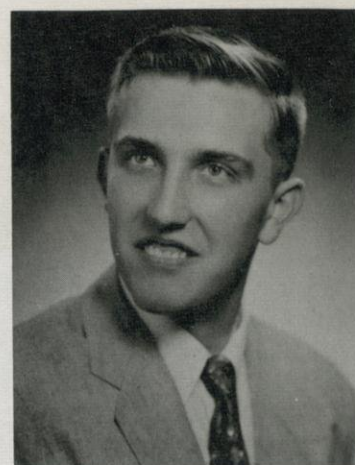
Karen Johnson
