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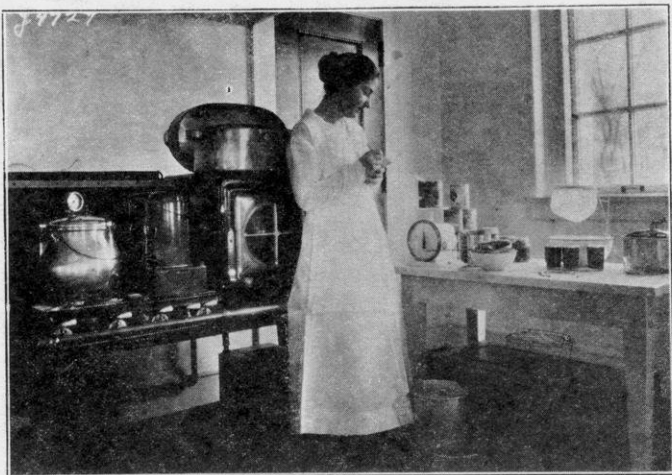

Each morning will be given to eight round table discussions at which the leader will outline the topics, after which free discussion will follow. Bring your questions.

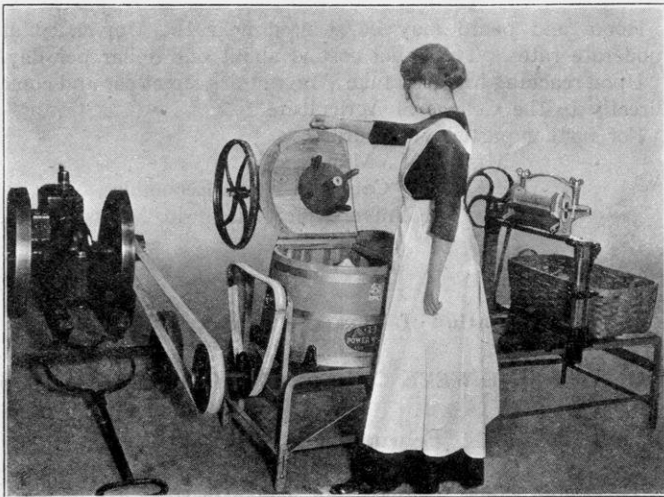
Round table topics will be repeated at the same hour each day so that all may have opportunity to attend the different round table discussions.

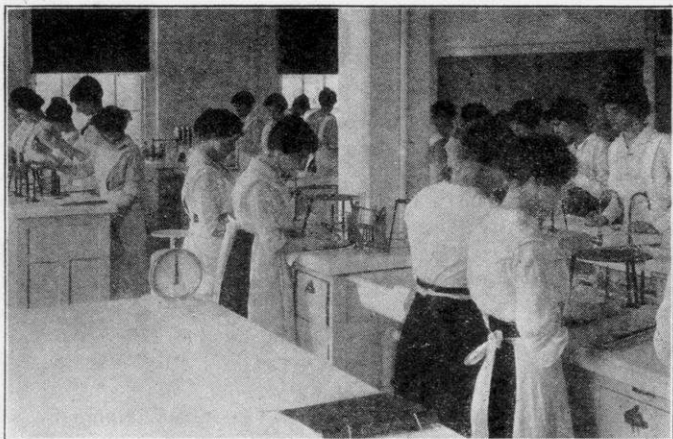

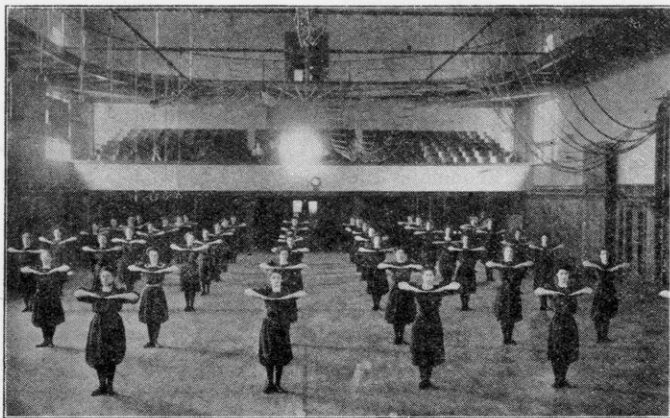
