Foreword

As an open competitive exhibition, the Wisconsin Salon of Art is and always has been among the foremost events in which young artists of the state can receive recognition.

In recent competitions these young artists have been exhibiting vigorous figurative paintings which in no way "go back" to the figure.

Figures are implanted in new concepts and painted in styles that have absorbed the free eloquence of abstract expressionism and the sardonic humor that evolved from Pop Art.

It is most closely related to expressionism but it has a social commentary, a bitterness about the plight of humanity in a pitiless society that is purely of the 1960's. It lambasts with lush paint.

The vigor and intensity of this new work with the figure by young artists is reassuring about the future of our art.

It is a vital expression about humanity today from the eyes of a perceptive and forward-seeing generation.

Golub: The show looks lively and experimental. The sculpture had an air of excitement and vitality. Graphics were very good in quality.

Cassill: The pressure of space limitation was with us all weekend. This made us look for innocence and originality of expression. More space might get a different kind of show.

Golub: Notwithstanding the fact that major awards were given to paintings, the general tenor of the paintings seemed less interesting to me than the graphics and sculpture.

Gallo: The show suffered from a loss of originality. The print work was far superior to other areas. The sculpture was glib and superficial by comparison.

Golub: Sculpture had the greatest interest for me. Much of it had a force and an experimental elan.

Cassill: I think we have contributed to further confusion about the idea of professionalism.

Gallo: I agree with that.

Cassill: I feel that in a way it's bad to confuse professionalism; but it's an indicator of a thriving art community.

Golub: The exhibition has edge and vitality and, I hope, controversy. If there is controversy, it will reflect the fact that much art today is involved in the tumults, excitement and controversies of the world outside art.







Statistics

457 artists submitted 668 works in oil, watercolor, graphics, and sculpture. 88 works by 82 artists were selected for exhibition. The committee selected 7 Wisconsin artists to submit an Invitational Work which was not juried.
