

TO UNLOCK the book, raise cover to be unlocked to a vertical position, and pull rod out at bottom toward you as far as it will come.

TO LOCK — Adjust the cover back into position so the notches in the cover fit over the posts, then push in rod.

Do not attempt to unlock either cover unless opposite cover is locked, as posts should always be held in one of the covers.


TO LOCK BOOK PERMANENTLY — This is only to be done when all the sheets are written up and placed in the binder, for once permanently locked, it is impossible to unlock or open it.

For this purpose two permanent sealing buttons are furnished on request. Insert these sealing buttons into the round holes near end of locking case so that the slot in the sealing button runs lengthwise with the binder. Then drive in button with sufficient force to turn the ends of split button. This permanently locks and seals the book.

Meeting called to order by President M. Myers at 7 pm with R. Danz absent.

Public notice was approved as given on motion by R. Dimpfl, 2nd by R. Schaller and carried.

Minutes approved as printed on motion by D. Williams, 2nd by J. Owens and carried.

Greg Held, Held & Associates, Inc, reported that Russ Nelson's contract is complete except for testing the pumping station. The pumps from the old station can be used as standby pumps for the other lift station. He will be 90% done by his next pay request. The curb and gutter on the south side of Main Street will be done next spring when the remaining sidewalks and curb and gutters are done. The water problem at Wright's Feed Service was discussed. Donahue Engineering will be coming with some new equipment to look for water leaks. The Board directed Greg to prepare plans for the storm sewer on South Grove so it can be done this fall.

Ray Kokette, Madison Gas & Electric, stated they will not be raising rates as they have to apply to the Public Service Commission first. There will be a fellow available to instruct the Firemen in regard to fighting Natural Gas fires.

S. Webster went over the letter from Stand Associates concerning Valders Blvd. Also went over the letter that was sent to DNR in regard to the Bike Trail. He reported the University of Wisconsin insurance team that did a survey in Barneveld will be sending a report soon.

Discussion on David Ranney's equipment parked on mediun. Since the Village may be doing some work in this area he will be asked to move them.

After reviewing the Revolving Loan Fund Management Plan it was adopted on motion by C. Roberts, 2nd by R. Schaller. D. Williams voted no. Motion carried.

D. Williams moved the Board wait until the November meeting to act on Bonnie Hodgson's application for a loan. Motion died for a lack of second. The Board went over her application and approved it in accordance with the Revolving Loan Fund rules on motion by C. Roberts, 2nd by D. Williams and carried.

Pay request #3 on Contract No. 85-100 of Russ Nelson for \$81,325.60 contingent on receiving Lien Wavers from his suppliers was approved on motion by D. Williams, 2nd by R. Schaller and carried.

The 1986 Sewer Budget was reviewed and adopted on motion by D. Williams, 2nd by R. Dimpfl and carried.

It was agreed the Village Ordinances need redoing. Two representatives from firms will appear at the November 4th meeting.

S. Websters wages for September were ok'd on motion by J. Owens, 2nd by R. Schaller and carried.

Clerk to call Leary Co. that painted the water tower on repairs that should have been done.

The Library will be hooked up to Natural Gas on motion by D. Williams, 2nd by C. Roberts and carried.

On motion by R. Dimpfl, 2nd by D. Williams the Village Board will go on record as recommending that the Municipal Building not be hooked up to Natural Gas. Motion carried.

On motion by D. Williams, 2nd by R. Schaller, Evans & Waelti Builders will be directed to build covers over 2 pits at the sewer ponds. Motion carried.

A preliminary budget meeting will be held on Monday evening, October 28 at 6:30 pm.

Meeting adjourned on motion by D. Williams, 2nd by C. Roberts and carried.

VILLAGE BOARD MEETING November 4, 1985 7 pm

Meeting called to order by Pres. M. Myers with all trustees present.

Public notice as given approved on motion by R. Dimpfl, 2nd by R. Schaller and carried.

Minutes approved as printed on motion by D. Williams, 2nd by J. Owens and carried.

John Liebmann, Chairman of the Barneveld-Brigham Fire District presented the budget for 1986 of \$32,400 to be split between the Village and Township. \$20,400 is for insurance and maintenance of the Municipal Building and \$12,000 is for the Fire Dept budget. Budget accepted on motion by D. Williams, 2nd by C. Roberts and carried.

Residents north of Main Street have asked that a driveway not be allowed for a back entrance for Thousand Island Bar and Cuttin' Corral. The Dept of Natural Resources left the decision up to the Village Board. After much discussion on the pros and cons and other alternatives R. Danz moved the driveway for the businesses be denied. D. Williams seconded. R. Dimpfl abstained. Motion carried. The Board suggested the owners of businesses contact the Planning Commission for suggestions &/or any changes they would like.

BUDGET HEARING - 8 pm

The budget of Income of \$202,670.06 and Expenditures of \$202,416.46 was accepted on motion by R. Dimpfl, 2nd by R. Danz and carried. Clerk/treasurer & Zoning Administrator Pat Messinger will receive a \$.50 an hour raise; a weeks paid vacation and pension of \$100 per month. (\$50 from her check & & \$50 from Village) Budget also included a raise for Municipal Judge Jack Parman from \$375 a year to \$500.

Representatives of Wisconsin Power & Light Co appeared concerning the installation of photo voltaic panels on the roof of the Municipal Building for experimentation of collecting electricity from the sun. They showed slides of other such set ups to the Village and Township Boards. They had contacted the Roofing outfit and if the roofing men can put the braces on the roof the 20 year warranty will still be in effect. By unanimous vote the Boards gave W. P & L. instructions to proceed.

The Board and guests viewed the Miller Beet Commercial several times. It was approved.

Jim Kinnard of Iowa Kounty Chrysler stated he had extra expenses in digging the footings for his building as the land had not been loosened down 4 feet as he had been told. The Board at a previous meeting had agreed to incur any extra costs should this be the case. Eng. Larry Schmidt is to be contacted regarding this situation.

Al Wright of Wrights Feed Service appeared reporting the lift station for the Commercial Park is not operating yet. He still has a water problem. Donahue from Milwaukee had checked the water mains on that end of the Village and had not found a leak. Steve Webster is to contact the University as to what to do when an underground stream has been opened up.

Robert Prosch of U. S. Municipal Codification, appeared in regard to having the Village Ordinances recodified. He gave prodecures and prices. Board will let him know after the first of year if he is hired.

- 2. Pursuant to Sections 66.296(2)(b) and 66.296(5) of the Wisconsin Statutes, a public hearing on the passage of such Final Resolution shall be held on Monday, December 1985, at 7:00 o'clock p.m., at the Municipal Offices, County Trunk Highway PD East, Barneveld, Wisconsin.



They came in with the highest Discount, giving a total estimated savings of \$122,022.92. The revenue bonds combined would be at an NIC rate of 7.95759 and would mature in 20 years. The net present value saings would be at \$19,138.78. The revenue would have a call date in 8-9 years. At this time, any money available could be used to pay off toward principal. A 30 day notice would have to be given in a nationally circulated paper (The Bond Buyer). This could be done as often as semiannually.

The following resolution was then introduced and moved by Trustee Doug Salisbury. Roll Call: Bob Schaller - aye, Doug Salisbury - aye, Bob Jabs - aye, Clinton Roberts - aye, Mary Ann Myers - aye.

Motion was made that Ehlers and Associates be offered the revenue bond for issue with anticipated future savings of \$122,022.92 from the purchase of the FmHA Discount Loan Program.

Harold Zander has 125 acres available to spread the sludge on from the sewer ponds. Village Clerk to contact DOT on current status of purchase of land at corner of 18-151 and ID.

Board asked Utility Bookkeeper to send letter for all delinquent Utility bills.

ORDINANCE NO. 12.08

AN ORDINANCE TO INCLUDE CATS IN THE REGULATION AND LICENSING REQUIREMENTS OF \$12.06 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF ORDINANCES

The Village Board of the Village of Barneveld, Wisconsin, hereby ordains as follows:

Section 1. Section 12.06 of the Municipal Code of the Village of Barneveld, Wisconsin, is hereby amended to include the term "and cat" or "and cats" in this section in all cases except where the inclusion would clearly be inappropriate to the intent of the section and this ordinance.

 $\underline{\text{Section 2}}$. Subsection (1) of §12.06 of the Municipal Code shall be amended by adding the following sentence to the end of such section: "All licenses required under this section shall be obtained before January 31st of each calendar year; except where a dog or cat is brought into the Village after that date or when a kitten or puppy has not reached the required age by that date, such license shall be obtained within 14 days of such event."

Section 3. This ordinance shall become effective the day after posting as provided by law.

WHEREAS, the Village of Barneveld, being only 651 in population does not divide the Village into wards.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE VILLAGE BOARD OF THE VILLAGE OF BARNEVELD, IOWA COUNTY, WISCONSIN, THAT, the Village accepts Iowa County's determination that the entire municipality be included in the District 12 ward division county supervisory district.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, upon passage, a copy of this resolution shall be filed with the Village Clerk, who shall transmit a copy to the County Clerk within five days of its adoption and that this resolution shall remain in effect for each election until modified or rescinded, in accordance with Statute, or until a new division is made following the next federal decennial census.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE VILLAGE OF BARNEVELD, WISCONSIN

The Village Board of the Village of Barneveld ordains as follows:

Section 1. Section 10.03(6) of the Code of Ordinances is hereby repealed and recreated to read as follows:

(6) NOXIOUS WEEDS. All weeds and other rank growth of vegetation in residential areas shall be kept cut to a height not to exceed 6". All weeds and other rank growth of vegetation on unplatted, wooded or other areas shall be cut or sprayed a minimum of twice a year. The Village Board may cause all weeds and grass to be cut and removed, brush to be removed and the cost thereof charged to the property under §66.60 (16), Wis. Stats. In addition to the costs of removal, the owner of any property in violation of this subsection may be subject to a penalty as provided in §25.04 of this Code of Ordinances.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect the day after passage and posting as provided by law.
