimburse the Federal Government for military equipment lost or stolen in the amount of \$39.06, this amount to be charged to 20.41(1)(a) Regents' Unassigned.

  Adopted.
- 9. That upon the recommendation of Director Goodnight, Professor Theodore Macklin be permitted to elect cash for summer session service in 1926 in the amount of \$600.

  Adopted.
  - 10. That the following rebates be granted:

11. That authority be requested from the Emergency Board for urchase of a Ford ton truck for the Horticultural Department; ted cost \$563.00, chargeable to 3-K, Dairy and Farm Sales.

- 12. That upon the recommendation of Dean Richards, an appropriation of \$552.75 be made for Law School continuation invoices, and \$75.00 for a requisition for law books, chargeable to 20.41 (1)(d), Regents' Unassigned.

- 13. That the following partial Schedule of Costs for the Memorial Union and Tripp Commons be approved:

VOTED, That a committee of three, consisting of Regents Grady, Wild and Olbrich, be appointed to confer with the Attorney General with reference to the matter of abandoning military training in the University, the committee to report at a later meeting.

19. The President brought up the matter of the University regulations regarding the Military Department. It was VOTED, That the University regulations be amended to conform to the Federal Statutes. Acc Ad. Jan. 18/27 pp. 172

20. That the regents authorize a compulsory Memorial Union fee of not to exceed \$10.00 from each student.

21. That consent be given to John Peterson to crect a filling station at 1528 University Avenue, adjoining University property. Adopted.

That as soon as practicable, the Alumni Records office and the office of the General Alumni Association be combined; that Mr. B. E. McCermick, present general secretary of the Alumni Association, in addition to helding his office as secretary, be made a paid member of the faculty of the University to officially represent the University in field work and advising secondary school students and their parents relative to the University and to meet with the alumni to organize and strengthen local alumni clubs and make the alumni body as helpful as possible to the University. It was VOTED, That the matter be referred to President Frank.
