Dr. Kit Saunders, the Director of Women's Athletics for the past nine years, has assumed a new role in the Wisconsin Athletic Administration. As the Associate Director of Non-Revenue Sports, Kit oversees the policies and direction of the twenty-two men's and women's non-revenue sports at Wisconsin. Kit's long association with UW athletics also includes serving as the women's sports coordinator, lecturer in physical education, and the women's tennis coach prior to her appointment as Director of Women's Athletics in 1974.

She has held positions of leadership on the state, regional, and national level. As one of the founders of the Wisconsin Women's Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, Kit served in numerous state offices including that of president. She has been a commissioner for the six-state Midwest Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (MAIAW), and was elected vice president for Division I schools of the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW).



Paula Bonner has assumed the role of Assistant Athletic Director in charge of the Wisconsin Women's Intercollegiate Athletics Program. Now in her sixth year of administrative association with the UW program, Paula oversees the complete operation of the 11-sport Badger women's program including budget preparation and expenditures, financial aid, special events arrangements, and recruiting.

She has served as the chairperson of the State and Midwest Regional AIAW ethics and eligibility committees, and heads the UW Athletic Board Women's Sports Committee.

Sports Information

The responsibility for disseminating all information and publicity materials for the 11-sport women's athletic program lies with **Tamara J. Flarup**, Director of Women's Sports Information

Now in her seventh year, Tam has been able to observe Wisconsin women's sports gain stature and recognition both statewide and nationally. Under Tam's direction, the sports news staff coordinates sports results, plans brochures and other publicity materials, and writes weekly sports releases and additional features on the women athletes. Tam also assists the Women's Intercollegiate Sports Booster Club (W.I.S. Club) in its promotions and publications.

Active in concerns of women's sports publicists nationally, Tam organized and chaired the College Sports Information Directors (CoSIDA) "Publicists for Women's Sports Committee" two years, served as a coordinator for the CoSIDA Publications Contest Committee, and was a member of the AIAW Publicity Committee.

During the past summer, Tam was selected as one of 34 sports information directors to serve as a media liaison director for the 1983 National Sports Festival in Colorado Springs.



Academic excellence is emphasized at Wisconsin. Much of the credit for the impressive academic record behind many Badger athletes is the counseling system available to the men and women student athletes.

Assistant to the Director of Athletics **Diane Johnson** and Counselor **Alan Zussman** are responsible for the Wisconsin athletics counseling program which is offered to the nearly 900 Badger athletes. As former members of the academic dean's office, Diane and Al have a comprehensive understanding of academics at Wisconsin, and a permanent line of communication with all university departments.

For those athletes that do request assistance, Diane and Allan offer counseling sessions on a one-to-one basis at a time appropriate for the athlete. Wisconsin athletes are encouraged to be degree-oriented while allowing for the flexibility to explore different areas. Diane and Allan take a personal approach to each athlete in determining his or her individual needs, whether the needs be personal or academic in nature.

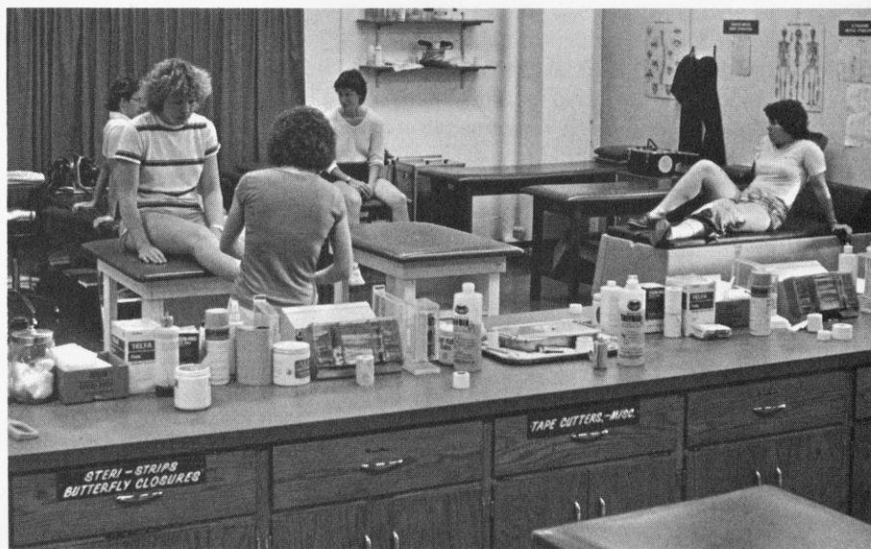


Academic Counseling

Sports Medicine

The care, prevention and treatment of injuries to all Wisconsin athletes is supervised by a four-person staff of N.A.T.A. certified athletic trainers. **Gordon Stoddard, Jan Tappon, Dennis Helwig, and Jim Bossany** are supported by a staff of 25 student trainers and one certified graduate assistant as they care for the nearly 900 men and women athletes at Wisconsin.

The staff utilizes training rooms in the Stadium, Natatorium, and UW Fieldhouse. All training areas are equipped with the finest therapeutic modalities and rehabilitative apparatus. An orthopedic surgeon assigned to intercollegiate athletics also assists in the diagnosis and treatment of the athletes.





**Head Coach
Russ Carney**

Former UW assistant Coach Russ Carney begins his second season as head women's volleyball coach. Carney came to Wisconsin from Kellogg Community College in Battle Creek, MI, where he coached his 1980 women's volleyball team to the NJCAA National Championship Title.

The former U.S. National team member began his playing career at Kellogg and later transferred to Ball State University, where he lettered two years. Russ earned his bachelors degree in physical education from Ball State in 1977 and returned to Kellogg Community College as the assistant coach prior to coming to Wisconsin.

Besides the national champion women's team, Russ has had successful coaching endeavors with the Junior Olympics, where his men's team won the gold medal in 1980. Russ collected another gold medal in the 1981 National Sports Festival when he coached the men's East team to a first-place festival finish.

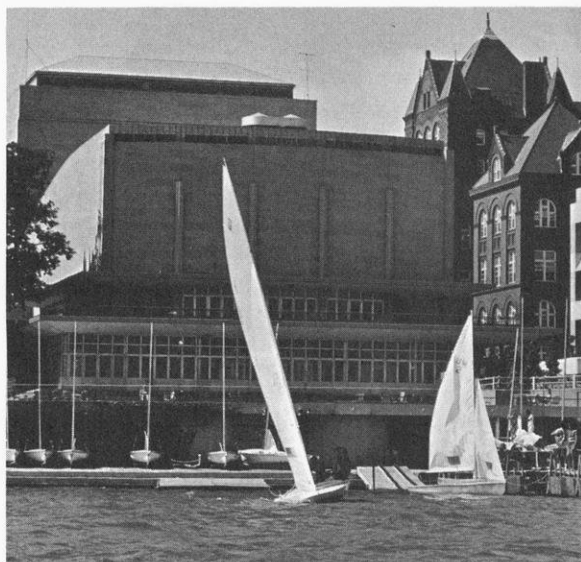
**Assistant Coach

Assistant volleyball coach Mary Skudlarek begins her second season with the Wisconsin program. She has national champion competitive experience as a member of the twice NJCAA Champion Kellogg Community College volleyball team. She completed her education at the University of Illinois where she was a two-year letter winner and physical education graduate.

Additional coaching experiences include a year stint as assistant coach at Lakeview High School in Battle Creek, MI. Mary has also coached in Sports Camp International summer camps, and coached the Battle Creek junior team to an 11th place finish at the 1980 Junior Olympic Games.

The South Bend, IN, native is enrolled in graduate school at Wisconsin.

Madison and the Campus



Nestled between a chain of four sparkling lakes, the dominant feature on the Madison skyline is the majestic capitol building, whose 200-foot illuminated white dome is visible for miles both day and night.

Madison is a clean, vibrant city whose chief businesses are education and government. Located just three driving hours from Chicago, one-and-one-half hours from Milwaukee, and five hours from Minneapolis, Madison is consistently rated as one of the most attractive places to live in the country. In 1978, Madison proudly accepted the designation of All-American City given by the national Municipal League.

The Wisconsin campus is located just one mile from the state capitol on a series of hills overlooking scenic Lake Mendota, the largest of the chain of lakes.

The campus covers over 900 acres—most within two blocks of Lake Mendota. Many of the residence halls have the lake in their backyard, and there are numerous bathing beaches along the Mendota shoreline. In addition, the UW Arboretum, a nature study and hiking area, offers another 1,224 acres to the campus community. Also located near the campus is Picnic Point, a 129-acre park-like peninsula which extends into Lake Mendota and is used for nature study and recreation. Jogging paths and bike trails extend along the entire campus shoreline of Lake Mendota.

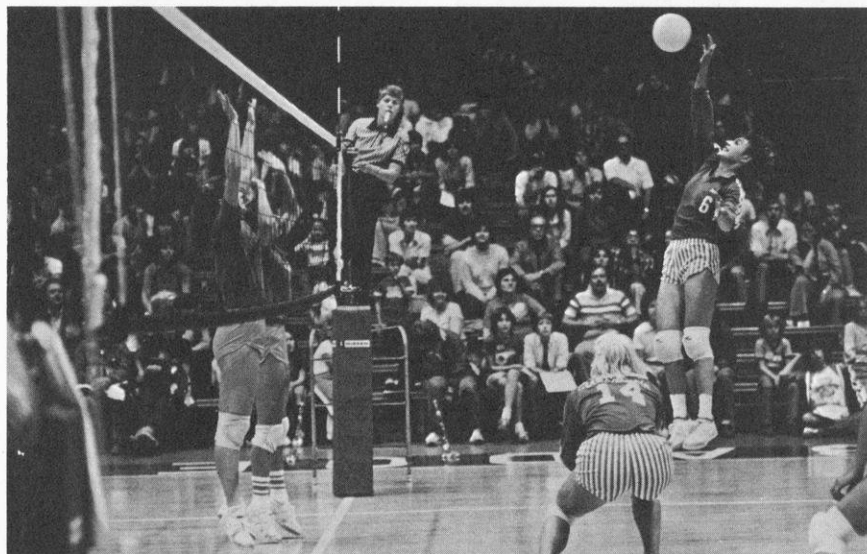
History and Highlights

In its 10-year history, the UW women's volleyball program has fashioned a 239-149-14 overall record for a winning percentage of .216. Just two losing seasons are included in that record, but the Badger team is definitely on the rebound completing its first Big Ten Conference season last year with a 4-9 record and sixth place finish. Wisconsin was 11-16 overall last season, but looks to improve that record with the return of five starters.

Senior **Megan Scott** of Platteville, WI, was a top performer last season leading the Big Ten Conference in three categories. Scott led in total kills (173), kills per match (14.4), and blocking points (74).

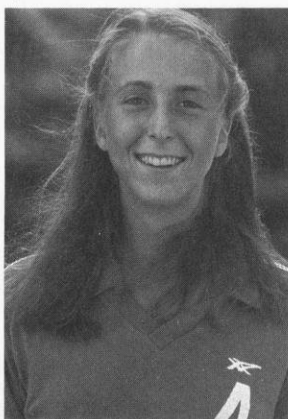
As a member of the Big Ten Conference, Wisconsin will play each school in the Western division of the Conference twice (home and away), and each school in the Eastern Division once. The top two teams in each division will meet in a single-elimination tournament which will determine the Big Ten Champion and automatic qualifier to regional play in the NCAA National Volleyball Championship.

Volleyball practice and tryouts begin the third week of August, with the intercollegiate competitive season extending from September through November. Following the semester break ending in January, the varsity team competes in its "second season" as a school sponsored USVBA team.

Thus, Wisconsin will play each team in the Western division twice (home and away), and will play each team in the Eastern division once. The top two teams in each division will meet in a single elimination tournament, November 18-19, at Northwestern.

Big Ten Eastern Division: Indiana, Michigan, Michigan State, Ohio State, Purdue.

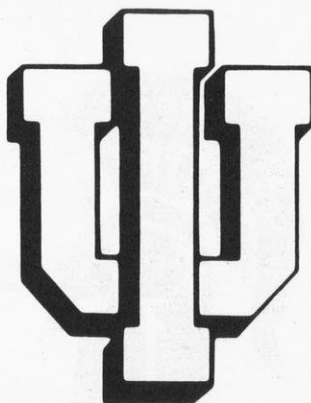

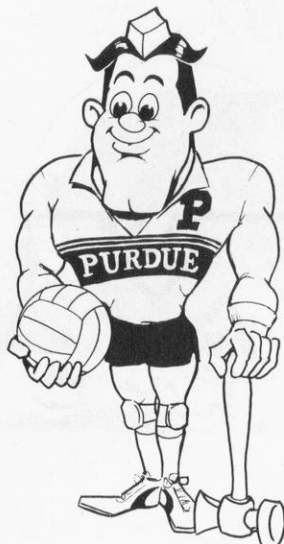

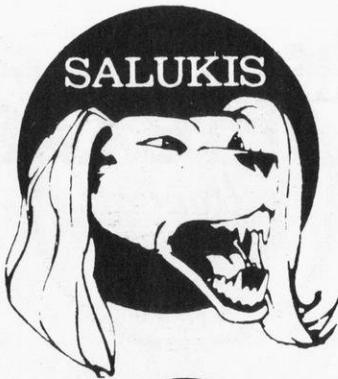
