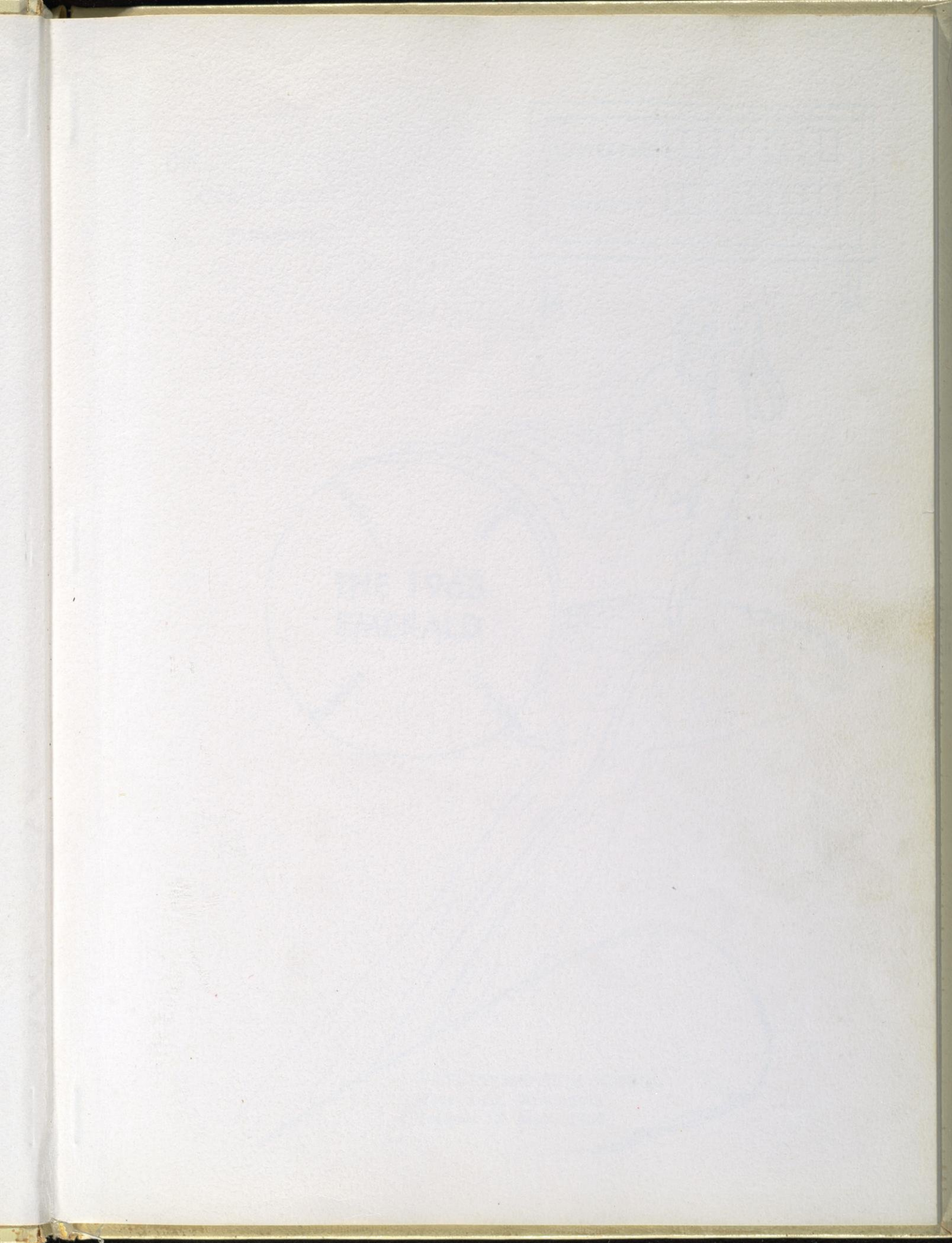

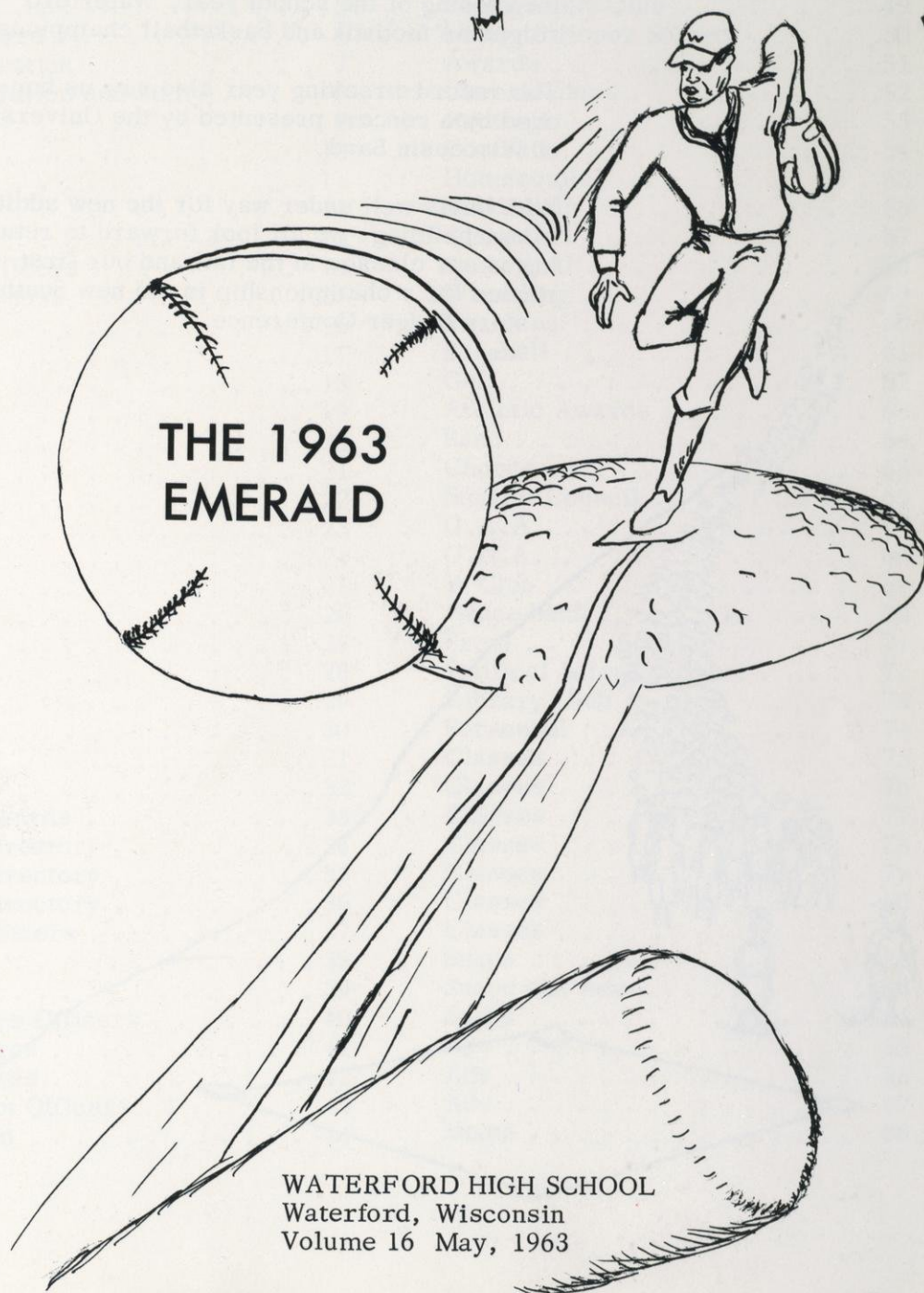
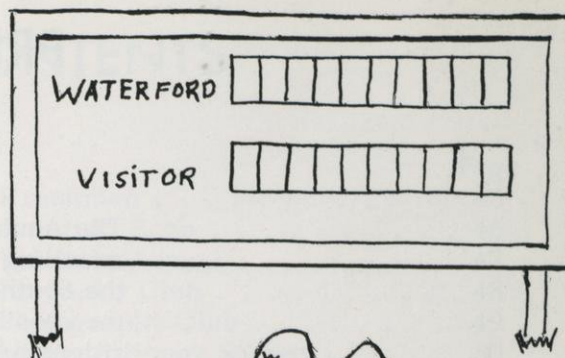

With plans well under way for the new addition to our building, we all look forward to returning to our classes in the fall and our first chance for a championship in the new Southeastern Badger Conference.

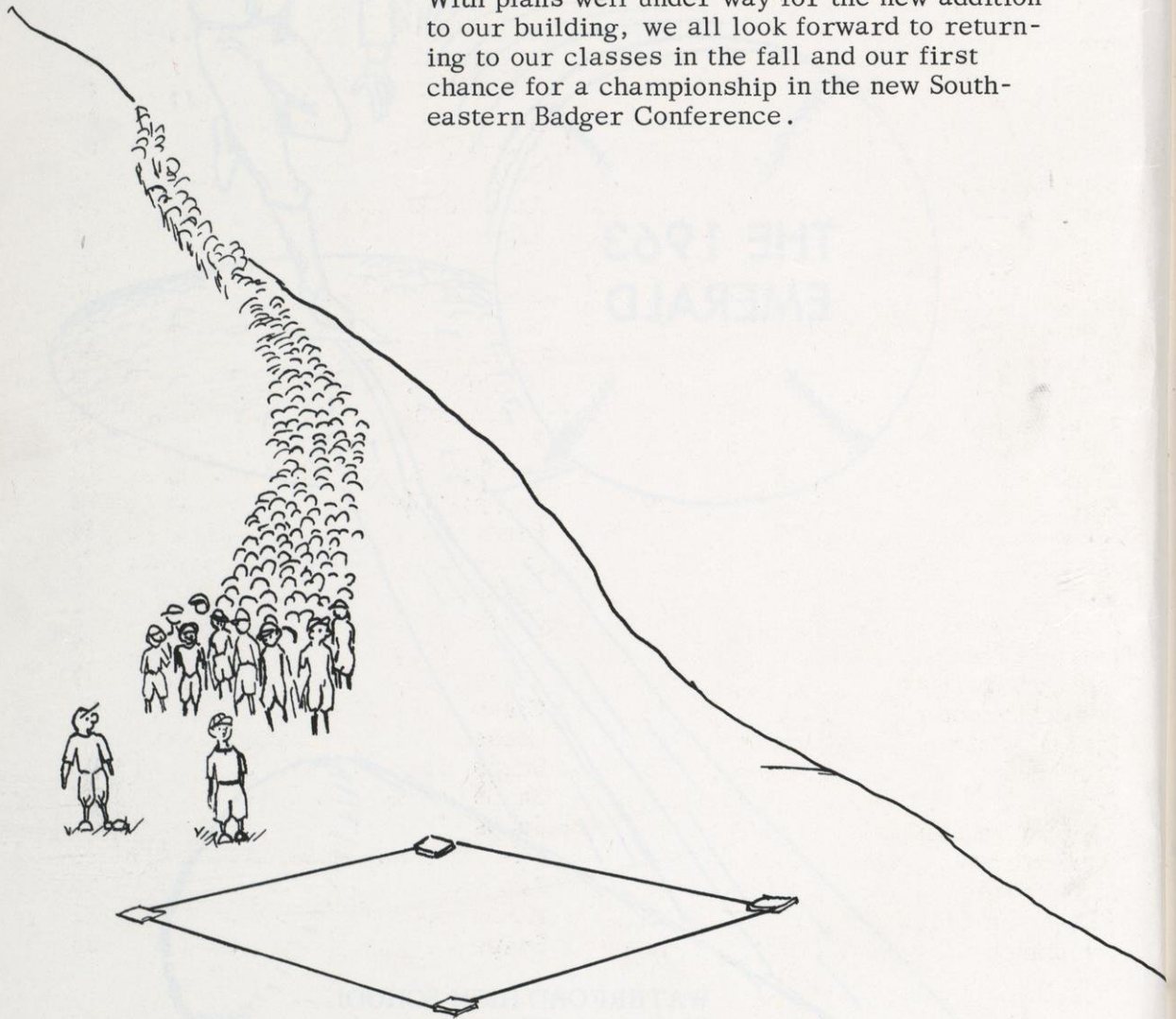
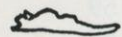

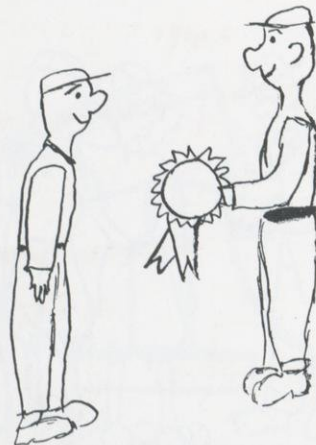

The Waterford High School Wrestling Team finished a successful season with a 6 and 4 record.

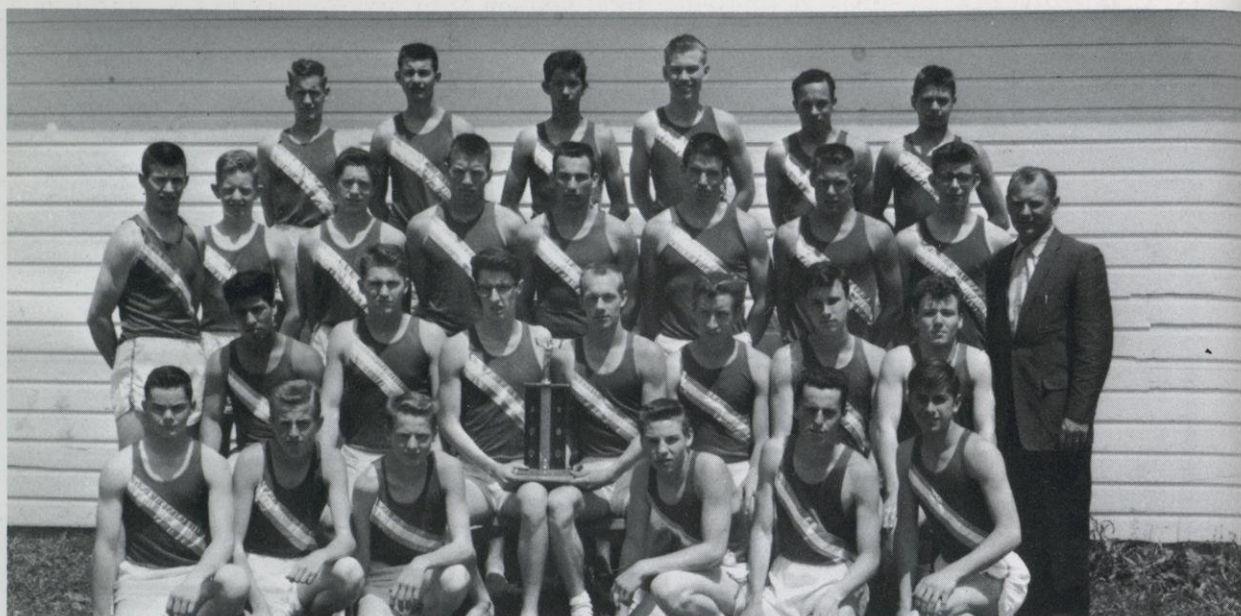
