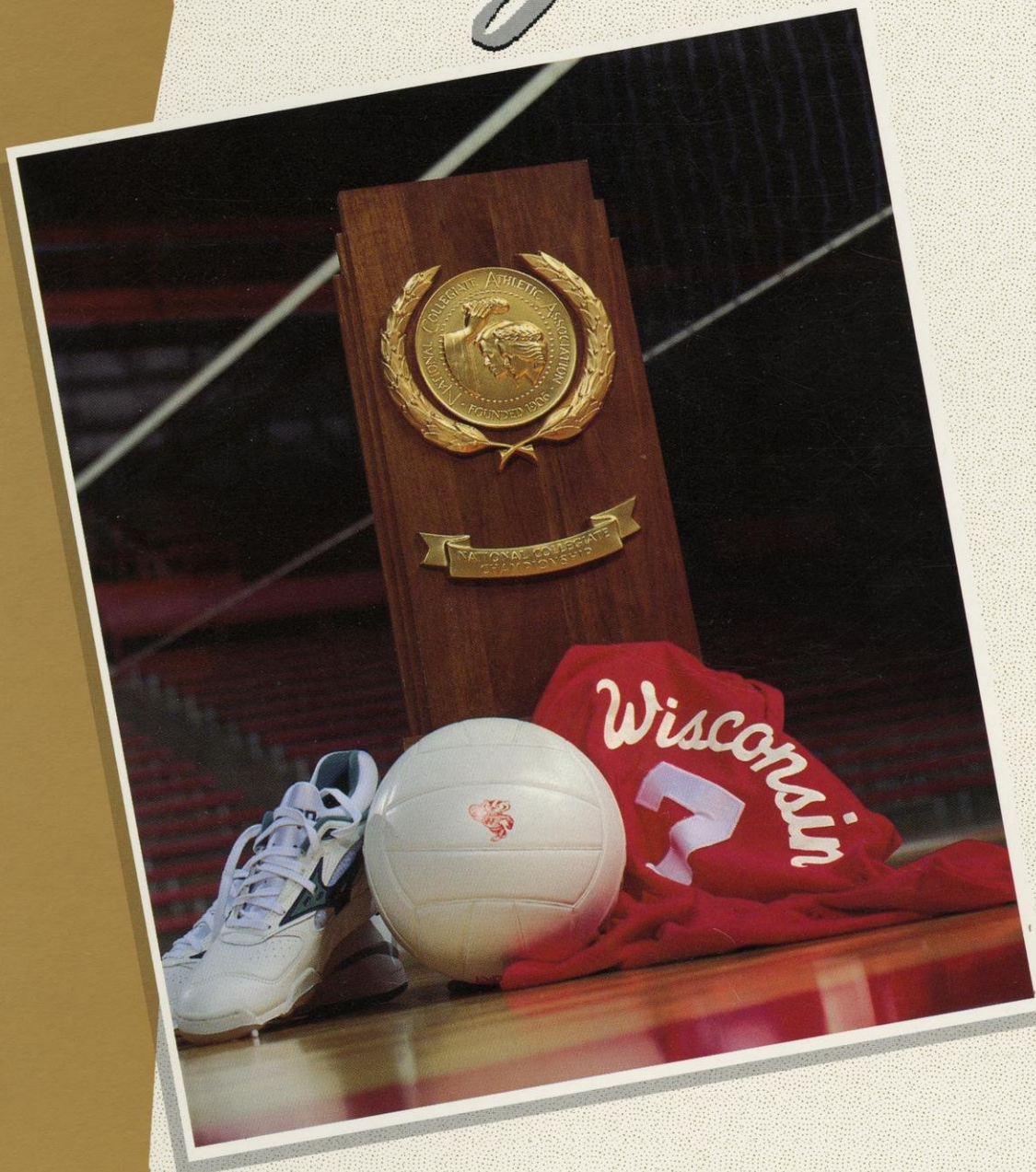

Media Information

Media Credentials: All print, photo and electronic media requesting credentials to cover Wisconsin volleyball should contact Diane Nordstrom at the Women's Sports Information Office at least 24 hours in advance of the match. Credentials will be placed at the Pass Gate, located to the north of Gate A in the Field House, on the night of the match.

Parking: Parking for media during Wisconsin volleyball matches is reserved in lots 18 and 19. Please contact Diane Nordstrom for parking credentials one week in advance of the match. Free parking is located north of Camp Randall Stadium in lot 17.

Media Services: Media covering Wisconsin volleyball in the Field House will be provided with event programs, media guides, and pre-match notes. Working facilities for press/radio/television are located on the west side of the Wisconsin Field House, just below the first balcony. Electrical outlets are available at every seat. Telephone lines must be installed in advance of the match. A complete box score will be available at the conclusion of the match.

The Wisconsin sports information office provides up-to-date information and statistics on the Badger volleyball team. Any additional information requests should go to the Women's Sports Information Office at (608) 262-9024.

Photographers: Photographers may work from either end of the court and the west side of the floor. Photographers may not work from in front of team and scoring benches.

Post-match Interviews: All post-match interviews will be conducted in the women's basketball locker room located down the ramp in the southwest corner of the Field House. The visiting coach and players will be interviewed approximately 10 minutes following the completion of the match. Coach John Cook and the Wisconsin players will follow immediately. All requests for interviews should be directed to Diane Nordstrom prior to the completion of the match.

Head Coach John Cook

A former Olympic coach, John Cook begins his second year as the head coach at the University of Wisconsin. Cook not only brings Olympic credentials but also national championship experience to the Badger program.

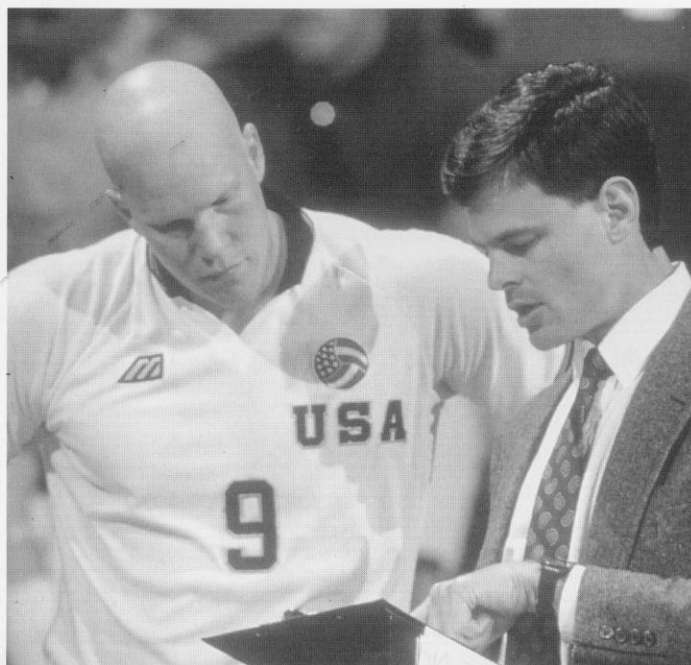
As an assistant coach with the United States Men's National Volleyball team, Cook aided the U.S. to a bronze medal in the 1992 Olympic Games in Barcelona. The team's defensive coordinator, he was also in charge of scouting, and supervising the team's flexibility, strength and conditioning programs.

Cook was honored in June of 1993 at the NACDA/USOC Collegiate Coaches Recognition Awards Luncheon for his Olympic coaching experience.

Prior to his appointment with the national team, Cook served as the first assistant coach with the University of Nebraska women's volleyball program from 1988-91. During Cook's tenure at Nebraska, the Cornhuskers advanced to the NCAA final four every year including a second-place finish in 1989. Nebraska also captured the NCAA Midwest Regional and Big Eight Conference championship each of those three years.

Cook served as the Huskers' recruiting coordinator, scouting chief, strength and conditioning coordinator, and was the liaison with the academic advising center. Nebraska garnered seven academic all-America honors, ranking them No. 1 in the country.

In the U.S. Olympic Festival competition, Cook served as head coach of the bronze medal-winning North team in 1989 and was an assistant coach with the third-place West team in 1987.

A co-founder of the San Diego Volleyball Club, Cook served as a coach with the club from 1986-88. The club won two Southern California Regional Championships and finished among the final four teams twice in the USVBA Junior Olympics for girls 18 and under.

Cook's coaching credentials also include leading Parker High School in San Diego to two California state championships. During his six-year coaching stint, he had a .900 winning percentage with an overall record of 162-18, including a 90-match league winning streak.

In his first year at Wisconsin, he led the young Badgers to a 14-17 record and

seventh-place finish in the Big Ten Conference. Cook garnered his first all-Big Ten honor as senior Arlisa Hagan was named to the second-team all-Big Ten Conference team. Hagan also set the all-time UW kills and blocking records during Cook's first season.

A 1979 graduate of the University of San Diego, Cook earned his bachelor's degree in history. He completed his master's degree in teaching and coaching effectiveness from San Diego State University in 1991.

Cook and his wife Wendy are expecting their second child in October. They have one daughter, Lauren.

Assistant Coaches

Margie Fitzpatrick



A former member of the Wisconsin volleyball team, Margie (Kaminski) Fitzpatrick begins her third season as an assistant coach with the Badger team.

Fitzpatrick served as the interim head coach of the Badgers during 1991 following the death of Steve Lowe. She led Wisconsin to its second consecutive NCAA post-season appearance and a second-place tie with Penn State in the Big Ten Confer-

ence. Overall, the Badgers finished 23-10 including a first-round NCAA tournament win over Bowling Green State advancing to the Midwest Regional for the second year in a row.

In her first year as an assistant coach in 1990, Fitzpatrick realized a championship dream when the Badgers won the Big Ten title.

A former UW volleyball player, Fitzpatrick was Wisconsin's most valuable player in 1986 and 1987. She served as captain of the 1987 team and is a three-time all-Big Ten honorable mention selection. As an outside hitter, Fitzpatrick ranks among the top 10 in every hitting and blocking career category at Wisconsin. She is also the UW record holder for most service aces in a career (166), in a season (61) and in a match (8).

A native of South Bend, Ind., Fitzpatrick was a member of the St. Joseph's Academy varsity team four years, and the South Bend Junior Olympic volleyball team from 1981-84. She played on the AAU Junior Olympic gold medal team in 1982, and received the Indiana President's Award for volleyball in 1983. Her teams won the Indiana State White River Games Championships in 1987 and 1988.

A 1989 graduate of the University of Wisconsin in recreation resource management, Fitzpatrick's coaching resume includes experience with the USVBA in West Allis, Wis., and Sports Camp International in Grand Rapids, Mich. In addition, she also coaches at a number of summer volleyball camps in the area.

Fitzpatrick continues to compete in volleyball on the recreational level. She also serves on the board of directors of the Wisconsin Avid Volleyball Enthusiasts (W.A.V.E.) Booster Club.

Megan McCallister



Megan McCallister, a member of the United States National Women's Volleyball team, begins her first year as an assistant coach with the Wisconsin volleyball program.

A six-foot outside hitter, McCallister has been a member of the national team since 1991. She competed in the 1991 Pan American Games and 1991 World University Games earning a bronze medal. As a member of the Chrysler

Californians, she won the inaugural NORCECA Women's Club Championship in 1991.

A 1991 graduate of USC in business administration, McCallister served as the Trojans captain as a senior. A four-year starter, she was a two-time all-PAC 10 selection. As a freshman McCallister led the conference and ranked fifth nationally in hitting percentage at .391. She was named to the PAC 10 all-freshman team. McCallister completed her career at USC with 1,472 kills and 375 blocks, and led USC to three appearances in the NCAA tournament. She was also named the USC Scholar Athlete of the Year in 1991.

McCallister competed in the 1986 and 1987 U.S. Olympic Festivals earning bronze medals. A native of Manhattan Beach, Calif., she graduated from Mira Costa High School and was named the 1986 high school player of the year by *Volleyball Monthly*.

Since her graduation, McCallister has worked as an assistant to the branch manager at Paine Webber in Beverly Hills, Calif. She will be working towards her master's degree in educational administration while at Wisconsin.

Cowabunga! Wisconsin Volleyball '93



COWABUNGA, DUDES—IT'S THE 1993 WISCONSIN VOLLEYBALL TEAM!

Wisconsin has always been known for its dairy cows, but in 1993 Coach John Cook and the volleyball Badgers hope the University of Wisconsin becomes known as the volleyball capitol of the world.

Madison will be the site of the 1993 NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball Championship in December. The championship will feature the four best teams in the country. And prior to the championship, Wisconsin will play its version of Badger ball during the 1993 season. Cook and his coaching staff have worked hard to make his second-year team a championship contender.

"I feel really good about our upcoming season because I'm challenging our players and they're rising to the challenges," says Cook. "We've raised our expectations this year and we'll continue to raise our expectations every year."

The Badgers finished

with a 14-17 record last season and placed seventh in the Big Ten Conference. Wisconsin did not advance to a post-season tournament for the first time in three years, but in 1993 things are looking up.

"Our players have made a commitment in their spring season, in their strength and conditioning, in the classroom, and in their summer program," says Cook. "Our players have made a commitment in all areas of their life so they can play their best volleyball and excel as student-athletes. I think you'll see that reflected in our play and our overall record this year."

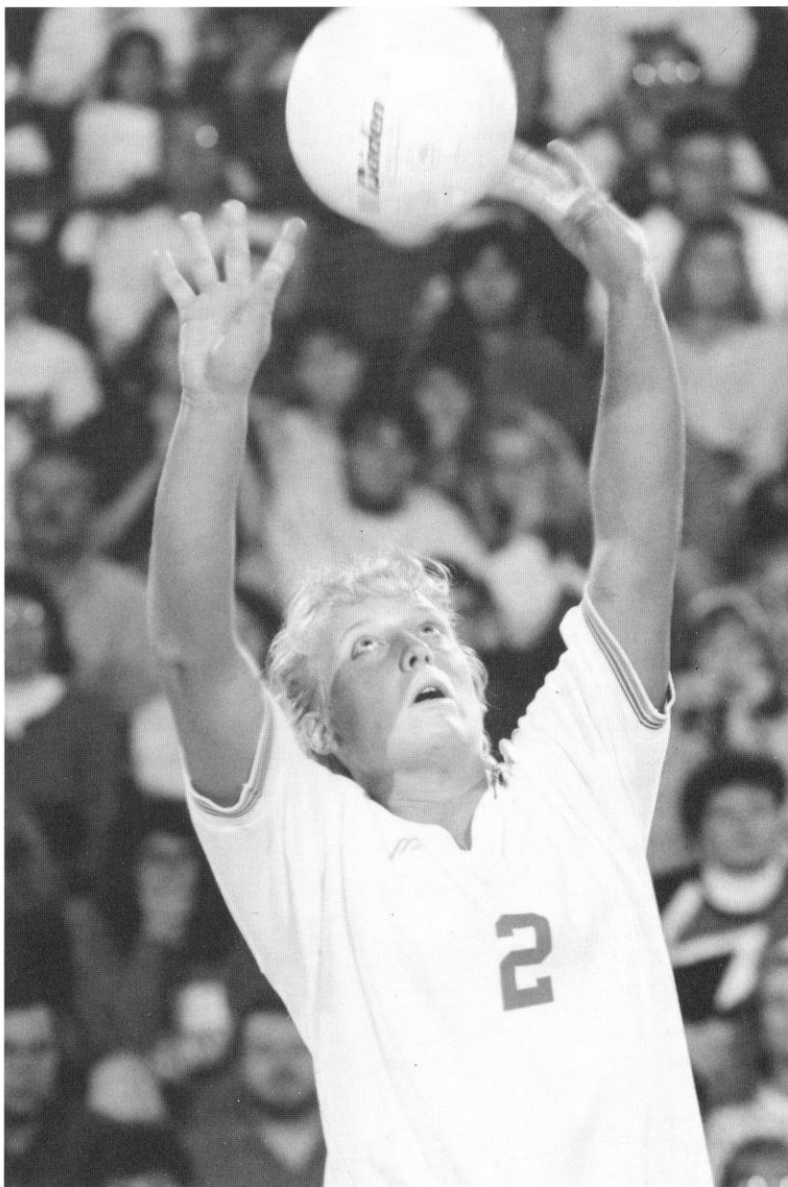

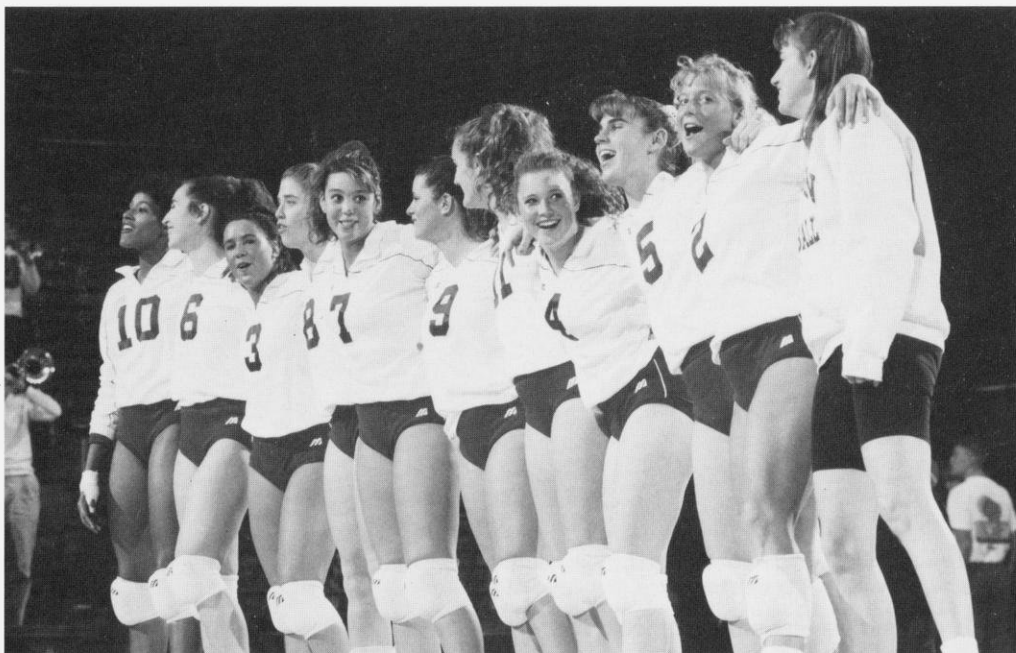
going to jump serve and we're going to run a very fast-tempo attack. We're quicker, we're stronger and we jump higher."

Wisconsin played one of the toughest schedules in the country last year and the 1993 schedule doesn't look much easier. The Badgers begin the season by playing host to defending NCAA champion Stanford. Wisconsin competes in three tournaments during the non-conference portion of its schedule in preparation for the always tough Big Ten schedule. Defending conference champions Penn State and Illinois return most of their players as does third-place Ohio State and fifth-place Michigan making them the league favorites.

Wisconsin lost only one player from its 1992 squad, all-Big Ten middle blocker Arlisa Hagan, but the Badgers are still a young team with only one senior returning.

Kristin Sobocinski led the 1992 Badger squad at setter. She is the only senior on the 1993 Wisconsin squad.

“We lose Arlisa, but we’re going to be a better team and be more competitive because we don’t have Arlisa to rely on,” says Cook. “This year we’re going to have to play as a team and play within our system to be effective.”

Wisconsin’s only senior is Kristin Sobocinski, from Hales Corners, Wis. Sobocinski was the Badgers starting setter in 25 matches last year. She missed six matches due to an ankle injury, but still recorded 1,006 assists which is fourth on the UW season list. Sobocinski ranked seventh in the conference in assists per game with 11.18 in 1992.

“Kristin has worked harder this year than she’s ever worked in her life,” says Cook. “Our goal with her is that she have a good senior season and play the best volleyball of her career. Based on what I saw this spring, I think that’s going to happen.”

Cook credits Sobocinski and junior Laurie Smith for establishing the Badgers new attitude on the court and in practices for 1993.

“Kristin and Laurie set the tone for every practice and every strength and conditioning session that we had,” explains Cook. “They both worked extremely hard and earned the respect of their teammates with their efforts

day-in and day-out.”

One of the hardest working players Cook has ever seen, Smith played in all 31 matches last season as the starting right-side hitter. She finished fourth on the team in kills with 285 (2.44 per game) and third in blocks with 89. The Wheaton, Ill., native is one of the best blockers on the team according to Cook and will move to middle blocker this season.

“Laurie’s a very good blocker and we’re going to take advantage of her blocking skills by moving her to middle,” explains Cook. “She’ll get more opportunities to block in the middle than she would just being on the right.”

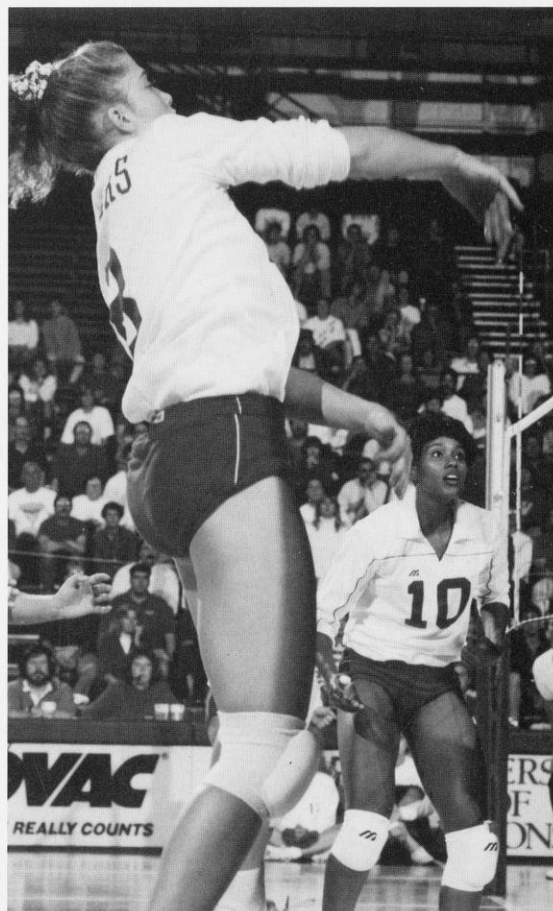
With the 5-11 Smith moving to middle blocker, the Badgers should improve their blocking. Add to that a strong service and defense, and the only area that Cook considers a weakness on his team is attacking.

“We don’t have the big dominating hitter that many of the teams we play do,” says Cook. “We’re going to have to

distribute the ball to all of our attackers and keep teams off balance with our quickness and the tempo of our attack.”

The Badger attack should improve with junior Brigitte Lourey moving back to outside hitter. Lourey, from Columbia Heights, Minn., moved from outside hitter to middle blocker halfway through last season, but will hopefully move back to the outside if freshman Holly Smith can step into the starting middle position.

The 5-11 Lourey finished second last season on the team in kills with 366 and blocks with 81. She ranked ninth in the conference in kills per game with 3.52 and 10th in service aces with .36 per game. Lourey recorded a career high 29 kills against Texas-

Arlington, which is only two short of the UW record.

"Brigitte needs to carry a big hitting load for us," says Cook. "We need her to play well every night out and be consistent."

Laurie Smith and Lourey are only two members of the Badgers strong junior class. Third-year junior Cathy DeZutel along with second-year junior Joanna Grotenhuis make up the largest and most experienced class.

DeZutel, a 5-8 outside hitter, has played a strong defensive and serving role for the Badgers the past two years. A native of West Chicago, Ill., she recorded 199 digs and 17 service aces last season. DeZutel, who became the first Badger to jump serve last year, also recorded 69 kills.

"Cathy had a great spring," says Cook. "Right now, she's a starter on

the court. When she's out there, Cathy should be our best defensive player and passer on the court."

"The backbone of the team is going to be serving and defense, because I think that's what wins big matches."

Grotenhuis walked onto the Badger squad last season and played in six matches. The 5-11 outside hitter improved tremendously during the spring season and should challenge for a starting position at outside hitter.

"The junior class is going to be the core of our team," says Cook. "I expect them all to step it up another level. They're not rookies in the Big Ten anymore; they're experienced players and we should see that reflected in their play."

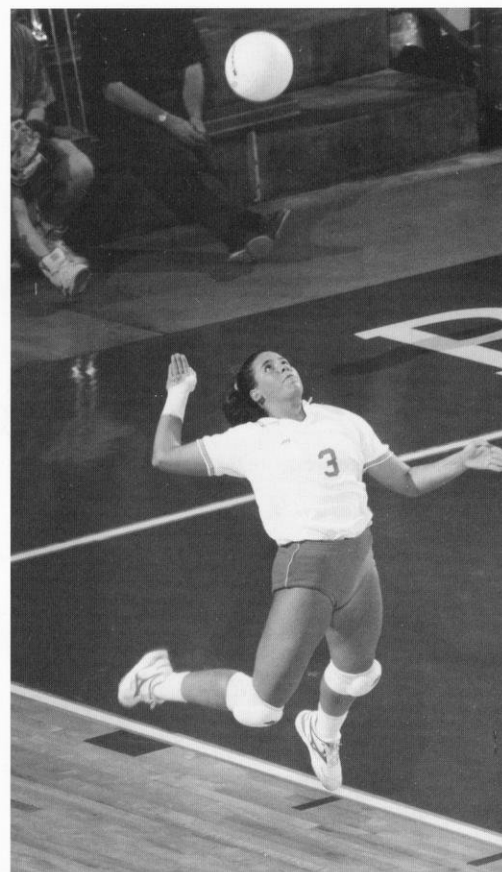
Both members of the Badger sophomore class missed the spring season due to injury.

Jamie Smith, a 5-8 outside hitter, had wrist surgery during the off season. The El Toro, Calif., played injured last season, but still recorded 104 kills and 219 digs in 30 matches. She started several matches and recorded a career high 19 kills and 21 digs.

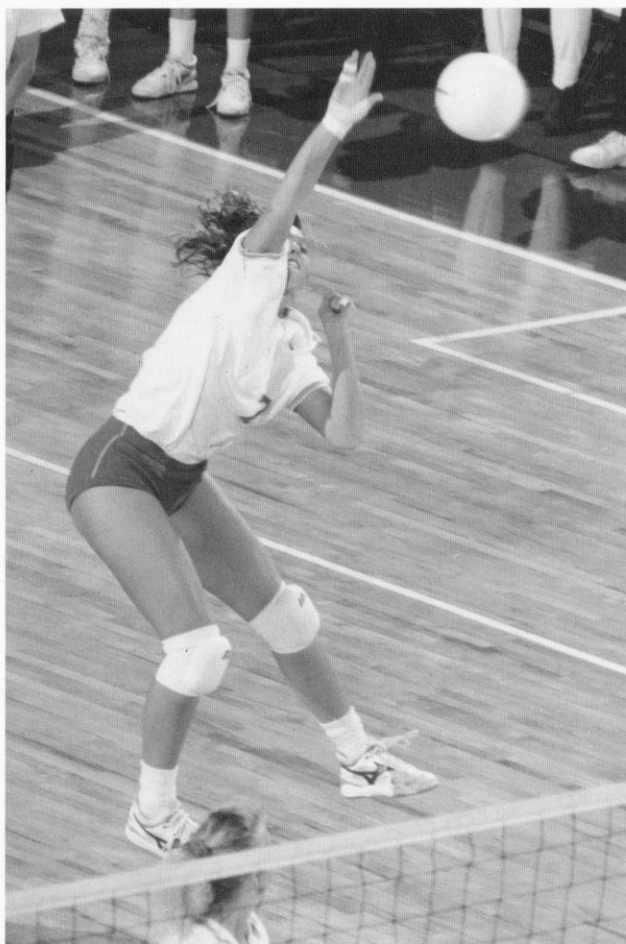
"Everyone's anxious to see what Jamie can do when she's healthy since she played injured all last fall," says Cook.

The same can be said for Tricia Landry, a 6-0 middle blocker from Milwaukee. Landry had shoulder surgery during the off season after playing in 14 matches last season. She had a career high three kills against Minnesota.

Cook is also anxious to see how his freshman class will com-

pliment his returning players and fit into the Badger program.

"It's a good solid recruiting class," says Cook. "We have a player at each position so we've strengthened ourselves in all areas."

"The freshmen are going to help establish the foundation we're going to build on to be competing for a Big Ten Championship every year."

Leading the freshman class is Laura Abbinante, a 5-9 setter from Itasca, Ill. Abbinante was a 1992 all-state selection and a 1993 *Volleyball Monthly* Feb 50 selection. She was named the most valuable player of the 1993 AAU 19-and-under national tournament and the 1991 AAU 16-and-under national tournament leading her team to the title. Abbinante was a four-time AAU All-American and a USVBA All-American.

"Laura will bring to our team a competitive spirit that is very rare in

high school players," says Cook. "She's very competitive and makes the players around her play better."

Kelli Luther, a 6-1 outside hitter from Grand Island, Neb., comes from a volleyball family. Her sister Laura is a senior on the Nebraska team. A two-

time all-state selection, Luther led her team to the 1992 state class B championship with a 29-1 record. She led her team in kills as a senior setting a school record of 629 kills in her career.

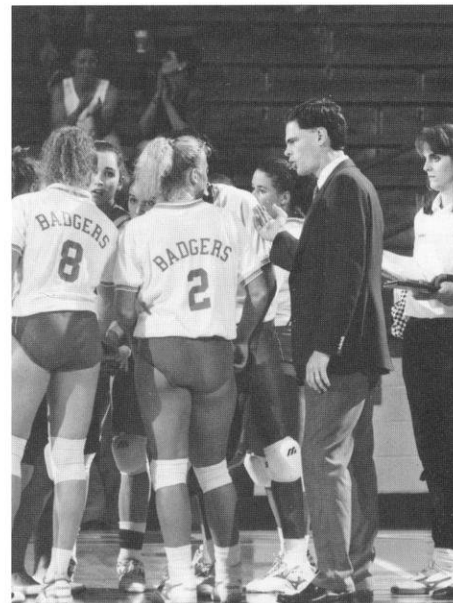
"Kelli will give us size at the left-side hitter position which we haven't had," says Cook. "She should develop into a good Big Ten attacker but more important, she's a good blocker who can stop the other team's right-side attack."

Holly Smith, a 6-1 middle blocker from Wheaton, Ill., also comes from a volleyball family—she is the sister of middle blocker Laurie Smith. Holly played on the same AAU team as Laura Abbinante that won the 1991 16-and-under national championship. A two-time all-conference selection, Smith earned all-area honors and also played in the *Chicago Sun Times*/Mizuno All-Star volleyball match.

"I think Holly's going to develop into an outstanding volleyball player," says Cook. "She's a very gifted blocker and we expect her to compete for a starting position at middle blocker."

Cook's 1993 team looks focused and intent on achieving their goals for 1993.

"Our goal every year will be to challenge for the Big Ten championship," says Cook, "because if you win a Big Ten championship, everything else you want in the season will come with it—the NCAA tournament, a top-10 ranking and a chance at a national championship."

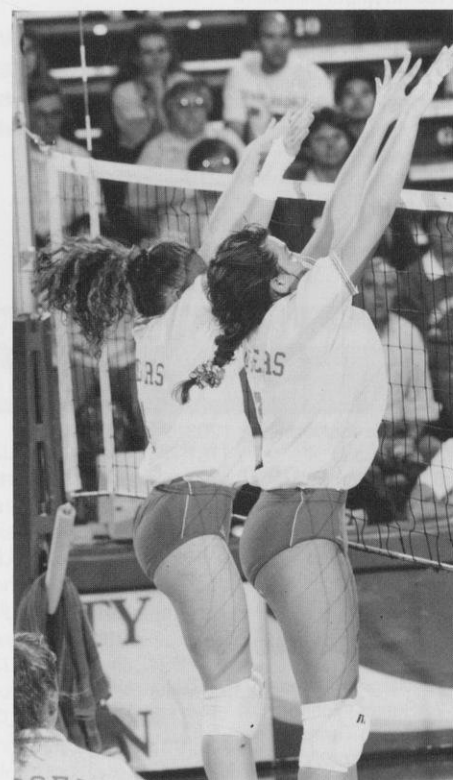

The University of Wisconsin benefits from the interest and media exposure associated with the Big Ten Conference, one of the premier athletic conferences in the nation. Big Ten women's athletics programs take pride in leading the nation in volleyball attendance and in receiving more network and cable television exposure than any conference in the nation.

Begun in 1895, the Intercollegiate Conference of Faculty Representatives (popularly known as the Big Ten) has changed little from its original philosophy of faculty control of athletics with emphasis on the student-athlete.

The women's athletics programs became affiliated with the Conference officially in 1981, although unofficial conference championships had been held among the member institutions since 1972. Penn State became the 11th university to join the conference in 1991.

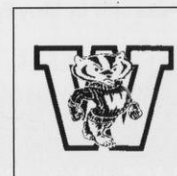
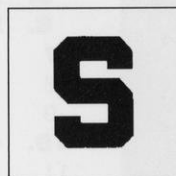
As a Big Ten school, Wisconsin women athletes compete in conference championships in basketball, cross country, golf, swimming and diving, tennis, indoor and

outdoor track and field, and volleyball.

The Big Ten Conference volleyball champion is determined by the match record within the conference. The teams play a double, round-robin schedule with all teams playing each other twice, both at home and away, for a total of 20 matches.

The conference champion earns an automatic bid to the NCAA tournament. In 1992, the Big Ten was represented by three universities in the NCAA Volleyball Championship and one university in the NIVC Championship. In 1993, the University of Wisconsin will serve as the host school of the NCAA Women's Volleyball Championship.

For four consecutive years, the Big Ten Conference has led the nation in volleyball attendance. Five schools finished in the top 19 in attendance, and overall the league averages 1,055 spectators per match. The University of Wisconsin finished ninth in the nation in attendance average with 1,440 in 1992. Illinois was second with 3,061, Penn State was fifth with 1,754, Purdue was 13th with 1,194 and Minnesota was 19th with 943.

A World-Class University

The University of Wisconsin-Madison, one of the nation's leading institutions of higher education, is dedicated to the support of academic freedom.

Established in 1848, the first class of 17 students enrolled February 5, 1849. Today, UW-Madison ranks as the nation's fifth largest university with 41,948 students. The student body is one of the most diverse in the country with students coming from every state in the country. Wisconsin also ranks fourth in the nation for foreign student enrollment.

More than 4,470 courses and 12,832 sections are offered in UW-Madison's 12 schools and colleges. Majors are available in 156 bachelor's, 184 master's, and 125 doctoral and professional degree programs.

Wisconsin has ranked among the top 10 universities in the United States in every scholarly reputational study since 1910. The quality of its undergraduate, graduate and research programs is recognized around the world.

One recent survey rated 49 different undergraduate programs at UW-Madison among the top 10 in the nation. Among those ranked include sociology, German, chemical engineering, geography, statistics, plant pathology, molecular biology, biochemistry, Spanish, Portuguese, zoology, political science, chemistry, economics, mathematics, and history.

Much of the University's international academic reputation stems from the quality of its faculty. UW-Madison faculty or alumni have been awarded 12 Nobel Prizes and 17 Pulitzer Prizes. Many other faculty are leaders in their field being members of the National Academy of Sciences, National Academy of Engineering, and National Academy of Education. The university is also ranked fourth in the nation in research and development expenditures.

UW-Madison is one of the nation's first land-grant colleges, establishing a tradition of research in agriculture and the life science. The founders of the university developed the "Wisconsin Idea" as making "the beneficent influence of the university available to every home in the state."

UW-Madison is the largest institution in the University of Wisconsin System. It has the only public law and medical schools in the state as well as the only school of veterinary medicine.

A Scenic Campus

One of the most picturesque college campuses in the country, UW-Madison lies along the beautiful shores of Lake Mendota.

One mile from the capitol, traveling down historic State Street, the city was designed so the University and state would be linked, signifying the interrelated nature of the academic and political life of Wisconsin.

Madison's lakes, rolling hills, architecture, parks and arboretum have enhanced

UW-Madison's reputation for scenic beauty. Two major films, including the 1986 summer hit *Back To School* starring Rodney Dangerfield, have been shot on the picturesque campus.

Tree-lined Bascom Hill, which features a bronze statue of Abraham Lincoln, is one of the University's most famous landmarks. Others include North Hall, the first building on campus; the Carillon Tower in front of the Social Science building; the Library Mall, with its clock tower and fountain; and Picnic Point, a 129-acre peninsula complete with hiking and biking trails—one of the most romantic spots on campus.



A favorite area for UW students to congregate is the Memorial Union and its lakeside terrace. Here students can study or socialize against a backdrop of sailboats, canoes, sailboards, kayaks and swimmers, while enjoying the sunshine and cool breezes from Lake Mendota.

The Student Body

Over 41,000 students populate the 900-acre UW campus, including more than 10,414 graduate students in numerous fields.

Although a UW Board of Regents policy limits undergraduate enrollment from outside the state to 25 percent, the University still maintains one of the nation's most diverse student bodies.

Students hail from every county in the state and every state in the nation, as well as from approximately 115 foreign countries. UW-Madison ranks fourth in the nation for total foreign student enrollment.

A greater effort is also being made to recruit and retain minority students and faculty. In 1992-93, African-Americans, Hispanics, Native Americans and other minority groups accounted for 7.64 percent of the student body.

The Community

Located in southern Wisconsin, Madison is the home of the University of Wisconsin and the state capital. Considered one of the Midwest's most vibrant communities, it offers an endearing quality of life for full-time residents and students.

With a diverse population of 194,591, Madison offers the "big city" spheres of politics, arts and entertainment, as well as the attributes of a small town. It is a family, action-oriented community that promotes participation in government, education, the arts, sports, and recreational activities.

The May 1989 issue of *Outside* magazine rated Madison as one of the top 15 "great sports towns" in the country, based on quantity and quality of outdoor activities, the surrounding environment, and the participation of its population in various sports and recreation.

Madison was also listed as the eighth most livable city in the nation in a 1991 *Money* magazine survey.

How to get an Ivy League Education at a State University



Where Wisconsin Ranks

Since 1910, the University of Wisconsin has ranked on the top ten lists in every objective national faculty reputational survey. The quality of Wisconsin's undergraduate, graduate and research programs is recognized worldwide.

The *Fiske Guide to Colleges 1993*, the best-selling guide to colleges, gives the UW-Madison its highest academic ranking. In fact, UW-Madison is one of only eight public universities to receive the five-star rating.

One recent survey rated 49 undergraduate programs at the UW-Madison among the top ten in the nation. The university has also ranked fourth for the last several years in research funding among the nation's universities.

Academic, financial, and other rankings are summarized below to offer a flavor of the quality at the University of Wisconsin-Madison.



Funding

► **Federal Grants:** UW-Madison ranked ninth nationally in 1990, receiving 1.2 percent of the federal budget for research.

► **Research and Development Funds:** UW-Madison ranked fourth in the country for research and development expenditures in 1990, with \$326.4 million, according to the National Science Foundation.

► **Tuition:** Over the last ten years, tuition for resident undergraduates at the UW-Madison has been consistently lower than the average for public Big Ten schools. The UW-Madison has the second-lowest resident undergraduate tuition, behind the University of Iowa, and the third-lowest nonresident undergraduate tuition of the public Big Ten institutions.

► **Private Support:** UW-Madison ranked sixth in the nation, and first among public institutions in 1990-91 by receiving \$128 million in private support.

Research and Programs

► **Research Activity Index:** In 1986, the UW-Madison ranked second in a new multidimensional study that evaluated research activity at U.S. universities.

► **Doctoral Degrees:** Between the school's founding and 1992, the University of Wisconsin-Madison awarded 29,033 Ph.D.s. Few institutions in the world can match this record.

Departmental Academic Rankings

► **Business:** The School of Business real estate program ranks first in the nation in 1993, according to *U.S. News and World Report*. The faculty's scholarly output ranks first among business schools at public institutions.

► **Education:** The School of Education is the nation's best according to a survey by the University of Illinois released in 1990. The UW's educational administration and educational policy studies rank second.

► **College of Agricultural and Life Sciences:** In 1993, the College of Agricultural and Life Sciences is one of the top 10 agricultural schools in the country according to *Farm Futures* magazine.

► **Journalism and Mass Communication:** The faculty at the School of Journalism and Mass Communication was

rated first in the nation in research productivity in 1988 by *Journalism Quarterly*.

► **Science Programs:** According to *U.S. News and World Report's* annual graduate school ratings, published in March 1993, six UW-Madison science programs ranked in the top 12: computer science, tied for eighth; biology, tied for ninth; chemistry, 10th; nursing, tied for 11th; health-sciences administration, tied for 12th; and engineering, 12th.

► **Libraries:** The UW-Madison has the 13th largest university library system in the United States, with 5.3 million books in 28 locations across campus.

► **Graduates:** According to a 1987 *Wall Street Journal* survey, UW-Madison produced the third highest percentage of CEOs at Fortune 500 industrial companies and at 350 Fortune 500 service companies.



UW-Madison Sets the Pace

- ▶ with the oldest Scandinavian studies (1875), psychology (1888), agricultural economics (1909) and genetics (1910) departments in the United States
- ▶ in discovering Vitamins A and B
- ▶ with the oldest radio station in the nation—WHA—which began broadcasting in 1917
- ▶ as the Memorial Union became the first public university union to serve beer in 1933
- ▶ in finding in 1937 that niacin supplementation prevents pellagra, a deadly disease that killed 5,000 people a year
- ▶ with the nation's first department of wildlife management in 1939
- ▶ in the synthesizing of genes. Biochemistry professor Har Gobind Khorana synthesizes the first gene, for which he later receives the Nobel Prize in 1968
- ▶ in finding which wavelength of ultraviolet light produces skin cancer
- ▶ in discovering the anti-cancer drug, fluorouracil
- ▶ as Elizabeth and James Miller, UW Medical School professor of oncology and professor emeritus of oncology, were the first to identify characteristics among chemicals that cause cancer
- ▶ with the Orbiting Astronomical Observatory, the world's first true observatory in space
- ▶ in revolutionizing brain surgery, as Dr. Manucher Javid, UW Medical School professor of surgery, became the first neurosurgeon to use a solution from the age-old compound area during brain surgery on a human
- ▶ in developing tests for phenylketonuria (PKU), a congenital disease of children
- ▶ as UW-Madison researchers describe the atomic structure of a common cold virus
- ▶ in developing new techniques to measure bone tissue loss, known as osteoporosis
- ▶ with the Biotron, a research building that can control environmental conditions for experimental purposes
- ▶ with bone marrow transplants. Using techniques developed at UW-Madison, the first bone marrow transplant in the U.S. was done at UW Hospital. Today, more than 10,000 transplants are performed yearly, giving new hope to patients with leukemia and immune deficiency diseases



- ▶ in finding evidence linking cancer in laboratory animals with saccharine and cyclamates
- ▶ in finding that the anti-estrogen drug tamoxifen can prevent breast cancer from recurring in certain women who have had cancer previously
- ▶ as UW Hospital and Clinics develop the nation's first Mobile Critical Care Unit, which duplicates facilities of a hospital intensive care unit and laboratories



- ▶ with the first and only medical physics department in the nation to exist within a medical school
- ▶ with the establishment of the Center for Dairy Research, the nation's first such center to be established at a university
- ▶ in organ preservation breakthroughs. In 1987, Dr. Folkert Belzer used a cold storage preservation solution to preserve dog livers up to 36 hours and dog pancreases up to 72 hours. Clinical use of this new solution decreases the need for emergency transplantation, increases the number of livers and pancreases available to people who need transplants, and improves organ sharing among transplant centers
- ▶ with Dr. Howard M. Temin of McArdle Laboratory and his coworker discovering reverse transcriptase (Independently discovered by Dr. David Baltimore). This enzyme explains how retroviruses cause cancer and AIDS. Temin's work in this field led to his selection as a co-recipient of the 1975 Nobel Prize in Medicine.



Chancellor David Ward

David Ward was named the chancellor of the University of Wisconsin-Madison in June, 1993. He replaced Donna E. Shalala, who resigned to become the secretary of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.

The former vice chancellor for academic affairs and UW-Madison provost, Ward continues in efforts to improve the quality of undergraduate education. He is also coordinating the efforts to enhance the diversity of the UW campus and restoring support for the university's infrastructure.

A native of Manchester, England, Ward received his bachelor's and master's degrees from the University of Leeds. He earned a Fulbright Travel award to the United States in 1960, and received a doctorate from Wisconsin in 1963. Ward served on the faculty at Carleton University in Ottawa and the University of British Columbia before joining the UW-Madison geography faculty in 1966.

Athletics at the UW

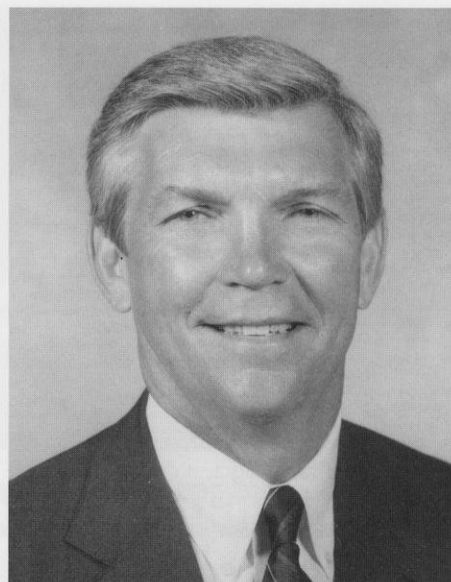
The University of Wisconsin-Madison offers its students one of the most diversified intercollegiate athletic programs in the country.

A member of the prestigious Big Ten Conference, Wisconsin offers its student-athletes the best in education, opportunities, coaching and on-field competition at the NCAA Division I level.

Men's teams compete in football, basketball, ice hockey, track and field, soccer, swimming and diving, tennis, rowing, wrestling, cross country, and golf. Women's sports are basketball, track and field, cross country, volleyball, tennis, soccer, swimming and diving, rowing, and golf.

In 1992, Wisconsin had the sixth most successful athletic department in the nation according to a survey conducted by *USA Today*. The women's department was rated eighth nationally and the men's program was 10th in the all-sports ranking.

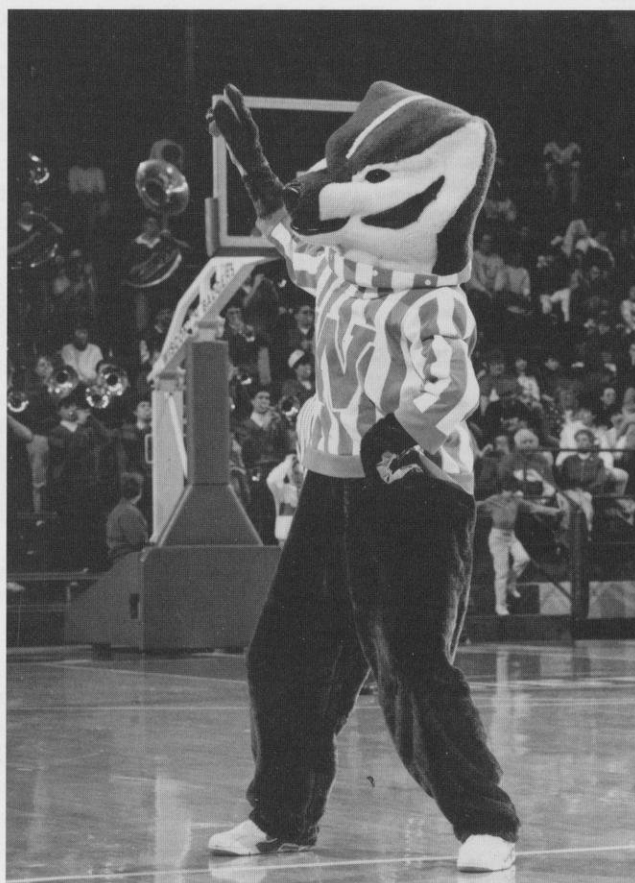

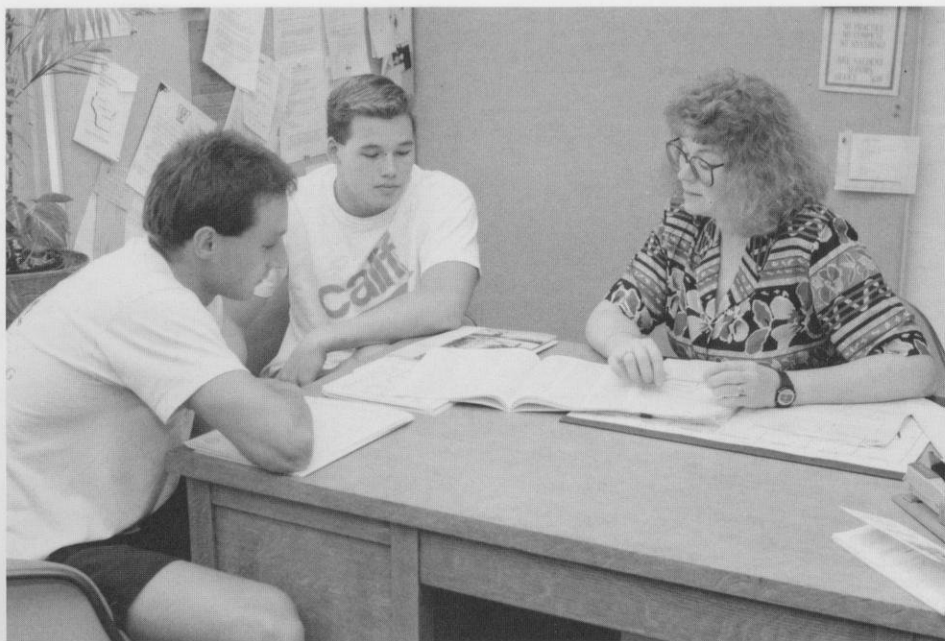

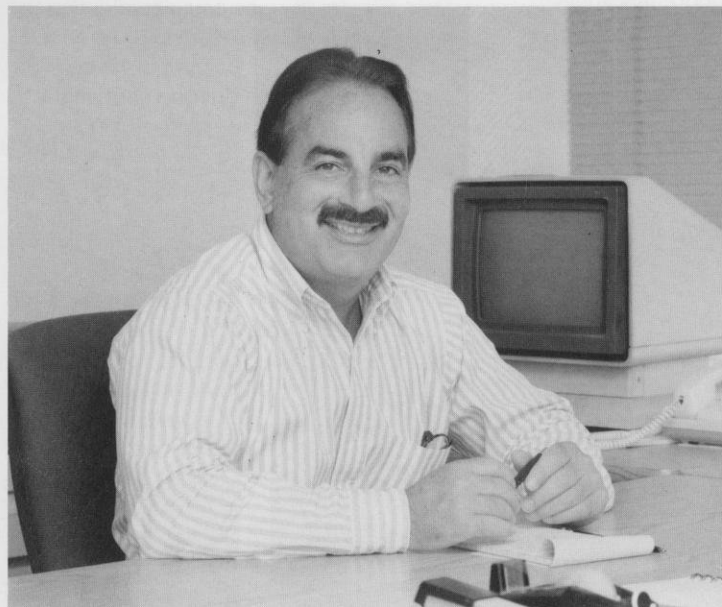
Scholarships

UW-Madison is proud to offer to its prospective student-athletes one of the most comprehensive athletic scholarship programs in the nation. As a Division I member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA), scholarships are awarded to athletes on a one-year basis, renewable yearly if scholastic and athletic commitment are maintained.

Full and partial scholarships are available in all varsity sports with the exception of rowing, which does not grant schol-

arships. Full scholarships include the cost of room and board in addition to tuition and fees. The selection of scholarship recipients is based on athletic ability and projected academic success at the University of Wisconsin-Madison.

Wisconsin Sports Facilities

Athletes at the University of Wisconsin benefit from outstanding sports facilities. From practice and competitive areas to athletic and weight training, Wisconsin offers modern and well-equipped facilities for its athletes.

The Wisconsin Field House, which seats 11,500, is the practice and competitive facility for the Badger basketball and volleyball teams. It is also used as a competitive arena for wrestling. The Field House features four locker rooms, an athletic training area and state-of-the-art scoreboard, sound and lighting systems.

The Camp Randall Memorial Sports Center or Shell, located next to Camp Randall Football Stadium, is a multi-purpose facility used by all students. A 200-meter Mondo rubber track surrounds four basketball or volleyball courts that double as throwing and jumping areas for indoor track meets. With a seating capacity of 2,500, the Shell is the site of numerous track meets including the 1992 Big Ten Men's Track Championship.

One of the most versatile facilities is the McClain Athletic Facility. Over 76,000 square feet of artificial turf offers the ideal indoor practice facility for football, soccer and track. The lower level features the headquarters of the Badgers Sports Medicine facility and a fully-equipped weight room. Locker rooms for football and men's and women's track are also located on the lower level.

The Wisconsin tennis teams have a competitive advantage to play year-round at one of the best college facilities in the United States—the Nielsen Tennis Stadium. The stadium features 18 tennis courts (12 indoor and six outdoor), five squash courts, one squash doubles court. and

seats 1,500 spectators. The stadium is named for Arthur C. Nielsen, founder of the Nielsen television rating system. Nielsen captained the Wisconsin men's tennis team from 1916 to 1918 while a student in electrical engineering.

The newest facility at Wisconsin is the outdoor track and soccer complex located at the west end of campus. The Dan McClimon Memorial Track, named for the former UW coach, features a newly resurfaced 400-meter, Martin rubber outdoor track. The track surrounds the Olympic size, natural grass Bill Reddan Soccer Field. The facility was completed during the summer of 1992 with lighting to be added

during the fall of 1993. Building permanent seating with locker rooms and press box area is scheduled to begin in the near future.

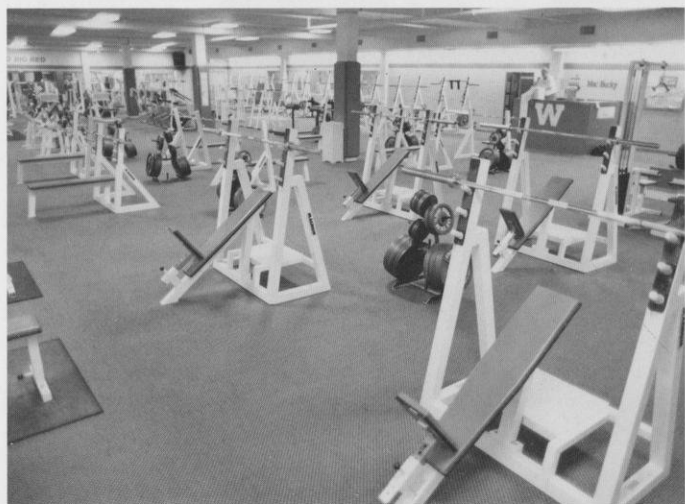
The swimming and diving teams have the luxury of two pools for practice and competition—the Natatorium and Southeast Recreational Facility. The "Nat" contains an eight-lane, 25-yard racing pool equipped with an automatic Colorado Timing

System and digital readout score board. The 50' x 40' separate diving well is fitted with three one-meter and two three-meter Dura (Maxi) Flex boards. The SERF facility

features an indoor long course pool with movable bulkheads that more than double the program's training space.

Situated between five lakes, Madison is the perfect location for a rowing program. The Badger crews are headquartered in the boat house, situated on Lake Mendota. The boat house provides the Badger crews with an indoor rowing tank during the winter season. During the warm months, crews can often be seen any one of the five lakes.

With the opening of University Ridge in 1991, UW golfers now have the opportunity to compete on the new UW golf course. The par 72, 18-hole course was designed by Robert Trent Jones Jr. The facility also features a 15,000 square foot practice green and 5,000 square foot chipping green.

The Wisconsin strength and conditioning program is a sophisticated blend of science, technology and one-on-one attention to each athlete. Weight training areas in the McClain Center and Camp Randall Stadium feature Nautilus equipment, free weights, and stereo music in spacious, carpeted rooms. Several full-time weight training instructors monitor and advise all Wisconsin student-athletes. The UW also offers a sports nutrition program to assist athletes in meeting their nutritional demands and body composition goals.

The care, prevention, and treatment of injuries to Wisconsin athletes is supervised by a staff of N.A.T.A.-certified athletic trainers. Wisconsin's Sports Medicine program features start-of-the-art facilities and

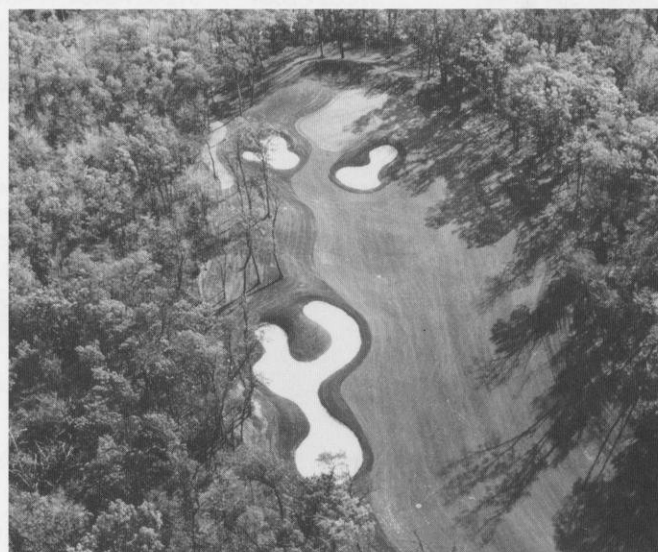

the services of leading sports medicine and health care professionals.

The Sports Medicine program focuses on injury prevention. Staff members utilize Cybex strength-testing devices, provide dietary analysis, measure physiological capacity and outline programs to improve flexibility. Should an injury occur, athletes are seen immediately by team physicians affiliated with the UW Hospitals and Clinics.

In addition to the headquarters in the McClain Athletic Facility, auxiliary training rooms are located in the Stadium, Coliseum, Natatorium, and UW Field house. All training areas are equipped with the finest therapeutic modalities and rehabilitative apparatus. Other medical specialists assigned to intercollegiate athletics also assist in the diagnosis and treatment of the athletes.

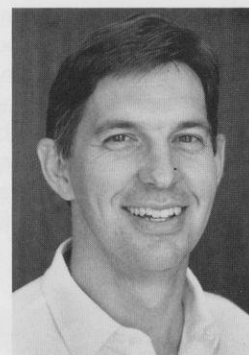

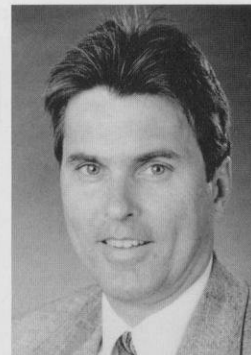
