

History of Union Art is published



We are proud to announce the publication of A Reflection of Time: the Wisconsin Union Art Collection, a history of the Union art program and collection.

Researched and written by former

Union Public Information Director Jody Schmitz, the art booklet illustrates how art became an important part of the overall Union program, shaped largely by former Union Director Porter Butts, whose own interest in the various arts strengthened his philosophy that art be an accepted part of the daily life of students and the entire University community.

A Reflection of Time is replete with photographs of the "living collection" and remembrances from the archives, includes a history of the Salon of Art and student competitive art shows, recalls the founding of the Craftshop, and explains how the state's largest collection of art by Wisconsin artists was put together. Also featured are selected artists from the collection. An addendum to the booklet, a catalogue of the complete Union collection, is soon to be completed.


Once again, reserved parking will be available to series subscribers.

Keep this in mind when traveling close to campus . . . it may be best to park at the Lake Street ramp or beyond to avoid traffic disruptions. At Memorial, the outdoor deck surrounding Tripp Commons will be ripped up and resurfaced, and the Theater roof and the deck above the Hoofers Quarters will be replaced.

Summer Children's Craft Classes


