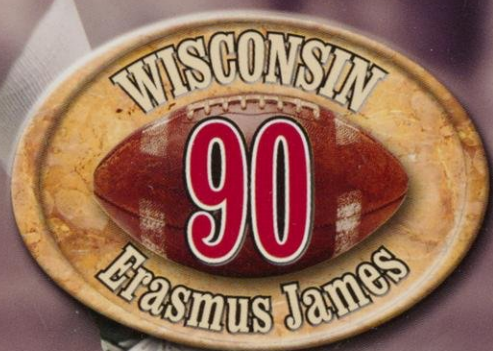

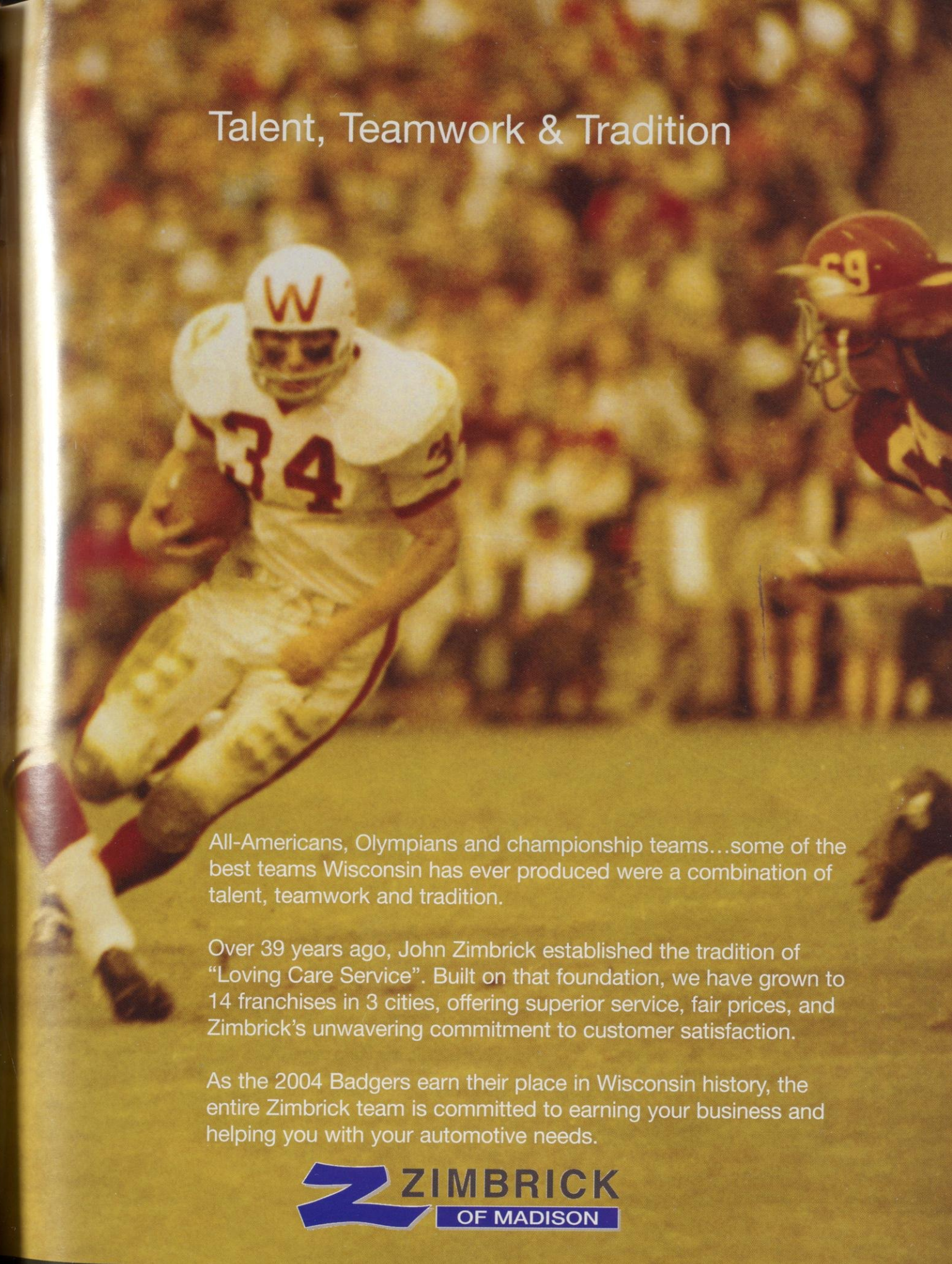

## Badgers Look to Go 2-0 vs. UNLV

Wisconsin (1-0) hosts UNLV (0-1) today at 81,318-seat Camp Randall Stadium. Kickoff is set for 11:02 a.m. CDT. ESPN will televise the game nationally, with Mark Jones, Bob Davie and Holly Rowe (sideline) calling the action.

Wisconsin Public Television (Mike Heller and Scott Nelson) will air its tape-delay telecast of the game statewide at 10 p.m. on Saturday.

The Badgers, ranked No. 22 in the latest ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll and 21st according to the Associated Press, will be facing the Rebels for the third straight season.

Wisconsin opened its season last weekend with a convincing 34-6 victory at home over UCF last Saturday.

UNLV, a member of the Mountain West Conference under Coach John Robinson, opened its season on the road at Tennessee Sunday night and dropped a 42-17 decision to the Volunteers. The Rebels are playing in Madison for the second straight season.

## UW vs. UNLV Series Info

- Wisconsin has played UNLV more times than any other non-conference opponent during the Alvarez era. The Badgers and Rebels will meet for the fifth time since 1996 (seventh time overall) on Saturday. The two schools have three more games scheduled in the coming years.

- Wisconsin leads the series 4-2 ... UNLV defeated the 14th-ranked Badgers 23-5 last season in Madison after the Badgers had outscored the Rebels 131-31 in the previous three meetings between the schools (all UW wins) ... Wisconsin QB coach Jeff Horton is a former UNLV head coach, while Badger offensive coordinator Brian White was a Rebels assistant in the early 1990s.

## Shut 'Em Down

Wisconsin limited UCF to two field goals last Saturday. That is the first time the Badgers have held an opponent without a touchdown since a 24-6 win over Western Kentucky on Sept. 29, 2001 (a span of 34 games). UCF's six points were the fewest by a

Anttaj Hawthorne recorded his first career interception and helped the Badger defense limit UCF to six points.

Badger season-opening foe since a 24-3 win over Eastern Michigan on Sept. 7, 1996.

The Badgers haven't gone two straight games without allowing a TD since back-to-back wins over Illinois (37-3) and Iowa (31-0) on Oct. 17 and 24, 1998.

Wisconsin limited UCF to just 1.51 yards per rushing attempt last Saturday. That was the lowest rushing average for a Badger opponent since Penn State averaged 0.92 per carry in 2001.

## Tough Ticket

The listed capacity for Camp Randall Stadium this season is 81,318. Last Saturday's season-opening crowd of 82,116 was a stadium record.

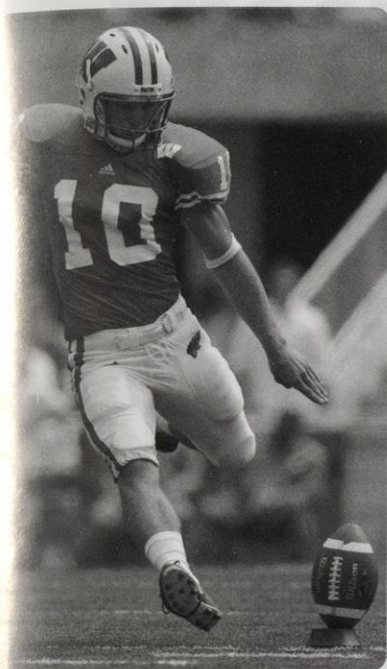
Wisconsin's entire 2004 football season was sold out before it began for the first time ever. The Badgers have ranked 19th or better in national attendance average in each of the past 12 seasons.

## Welcome Aboard

Four Badgers made their first career starts last Saturday vs. UCF, including LBs Dontez Sanders and Reggie Cribbs, DB Johnny White and QB John Stocco.

Stocco became the seventh QB to start a game for the Badgers during the Alvarez era. Wisconsin QBs are now 5-2 in their starting debuts under Alvarez.





Freshman Taylor Mehlhaff made his UW debut with three touchbacks. His six kick-offs resulted in an average starting field position of the 19-yard line for UCF.

## Getting His Kicks

True freshman kicker Taylor Mehlhaff enjoyed a solid debut against UCF last Saturday. Three of his kickoffs resulted in touchbacks and three others helped leave the Golden Knights starting at their own 14, 21 and 19-yard lines.

UCF's average starting field position last Saturday was its own 25-yard line. That average starting field position was worse than any of Wisconsin's 13 opponents had last season.

## Back in the Fold

WR Jonathan Orr caught just seven passes (no TDs) last season, but opened the season last weekend with a team-high three receptions for 42 yards and a touchdown. That made Orr the 16th receiver in UW history to eclipse the 1,000-yard mark for his career. He now has 57 receptions for 1,001 yards and nine TDs.

## Tidbits

- The Badgers' 34-6 victory over UCF represented their largest margin of victory in a season-opener since a 49-10 win over Murray State on Sept. 4, 1999.
- Wisconsin allowed no quarterback sacks vs. UCF last Saturday, the first time that has happened since the 2003 season-opener at West Virginia.

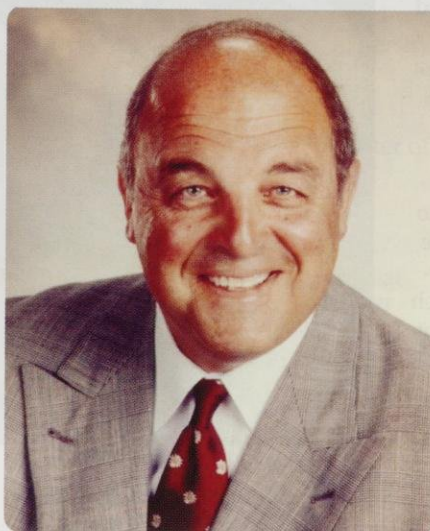
# Head Coach Barry Alvarez

**B**arry Alvarez, the winningest football coach in Wisconsin history, has completed 14 seasons at the head of the program he transformed from a perennial second-division finisher to one that is nationally respected and is a fixture on the postseason bowl scene.

Alvarez, whose overall record with the Badgers is 99-67-4, became Wisconsin's Director of Athletics in April of 2004. He is one of just two people (UAB's Watson Brown) at the Division I level who serves as head football coach and athletic director.

Alvarez's list of accomplishments at Wisconsin is remarkable. Consider just a few of the most notable ...

- winningest coach in school history
- coached three Big Ten and Rose Bowl champions
- only Big Ten coach ever to win the Rose Bowl in consecutive seasons
- needs one win to become just the 10th coach in Big Ten history with



- 100 victories at one conference institution
- has coached five national award winners, including Ron Dayne (Heisman, Doak Walker, Maxwell), Jamar Fletcher (Jim Thorpe) and Kevin Stemke (Ray Guy)

- guided UW to back-to-back Big Ten titles in 1998 and 1999 (hadn't happened at Wisconsin since 1896-97)
- bowl record of 7-2 (.778)
- coached the three winningest teams in school history

When Alvarez arrived in Madison in 1990, Wisconsin had compiled a 9-36 record during the previous four seasons and attendance at Camp Randall Stadium had dipped to an average of 41,734 per game (54 percent of capacity). The program sorely needed a boost and got it when new Director of Athletics Pat Richter hired Alvarez from Notre Dame, where he had been an assistant coach under Lou Holtz.

Alvarez's coaching career began at the high school level. He served as an assistant at Lincoln (Neb.) Northeast High from 1971-73 before taking over as head coach at Lexington (Neb.) High from 1974-75. His last prep coaching stop was at Mason City (Iowa) High

where he was head coach from 1976-78 and where his team won a 4A state title in his final year.

Iowa's Hayden Fry hired Alvarez as an assistant coach in 1979. The Hawkeyes played in six bowl games (two Rose Bowls) during Alvarez's eight years in Iowa City, compiling a 61-33-1 mark in the process. Alvarez's stand-out player with the Hawkeyes was LB Larry Station, a two-time All-American and two-time Academic All-American.

Alvarez left Iowa after the 1986 season to become linebackers coach at Notre Dame. He was promoted (linebackers to defensive coordinator to assistant head coach) by Holtz each of his three seasons as the Fighting Irish went 32-5 and won the 1988 national title. While in South Bend, Alvarez coached All-America linebackers Michael Stonebreaker, Ned Bolcar, Cedric Figaro and Wes Pritchett.

Alvarez grew up in Langeloth, Pa., a small town among the coal mines and steel mills in western Pennsylvania. He starred as a prep linebacker and went on to play at Nebraska (1965-67) for legendary head coach Bo Devaney. Alvarez was the leading tackler for the 1967 Cornhuskers, who led the nation in total defense and created a school-record 40 turnovers. Alvarez played in both the Sugar and Orange Bowls at Nebraska (the Cornhuskers were 25-7 during his three varsity seasons). Alvarez earned his bachelor's degree in 1969

and added a master's degree in 1971, both from Nebraska. Alvarez's family includes his wife Cindy, daughters Dawn (Mrs. Brad Ferguson) and Stacy (Mrs. Mike Delzer), son Chad, grandsons Joe and Jake Ferguson, Jackson Delzer and granddaughter Grace Delzer.

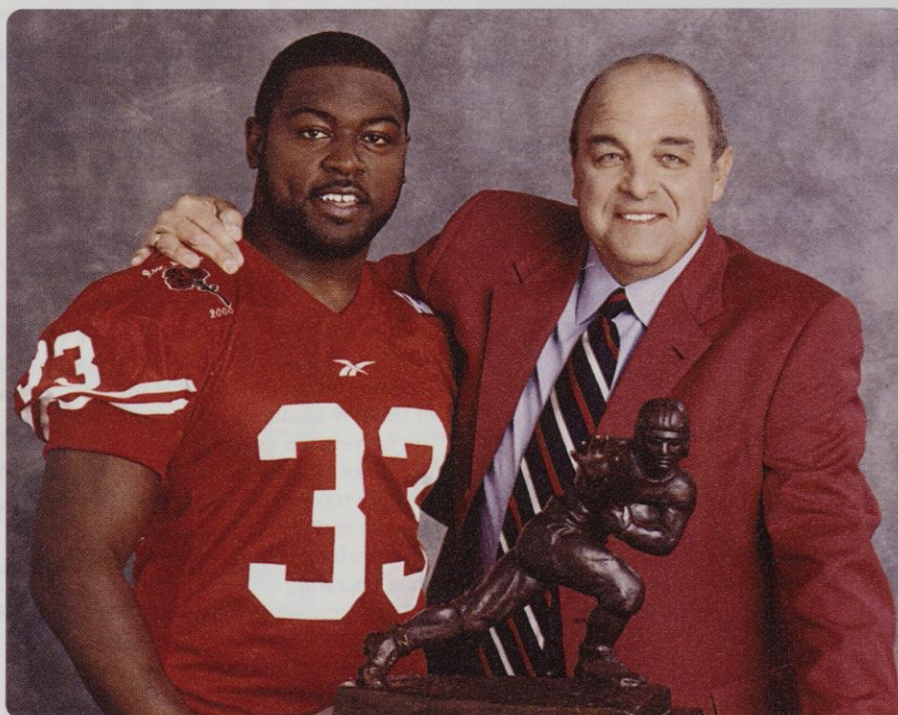

- Coached 27 All-Americans, including six consensus first-team choices, at Wisconsin.
- Coached 54 first-team All-Big Ten selections at Wisconsin.
- Coached 98 Academic All-Big Ten selections at Wisconsin.
- Big Ten-record 10 straight seasons with a 1,000-yard rusher (1993-2002).
- Two Big Ten MVPs.
- Three Big Ten Defensive Players of the Year.
- Two Big Ten Offensive Players of the Year.
- Three Big Ten Freshmen of the Year.
- Three Big Ten and Rose Bowl championship teams (the only other Big Ten coach with at least three Rose Bowl wins was Ohio State's Woody Hayes).
- Nine bowl qualifiers.
- Has coached or played in 20 bowl games (at Wisconsin, Notre Dame, Iowa and Nebraska).
- Alvarez set a goal to become a collegiate head coach by his 42nd birthday and was named to the Wisconsin post three days after he turned 42.

- Has been a head coach in the 1995 Blue-Gray Game, 1996 East-West Shrine game, 2000 Hula Bowl and 2004 Florida Gridiron Classic.
- Alvarez received a Distinguished Alumnus Award from the University of Nebraska in May of 2003.
- Barry was inducted into the Washington County (Pa.) chapter of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame in 2000.
- Alvarez and his wife, Cindy, endowed a football scholarship at the UW in the spring of 2000. "I thought it was a small way for me to say thanks to the UW-Madison," Alvarez said of his quarter-million dollar contribution to the school's foundation.
- Alvarez added administrative duties to his job description in 2000 when he was named Associate Athletic

Director. He became Wisconsin's Director of Athletics in April 2004, operating in a dual role as football coach as well.

- Alvarez was a finalist for ESPN's College Football Coach of the Decade Award in 1999. He was one of 18 coaches named to new positions in 1990 and is the only one still at the school which hired him.
- Alvarez was named one of the "100 Most Influential Hispanics" by *Hispanic Business* in October of 2001.
- Numerous former Alvarez assistants at Wisconsin have gone on to success on the professional level, among them Bill Callahan (former Oakland Raider head coach), Brad Childress (Philadelphia Eagles offensive coordinator), Jay Hayes (Cincinnati Bengals defensive line coach) and Jay Norvell (former Oakland Raiders tight ends coach).

# Chancellor John D. Wiley

Athletics has always been an important avenue for the university to connect with its alumni and friends. I am committed to helping ensure that our teams achieve the highest standards of excellence, not only in performance, but also integrity, values and character.

John D. Wiley

Chancellor John D. Wiley received his bachelor's degree in physics from Indiana University in 1964. He attended graduate school at the University of Wisconsin-Madison and received master's and doctoral degrees in physics in 1965 and 1968, respectively. He joined the technical staff of Bell Telephone Laboratories at Murray Hill, N.J., from 1968 to 1974, and then spent a year at the Max Planck Institute in Stuttgart, Germany, as a recipient of the Alexander von Humboldt Senior U.S. Service Award for Research and Teaching.

Wiley joined the UW-Madison faculty in the Department of Electrical and Computer Engineering in 1975. His research and teaching focused on a variety of topics related to semiconductors and other materials, and processes important to the electronics field. He is a co-founder of several highly successful research centers, including the Center for X-ray Lithography and the Engineering Research Center for Plasma-Aided Manufacturing. From 1982 to 1986, he chaired the Materials Science Program, a graduate-level, interdepartmental-committee program for master's and doctoral degrees.

From 1986 to 1989, Wiley served as associate dean for research in the College of Engineering, with oversight responsibility for all aspects of graduate study, grant submission, agency liaison, research infrastructure and centers, and technology transfer. From 1989 to 1994, he was dean of the UW-Madison Graduate School and the university's senior research officer.

Prior to his appointment to the university's top position, Wiley served as provost and vice chancellor for academic affairs, which carries the responsibility of chief operating officer and deputy chancellor. As provost, he worked closely with deans, faculty, academic staff and student committees in the exercise of shared governance and the overall management of the institution.

Wiley was named UW-Madison's 21st chancellor on January 1, 2001. As chancellor, he has aimed to enhance the university's role in creating a new, more viable economic future for Wisconsin while opening avenues to innovation and learning. He also has worked to amplify the Wisconsin Idea—the belief that the boundaries of the campus are the boundaries of the state and beyond—and to build on the research and teaching strengths that have made the university rich in accomplishment and tradition.

Wiley has presided over unprecedented growth on the west side of the campus, which is being transformed into one of the nation's great health-sciences centers. He also has mapped an east-side redevelopment that will create a vibrant arts-and-humanities district to anchor the lower State Street area, with an expanded Elvehjem Museum of Art, new classroom buildings and additional music-performance space. Wiley believes that the arts and humanities are an integral component of the research enterprise.

"Nurturing an environment of creativity—encompassing industry, the arts and individual expression—is important for attracting and keeping these very mobile, highly sought, knowledge-based workers within our borders," Wiley says.

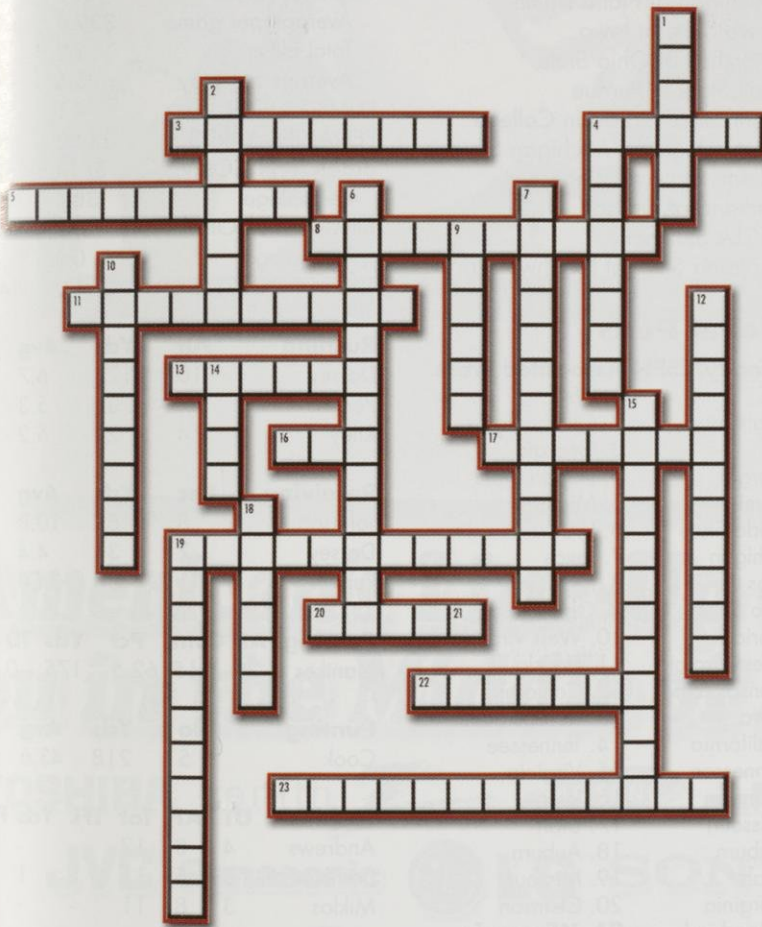
The chancellor has been a leader in efforts to expand on-campus student housing to meet demand, stem high-risk drinking and integrate athletics into the mainstream of university life. Wiley has reached out to the private sector by creating the Office of Corporate Relations to serve the increasing needs of the business community and to help build a more prosperous Wisconsin economy.

"The Wisconsin Idea offers a shared medium through which we can help the state achieve its maximum potential as a participant in a world economy that embraces learning and the advancement of knowledge as much as it does material production," he says.

## BRET BIELEMA Defensive Coordinator & Linebackers

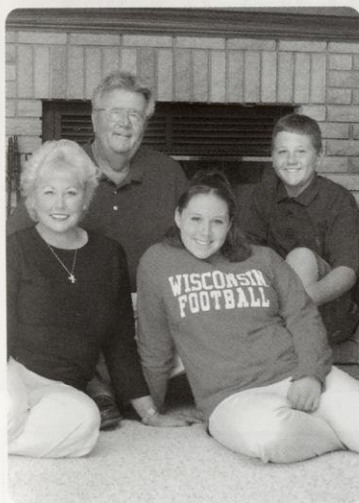


## JIM HUEBER Offensive Line

### At Wisconsin

- Enters his 13th year at UW and 21st in the Big Ten (longest continuing tenured assistant in the conference).
- Has coached Badger off. linemen for nine seasons.
- More than 25 Hueber-coached players have made NFL rosters.
- UW's offensive lines paved the way for a 1,000-yard rusher every year from 1996-2002 (during a Big Ten-record 10 straight seasons).
- In 2002, tailback Anthony Davis rushed for a UW sophomore-record 1,555 yards behind Hueber's line that included Rimington Trophy finalist Al Johnson.
- The 2000 Badgers broke in a new tailback and fought a lot of lineup inconsistencies, but Michael Bennett finished third nationally in rushing. Three of Hueber's seniors (Casey Rabach, Bill Ferrario and Dave Costa) earned pro contracts.
- The 1999 line helped Ron Dayne become college football's career rushing leader. Among Hueber's blockers was Chris McIntosh, the Big Ten's 1999 Offensive Lineman of the Year and a finalist for the Outland Trophy.
- Hueber also coached running backs for three seasons (1992-94) at UW. He tutored Big Ten MVP Brent Moss and Terrell Fletcher in 1993 when that duo combined for 2,633 yards.

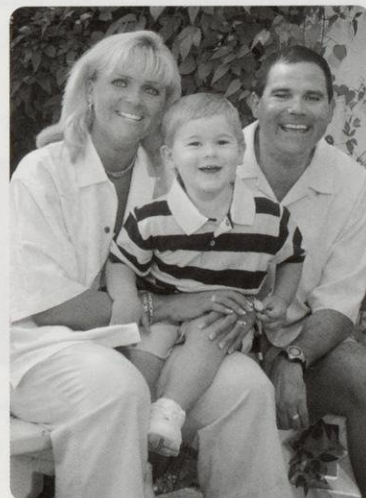

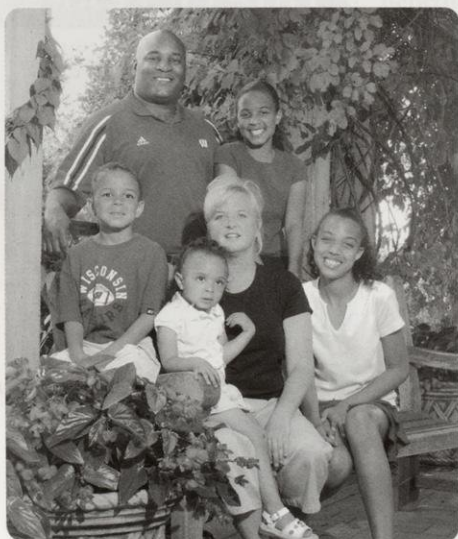

He also set UW career records for receptions (175), receiving yards (3,468) and receiving touchdowns (27). He was a 2004 NFL first-round draft choice by Buffalo.
- Chambers, the school's MVP in 2000, is one of only three Badgers (Al Toon and Evans are the others) in history to record more than 2,000 yards receiving. He was picked by Miami in the second round of the 2001 Draft.
- In the mid-1990s, coached Tony Simmons and Donald Hayes who formed one of the best wide receiver tandems in college football. That duo ranks fourth (Simmons) and seventh (Hayes) in career yardage at Wisconsin.
- In 2002, with Evans injured, Mason developed freshmen Jonathan Orr and Brandon Williams into aerial threats. Orr's 842 receiving yards were a UW rookie record as were Williams' 52 catches.

- The Broncos led the Mid-American Conference in passing three times in Mason's four seasons.

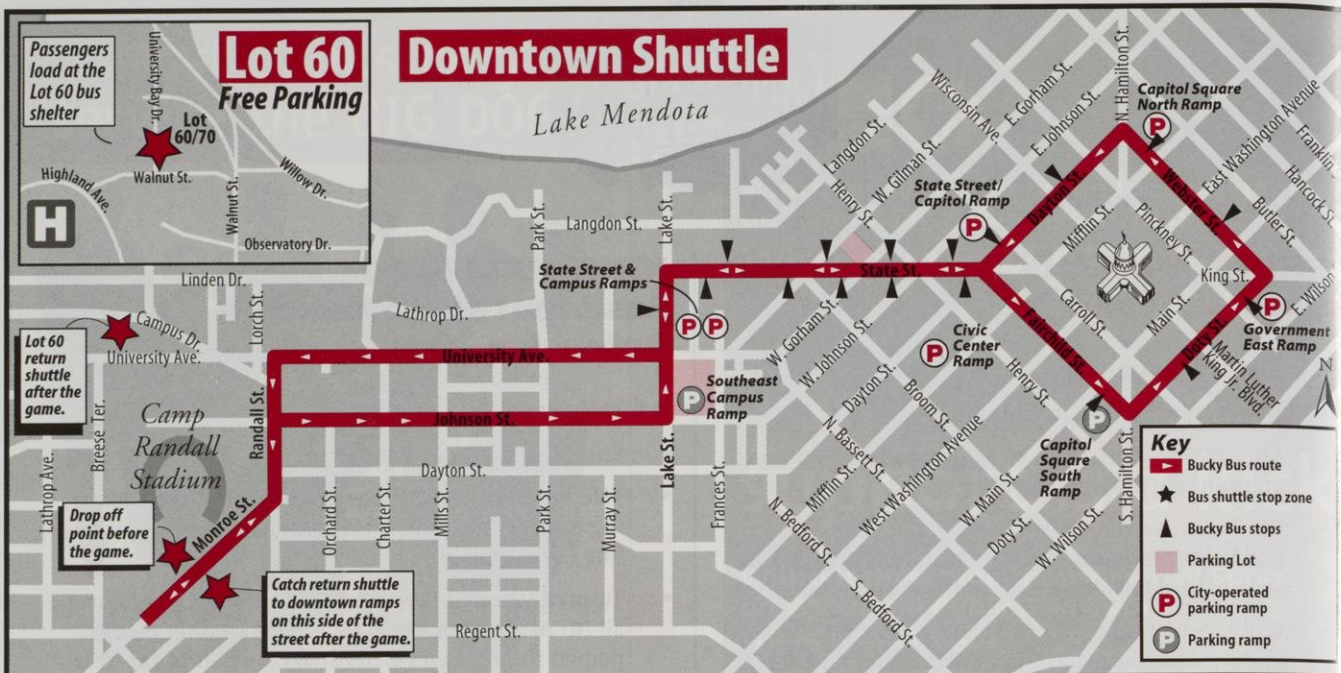

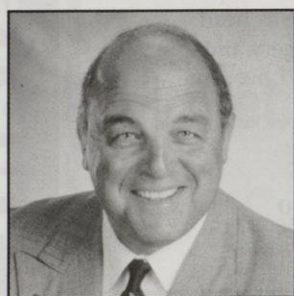

### At Wisconsin

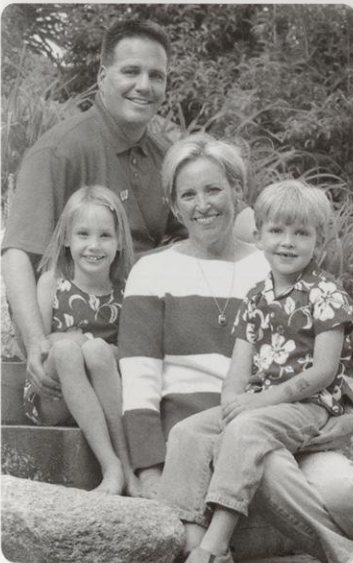
Enters 10th season at Wisconsin and sixth as the offensive coordinator.

In his rookie season at the controls of the offense (1999), the Badgers set a school scoring record and finished 10th nationally in that category.

In 2000, first-year starter Michael Bennett was the NCAA's third-leading rusher, but the team also had a school-record six 200-yard passing games.

In 2001 Anthony Davis was the nation's fifth-leading rusher and Big Ten Freshman of the Year, Lee Evans set the Big Ten record for receiving yards in a season (1,545) and quarterbacks Brooks Bollinger and Jim Sorgi each threw for more than 1,000 yards.

- Evans set UW career records for receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns with White calling the plays.
- As backfield coach, White helped the Badgers produce a 1,000-yard rusher in each of his first eight seasons at the school. The UW has led the Big Ten in rushing three times (1996, 1998 and 1999) with White on staff.
- Served as Ron Dayne's position coach during his run to the 1999 Heisman Trophy and the NCAA Division I-A career rushing mark.

## **Jamie Pollard** **Deputy Athletic Director**

Jamie Pollard was named deputy athletic director for the UW-Madison in 2003 and serves as the No. 2 administrator in the Division of Intercollegiate Athletics. He is responsible for the overall administration of the Badgers' 23-sport, \$60 million athletic department and represents Barry Alvarez at all national, conference and university meetings when necessary.

Prior to being named deputy athletic director, Pollard served as the division's chief financial officer and senior associate athletic director. He developed a comprehensive strategic financial plan ("Keeping Big Red in the Black") that increased the division's operating reserve to \$7 million and

allowed the university to move forward on the \$107 million renovation of Camp Randall Stadium. He also assisted with the development of the school's inaugural preferential seating program that is generating more than \$9 million annually for the athletic program and he helped negotiate a multi-year, multi-million dollar contract for media and marketing rights that is the largest collegiate contract in the country.

Pollard has been the sports administrator for the men's and women's basketball programs since 2001-02 and served as the Tournament Manager when the UW hosted the 2002 NCAA Men's Basketball Midwest Regional.

In the fall of 2003, Pollard was selected by *Street & Smith's Sports Business Journal* as a recipient of its "Top Forty Under 40" Award. It is given annually to the 40 most influential and creative individuals in sports under the age of 40. Pollard is the first college sports administrator honored by the magazine. Pollard is the president for

the Collegiate Athletic Business Managers Association (CABMA) and was chosen by his peers as the 2002 Business Manager of the Year.

Pollard is the campus chair of the Partners in Giving campaign that benefits more than 300 non-profit organizations. He led the 2003 campaign for the Athletic Department, which resulted in a 100 percent increase in participants and a 78 percent increase in contributions.

His other intercollegiate administration experience came as associate athletic director for administration at Maryland (1994-98) and associate athletic director for internal operations at St. Louis (1989-94).

Pollard, the 1987 NCAA Division III national champion in the 5,000-meter run and a two time Division III All-American, has a B.S. degree in business administration from UW-Oshkosh (1987). Pollard and his wife, Ellen, have four children, (Thomas, Annie, Maggie and James).



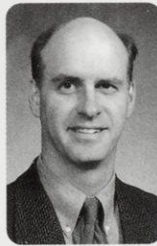
## **Cheryl Bailey** **Sports Admin.**

## **John Chadima** **Operations**

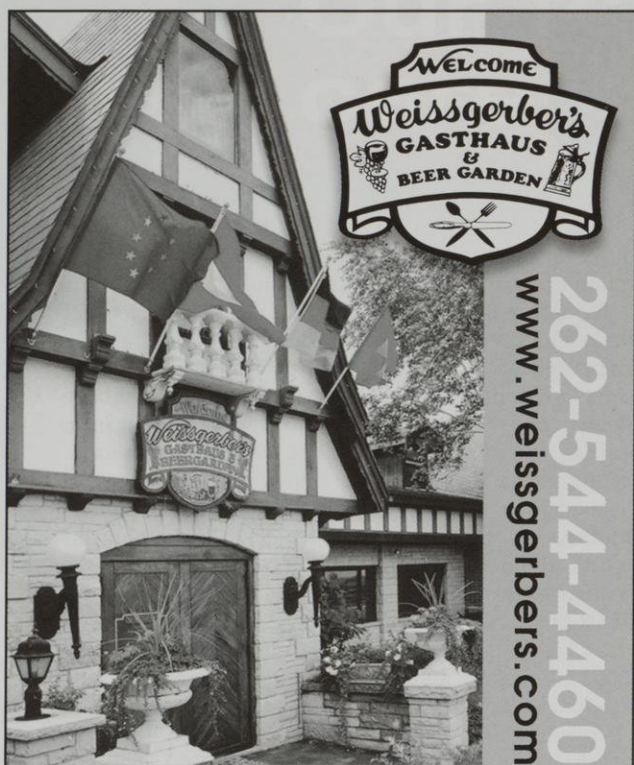
John Chadima began serving as the department's associate AD for operations in 2003. He is in charge of managing

# Camp Randall Stadium Policies



## Conduct Code

In order to keep Wisconsin football games as enjoyable as possible for our fans and their families, we ask that you respect others around you. If a ticket holder's conduct endangers or disrupts players, coaches, officials or other patrons, the University reserves the right to remove the ticket holder from the premises. No refund will be made in such cases. Stadium violations (body passing, throwing objects, and possession of alcohol 21 or older) and object passing may result in a \$181 fine.

## Smoke-Free Facility

Smoking is prohibited in all state-owned buildings, including Camp Randall Stadium. Designated smoking areas are located within the stadium perimeter.

## Entry / No Re-entry

Please enter the gate printed on your ticket to allow for the most efficient entry to the stadium. Gates open 90 minutes prior to kick off. Fans may not leave the stadium and then re-enter during the game. If an emergency arises, check with gate security.

## Alcohol

No alcohol may be brought into the Stadium. Possession may result in police arrest and a fine of \$181. The fine for first offense for underage possession/consumption of alcohol is \$243.

## Emergencies

In the event of a medical emergency, immediately notify a security guard, usher, police officer or paramedic in your area. UW Health First Aid Stations are located in the upper deck at Section GG, in the new 5th level concourse behind Section T, and under Section YZ in the new south end zone concourse.

It is possible to contact a patron during a game if you know their exact seat location by calling (608) 265-8676. No announcements will be made over the stadium sound system.

## Lost and Found

If you lose an article on game day, please go to the Guest Services Center located under Section YZ, in the new south end zone concourse, or call (608) 265-8676. For lost-and-found inquiries on non-game days, please call or visit the Kohl Center Gate B reception desk (608-263-5645).

## Items Not Permitted

For the safety and security of all patrons, certain items are prohibited, including, but not limited to: any food or beverage items, cans, bottles, coolers, thermoses, backpacks (gym, duffel and tote), luggage, strollers, laser pointers, banners, flags, signs, noisemakers, weapons, balloons, beach balls or umbrellas. All patrons entering Camp Randall Stadium are subject to search. Storage facilities are not available for checking prohibited items.

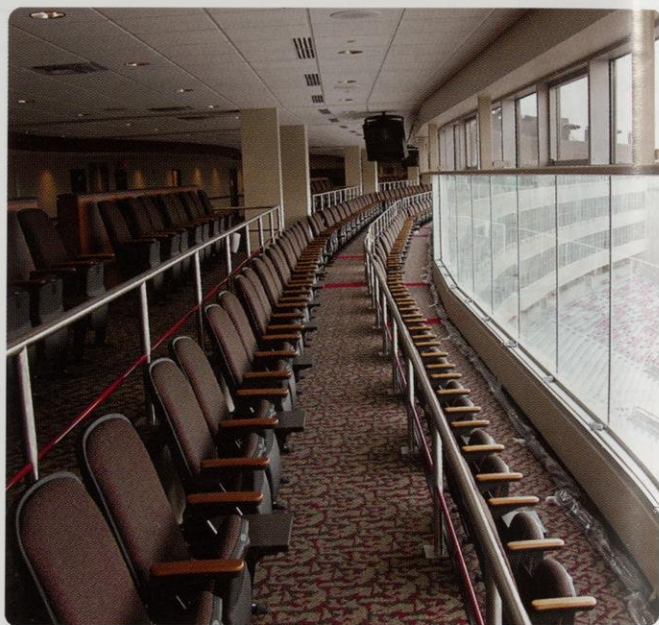
# Stadium Renovation

Camp Randall Stadium, the fourth-oldest college football stadium in the country, is in the midst of a \$107 million renovation project that will fully conclude in 2005. The project will include:

- increased seating capacity to 80,112 (in 2005);
- creation of new and wider concourses to provide safe and convenient fan access;
- renovation of old (and addition of new) restrooms throughout the facility;
- installation of three video replay boards plus improved sound and lighting systems;
- addition of private suite and club-level seating areas on the east side of the stadium;
- construction of a new ticket office with convenient on-site parking
- development of a consolidated office building for athletic department staff
- expansion of accessible facilities for disabled fans and visitors.



Three levels of suites and club seats were added to the east side of the stadium, along with permanent lighting for late afternoon and night games.

## Program Welcomes Fans to Game Day

A campaign to create welcoming new traditions at UW-Madison's new-look Camp Randall Stadium has won broad campus and community support as the 2004 season kicks off.

The university's "Rolling Out the Red Carpet" campaign -- the result of months of discussions with students, athletes, administrators, and alumni officials -- encourages a friendlier gameday climate for fans and families. The Badger Fan Initiative emerged as a way to make game day more welcoming.

The initiative will be promoted with a privately funded, marketing and advertising campaign based on the "Rolling Out the Red Carpet" theme, complete with video spots featuring UW Marching Band Director Mike Leckrone and Badger coaches and players. The spots will air on the stadium's new video scoreboard.

Last season, the university received a spate of complaints -- especially from opposing fans -- about their hostile and offensive treatment at the hands of some fans.

"Wisconsin is not alone in wrestling with the issue of fan conduct," UW-Madison Chancellor John D. Wiley says. "It's a troubling problem on campuses nationwide. It's a national issue and we're hoping that the success of our program will make UW-Madison a leader in addressing the problem."

While officials want to create a more inviting tone, they also emphasize the importance of preserving the electric, fun atmosphere that is the trademark of Badger football Saturdays.

"Loud and friendly can co-exist in the same stadium," Wiley says, noting that a tiny minority of fans has the potential to give the community an undesirable reputation. "Working together, we can bolster

pride in Badger athletics and establish a more friendly climate for fans and families."

Another element of the "Rolling Out the Red Carpet" campaign is the establishment of Fan Ambassadors, volunteer students who will work with Guest Services personnel at the stadium to greet and provide information to fans on game day, with an emphasis on visiting fans.

The message about creating UW sports traditions from the ground up is also being carried to students through housing orientations, Wisconsin Welcome programs, the annual Student Involvement Fair and the Chancellor's Convocation for New Students. But students are only one many factors when it comes to the issue. The university is counting on all Badger fans to take a hand in "Rolling Out the Red Carpet."

Madison's business community is another key element in the campaign to encourage positive culture

change. Among those backing the effort are the Greater Madison Chamber of Commerce, Downtown Madison Inc., and the Greater Madison Convention and Visitors Bureau.

The university is offering free kits of promotional items for display and use in businesses, and is making sponsorship and giveaway opportunities available.

"The campaign's theme demonstrates that we value what fans bring to our city and our economy and says that we want them to enjoy their visit and come back," Wiley and football coach and Athletic Director Barry Alvarez wrote in a letter to stadium-area businesses.

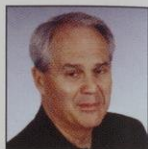

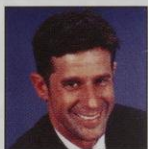

## Women's Cross Country

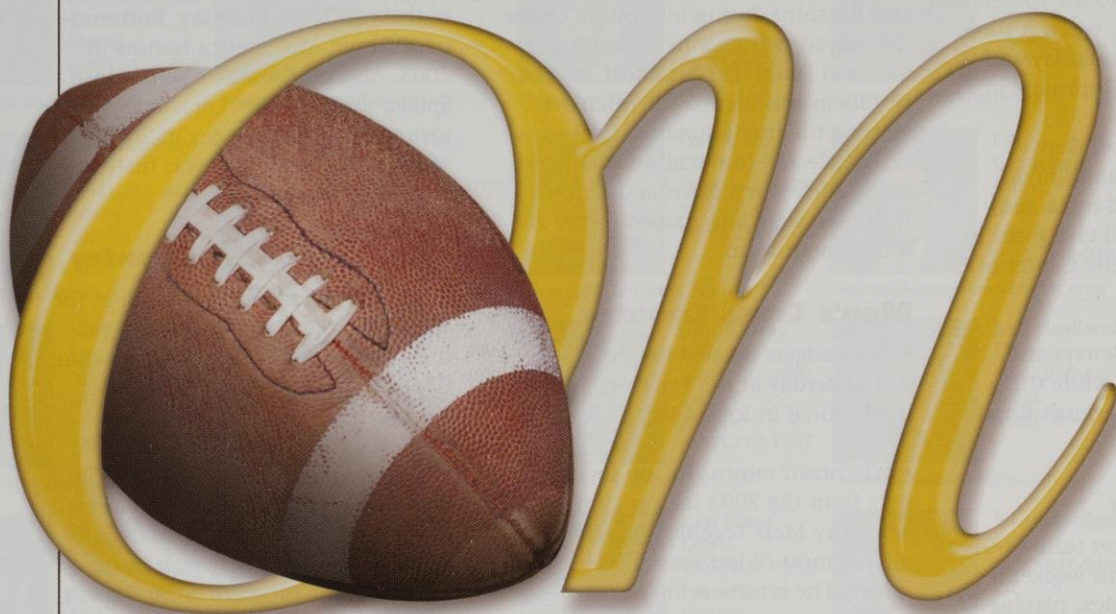
- The Badgers begin the season at the 18th annual Mel Brodt Invitational today. The meet is hosted by Bowling Green University and will begin at 8 a.m.

Each week in the Badger Gameday Program, senior defensive back Scott Starks will give us an inside look at what it's like to be a UW football student-athlete. Starks is a four-year starter for the Badgers and is fourth in career pass breakups at UW with 42. He is also a two-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree and was named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District 5 team in 2002.

Atmosphere. Atmosphere can be a crucial part of football, beginning with the five practices leading up to game day all the way until the last person leaves the locker after a game.

To begin, I will focus on the atmosphere at practice the week of the Central Florida game. Obviously, it is hard to speak for the offensive side of the ball, but I could tell that there was a great deal of focus and execution coming from that side of the ball. The only time the starting defense is able to observe the offense is in the few short periods of team practice we have. I only needed to see a few snaps to know that everyone on the offense was in tune and ready to play.

The defensive side also had a good week of practice. Sometimes it's hard to get a perfect look from the scout team when we have our d-line playing at game speed, and often interrupting plays before they even have a chance to develop (no offense to the scout team). Playing at game speed during practice allows the defense to not let down, even when playing against a lesser opponent. We want to practice and play as if we are preparing to play against the one or two team in the nation. This allows us to have a great atmosphere in practice. All in all, focus and concentration permeated through each practice.

Anticipation filled the atmosphere at the hotel. Everyone was anticipating that first snap of year. Many people, including me, spend a lot of time in the hotel visualizing themselves carrying out their responsibilities on certain plays. This contributes to a quiet, business-like atmosphere at the hotel.

The night before the game, the traveling squad catches a movie. The movie is usually not good. To be honest I cannot remember the title of the movie that we saw. It was about some serial killer who killed serial killers. I'm sure some of you have seen it already. It sounds good, but trust me, wait for the video.

After the movie, it's really time to focus in. There is no joking around or talking on the bus, and really for the rest of the night. It's game time now. The atmosphere on the bus is ... unexplainable. For some reason I usually get angry around this time. I don't know why. Maybe it's because I have "little man syndrome," and I play a game with a lot of big men. But, whatever.

This is probably common among a lot of people, but I can never sleep the night before a game, even if it's a 6:45 a.m. wakeup. This really does bug me, but I can't do anything about it.

In the locker room the next morning, there was a sense of confidence in the atmosphere. Not cocky, but definitely confident because we were so well prepared. Everyone knew that they could play fast because they knew exactly what they had to do in order to make the team successful. We knew that the game did not have anything to do with who our opponent was, but it had everything to do with how we executed.

Walking out that tunnel for the first time with the renovation was unbelievable. The fans set the perfect home field atmosphere. We (all the players) really do appreciate that and know it will continue. It

was almost as if the sound from the side with upper deck was bouncing off the skyboxes and reflecting right onto the field. Electrifying is the best word my little vocabulary could come up with to describe it.

With Alvey (Coach Alvarez) earning his 100th victory, the atmosphere in the locker room was an extremely great one. ### #18 Jim Leonhard, Sr., DE

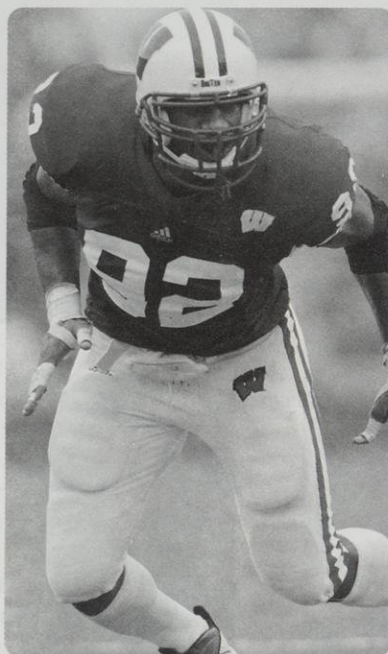

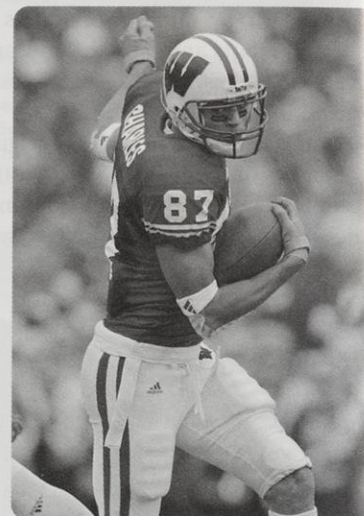

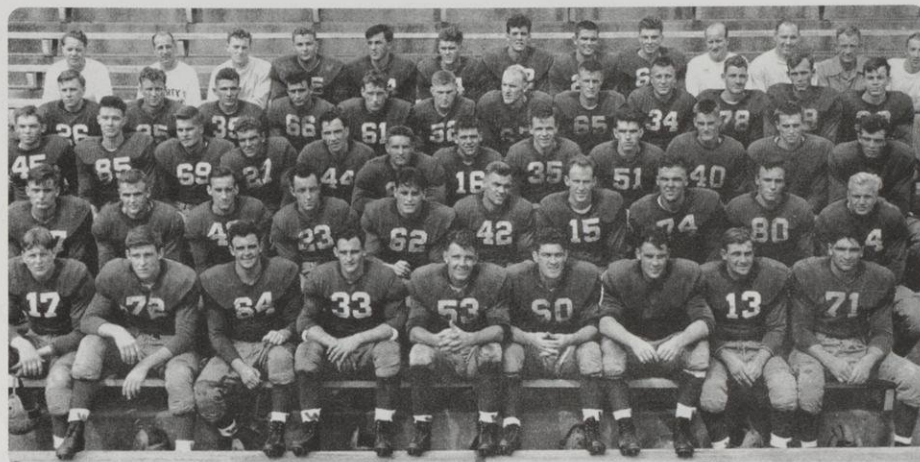

## From the Prologue

In my father's den, we looked at the picture of him in his P-38 fighter plane in the skies above the Pacific. Because my father had crossed the maximum-hour threshold on his 67th combat flight, the pilot in the other plane on the mission took the picture for posterity.

I asked my father what he was thinking after he landed in the Philippines that day.

"I wanted to get home, I wanted to get married, and I wanted to get back in college and play football," he said decisively.

After his death in February 2001, that response made me think of one phrase.

Missions accomplished.

Jerry Frei got married in December 1945. He re-enrolled at Wisconsin, played two more seasons, and got his degree. He spent more than fifty years as a husband, father, grandfather, player, college and NFL coach, scout, and administrator, and he was still working and sharp when he died.

The cynical sportswriter was reminded. Done right, sports teach. Sports bond. Sports enrich. Sports are about lessons and unbreakable friendships that can last through one man's lifetime.

And longer.

My mother, Marian, moved into a retirement community apartment, but she put some of my father's den pictures on her walls. One of them was the 1942 Wisconsin team picture and plaque. My father, the 18-year-old sophomore guard from Stoughton, was No. 65 in the third row, sitting next to star fullback Pat Harder and behind fellow sophomore Elroy Hirsch.

Finally, I decided. I wanted to know more about what it was like for the players to go through that 1942 season, knowing that they, like so many of their contemporaries, soon would be in another uniform, risking their lives for their country. I set out to learn more about that team, about that season, about the men, about their fates in the war and in later life.

I knew that World War II-era values-and certainly, his own service experiences-were critical foundations in my father's life and philosophy, in combination with the lessons he learned in athletics. "I'm sure that between football and World War II,

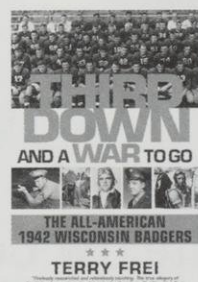
those things had a lot to do with me growing up, maturing and facing the world," he said.

I suspected it was the same for his teammates.

As I set out to research the story, regret and curiosity combined to create powerful motivation. My father could have provided many answers and fascinating remembrances. I didn't ask him enough questions early enough.

After I completed my research, I came to view these men-both the survivors and those who had passed on before I could talk with them-as my extended family, and not just because they were part of my father's life.

The 1942 Wisconsin Badgers were a terrific football team. As young men of that era, they were extraordinary, yet typical. Among other reasons, that's why theirs is an All-American story.

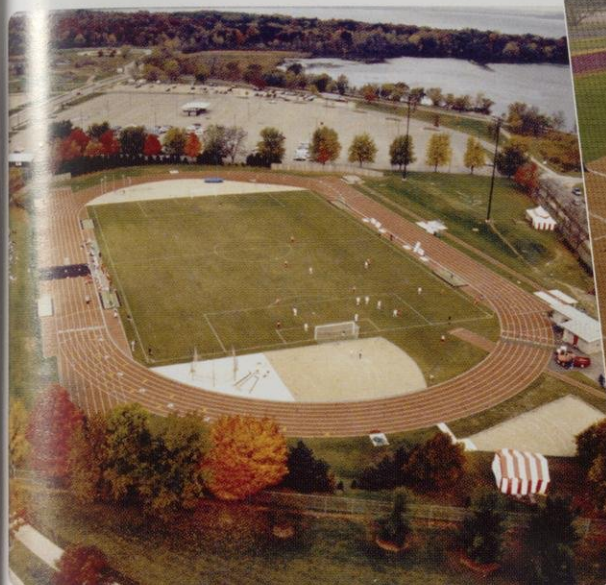

# Wisconsin Traditions

## Badger nickname

The athletic teams' nickname (Badgers) was borrowed from the state. The territory was initially dubbed the "Badger" state. The reason for the moniker was not because of badgers in this region, but instead because of an association with lead miners in the 1820s. Prospectors came to the state looking for minerals. Without shelter in the winter, the miners had to "live like badgers" in tunnels burrowed into hill-sides according to folklore.

## Bucky Badger

Badgers in various forms have been recognized as the school mascot for decades. The version currently known as Bucky, sporting a cardinal and white striped sweater, was first drawn in 1940 by artist Art Evans. At that time, the badger went by names like Benny, Buddy, Bernie, Bobby and Bouncey. Art Lentz, the department's publicity director, had the idea to bring the mascot to life.

The original badger mascot was too vicious to control. On more than one occasion, the live badger escaped his handlers. It was decided in the interest of fan and player safety that Wisconsin's mascot be retired to the Madison Zoo.

The Badger Yearbook replaced the live badger with a small raccoon named Regdab (badger spelled backwards) and passed it off as a "badger in a raccoon coat."

In 1949, a student in the university's art department, Connie Conrad, was hired to mold a paper-

mache badger head. Cheerleader Bill Sagal, of Plymouth, Wis., was directed by homecoming chair Bill Sachse, to wear the outfit at the homecoming game. A contest was staged to name the mascot. The winner was Buckingham U. Badger, or Bucky. The name came from the lyrics in a song which encouraged the football team to "buck right through that line."

Bucky Badger has persevered through the years, even surviving a threat by then assistant attorney general, Howard Koop, in 1973. He suggested that Bucky be replaced by Henrietta Holstein, a loveable cow. Koop argued that "kids love cows. A generation could grow up supporting the university and Henrietta Holstein." Koop's effort to overthrow Bucky failed.

Bucky even survived a cameo appearance by former Sports Illustrated writer Rick Telander. In preparation for a book about the department, Telander wore the Badger costume at a 1991 volleyball game. Telander overcame "terminal claustrophobia" in his first and only act as Bucky.

## Bud song

An integral part of any Wisconsin band performance is the playing of the Bud song. The tune is a spinoff of the song "You've Said It All," a jingle with words and music originally written by Steve Karmen for Budweiser beer commercials.

The song has become legendary at the University because of its polka-like rhythm. Band director Michael Leckrone said the song's popularity got started at a 1975 hockey game. "The crowd wanted to hear a polka," he said. "I didn't have any polkas. We had, just by accident, added this beer commercial to the tunes we play. I told the

band if we substituted the word 'Wisconsin' for 'Budweiser' it would work."

Leckrone said the song became a football tradition after a 1978 come-from-behind victory over Oregon. "Wisconsin was behind by three touchdowns, and the crowd was really dead. I played the song to get everyone pepped up. About 20 seconds after that, Wisconsin scored a TD. I played it again, and we scored another touchdown. From then on, the band could never play enough 'Bud,'" said Leckrone.

### Fifth Quarter

The Wisconsin band has become famous for its post-game celebration called the Fifth Quarter. Win or lose, fans sing, dance and cheer with the band as they play traditional favorites like "On, Wisconsin" and the Bud song. Originally, the post-game concert was designed to give the fans something to listen to on their way out, but it developed into a post-game party as the band built in audience-participation activities.

### Motion W

When Coach Barry Alvarez came to Madison, he decided that the helmet logo needed to be updated to signal a new era. He entertained 15-20 designs in 1990 before Rayovac artist Rick Suchanek developed the "Motion W," which originally included a tail at the back of the logo. Alvarez thought the tail was a bit much, but when it was removed, decided to go with it. The University bought the rights to the design, and the logo has been adopted by all other UW sports.

### "On, Wisconsin"

The school's fight song was originally composed in 1909 by Chicago's William Purdy, and the words were

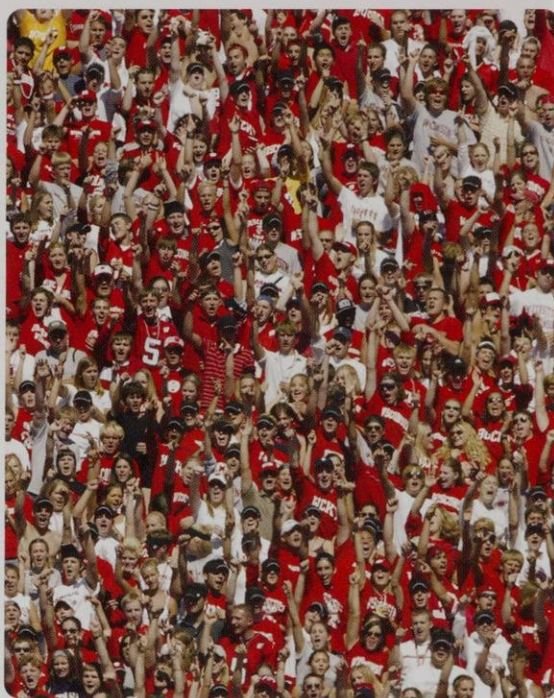
written by Carl Beck. Purdy and Beck had been fraternity brothers at Hamilton College (Clinton, N.Y.) and were roommates in Chicago. Purdy was going to submit the song for consideration to win a \$100 prize that the University of Minnesota was offering for a new football song. When Beck heard the music, he offered to write words and suggested that Purdy offer it to Wisconsin, where Beck had once studied. The song was an instant hit on campus and spread throughout the world.

Some 2,500 schools have adopted the music and changed the words to suit their needs. "On, Wisconsin" was sung for the first time at the 1909 homecoming game vs. Minnesota.

The music was adapted by Band Director Michael Leckrone in 1969. The original version had been played virtually unchanged since its inception. "I got a lot of flak for the change," Leckrone said. "The old version was one you had to wait on. I wanted to generate immediate crowd reaction, so I stepped it up a bit."

### Paul Bunyan Axe

The most-played rivalry in Division I-A football continues this fall when Wisconsin and Minnesota meet. The UW-UM series is the nation's oldest and has been played continuously since 1907. The game has alternated sites between the university campuses since 1946. Much prestige was always associated with the game, and the significance was emphasized with its place on the schedule. Between 1933 and 1982, the Wisconsin-Minnesota game was always the final regular-season contest for each school.



The series took an added twist in 1948 when more than state bragging rights were on the line. After a 16-0 setback that season, the Wisconsin letter-winners group, the National "W" Club, presented Minnesota with an axe wielded by Paul Bunyan. He was the mythical giant of midwestern lumber camps. Each year since, the winner of the annual battle between the Big Ten rivals is presented with the axe, complete with scores inscribed on the handle, for display on its campus.

### "Varsity"

The traditional arm-waving at the end of the song, "Varsity," was the 1934 brainstorm of then-band leader Ray Dvorak. He saw Pennsylvania students wave their caps after losing a game. Dvorak later instructed Wisconsin students to salute UW-Madison President Glenn Frank after each game.

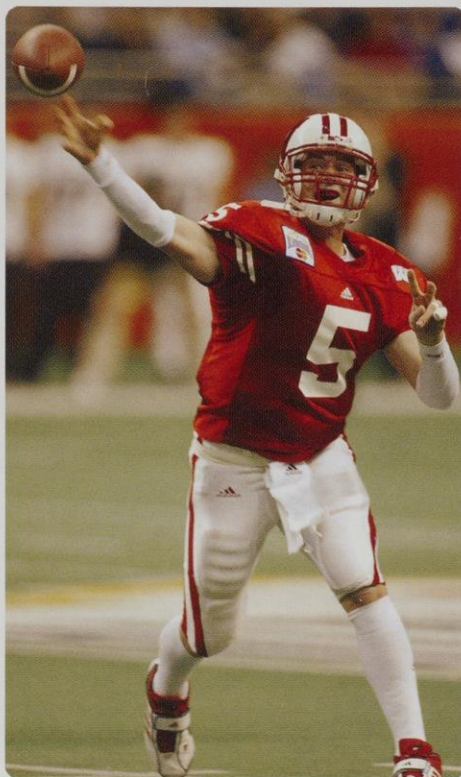
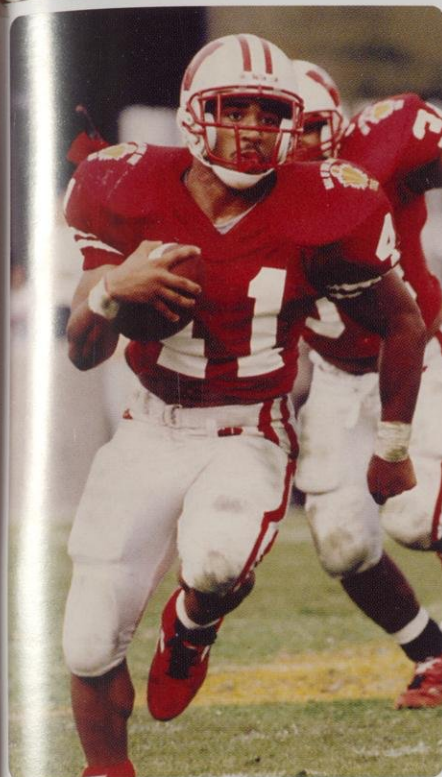

## This is the Big Ten Conference

The Big Ten Conference is an association of 11 world-class universities whose member institutions share a common mission of research, graduate, professional and undergraduate teaching and public service. Intercollegiate athletics has an important place within the mission.

Founded in 1896, the Big Ten has sustained a comprehensive set of shared practices and policies that enforce the priority of academics in student-athletes' lives and emphasize the values of integrity, fairness and competitiveness. Big Ten universities provide in excess of \$76 million in athletic scholarship aid to more than 8,500 men and women student-athletes who compete for 25 championships, 12 for men and 13 for women. In 2003-04, the Big Ten distributed over \$115 million in revenues to its 11 member institutions. Conference institutions sponsor broad-based athletic programs with more than 270 teams.

- Big Ten Universities are members of the nation's only conference whose constituency is entirely composed of institutions that are members of the AAU, a prestigious association of major academic and research institutions in the United States and Canada.

- Big Ten Universities host more than 70 Nobel laureates as faculty, students or researchers.

- Big Ten Universities enroll students of whom over 41 percent have graduated in the top 10 percent of their high school class, while 74 percent graduated in the top quarter of their class.

## BIG TEN CONFERENCE FOOTBALL INSTANT REPLAY FACTS

- The Big Ten Conference, with the unanimous support of its head football coaches, forwarded a recommendation to the NCAA Football Rules Committee last winter and was granted the right to experiment with instant replay on a one-year trial basis.

- The Big Ten Conference collected data from 68 televised football games in 2003. The study showed there would have been 42 replay opportunities in the 68 games, approximately .65 replays per game. The rate of reversal was 54 percent, or 23 of 42 reviews would have been overturned. On a base of 10,800 football plays in 2003, 8-12 plays (of the aforementioned 23) could have been viewed as having a significant affect on the game.

- The Big Ten instant replay model and the NFL instant replay system are different. In the Big Ten model, only the Big Ten Technical Advisor, working in the press box, can stop a game to review a play. Unlike the NFL model, in the Big Ten neither the coaches nor the game officials on the field may ask for a review.

- In order for a play to be changed the Technical Advisor must have indisputable video evidence that an error occurred. Television broadcast of the game will be the sole source of whether there is indisputable video evidence.

- The types of plays that are reviewable include plays that are governed by the sideline, goal line, end zone and end line, passing plays, and other detectable infractions, such as forward progress with respect to first down.

- Throughout the conference, the Big Ten had more than 8,500 student-athletes playing on over 270 teams in 2003-04. Those student-athletes received in excess of \$76 million in direct financial aid.

- Big Ten student-athletes graduate at a rate of 10 percent higher than all Division I student-athletes.

- The Big Ten recognized 1,894 Academic All-Big Ten honorees during the 2003-04 academic year, the highest total in the last decade. Over the past five years, the Conference has annually acknowledged more than 1,500 student-athletes as Academic All-Conference honorees.

- In the past 10 years (1994-95 through 2003-04), the Big Ten claimed 41 NCAA team championships including 25 since 1998-99.

- Big Ten athletic programs have won more than 185 team national championships and 1,100 individual NCAA titles. In 1999-00, the Conference celebrated six NCAA team titles (men's soccer, women's volleyball, wrestling, men's basketball, fencing, men's gymnastics), the most for the Big Ten in the last 10 years.

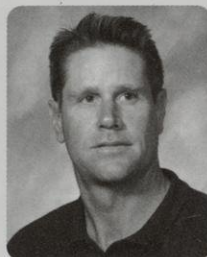

He also was named an "Unsung Hero" by the NFL Players' Association and was featured on the Fox Sports All-Madden Team as one of the National Football League's "good guys."

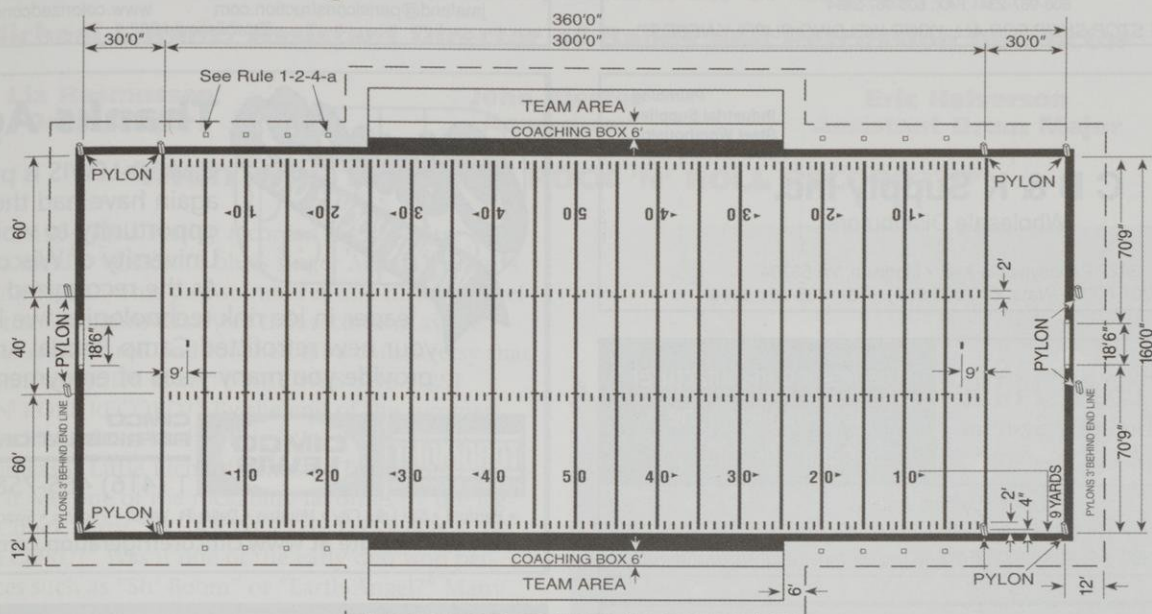

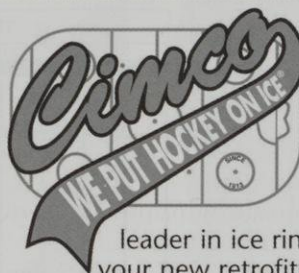

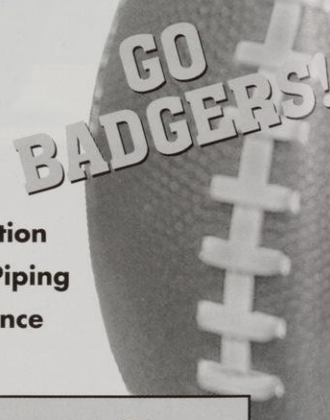

### "WHAT WAS THE FIRST ROCK 'N' ROLL RECORD???"

In June of 1954 Elvis Presley recorded his very first release, a rockin' version of blues singer Arthur Crudup's "That's All Right." This past summer music historians celebrated the 50th anniversary of that recording as the genesis of rock 'n' roll and touched off a controversy that will remain unsettled as to "WHAT WAS THE FIRST ROCK 'N' ROLL RECORD?" By the end of the summer winners had laid claim to that title. Was it "That's All Right" or was it Little Richard's classic "Tutti Frutti." Perhaps it was one of the rockabilly favorites by the legendary Chuck Berry, "WHAT WAS THE FIRST ROCK 'N' ROLL RECORD?" Was it one of the early doo wop performances such as "Sh' Boom" or "Earth Angel?" Many of the pioneers of rock (Bo Diddley, Fats Domino, Big Joe Turner, or Ray Charles) can claim credit for being the "first" but the question will obviously remain unanswered. Nevertheless the music that came from that era is permanently etched in our American culture, so we'd like to submit a few nominees for that title as the Wisconsin Band presents: "WHAT WAS THE FIRST ROCK 'N' ROLL RECORD???"

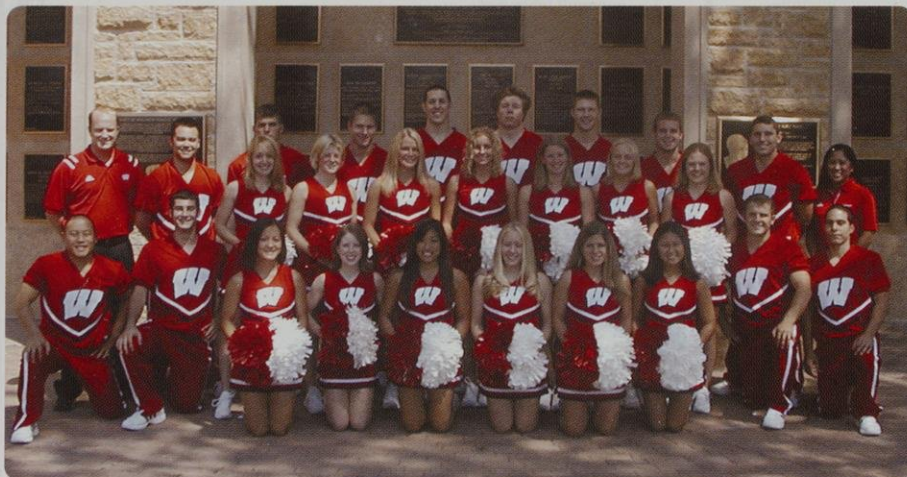

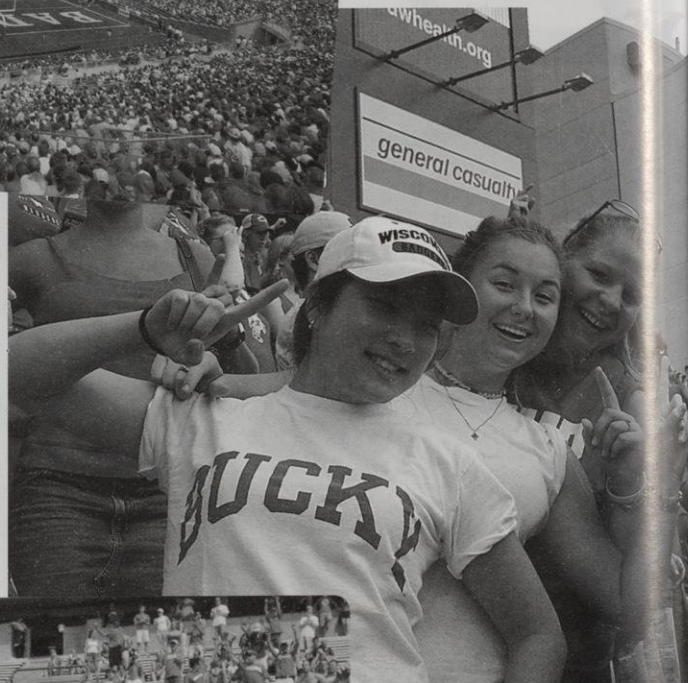

In sports history there are a handful of standout athletes whose antics are unforgettable. Wisconsin football is no exception. Any true Badger fan remembers Crazylegs, The Horse, Great Dayne and of course, The Roadrunner. Curious as to what became of that "Effervescent Badger," Rufus Ferguson, Gameday Program caught up with him to find he's still got plenty to celebrate.

Today, Ferguson lives and works in Bowie, Maryland. With the flexibility of being an automotive sales consultant, Ferguson's recent two-week adventure to Greece was no problem. The trip was the latest stop in following his son and only child, Rhadi, to judo competitions. This time he was watching his son contend for a medal at the 2004 Olympic Games in Athens.

Rhadi Ferguson is a second degree black belt in judo and competed in the 100 kg (220 lbs.) class.

Celebrating 32 years of marriage, Ferguson calls his wife, Stephanie a "first-round draft choice."

"I have a super wife," said Ferguson. "It takes a good spouse to keep you rolling and I'm very blessed."

In his tenure at Wisconsin, Ferguson was second only to Alan Ameche in career rushing and today ranks eighth in Badger history. He was the team's 1972 MVP and the first Badger to break 1,000 yards rushing in two consecutive seasons, paving the way for future Badgers like Ron Dayne and Anthony Davis.

More important to Ferguson than his stats, though, were the people he met through his association with the UW.

Friends and alumni like Arlie Mucks, Jr., and assistant coach Les Ritcherson helped groom him to love the

University of Wisconsin. Mucks was instrumental in helping Ferguson start up a Wisconsin Alumni Association chapter in Portland, Ore. Later Mucks tapped him again encouraging him to become the president of the Miami chapter of the WAA and serve on the WAA Board of Directors. In 2002 Ferguson was honored as the Grand Marshall of the Wisconsin Homecoming Parade.

A personal friend, Mark Cullen of J.P. Cullen & Sons, graduated the same time as Ferguson and the two remained friends. When Rhadi attended Toki University in Japan for a judo camp, J.P. Cullen & Sons were instrumental in helping him get there.

In the 30 years since he left Madison, Ferguson has built a successful life for himself and his family and in his words, "Life is fabulous." In 1973 he was drafted by the NFL's Atlanta Falcons and went on to play professionally in the Canadian and World Football Leagues. After his time in the pros, Ferguson applied his economics and marketing degrees to working for Chevrolet

Motors.

Although following his son's football career at Howard has kept him from attending many Badger games, Ferguson has kept an eye on the happenings in Madison.

"My experience at the University of Wisconsin was just phenomenal. I don't think I'll ever have a feeling that will overshadow that feeling at the University. It was such a unique experience for me. I had an opportunity to meet lovely people and met real good friends that helped contribute to my success as an excellent husband and a superb father."

Just as nothing in Ferguson's memory will eclipse his time in Madison; Wisconsin fans, for years to come will think of the "Rufus Shuffle" with the same fondness.

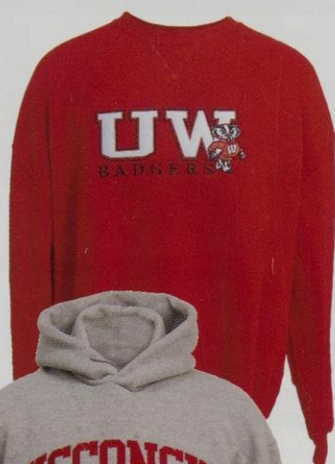

When you're watching the football game today and you see defensive back Leonhard, you may already know that he's a former walk-on that went from obscurity to ESPN.com first-team All-America. What you may not realize is that a fellow student-athlete and friend on campus shares that kind of success story.

Jessica Ring, a defender from Rockford, Ill., came to the University of Wisconsin as a walk-on for the women's soccer team before eventually blossoming to an anchor for the field. The former red-shirt freshman is now a captain in her junior year of eligibility, and she will try to lead the team to its second NCAA Tournament appearance in the past four years.

"Jessica's dedication and commitment over the years shows what student-athletes can accomplish at this university," head coach Dean Duerst said. "She has great character to go along with strong academic and athletic abilities. That's why her teammates look up to her."

Ring came to UW feeling out of her comfort zone. New surroundings and a new life, in addition to the difficulty of sitting out her first season, made for a dejected start to her career as a Badger.

The 2002 season was not much better as she was assigned to play forward, a position completely new to her. She turned to her family and teammates for comfort while weighing whether or not to quit.

"My parents said they would support me with any decision I made," Ring said. "But if I decided to continue playing, my dad told me to do it 100 percent, otherwise there was no point in playing."

Last year things really began to turn around for Ring. She began starting on a regular basis and scored the winning penalty kick against top-seeded Penn State in the Big Ten Tournament.

According to Ring, the sudden

transition from the bench to a starting job was more of a relief than anything else. She hopes that because of these wide-range of experiences, she can be someone to whom the newcomers can talk.

Ring's story parallels Leonhard in another way, in that she also is a role model in the classroom. The 4.0 student majoring in legal studies was picked as CoSIDA Academic All-America District V and Academic All-Big Ten last season (Leonhard was Academic All-Big Ten and CoSIDA second-team Academic All-America).

"I don't think of myself as a smart person," Ring said humbly. "I'm just driven and I know how to manage my time well. I live through very structured days."

Although she's not sure exactly what she will do after she graduates

in May 2004, Ring is leaning toward law school or graduate school. She also has one more year of eligibility remaining, so Badger fans may get to watch her play another season.

So it seems that Ring is coming full circle, once again figuring out if she wants to return to the team. This time, fortunately, the circumstances are a lot more positive.

"Finishing up my senior year of high school, I didn't know what I wanted to do," Ring said. "But I'm happy here and glad with the way things turned out."

"Those first two years at UW really challenged me and pushed my limits, and as a result, made me stronger as an individual. I see that as something that can benefit me throughout life."

Bollinger, who led the team to three consecutive scoring drives in the final six minutes of play, completed 11 of his 20 attempts for 168 yards and two touchdowns, despite not playing until mid-way through the fourth quarter.

✓ Colts head coach Tony Dungy on Jim Sorgi making the roster: "Jim did a great job. He probably did as well as any rookie we've had in this system. He's going to be, we think, a good player for us down the road."

✓ Nick Greisen is currently listed as the starting middle linebacker for the Giants.

✓ Starting running back Michael Bennett will miss the Vikings' season opener on Sept. 12 with a right knee sprain.

✓ Chris Chambers signed a five-year contract extension with the Dolphins through the 2009 season in August. He led the team in both receptions and reception yardage during the pre-season.

✓ Ron Dayne rushed for 263 yards in the preseason, putting him second among all NFL running backs. He is listed as second on the Giants' depth chart behind Tiki Barber.





## National Football Foundation College Hall of Fame

These seven former Badgers have received the highest honor the game of football affords. They have been inducted into the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame. They are the greats of the game and their achievements are documented at the College Football Hall of Fame in South Bend, Ind.



Pat O'Dea (elected in 1962), nicknamed "The Kangaroo Kicker," was a two-time All-America fullback and punter between 1896-99. He was also a two-time team captain.



Robert Butler (elected in 1972) was a three-year letterwinner at tackle and won all-league (1912-13) and All-America (1913) laurels.



Pat Harder (elected in 1993), an All-America fullback, was the Big Ten's scoring and rushing champion in 1941.



Dave Schreiner (elected in 1955), the two-time All-America end, was the Western Conference MVP in 1942.



Pat Richter (elected in 1996) was a two-time All-America end and led the nation in receiving as a junior.



Marty Below (elected in 1988), a rugged right tackle, earned All-America praise as a senior.



Alan Ameche (elected in 1975) was the 1954 Heisman Trophy winner and a multi-year All-American in the classroom and on the field.

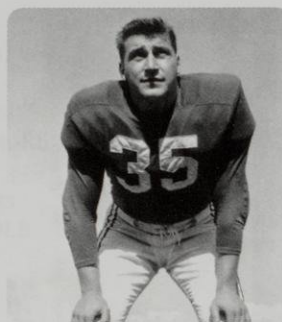
Four former Badger football greats were named to the Academic All-America All-Time team at the College Sports Information Directors of America convention in 1998.

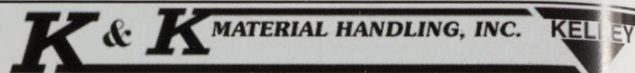

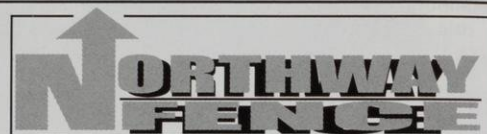

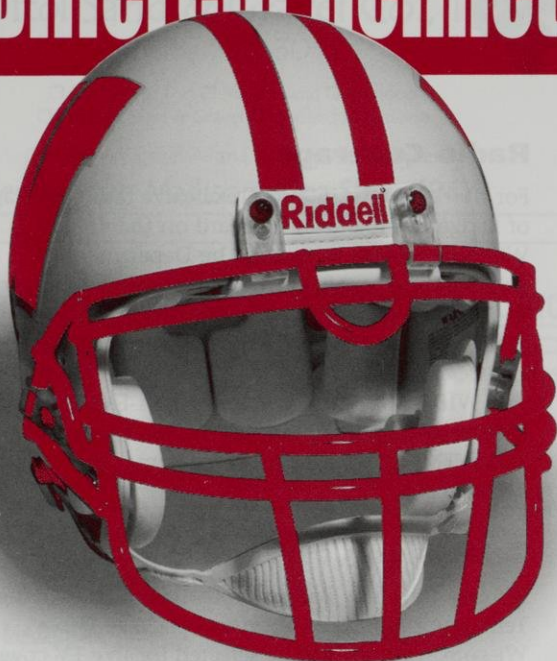

**DAN LANPHEAR (1957-59):** Madison native was a 1959 All-American before pro career with Oilers

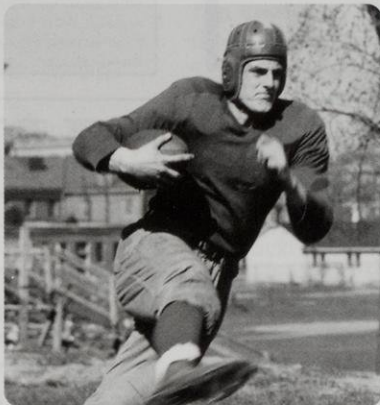
**ARLIE MUCKS, SR. (1914):** All-American on gridiron and silver medalist at Olympics (discus)

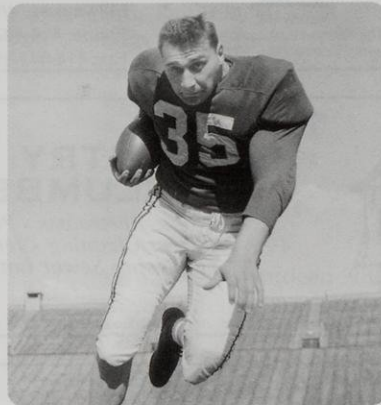
### #40 Elroy Hirsch

Elroy Hirsch played only one season (1942) at UW, but he was one of the most beloved sports figures in school history. Hirsch, nicknamed "Crazylegs," rushed for 786 yards for Wisconsin's 8-1-1 team in 1942. He starred for nine years with the L.A. Rams and later served as UW's Director of Athletics (1969-87).



### #83 Allan Shafer

The memory of former quarterback Allan Shafer is continued with the "Living Memorial" Scholarship that is given in his name. Shafer was fatally injured during the 1944 Wisconsin-Iowa game. Shafer is one of two Badgers (Jay Seiler is the other) to die from a football-related injury.



### #35 Alan Ameche

Alan Ameche, the 1954 Heisman Trophy winner, was a three-time All-American and ended his career as the NCAA's all-time rushing leader. He led the Badgers to the 1953 Rose Bowl and rushed for 133 yards in that game. The four-time NFL Pro Bowl pick was inducted into the College Hall of Fame in 1975.



### #80 Dave Schreiner

Dave Schreiner, the two-time All-American end, was named Western Conference Player of the Year in 1942. Schreiner lettered three years at the UW as an end, both on offense and defense. He is a member of the National Football Foundation and W Club Halls of Fame. He was voted to the UW's all-time team in 1969.

## What Every Badger Fan Should Know

With increasing numbers of NCAA rules governing outside intervention in recruiting, coaches cannot afford to have any extra "help" in recruiting elite student-athletes to the University of Wisconsin. The penalties are too severe.

Here are some tidbits of information concerning you and Badger athletes ...

You are a "representative" of the UW's athletics interests (i.e., booster) if any of the following apply:

- a) you are an alumnus of the University of Wisconsin;
- b) you have ever made financial contributions to the athletics department, to an athletic booster organization of the UW, or to a UW athletics program;
- c) you have ever helped to arrange employment of enrolled student-athletes and/or National Letter of Intent signees;
- d) you have ever been involved in any way promoting the Badger athletic program.

Once an individual is identified as an "athletics representative / booster," the person retains that identity forever, even if that person no longer contributes to or supports the athletics program.

**NCAA Bylaw 13.01.5 states:** In Division I, a representative of the UW's athletics interests is prohibited from making in-person, on-or-off campus recruiting contacts, or written or telephonic communications with a prospect or the prospect's relatives or legal guardians.

A prospect is any student who has started classes for the ninth grade. In addition, any student younger than ninth grade could become a "prospect" if they receive any benefits from an institution or a booster. Student-athletes enrolled in preparatory school or two-year colleges are also considered prospective student-athletes.

## What Can You Do?

If you know of a high school or junior college student-athlete who might want to attend the UW, the only permissible activity for a representative is to call the appropriate UW coach.

### Extra Benefit Rule

A representative of UW athletics interests cannot provide an "extra benefit" to a prospective or enrolled student-athlete. An extra benefit is any special arrangement by an institutional employee or a booster to provide for a student-athlete or a student-athlete's friend or relative not expressly authorized by NCAA legislation. Some examples of prohibited activities are:

- a) providing gifts or reduced cost services;
- b) providing a loan, or arranging for or co-signing a loan;
- c) employing relatives or friends of a prospective student-athlete as an inducement for the enrollment of the prospect;
- d) providing use of an automobile;
- e) providing rent-free or reduced-rent housing;

f) providing tickets to an athletic, institutional or community event;

g) entertaining or contacting a prospective student-athlete or a prospective student-athlete's family on or off campus;

h) promising to provide any of the above;

According to NCAA rules, the University of Wisconsin Athletic Department reserves the right to withhold any benefit or privilege associated with their athletic department (i.e., booster clubs, ticket privileges, etc.) from individuals that are involved in a violation of NCAA legislation.

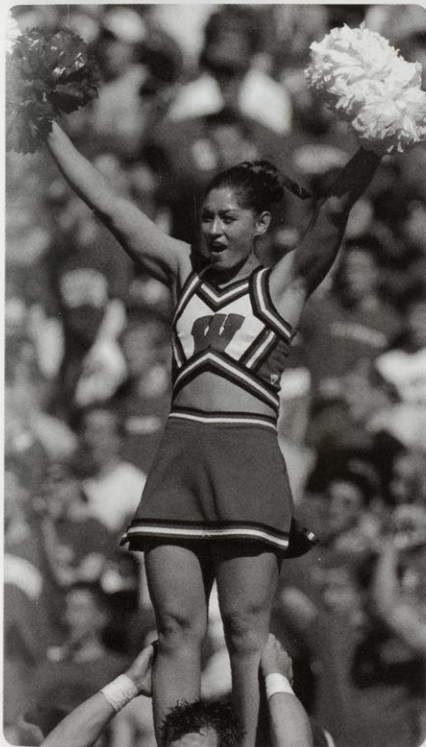
## Employment

NCAA rules are such that opportunities for your interaction with student-athletes are very limited. One of the best opportunities for alumni or friends of the program to assist student-athletes financially and provide them with a valuable internship experience is through employment. A representative of athletics interests is permitted to provide employment for student-athletes under the following conditions:

- Compensation can't include any remuneration for value or utility that the student-athlete may have for the employer because of the publicity, reputation, fame or personal following that he or she has obtained because of athletics ability;
- Compensation for only work actually performed; and
- Compensation at a rate commensurate with the going rate in that locality for similar services.

With more than 700 student-athletes competing at the UW, the Department of Athletics encourages businesses to hire Badger student-athletes. 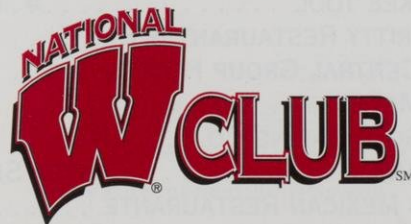
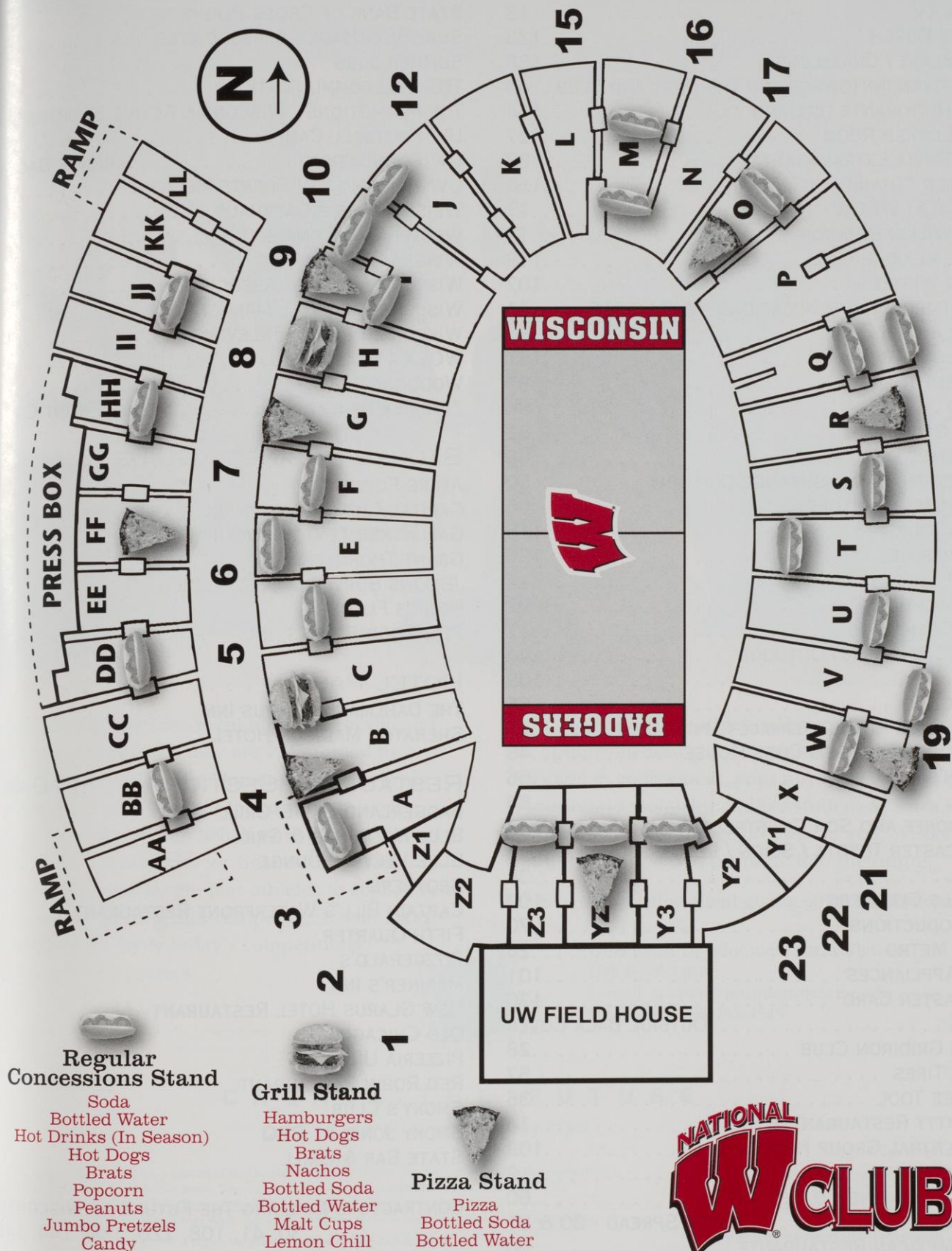

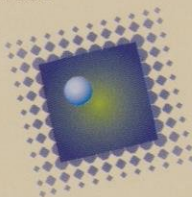
