The Senior Class made a new record this year when 14 students from their class qualified for honors. These students have maintained a 3.5 average and better through all four years of high school.

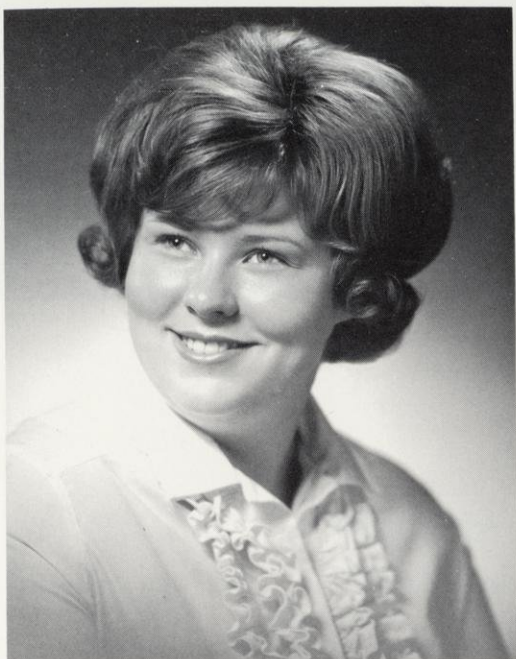

One of the most memorable events of the year was the Chorus active participation in "Li'l Abner," Waterford High School's first musical. After a busy schedule of

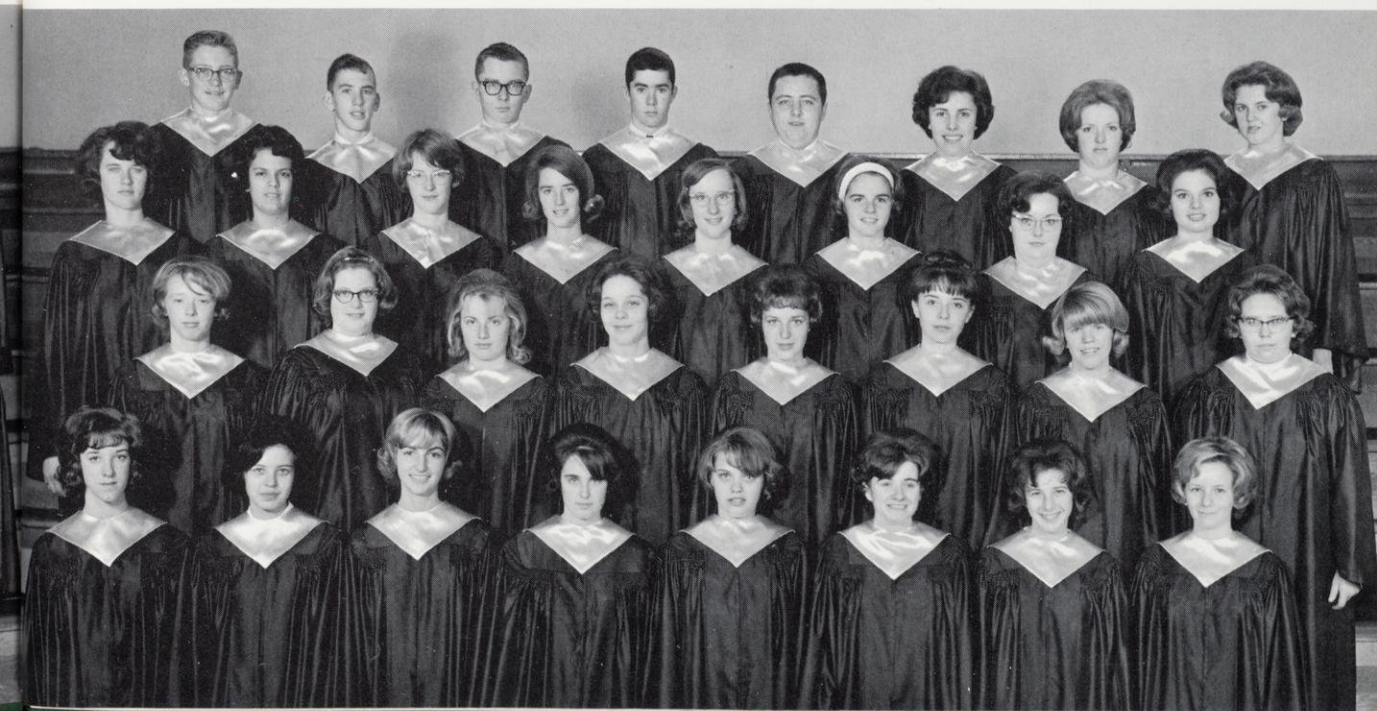
rehearsals for this presentation, the Chorus began practicing for the Winter Concert which was presented with the Band.

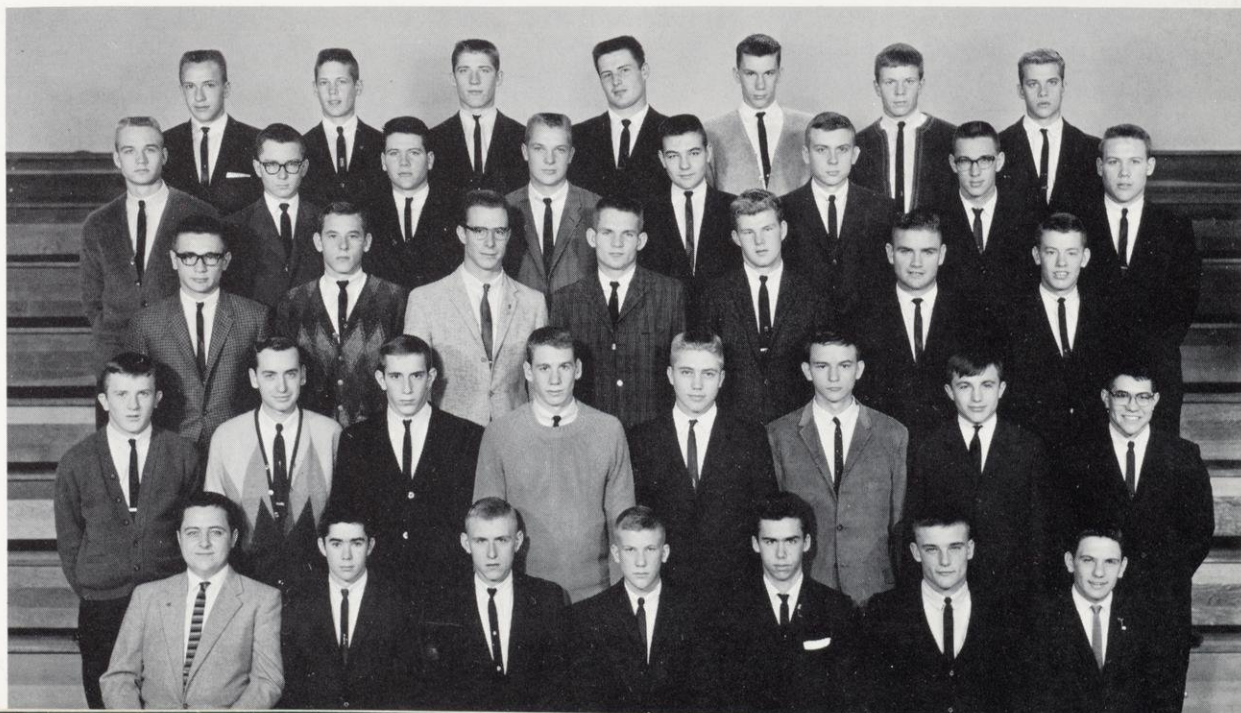

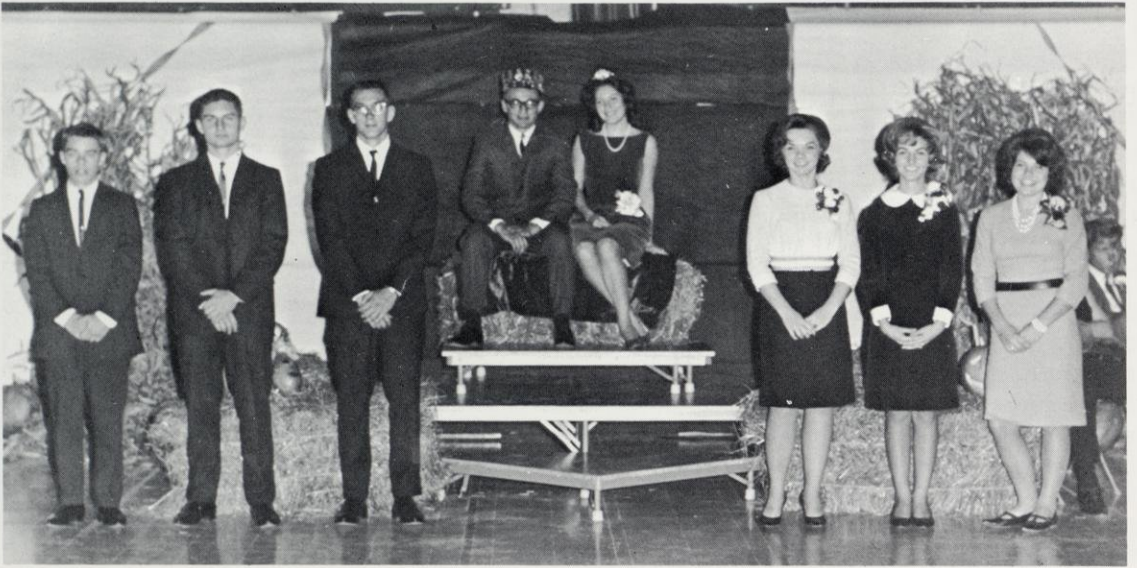

On Thursday, October 8, the Senior boys were busy gathering the wood for the bonfire, while the Senior girls prepared the

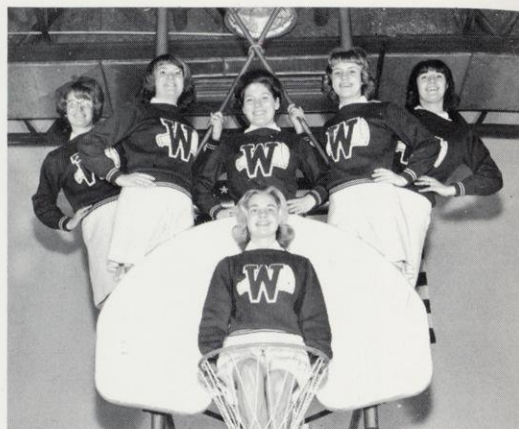

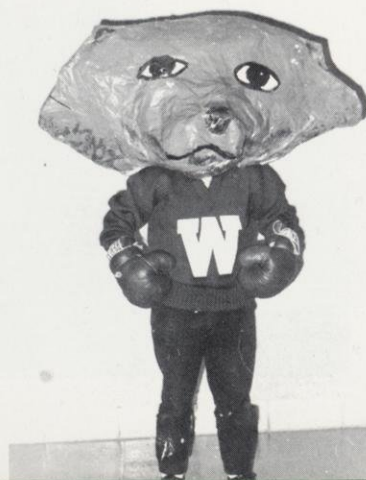

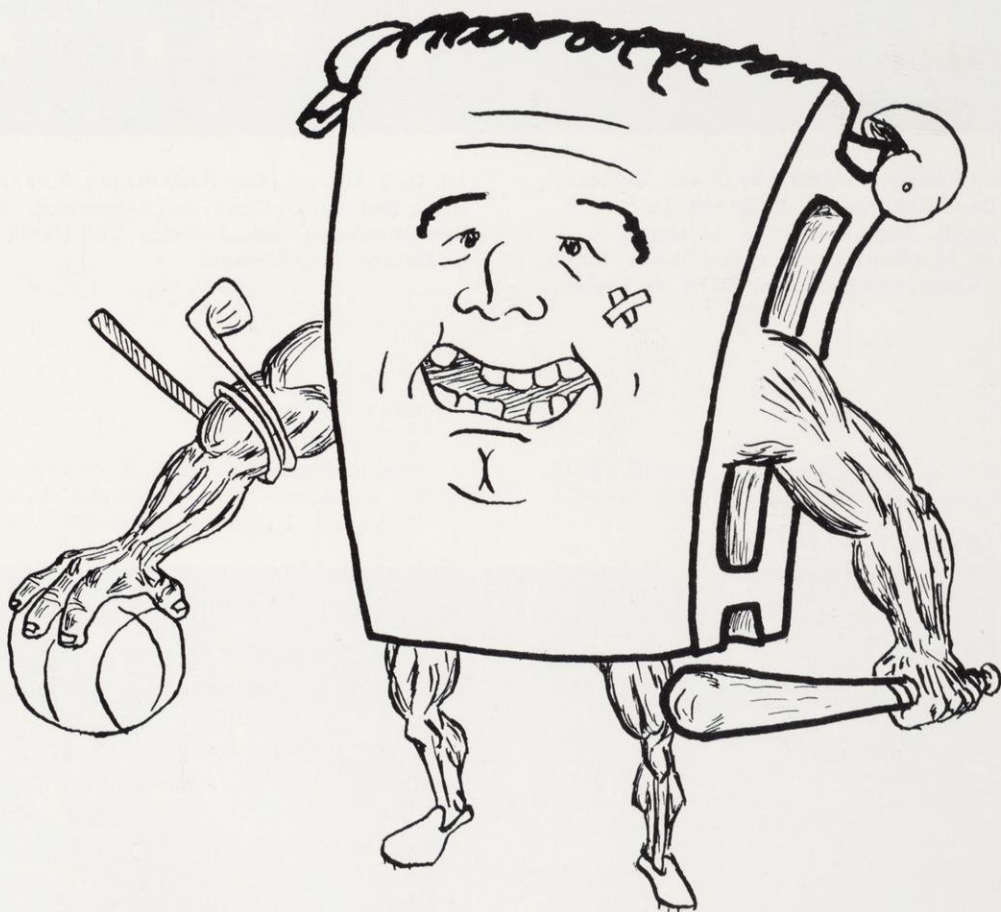

The Waterford High School B-Team, coached by Mr. Christiansen, had an excellent winning season of five victories and only one loss.

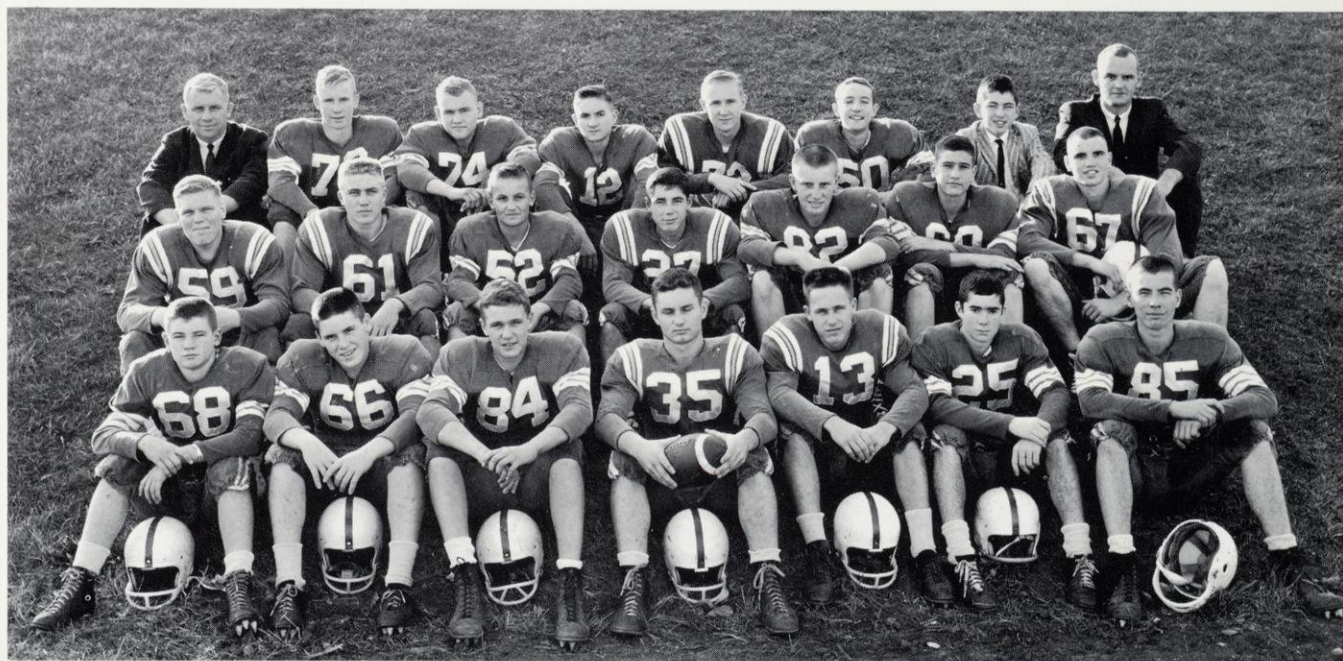
With mostly sophomores, freshmen, and a few juniors, this small number of boys showed a lot of spirit and gave all they had to make their team a tough one.

The Waterford Cagers have been playing an exciting brand of basketball by employing a full court pressure defense which in turn blends well with the fast break type of basketball.

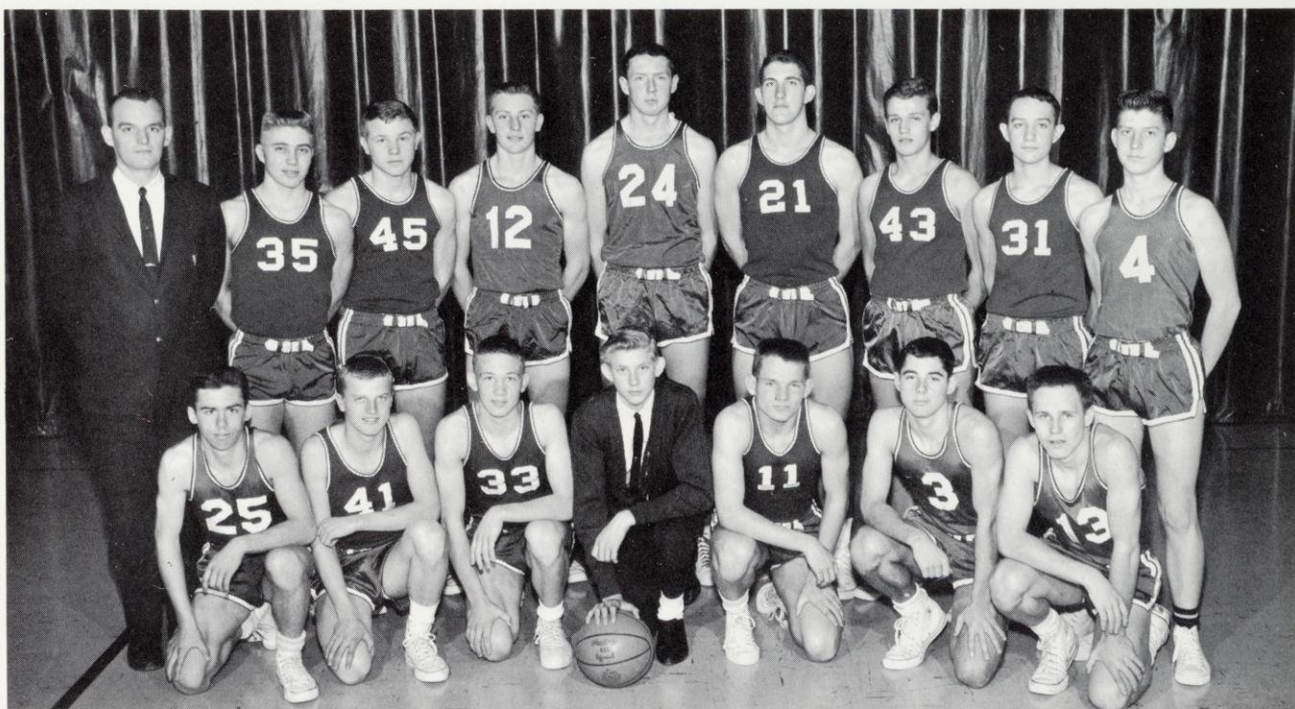
Despite the lack of size, the Wolverine quintet did an excellent job by compiling an over-all 12-1 record and a 6-0 conference record.
