HISTORICAL.

The city of Beloit has attained the age of fifty-seven years. After the Mound Builders and the Indians, came the white man, the way having been cleared by the Blackhawk war.

The first white man to live on the site of Beloit was a French Canadian, Joseph Thiebeau, (his name is variously spelled), who had two Indian wives and several children. His log house stood just about where the office of the Keeler Lumber Co. now stands. It was about this time that Abraham Lincoln, a private in a militia company returning from the pursuit of Blackhawk, passed through "Turtle Village;" when he spoke in Hanchett's Hall in 1858 he told Professor Emerson about it.

Caleb Blodgett was the first real settler. He came here exploring with one or two of his sons as early as May, 1836. Through the latter half of that year he was farming, building, and getting ready for his family, who came in December. His house stood on the river bank, where the Frederick Hardware Co. now have their store.

From Colebrook, N. H., about that time, "The New England Emigrating Company" sent out Dr. Horace White, Robert P. Crane, and Otis P. Bicknell, to find them a suitable place. Dr. White, as financial agent, bought for the Company a part of Mr. Blodgett's claim; it became the "east side" of the future Beloit. The other members of the Company came scattering along through that year and the next. The Company began housekeeping in Thiebeau's log house. Their fame led many steady and high-minded people to cast their lot with them.

They set up a saw-mill, which cut its first boards in April, 1837; these made a floor for the Blodgett cabin. The first death in the community was that of Horace Clark, Dec. 2d, 1837, the interment being made in what is now the City Green; there are said to have been three burials in the Green, as it was then meant to be the village cemetery. The grist mill began grinding, and the first store was built in 1838.

The postoffice for the first year was Chicago; then Rockford; then Roscoe. The Beloit postoffice was established in 1839.

The settlement was first called Turtle, but that name did not suit; then Albany, or New Albany, was proposed; the name Beloit was selected by a public meeting in the fall of 1838; L. G. Fisher proposed the name Beloit as short, euphonious and unique. It has since been copied in Iowa, Kansas, Alabama and other states.

The city bridge dates from 1840, a stock company being then organized to erect a toll-bridge. Finally the village paid the bill, and the bridge was made free. This bridge brought the west side land into market.

The Rock river dam dates from 1844; the attempts to use Turtle creek as a water-power began with the village, but have been suspended for about a dozen years past.

One of the earliest structures was the "Beloit House," erected where the Milwaukee railroad station now stands. State street was then called Turtle.

The Methodist church was organized as a class December 27, 1838; the First Congregational church began to be on December 30th of that year. The Baptist and Episcopal churches soon followed, and in time the rest.

In 1844 began the convention that resulted in the organization of the College. Middle College was begun in 1846; the first instruction was given November 4, 1847.

The Chicago and Northwestern railroad began running to Beloit in the winter of 1850, trains from Chicago coming by Belvidere. The Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul railroad was opened to Beloit in 1856. The railroad debt of the town, originally of \$100,000, was incurred in aid of this road; the bonds were dated May 21, 1853. The amount unpaid is now small and will soon be cleared away.

The village was cut out of the southeast corner of the township and made a city in 1856; it is two miles north and south, and two and a half miles wide.

Gas was introduced in 1859; the Savings Bank was founded in 1881; the water-works date from 1885.

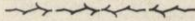

**WATER SUPPLY**—The city of Beloit has one of the finest water supplies in the country, which is remarkable for its medicinal qualities and its purity. The source of supply is evidently the same as that of Waukesha, Palmyra and other notable Wisconsin waters in this part of the state. The water is supplied by innumerable springs bubbling up in the bottom of a huge well 30 feet in diameter and 40 feet deep. It is so clear and colorless that a cut glass when filled to the brim looks no different than an empty glass of the same style, and the same great pureness of the water is demonstrated by heating the residue, which does not change its color. We give the interpretation of analysis made some time ago by Prof. E. G. Smith:

**INTERPRETATION OF RESULTS.**—The low amount of Free Ammonia, Albuminoid Ammonia, Oxygen Consumed, and Chlorine; the absence of Nitrites and Nitrates; and finally the Physical properties indicate an almost absolute freedom from organic matters. 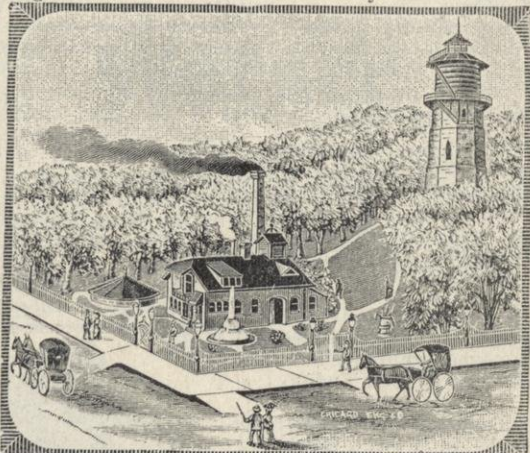

Since the analysis was made the continued pumping has seemed to improve the quality of the water, as it now shows no trace of chlorine.

The grounds of the Water Works occupy about five acres on the East bluff of the city. The water tower, nearly 100

feet high, is built of stone and is the finest and largest piece of stone masonry of the kind in the West. The tower sustains a large cypress tank, holding 100,000 gallons of water, which is kept full at all times, day and night, and gives from its own head 60 lbs. pressure to the business portion of the city.

The pump gives a direct pressure of 125 lbs. when required for fire purposes. In addition to the East Side water works, a West Side station is now located on Race St., drawing from several wells there. This water is even better than the East Side well furnishes. Beloit has over 14 miles of water mains and over 115 fire hydrants, thus giving splendid fire protection as well as beautiful and healthful water for domestic purposes.

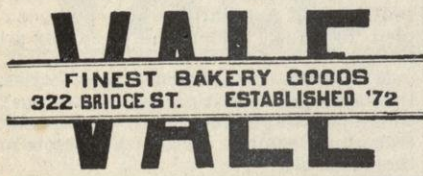

There are 29 double rooms and 10 single rooms, all nicely furnished and heated by furnace or stove as desired. Mrs. Hannamen is the matron and all the cooking is done in the building. The price of board is \$2 per week. Arthur A. Amy, '96, is the steward. Single rooms furnished, heated by furnace, rent for 60 cents per week, and if heated by stove, 50 cents per week. Double rooms, furnished, heated by furnace, \$1.00 per week for the two. If heated by stove, 75 cents per week. Rooms in North College can be had at lower rates. Spacious bath rooms are maintained in connection with the building for the convenience of the inmates. There are hard wood floors throughout. Chapin Hall is lighted by electricity.

It is the plan of the donor and of the trustees to have as much of the work as possible done by the young men and thus enable a number of students to pay their own way in part.

Rooms in private families furnished and taken care of are from 75c to \$1.50 for one, and from \$1.50 to \$3.00 for two per week. Fuel and lights are extra. Board at present rates is from \$1.50 (in clubs) to \$4.00.

## BUILDINGS.

MIDDLE COLLEGE (original building, erected 1847-8, four stories, red brick) contains Treasurer's office, History, Recitation and Library rooms (1, 2), Philosophy room (5), Greek room (7), Modern Languages room (9), Archaean Reading room (3), English room (11), Latin room (12). To see the view from the belfry, inquire for key at the Treasurer's office.

NORTH COLLEGE (1854, three stories, red brick) at north end of campus. Con-

tains students' rooms, renting from 25c to 50c per week, unfurnished.

ART HALL (Old Chapel) containing the Emerson and Fisher collections, and others.

SOUTH COLLEGE, two stories, frame, southwest of Art Hall. South end occupied by music rooms; north end by art rooms.

MEMORIAL HALL (1869, two stories, lime stone, southeast corner of campus), contains college library up stairs, cabinets down stairs. Notice the tablets in the vestibule.

GYMNASIUM (1874, frame, west center of the campus).

OBSERVATORY (1881-3, stone, with dome and wing, south end of campus, brow of the hill).

SCOVILLE HALL (1889-90, three stories, red pressed brick, trimmings of brown stone and terra cotta, brow of the hill, south of Observatory), contains manual training rooms, furnaces, etc., (basement), recitation rooms (all floors), Principal's office (first floor), assembly room (second floor), music rooms (third floor), janitors' rooms. See Academy Directory page.

NEW CHAPEL (1890-1, Wauwatosa and Richmond stone, east center of campus), contains 700 sittings rooms for College Y. M. C. A., President's office, organ, etc. Visitors are welcome to college worship at 5:00 p m, also at vesper service Sunday, same hour.

CHAPIN HALL (1890-1, red pressed brick, four stories, north end of campus), college boarding club, etc., on first floor; rooms for students in three upper stories; bath rooms, electric lights, etc.

SCIENCE HALL (1891, red pressed brick), is also the gift of Dr Pearsons; stands just northwest of Middle College. It is a handsome building, lacking nothing, either within or without, which such a Scientific Laboratory should possess. To the left on the first floor, the first door is the President's office; to the right is the Ladies' Study Room; opposite the entrance is the Public Lecture Hall, seating

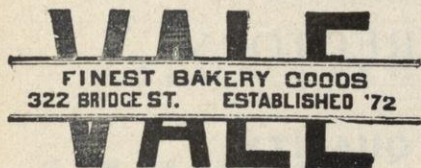

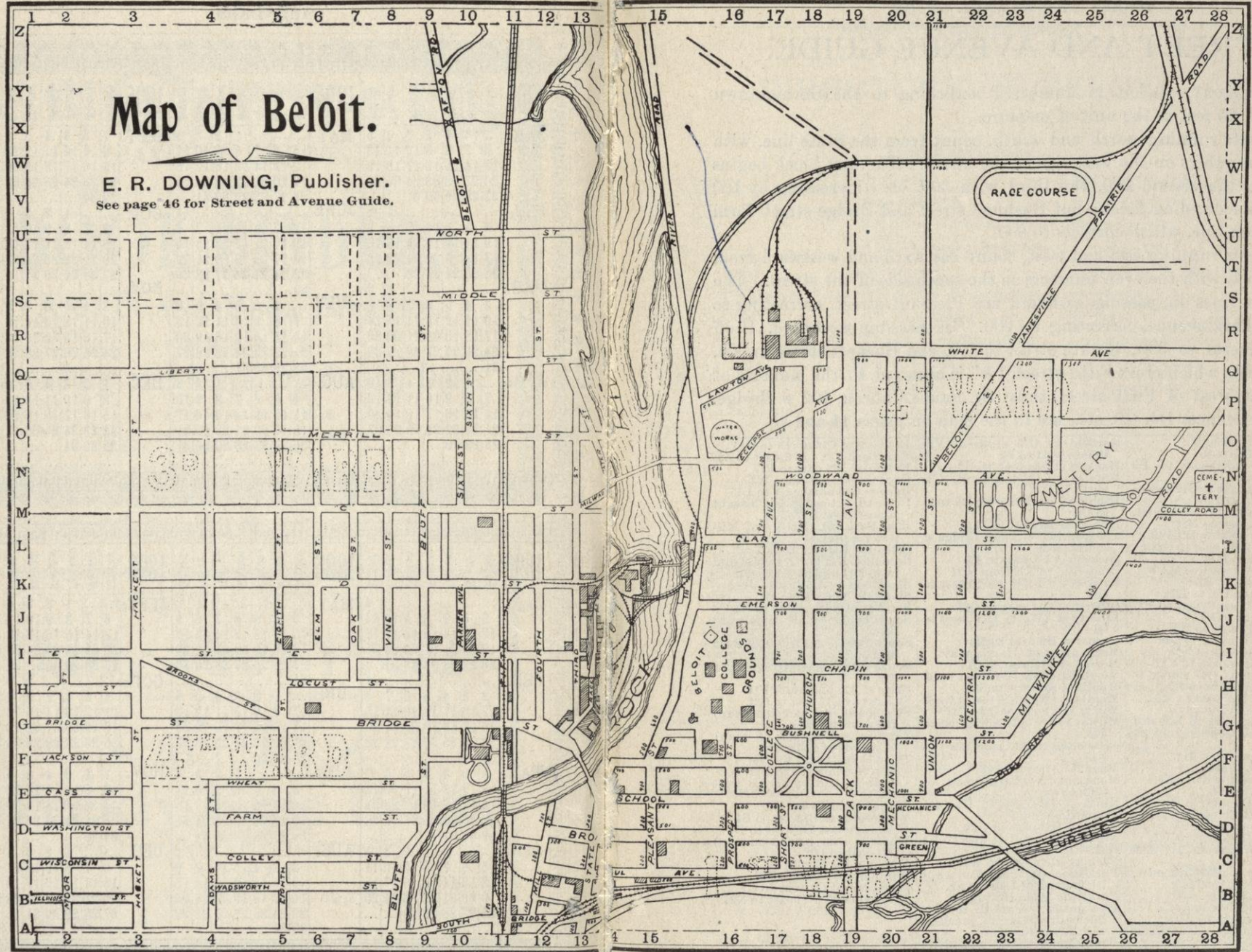

## STREET AND AVENUE GUIDE.

EXPLANATORY.—Beloit is numbered according to the Germantown plan, with 20 feet as the unit of measure.

All streets running north and south, count from the State line, with the even numbers on the west side of the street. The first block begins with 100, the second 200, the third with 300, etc., increasing by 100 with each succeeding block; but Bushnell street and Bridge street form a correction line, which corrects to 600.

All streets running east and west, count eastward and westward from Fifth street, with the even numbers on the south side of the street. The correction lines in passing eastward are Pleasant street, correcting to 500, and Park avenue, correcting to 900. In passing westward, Bluff street corrects to 300; Eighth street to 700, and Hackett street to 900.

On streets which cross Fifth street, "w" is annexed to the number of each house west of Fifth street, thus: St. Paul's Church, 102 w Bridge.



**BICYCLE ORDINANCE.**—No person shall ride upon a velocipede or bicycle of any description on any sidewalk of the city of Beloit, except in crossing the same, within the fire limits of said city, or outside the fire limits upon West Bridge street between Bluff street and the Northwestern railroad track where it crosses said West Bridge street.

No person shall ride upon any velocipede or bicycle upon any sidewalk within said city of Beloit at a higher rate of speed than four miles an hour when meeting or overtaking and passing a pedestrian.

No person shall coast down any hill or grade upon a velocipede or bicycle on any sidewalk in said city of Beloit.

No person shall ride upon any velocipede or bicycle upon any sidewalk in the city of Beloit after dark.

Any person or persons who shall violate any of the provisions of this section shall forfeit a penalty of not less than two (2)

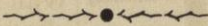

M. & St. P. R. R. Company and South Bridge street. In the Fourth Ward, all that part of the city which is bounded on the east by the Tail Race and the center line of Rock river; on the south by the center line of Rock river; on the west by the main track of the C. & N. W. R. R. Co., and on the north by the center line of E street to the Tail Race.

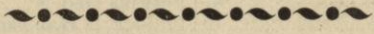

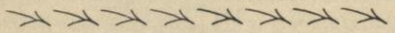

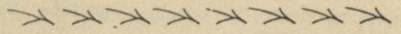
