



Campus Carnival, sponsored by the Wisconsin Student Association, is fast becoming an institution at the University. It was presented for the first time two years ago in the Stock Pavilion, replacing the Charity Ball. Founded with the purpose of helping needy organizations through the Campus Community Chest, the first Carnival was so successful that last year it was moved to the field house in order to accommodate the crowds and the overflow of booths.

All organized groups on campus are eligible to participate and each year more of them have taken part in the Carnival. Trophies contributed by the business men of Madison create a competitive spirit, adding to the enthusiasm of the groups entering. Two sets of first, second, and third place trophies will be awarded to the following: booths in which the audience takes an active part in the fun, and booths in which a show is given for the audience.

This year for the first time a new attraction has been added to the Campus Carnival in the person of a "Campus Clown". Each organization participating in the carnival is qualified to nominate a candidate for clown. The candidates will be voted upon by the Carnival-goers on their antics preceding and during the Carnival.

The highlight of the evening will be the awarding of trophies to the booth winners by the "Campus Clown".
