At the request of President Fred, Vice President Little made the following statement in presenting the recommendation for acceptance of a special gift to the University:

"Since the last meeting of the Regents, a gift of unusual historic interest has been received which we think deserves special mention.

"The famous fighting football song, 'On Wisconsin', has world renown, and its music is played and sung by many high schools and colleges throughout our state and country. This great march has had an interesting history. John Philip Sousa described 'On Wisconsin' as 'the finest college melody ever written.'

"Today we wish to announce that the University now has one of the first ten proofs of the march song 'On Wisconsin' which came off the press over forty years ago. The copy is autographed by William T. Purdy who wrote the stirring music.

"This copy comes to us as a gift from Mr. Harry L. Grant, Barber Farm, Essex Junction, Vermont, a friend of Bill Purdy, and a 1900 graduate of Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

"We believe that these excerpts from Mr. Grant's letter to us will interest you.

'On a rainy afternoon in 1910 my friend, Bill Purdy, sat down by my office desk in Chicago.

"Harry", he said, "I have written a song and the printer has just given me the first ten copies to be printed."

'He then unrolled the ten copies and presented me with one of them. He was modest about it and expressed doubt that it would amount to much.

'I thanked him and said, "Bill, you never can tell. It may be more successful than you think." I then requested him to sign my copy which he did.

'I believe this is the oldest copy in existence of the first edition of "On Wisconsin". As it includes also the auto-

graph of William T. Purdy, I hope you will accept it as a gift to the University.'

"Our librarian, Mr. Gilbert Doane, says that he will be glad to place this interesting gift among the rare documents of the University of Wisconsin."

Upon motion of Regent Rennebohm, seconded by Regent Steiger, it was VOTED, That the gift by Mr. Harry L. Grant, Essex Junction, Vermont, of one of the first ten proofs of "On Wisconsin", which was autographed in 1910 by William T. Purdy, who wrote the music, be accepted; and that the Secretary be instructed to thank Mr. Grant on behalf of the Regents for this fine gift.

Upon motion of Regent Gelatt, seconded by Regent Renk, Actions 1 to 3, inclusive, listed under the recommendation and report of the Vice President of Business and Finance (II. Report of Actions Taken) were approved, ratified and confirmed.

III. Budget Transfers

The Vice President of Business and Finance presented the report of budget transfers for the information of the Regents. (See EXHIBIT C attached)

Regent Rennebohm presented the report of the Executive Committee.

Regent Rennebohm reported that the following actions had been taken by the Executive Committee since the October 24, 1953, meeting of the Board:

1. That the current session of the Legislature be requested to enact legislation to permit the University of Wisconsin to extend the shoreline of Lake Mendota from the University Boat House west to Stony Point, with the maximum extension being approximately 640 feet north of the north face of the Memorial Union Theater, in order that the University may fill in the lake, over a period of years, to such extended shoreline to provide space for parking, roadways, and other University purposes; and that the Vice President of the Board be authorized to prepare and submit the necessary material to the Legislature for this request.
2. That the sale of the large quonset building on the lower campus to

Dane County for a consideration of \$3,500 be approved; and that the Vice President of Business and Finance be authorized to complete the transaction.

3. That, in accordance with the action of the Regents on September 12, 1953, authority be granted to include in the lease with Starks Farms, Inc., for the use of the Willis Juday Farm, a provision that the lessor may reconstruct the barn to provide a potato storage warehouse for which the lessee will reimburse the lessor at an estimated cost of \$7,500, chargeable to the Lelah Starks gift account, number 15-887.

Upon motion of Regent Rennebohm, seconded by Regent Gelatt, it was VOTED, That the above three actions taken by the Executive Committee since the October 24, 1953, meeting of the Board be confirmed.

Regent Rennebohm inquired whether action should be taken by the Regents to implement the authorization contained in Bill No. 709,S (1953 Legislature) for extending the Lake Mendota shoreline. He stated that any such action would, of course, be subject to the signing of the bill by the Governor. He also pointed out that any such action taken by the Regents should probably be limited at this time to authorize proceeding with this project to the extent of funds available for that purpose. He mentioned that a gift of \$10,000 has been promised for this purpose. Upon motion of Regent Watson, seconded by Regent Steiger, it was

VOTED, That the administrative officers of the University be authorized and directed to proceed with filling in Lake Mendota to the authorized extended shoreline and to expedite this project (subject to approval of Bill No. 709,S, 1953 Legislature, by the Governor).

Regent Renk presented the report of the Educational Committee.

Upon motion of Regent Renk, seconded by Regent Steiger, it was VOTED, That the following recommendations of the Educational Committee be adopted:

1. That Ronald E. Mitchell, professor of speech, be granted leave of absence, without pay, for the second semester of 1953-54.
2. That approval be given to the action of the University faculty requiring that majors in Elementary Education be required to present evidence of Speech proficiency.

Regent Steiger presented the report of the Business and Finance Committee.

Upon motion of Regent Steiger, seconded by Regent Renk, it was
VOTED, That, upon the recommendation of the architects, the Bureau of En-
gineering, and the Faculty Committee on Greenhouse Construction:

a. The following schedule of costs for the Walnut Street Greenhouse Range be approved:

(NOTE: The base bids would have provided 18,720 square feet of greenhouse space, plus corridors and head house. Due to budget limitations, it will be necessary to take the deductions indicated, which will reduce the greenhouse space to 14,625 square feet. The complete head house will be built.)

Regent Steiger moved and Regent Wanvig seconded the adoption of the following recommendation of the Business and Finance Committee:

"That the preliminary plans and specifications for the addition to the Biochemistry Building recommended by the University Campus Planning Commission be approved; and that authority be granted for the completion of the final plans and specifications."

Vice President Peterson displayed a sketch showing the exterior of the proposed Addition to the Biochemistry Building, as well as the present structure, and passed around a set of the preliminary floor plans. A question was raised as to whether the exterior design of the proposed addition could be revised to more nearly conform to the present structure. It was pointed out that the proposed design provided for the best utilization of the space in the proposed addition, which will be used as a research laboratory. It was also pointed out that the proposed addition is at the rear of, and partially obscured by, other buildings facing on University Avenue and Henry Mall. The suggestion was also made of the possibility of, at some future time, changing the exterior of the present structure to more nearly conform to the exterior of the proposed addition. Vice President Peterson reported on the distribution of space in the proposed addition. The question was then put and the above recommendation of the Business and Finance Committee was approved, subject to the understanding that the administrative officers will discuss with the architects the feasibility of harmonizing the exterior appearance of the proposed addition and the present building.

Upon motion of Regent Steiger, seconded by Regent Wanvig, it was VOTED, That the Vice President of Business and Finance be authorized to sign and file a preliminary application for a loan of \$2,850,000 with the Housing and Home Finance Agency for the construction of new residence halls.

Upon motion of Regent Steiger, seconded by Regent Watson, it was
VOTED, That the Regents express their appreciation to the Governor and
the members of the State Building Commission for the appropriations made by the
Commission to finance additions to the Service Memorial Institutes and Birge Hall;
that the Governor be requested to release the funds needed for the preparation of
plans and specifications; and that, subject to the approval of the Governor and the
State Chief Engineer, the Vice President of Business and Finance be authorized to
sign contracts with outside architects for the preparation of plans and specifica-
tions for the proposed additions to the Service Memorial Institutes and Birge Hall.

Upon motion of Regent Steiger, seconded by Regent Renk, it was
VOTED, That the Wisconsin University Building Corporation be authorized
to make applications for a first mortgage loan in the amount of \$550,000 for the
construction of the Indoor Practice Building at Camp Randall, the loan to be amor-
tized in not more than 30 years.

Upon motion of Regent Steiger, seconded by Regent Renk, it was
VOTED, That the Vice President of Business and Finance be authorized to
sign lease agreements with the City of Green Bay and with Marathon County for the
use of facilities in Green Bay and Wausau, respectively, to house University Ex-
tension Center activities; the agreements to be for a period of four years begin-
ning July 1, 1953, subject to cancellation by either party on June 30 of any year
by notice 60 days in advance, and to contain the same terms relating to payment of
expenses of operation which were contained in the lease agreements for the said
facilities in effect for the year 1952-53.

Regent Rennebohm, as Chairman of the Special Regent Committee on Agricul-
tural Lands, reported that the College of Agriculture was continuing the study of
possible land suitable for acquisition. He stated that availability, price and lo-
cation were matters which presented many difficult problems. He also reported
that, with reference to disposition of the present farm lands, nothing much could
be done until the report is received from the City of Madison regarding the recom-
mendations of the City regarding municipal developments in the area. He also re-
ported that nothing can be done regarding the removal of the chicken yards from
University Avenue until funds are available.

Regent Renk reported that there had been discussion, at the meeting of the Educational Committee on Friday, of the need for low-cost dormitories. He mentioned the number of women who did not enroll in September because of the lack of housing and pointed out that increasing enrollments in the future made it essential that the Regents should be doing something regarding this problem. He suggested the possibility of considering reserving part of the University farm areas for a dormitory or trailer camp project.

Vice President Peterson reported on the low-cost student housing which had been completed at Oregon State College. He pointed out that it was not fire-resistant construction and inquired whether the Regents would consider such type of construction for student housing. The Regents indicated that although they would prefer to have fire-resistant construction, the studies to be made should include both types of construction. Vice President Peterson also reported that the studies made to date indicated that low-cost dormitories cannot be built at the present time without substantial subsidies. Upon motion of Regent Renk, seconded by Regent Laird, it was

VOTED, That the Regents direct the University administration to work on preliminary sketches to build or buy, south or east of the campus, a low-cost housing unit for about one hundred students - either in one building or several; that we explore the possibilities of financing either through the State of Wisconsin, the federal government, or by public subscription; and that a progress report be made at the January Regent meeting.

Upon motion of Regent Steiger, seconded by Regent Renk, it was
VOTED, That the meeting adjourn.

The meeting adjourned at 11:05 A.M.
