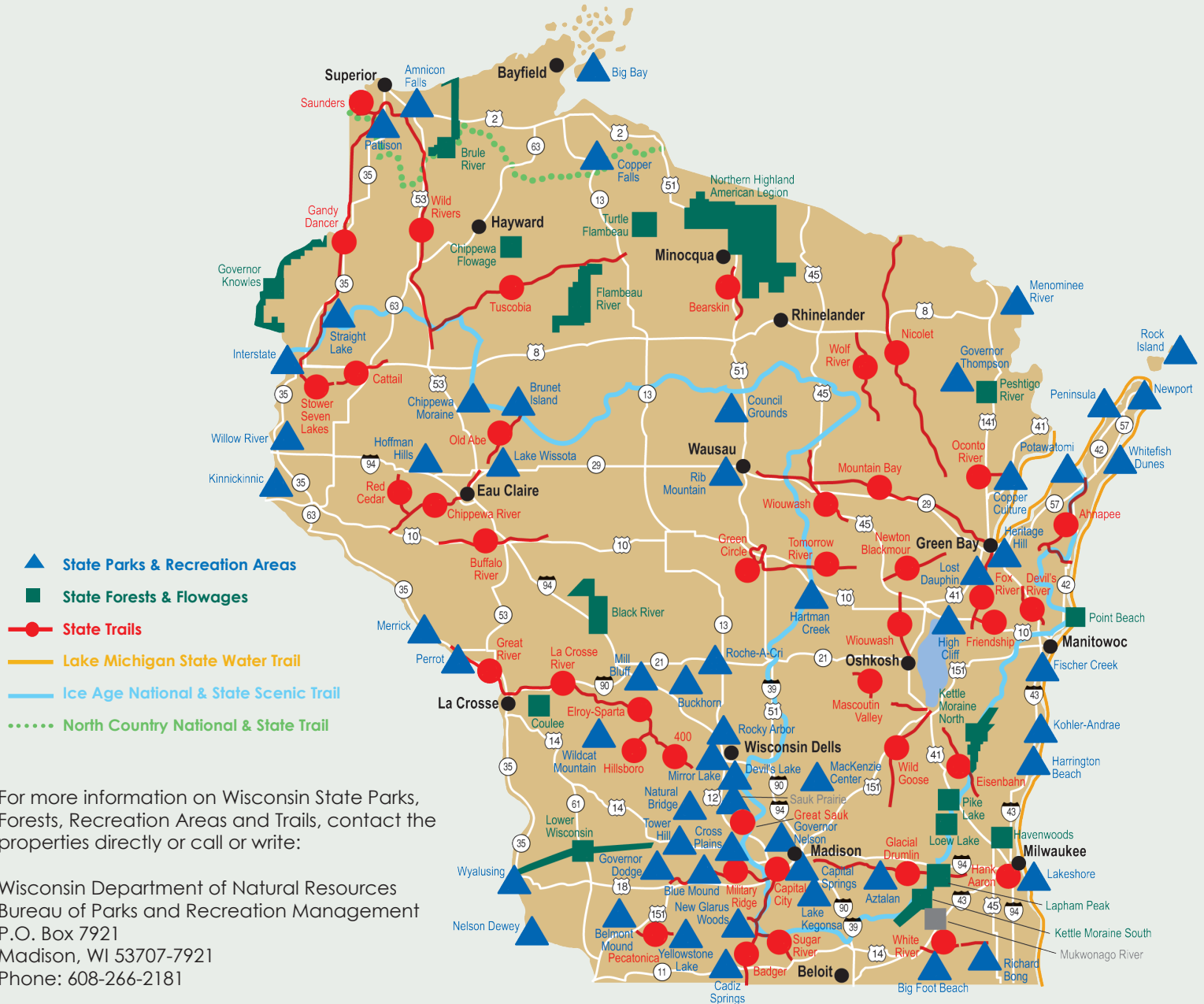

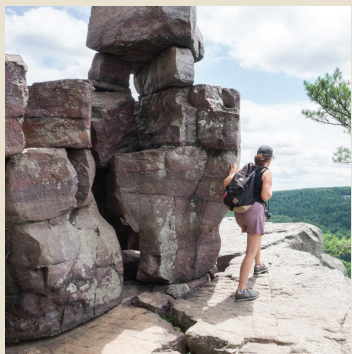

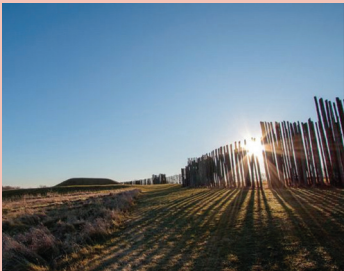

SUPPORT THE FRIENDS

Friends Groups raise money for necessary matching funds so they can apply for grants through the state's Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program to help with work including habitat restoration, trail maintenance and the construction of park facilities. Past Friends projects receiving stewardship funds have included the construction of shelters, playground equipment, boardwalks, trails, accessible cabins and interpretive exhibits, as well as invasive species removal and restoration of prairie and woodland habitat. Mid-November is the deadline to apply for stewardship grants.

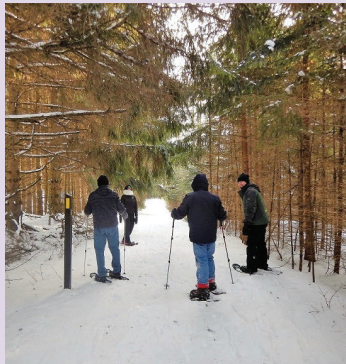
