Hoofers gets national coverage

USA Today recently cited Hoofers and area lakes as the main reasons UW-Madison is one of the "10 Great Places to get an A+ in the Outdoors." When *Outside* magazine named its 40 best college towns in September 2003, Hoofers was a big part of UW's number 18 ranking. UW-Madison came in third among the "Top 5 Outdoor Colleges" due in large part to the

Hoofer Outing Club, according to the October 2003 *Backpacker*. Finally, a feature about the Hoofer Sailing Club appeared in the February/March 2004 issue of *Northern Breezes*, a Midwest sailing magazine.

"Over the past several years, Hoofers has been taking steps to improve the quality of the equipment, facilities, trips, programs and educational opportunities we provide to UW students and the surrounding community," said Hoofer program advisor Amy Climer. "We are thrilled that people are recognizing Hoofers as a reason to attend UW-Madison."


